I believe inseparably connected with the interests and future success of the Church. There is nothing like it for building up binding together and carrying on practical experimental piety. And when the Methodists as people abandon the practice of meeting together in class, we will soon have a stale lifeless Church organization as some others I might mention.

He was enrolled in the service in September of 1814 and was honorably discharged at Nashville, Tenn., in March of 1815

"He was in the heart of the battle of New Orleans, on the 8th day of January 1815, that he was under Genl. Carroll of Tenn., was in no other battles, that he has mislaid his discharge, that he had it a few years ago, that he answered to his own name, and believes his name is on the Muster Roll of said Co."

J. M. D. Miller of Iuka, Miss., his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his post office is at Iuka, Tishomingo Co., Miss., and that his domicile or place of abode is 12 miles N. W. of Iuka. /s/ Samuel Dancer, Applicant

Vincent Shilling was born in La. and died 29 December 1910 in Antlers, Oklahoma. His wife Amanda F. (Gomer) Shilling died 27 October 1908 in Antlers.

The Shilling records were hand copied from the Bible of Leonidus Vincent Shilling and his wife Leona French who were married in Navarro County, Texas 29th November 1885 and later moved to Oklahoma.

FORT WORTH STANDARD, Fort Worth, Texas, Volume III, Thursday, June 24, 1875 Number 6: "A Carnival of Blood, A Man Shot in his Bad while Asleep, Escape of the Assassin-June Peak, the Marshal, received news of a terrible murder and kindly furnished us the following details concerning it. On Tuesday night last, Mr. C. W. Wood, of the firm of Cates & Wood, Decatur, Wise county, was shot and killed, while asleep in his bed, by a man named Crockett. The assassin was prompted to the deed by a desire of revenge, but mistook his man and killed in his place his partner. Crockett had been confined in the jail by Cates(the partner of Mr. Wood) who was Sheriff of the county. and during his incarceration swore to kill Cates if he ever got out. Filled with a desire of Cates' life, he took the first opportunity after his release to accomplish his hellish design, and shrouded by darkness and at the hour of midnight, he, with stealthy steps, approached the house of the victim, who as he supposed was in his bed. Carefully, he raised a window, and by the dim light he discovered what he supposed was Cates. He leveled his deadly pistol and fired, the ball taking deadly effect, and in the darkness escaped. He did not wait to see if the man he shot was his enemy, but fled. His wife, on being questioned, gave the information as regards his desire to kill Cates. Mr. Woods was a highly respected citizen, and his loss is deeply felt in the community....Dallas Comercial." \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

# RECOLLECTIONS OF EARLY DAYS IN TEXAS by Elder John A. Freeman

I crossed Red River into Texas north of Bonham about the 1st of November, 1845. There was a little town a mile or two from the river, but I don't recollect its name. I was then just entering my twenty-fifth year, full of life and full of hope, and an earnest desire to preach Christ in this new and strange land, for it was for this I came to Texas. Very soon we took the direct route to the "Three Forks of the Trinity River," as it was then called. There were a few settlements along the way, sometimes with miles between. Not far from the East Fork of Trinity we passed Col. Geary's place, where there was a company of rangers stationed. At that time they were a wild, rough looking set of men, some of them were dressed in buckskin, and some of them wore coonskin caps: some of them were drinking bad whisky and some of them were playing cards. In this way they spent their time when not in pursuit of the Indians, who came in every now and then to commit depradations on the settlers. From Rowlett's Creek to the Elm Fork of the Trinity there were no settlers; nothing to be seen but bands of wild horses and droves of deer and antelope. We crossed the last named stream about the 15th of November, 1845, six miles west of Elm Fork, at the house of James Gibson; myself and wife were taken in and cared for. Bro. Gibson was deacon of the Baptist church. To him and his wife we were indebted for many acts of kindness, and until death they were our true and tried friends. I found here a dozen or more families and among them ten or twelve Baptists, and others came in. Elder Joshua Hodges, an ordained Baptist minister, moved into the neighborhood a short time before I did and had an appointment to preach at Bro. Gibson's house. Here I preached my first sermon. I never shall forget that day while memory holds its place. Nearly all the people turned out to hear preaching. We commenced by singing some good songs. There was a deep solemnity prevading the entire congregation and many shed tears at the end of the service. My text that day was I Peter, 3:12, "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous and His ears are open unto their prayers, but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil." The thought that we tried to impress upon the minds of God's children was, that He who had heard their prayers in other days, was able to hear them now, and to shield them from every foe, both seen and unseen.

In a few weeks after this I first met Elder David Myers. He was a good preacher and one of the most lovable men I ever met. He did much to establish the Baptist cause in Dallas County. He held many revival meetings and was instrumental in winning many souls to Christ. In the midst of his usefulness he was called from his home below to his home in heaven. Eld. J. M. Myers, his son, is too well known by the Baptists of Texas to need any commendation from me. I assisted at his ordination and we labored together in many protracted meetings, saw many souls converted and have many times been made to rejoice together.

Lonesome Dove church was organized with twelve members. All of them have passed down the river, except myself and two others. We will soon follow on.

The third Sunday in July, 1846, I was ordained to the full work of the gospel ministry, and that evening, amid much rejoicing, I baptized three candidates, two of whom are yet living, Bro. A. J. Foster, of Lonesome Dove Church, and Perry Malone, of Azusa Church, Los Angeles County, California. And this reminds me that some of those that I have buried with Christ in baptism, are scattered all along the way from Texas to Oregon. Many of them have done, and are doing good service for the Master, while many others have gone to join the "general assembly and church of the first born." In the spring of 1846 I first met Elder N. T. Byass. He was a man of great energy, and perhaps did more to establish the cause of Christ on the frontiers of Texas, and assisted in establishing more Baptist churches than almost any one that ever labored on this field. I labored with him in several meetings, and learned to love him. But he is gone to his better home, and we say, in the words of another, "Servant of God, well done; the battle's fought, the victory won."

Elder A. J. Halford I knew from the time he was about 12 years old. I saw him converted, received him into the church, and baptized him. From that day I was satisfied that he would make a preacher. His work for 26 years previous to his death, fully confirmed that impression. He did more work and received less remuneration that any minister I ever knew. He was beloved by all who knew him and has gone to receive a "crown and kingdom" where "the wicked cease from troubling, and the weary are at rest." Eld. W. W. Harris, who was called "the Spurgeon of Texas," was converted at one of my meetings on Bear Creek, Tarrant County. He was from the first a wonderful boy. I heard him make his first effort, and did all I could to help him in his great work, which I hope was not lost labor. I am aware that nothing that I can say will add to the luster of his name.

I have just received the Fort Worth Gazette, from which I learn that Elder V. J. Hutton died near Collinsville, on the 13th of January, 1892. He was a not d character in the early days of Texas. I will relate an incident to show the power of divine grace. Mr. Hutton had a difficulty with a young man named Pleasant Smith. Everyone was expecting one or the other to be killed. Just at this time I was holding a meeting in the Crowley settlement. Hutton and Smith were both there. They were both convicted of sin, both came up for prayer, and in a short time they were both converted, and embraced each other and wept like children. They were friends ever after. I baptized both of these brethren, and many others at the same time. I think this was one of the most powerful meetings that I have ever held. There were influences for good set in motion then, that have been going on ever since, and like the waves of the sea, will go on and on forever. Glory to God, for the power of divine grace. (The following material is from the files of Dr. Martin H. Hall, Dept. of History, University of Texas at Arlington, Arlington, Texas, 76101. Dr. Hall is working on a book on the Arizona campaign which has led to his gathering muster rolls of Confederate Units around the state. Anyone having information on any of these men are requested to contact Dr. Hall.)

Thomas O. Moody enrolled his company in Mansfield, Tarrant County, on October 26. The unit was mustered into Confederate service "for the war" at San Antonio as Company K, Seventh Regiment Texas Mounted Volunteers (Cavalry) on November 15, 1861. Company K, although a part of Sibley's Army of New Mexico remained behind in San Antonio to serve as an escort to the brigade paymaster. The unit was still in San Antonio as late as March 12, 1862, and thus did not take part in the New Mexico Campaign proper. Company K arrived in Confederate Arizona sometime in April or May, 1862, and formed part of Colonel William Steele's rear guard which evacuated Arizona and far West Texas in July, 1862.

"Hankins Herald" - Genealogical Bi-Ways, 1420 Roma Lane, Fort Worth, Texas, 76134, six pages of material, grey Topsham, mimeograph, quarterly, subscription \$3/yr.

"The Baillio Newsletter" - Mrs. Jake Wilson, Box 281, Hillsboro, Texas, 76645, quarterly, subscription \$2/yr, white bond.

"Haynes Eagle" - Mrs. Miles S. Quinn, 81618 N. Davison Rd., Creswell, Oregon, 97426, quarterly, mimeograph, white bond, subscription \$4/yr.

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Of all the genealogy columns now appearing in newspapers throughout the United States, the one written by Schuyler C. Brossman, Box 43, Rehrersburg, Pennsylvania, 19550 is certainly superior. Called "Our Keystone Families," it appears in the Lebanon Weekly News, Lebanon, Pennsylvania. Subscription to the newspaper is \$5/yr. Brossman includes much data of interest to the genealogist such as helpful hints on research in his area, articles on wills, historical societies, orphans court records, letters of administration, inventories of estates, family reunions, maps, genealogy and postage stamps, reviews, queries, etc. This column has just entered its second year, and it is now read in all parts of the country. A column of this type needs to be reprinted in book form, and a writer of Brossman's caliber should branch out into greater literary endeavors.

Another publication that should interest persons with Pennsylvania ancestry is "Central Pennsylvania Genealogy Magazine." Published by Miss Mary Bell Lontz, 608 Broadway, Milton, Pennsylvania, 17847, it contains important data on this section of the state. Subscription rate is \$6/yr, and included in the formats are cemetery records, courthouse records, church records, marriage records, queries, etc. Each issue contains about 30 pages, and it is published in March, June, September, and December.

Have you seen a copy of "Linkage for Ancestral Research?" Edited and published by Mrs. Frank N. Reeder, 2900 Espanola NE, Albuquerque, New Mexico, 87110, it is the original coordinating publication for genealogical organizations. Contents are indexed in the "Genealogical Periodical Annual Index."

Mrs. Robertalee Lent, P. O. Box 1067, Pinehurst, Idaho, 83850 and Mrs. June B. Barekman, 3302 West Diversey, Chicago, Illinois, 60647 are the publishers of a monthly magazine called "Genealogical Reference Builders Newsletter." It is the only monthly of its kind and contains data from all states. The latest issue contains Posey Co., Indiana marriages, 1820 census of Greene Co., Pennsylvania, Maryland Muster Rolls, Dillahunty Cemetery (Henry Co., Tennessee), Linn County (Iowa) map, Rowan Co. (North Carolina) tax list, Linn Co. (Iowa) marriages, Mason Co. (West Virginia) wills, etc. There are over 50 pages in this issue, and each issue seems to improve on both quality and quantity.

# CRITIQUE TEJAS

BIOGRAPHICAL SOUVENIR OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, published by F. A. Battey Co., Chicago, 1889. The preface of this volume gives a clear insight into the importance of this publication.

"Until quite recently but little attention has been given to the preservation of biography, except in so far as it pertained to the preferred classes - persons who had been prominent in governmental affairs, or distinguished in their profession or calling, or in some way made conspicuous before the public.

Within the past decade, however, there has been a growing demand from the popular classes for the preservation, not only of biography, but of family genealogy, not altogether for its immediate worth, but for its future value and a laudable pride in its perpetuation for coming generations.

That the representative public, as well as the more illustrious citizen, is entitled to the priveleges and benefits afforded by a work of this kind needs no assertion at our hands, for one of our greatest Americans has said that the history of any country resolves itself into the biographies of its stout, earnest, progressive and representative citizens. This medium then serves more than a single purpose; while it preserves biography and family genealogy, it records history that probably would not be preserved in any other way; the expediency, therefore, of placing biography and genealogy in book form is beyond question.

The difficulties experienced by the collectors in gathering the material for this volume, forcibly illustrates the necessity for works of this character; in a majority of cases it is found that nearly all reliable trace of ancestry is lost back of the grandfather and grandmother - even in many families where prominence and intelligence would seem to guarantee better things.

No pains have been spared to make the facts to be found within these covers accurate. With but few exceptions the

material has been gathered from those most immediately interested and then submitted in typewritten form for correction and revision."

THE DODSONS OF TEXAS

One Charles Dodson received a third class unconditional certificate for 320 acres of land from the Republic of Texas, County of Panola, on 6 September 1841 stating that he arrived in the Republic of Texas in December of 1839 and that he was a single man. Charles Dodson (Junior) married Sarah Ann Curlin on 26 September 1841 in Panola County, Republic of Texas, recorded in Harrison County, Texas marriage records, Vol. 2, page 14. One Charles Dodson was granted 640 acres of land situated in Harrison District, Upshur County, Texas by virtue of unconditional certificate #85 issued 7 August 1843. On 19 January 1846, one Charles Dodson received a land patent for 320 acres of land situated in Harrison County, Texas. On 20 May 1846, there is a deed from Charles Dodson (Junior) to H. B. Kelsey for 640 acres of land, when it shall be surveyed, situated in the Republic of Texas, County of Harrison, which is the headright

Certificate of "my" father Charles Dodson (Senior) deceased.

There is also a deed from Elijah Dodson to Charles Dodson,

County of Upshur, State of Texas, releasing to "my" uncle,

Charles Dodson, all my right, title, interest, and claim in

and to the estate both real and personal of Charles Dodson

(Senior) deceased, being the father of the said Charles Dodson,

dated 2 December 1850....signed - E. R. Dodson.

According to the 1850 Upshur County, Texas census, Charles Dodson, Jr. was born about 1818 in Alabama and his wife, Sarah Ann Dodson (nee Curlin), was born about 1820 in Tennessee. The above Elijah R. Dodson is residing in their household and gives his birth year and place as 1830 in Tennessee. Also, there is a female M. A. Dodson, born about 1823 in Alabama whom I assume to be a sister to the head of the household, Charles Dodson, Jr. However, I have no proof, and no further record of her has been found. The known children of this marriage are as follows:

Nettie A. Dodson, William Robert Dodson, Eliza Jane Dodson, Charles Hallen Dodson, and Frances (female. Margaret and Nancy Dodson were probably children of this union.

According to the records of Mrs. Florine Sparks, Mrs. C. O. Anderson, the 1840 Tuscaloosa County, Alabama census, the 1850 Walker County, Alabama census, and the 1860 Titus County, Texas census - Elijah R. Dodson is the son of R. Thomas W. Dodson, born about 1811 in Tennessee. (Issue of R. Thomas W. Dodson and wife, Frances: Elijah R. Dodson, Francis Dodson, John R. Dodson, Elizabeth Dodson, Adaline Dodson, Sarah B. Dodson, Dovie A. Dodson, Hellen Dodson, Doc Charles Thomas Dodson, Joel Franklin Dodson, and Louisa Dodson.)

From the above records we know that this branch of the Dodson family was located somewhere in the state of Tennessee in 1811, somewhere in the state of Alabama in 1818, 1823, and probably until late 1839, and that they arrived in the Republic of Texas (Panola/Harrison?Upshur District) in December, 1839. We know that Charles Dodson, Sr. was deceased by 20 May 1846 and that he was the father of at least the three children referenced above: R. Thomas W. Dodson, Charles Dodson, Jr., and the female, M. A. Dodson. However, we need to know who the mother of these children was, when and where she died (Alabama or Texas), were there other children in addition to the three listed above, who were the parents of Charles Dodson, Sr., who were the parents of Sarah Ann Curlin, where in Alabama was this family located prior to coming to the Republic of Texas. There is a Charles Dodson listed as head of a household in Walker County, Alabama in 1830, and R. Thomas W. Dodson is shown as the head of a household in 1850. Records for Walker County, Alabama prior to 1878 have been destroyed.

We know from additional land records of Upshur County, Texas that Charles Dodson, Jr. and his family sold their various land holdings in Upshur County, Texas, in 1856 and moved to Azle, Texas (which is cut in half by Parker and Tarrant counties where presumably he purchased land and also put in some kind of "wood shop." However, no land records have been found to date for Charles Dodson, Jr. who died here sometime between 1856-1861. The 1860 Tarrant County, Texas census records were destroyed and the family cannot be found on the 1860 Parker County, Texas census.

I do have a copy of "An Application by Sarah Ann Dodson for 160 acres of land within the limits of the Mississippi and Pacific Railroad Reserve in Parker County, Texas, dated 31 March 1860 and stating that she has been a bona fide settler upon this vacant land since 26 August A. D. 1856 and said settlement embraces her improvements." This application does not state if she is a "Mrs." or a "widow." Family legend indicates that she was cheated out of her land after her husband's death, and she and her small children returned to East Texas somewhere and stayed with relatives until the Civil War ended at which time they returned to Parker County where she remained until her death in 1904. A son, Charles Hallen Dodson, resided in Parker County from their return at the close of the Civil War until his death in 1937 (Issue of Charles Hallen Dodson and wife, Sarah Gemima Plumlee: Mary E., Charles Robert, Nora, William Monroe, Lucy Jane, James Martin, Milburn, Chellie Ann and Gertie Pearl.)

R. Thomas W. Dodson, per the above cited census records, did not come to Texas until between 1852 and 1857 settling in Titus County, Texas at that time (where he appears on the 1860 census). His death date and place is unknown. He was born in Tennessee and had children born here between 1830 and 1837. Other children were born in Alabama between 1839 and 1852, and his youngest child was born in Texas in 1857. Three of his sons served in the Confederate Army. Elijah R., Francis and John R. all enlisted in Upshur County. (Charles Dodson Junior had one son, William Robert Dodson, who served in the Civil War, and he also enlisted in Upshur County.)

In accordance with "An act to provide for the recompilation of an abstract of the located, titled and patented lands in Texas," approved March 19, 1875, the following Abstract is published.

All lands patented or located up to August 21, 1877, are included in the present edition.

It is deemed proper to state that in a work of the magnitude of the following there necessarily must be errors which have escaped the notice of the Land Office. All errors that may be detected by parties interested should be reported to the Land Office, in order that the proper corrections can be certified to the counties in which the lands are situated.

Where a grant of land lies in two or more counties, the name of the original grantee appears in the Abstract of each of the counties, with the whole number of acres in the grant. Foot notes, with letter references, show the fractional parts of the grant in the counties respectively.

The Abstract should be regarded by assessors as authority in questions relating to the quantity of land in each of the counties; as the approximate quantity is all that should be required.

In some instances the date of the patent, as stated in the Abstract, does not correspond with the patent as issued. In some of the cases the Abstract gives as the date of patent the date on which the claim was passed for patenting.

As the edition printed for the use of the State is limited, all officers who may be furnished with copies of the abstract should preserve the same carefully, and turn them over to their successors.

Crosley has carried this county and is doubtless elected

Right now I willsay that Capt Barry of Camp Cooper has had a fight and got several killed - he is still in pursuit In regard to myself I have raised one Regiment in this county. All are ready to take the field when called on by the executive

I believe you are authorized to order out or commission some one to raise men for Young's Regiment. I would be glad if you will give me a commision to raise a Company of flying artillery for service with Young

I have a through knowledge of Artillery practise and am doing nothing now and would be very glad to get into service if you will give me authority I will have a company ready at any time

I have expended a good deal of money since here in hunting Indians and now if there is a chance let me have it I have a very fine company of mounted rifleman here and can soon change them to flying artillery of

> Please drop me a few lines by return/mail and give me a chance if possible

If what I ask is not practicable give me your assistance in getting us somewhere

Your friend C. L. Jordan

Charles L. Jordan was born in Virginia (probably Lynchburg). He apparently came to Texas in the 1850's, settling first in Houston as a practicing attorney, and then eventually moving to Weatherford. 1 Early in 1858 Jordan and two others established the Frontier News which they continued to publish until December of the same year. On August 20, 1858 Jordan was elected by a vote of 39 to 4 as Weatherford's second mayor. On November 30, 1858, Jordan married Isabella Young at Pilot Point, Denton County. Jordan was also a member of the Weatherford I. O. C. F. Lodge, No. 77.2 The census of 1860 shows that Jordan was residing in Weatherford as an "attorney and counselor at law," His real estate was valued at \$13,000, and his personal estate at \$2,000. He was also the owner of three mulatto slaves. Jordan enrolled his company in Weatherford, Parker County, on October 1. The unit was mustaged into Confederate service "for the war" in San Antonio as Company K, Fifth Regiment Texas Mounted Volunteers on October 23, 1861. Company K took part in the battle of Valverde and the skirmist of Peralta.

An asterisk (\*) indicates a soldier who joined after the first muster rell of October 23, 1861 was drawn up. The annotations cover the period from first muster to the end of the New Mexico campaign.

The Lewis Family Cemetery is located in Nelson County, Kentucky, about 1½ mile south of Botland, on state highway 605, on a farm once owned by Thomas Lewis (1765-1839), later known as the Dickerson place, and in 1952 owned by a family named Piles. The cometery is north of the house, across a meadow in a thicket of trees, brush, and brambles, unfenced, abandoned to the destructive pleasure of hogs and cattle. 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
