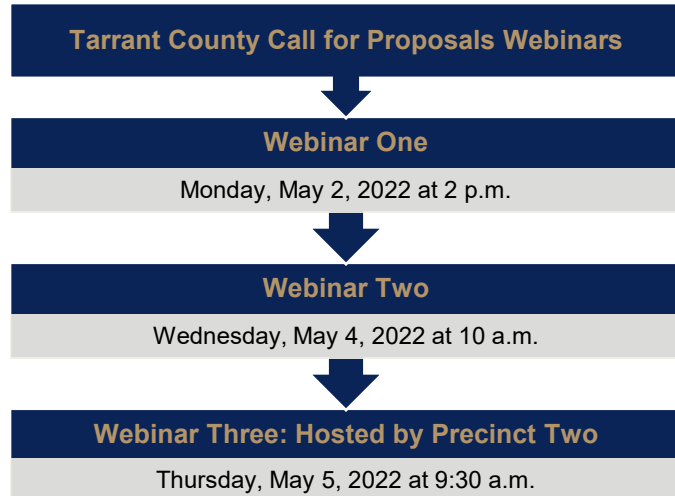

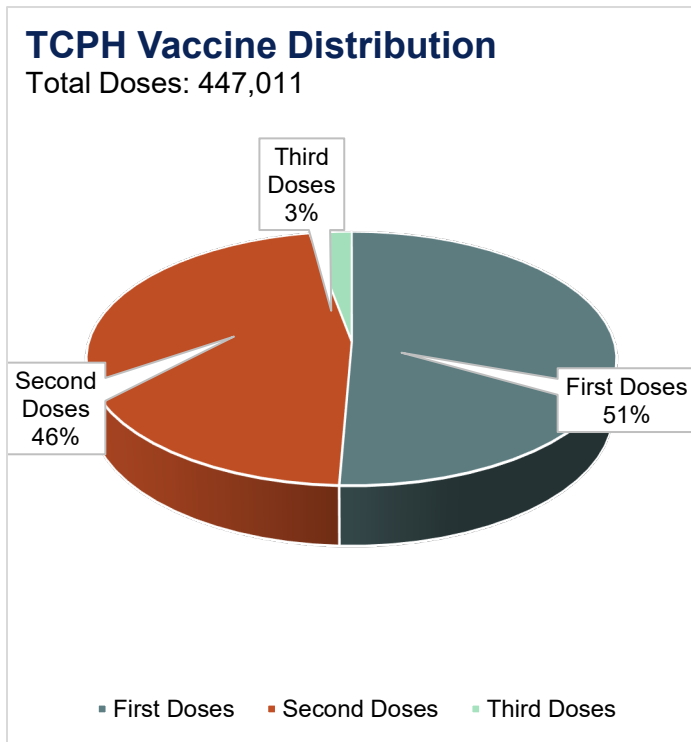

## Other Recovery Updates

### Small Business

- Staff has worked with IEM and several County departments to work toward an eligible small business grant framework. Staff hopes to present the framework to Commissioners Court for feedback in the coming weeks.

### Childcare

- Kara Waddell with Child Care Associates will be in Commissioners Court on 5/3 to present a proposal for the \$45 million allocated for childcare in Tarrant County.

### Housing

- Staff is considering various data-driven strategies for use of the \$32.5 million allocated for affordable housing in Tarrant County and plans to begin discussions with Commissioners Court in the coming weeks.

### Innovative Emergency Management (IEM)

- IEM has begun working with staff on Phase 3 of Tarrant County's ARPA-FRF Program. Current activities include: Support with Final Rule Requirements; Structuring Upcoming Calls for Projects; Online Application Creation; Compliance and Monitoring; and Public-Facing Reporting.
