Report of the commissioners to partition the real estate of William G. Helms, dec'd. The report is set aside on the

affidavit of W. S. Sugg, atty for the heirs of John Helms, Amanda Huffman, Martha Robertson, and Oscar Helms, that he was not notified of the time of the division of the estate ... and must dissent. Both papers filed May 1, 1855.

Report of commissioners to partition the estate of William G. Helms, submitted 15 May 1855: Lot one contains 640 acres; the headright of Wm ONeal; Lot two contains 160 acres.

On the basis of there being two children of Jacob H. at the time of the abslutative on this reposeotetions [?] Oscar would have 40 acres in the O Neal Survy from his brother 32 same suvy from his father 88 in the Themos Helms suvv. B. P. Ayres as admr of Jacob Helms opents [?] March 23-59 that a note on Wm Wadkins due said Helms had come to his hands, the note was due in July 55. [Note: The wording of the above notes has been checked by three persons for accuracy. We think that the handwriting has been correctly interpreted, but nowhere were we able to find a definition of (1) caroter, or (2) abslutative on this reposeotetions. We therefore consulted an attorney at law, and were advised that despite what the man wrote, the interpretation of the first phrase could only be "guardian ad litum," and the second phrase could only refer to an application for administration, as used here. Abstracted by Mildred Bagley Smith (Continued from Volume 17, Number 4)

The obituaries and death notices which have appeared in Footprints regularly since August 1969 were abstracted from newspapers on microfilm at Fleming Library, Serials Division, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas. Beginning with this issue the format will be altered slightly. The obituaries at this period are consistently found on page three of each issue, therefore, instead of documenting the issue, page, and column of the newspaper following each notice, the date of the newspaper will be found at the beginning of all notices of that date, with the page number only if found on a page other than the third page.

Many of the short notices are to be found in a column entitled "Secular Department." Although the editor seldom indicated the source of his information the varied items appearing under this heading were culled from more detailed news items which had appeared shortly prior to date of publication in other newspapers received by the editor on an exchange basis. Interested readers should attempt to locate extant newspapers of the period and locality of residence for a more detailed account. Should a copy of the paper carrying the original account have survived, it may be found in libraries far removed from the locale, rather than in the local area.

October 2, 1879

DANIEL DREW died suddenly in New York City at the age of eightytwo, Sept. 18. He was born in Putnam Co., New York, 1797.

October 9, 1879

Bryan, Sept. 27. - MISS LIZZIE CAVITT of Wheelock, died yesterday at Nashville, Tenn., where she had been taken by her uncle to have an aneurism on her head operated upon... Her remains will be brought back to Texas. (Sec. Dept)

Tribute of Respect, by McClellan Lodge No. 158, to J. E. MURRAY, Past Master, who died July 14, 1879. Signed: J. C. MORRIS, J. V. WATSON, W. J. BOWERS, Committee.

October 23, 1879

Letter to the Editor, from W. R. MAXWELL, Buena Vista, Texas, dated October 1879, states in part: "I announced a short time

ago the death of Sister MOTT, wife of Elder J. C. MOTT, and now Bro. Mott has himself passed to his reward. He died ... the 11th of this month."

October 30, 1879

"MRS. NANCY GARRETT departed this life on Friday, the 17th day of October 1879 at the residence of her husband, the Rev. HOSEA GARRETT, near Chappell Hill, Washington county, Texas, after a brief illness. She was a nee Banks, born in Elbert county, Georgia on the 9th day of March ... 1804. She first married Gen. THOS. D. WOOLDRIDGE, and after resideing some years in Alabama and Mississippi, removed with her husband to Texas, and settled in Burleson county, near Caldwell. Gen. Wooldridge died January 9, 1860, and Mrs. Wooldridge married the Rev. Hosea Garrett, July 9th, 1862, and removed with him to his residence near Chappell Hill. In early life she and Gen. Wooldridge were Methodists, but both united with the Baptist church at Caldwell, in 1858.... She born no children...." Signed: G.

November 6, 1879

Major General JOSEPH HOOKER, known during the war as "Fighting Joe," died suddenly in Garden City, La., on the last day of Oct. (Sec. Dept)

Hon. M. D. ECTOR one of the judges of the court of appeals, died in Tyler Wednesday, having just recovered from a severe attack of jaundice. His remains were carried to Marshall. (Sec. Dept)

"A boy named JOHN CASPER, while out hunting squirrels near Nacogdoches last week, was shot through the head and killed by the accidental discharge of his gun." (Sec. Dept)

November 13, 1879

ERNEST WOLCOTT ROBBINS, the son of Prof. J. A. ROBBINS, and grandson of our venerable brother, DR. HILLYER, died in Ledbetter on 19th October, 1879, of malarial fever ... in the 18th year of his age. Mentioned: surviving parents whose daughter also died a few months ago. Signed: C. C. C.

JOSEPH E. JOHNSON, a Denison policeman, was killed Friday night. (Sec. Dept.)

"A wreck occurred near Wortham on Tuesday night and about sixteen freight cars were ditched. JACK HARDY, the famous Texas racer, was killed in the wreck. - New Era." (Sec. Dept.)

"COL. JOHN S. THRASHER, an old and greatly esteemed citizen, died at his residence in this city ... yesterday.... - Galveston News." (Sec. Dept.)

November 13, 1879

"T. B. COLLINS, near Kosse, returned from town and found his wife lying on the floor dead, she having cut her throat with a butcher knife. She wrote a note stating that the cause was from long continued bad health, which was very painful, and preferred not to live any longer." (Sec. Dept.)

November 20, 1879

Memorial resolutions on the occasion of the death of MRS. B. H. DAVIS, "one of our members." [The organization not named, but Mrs. J. B. Hardwicke was an officer of the Woman's Benevolent Society of the Bryan Baptist Church.] Signed: Mrs. J. R. HARDWICKE, Mrs. R. J. SMITH, Mrs. H. C. RORINGTON, Mrs. J. G. ALLEN.

MRS. MARY CLABAUGH, wife of Eld. JOHN CLABAUGH, died at her residence in Leon County, Texas, on November 2, 1879. She was born in Bibb County, Alabama in 1833, and at an early age her father moved to Leon County, Texas. She professed religion at an early age and became a member of Concord Baptist Church. She leaves a husband and seven children. Signed: MARTIN HAGARD.

To the Memory of Rev. M. M. HAGARD. The subject of this sketch was born in Perry County, Alabama in 1841. His parents moved to Texas while he was a small boy, and while the society of Texas was, in a great measure, in an unsettled condition. He joined the Baptist church at age 13. "Martin was always a good boy.... He was for two years a student at Baylor University and was ordained and set apart to the full work of the gospel ministry by Tryon Church in Brazos Co., in 1874.... He leaves a wife and one child, a baby boy...." Signed: M. HAGARD

GEN. J. W. WHITFIELD, of Lavaca County, died recently. (Sec. Dept.)

A young North Carolinian, JOHN NEWLAND, from Lenoir County in that state, died in Waco on the 5th. (Sec. Dept.)

Tyler Courier: REV. J. W. ASHCRAFT, who lives four miles south of this city, died on Thursday night. (Sec. Dept.)

CAPT. JOHN CONNER, of Austin, is dead. He was quite an old man, and had lived in that city many years. (Sec. Dept.)

SENATOR LAMAR's mother, a venerable woman of seventy-seven years, died at her home in Vineville, Georgia, a few days ago. (Sec. Dept.)

November 27, 1879

MARY HINSON died November 15, 1879, at her residence near Mayfield, Milan County, Texas, age 51. She was a native of Perry County, Alabama.

WILLIAM BAILEY, from Greenville, S. C., was, the other day, shot and killed at Concho, by a gambler, R. W. STONE. (Sec. Dept.)

MR. NASH, of Dallas County, had his hand caught in a gin, and his whole arm drawn in and fearfully mangled. He died in a few hours. (Sec. Dept.)

December 11, 1879

Died, November 18, 1879, ANNIE, daughter of A. L. and G. R. PETIUS, near Weimar. She was born July 1, 1877. Signed: Pastor.

JONATHAN BURLESON of Bastrop is dead. He was an old Texan. He came here in 1843. (Sec. Dept.)

On South Bennet Creek, Hamilton County, recently, Citizen HURSTON, while hunting deer in the bru hes, was mistaken for a deer by another hunter, who shot him through the breast. HURSTON died instantly. (Sec. Dept.)

December 18, 1879

MISS HELLEN DAVIDSON died at Hearne, Texas, December 10, 1879, aged 24 years. She "united with the Baptist church during a meeting held in our town about two years ago, conducted by Maj. PENN. She was the daughter of JUDGE DAVIDSON."

MRS. P. HARRIS, consort of J. D. HARRIS, was born February 20, 1844, and departed this life November 8, 1879. She was baptized by the writer in 1867. Signed: R. F. HARRIS, Pastor.

MR. JAS. ERWIN, of Tennessee, while out bear hunting above Boerne, accidentally shot and killed himself. (Sec. Dept.)

DR. J. C. WATTS committed suicide in Flatonia last week.... (Sec. Dept.)

JUDGE J. D. GILMORE was shot and killed in Columbus last week. (Sec. Dept.)

MISS MATTIE THOMAS, daughter of Dr. R. B. THOMAS, of Flatonia, died recently in Waco, where she was a student at Waco University. (Sec. Dept.)

December 25, 1879

"MRS. ELIZA McLEILAND, wife of DR. J. B. McLELLAND, departed this life at their residence in Bryan, Texas, December 6th, 1879, in the 67th year of her age. Sister McLelland was a native of Chester district, South Carolina, and was the daughter of WILLIAM and SUSAN HEAD. She was married to Dr. McLEILAND July 1st 1832, and soon after, both made a profession of religion.... In 1833 they moved to Mississippi, where they spent useful and happy years, till in April 1869 they removed

to Bryan, Texas, where they have since resided.... She was buried in the family lot in the city cemetery. Signed: F. M. L., Bryan, Dec. 1879.

January 8, 1880

ANN ELIZABETH TROTTER, wife of M. F. TROTTER, and daughter of A. R. and M. F. GOOCH, died November 8, 1879. She "was born in Shelby Co., Alabama, Feb. 12, 1847. In her fourteenth year she joined the Baptist church at Grenada, Mississippi, while there in school. She afterward joined the Pleasant Grove church, Mississippi. Was married December 20th 1865. In 1872 she united with the Oakland Baptist church, Grimes Co., Texas... She leaves a husband, 3 [?] small children, father and mother, several brothers and a sister...." Signed: Her Pastor, JAS. M. CARROLL, Roan's Prairie, Grimes Co., Texas, 1879.

WILLIE CRANE, the only child of Mr. WM. CRANE and Mrs. LOU CRANE, died at Houston, Texas, on December 18, 1879, aged 6 years, 5 months and 20 days. Signed: P. F.

W. B. HALL, aged 50, formerly of Macon, Ga., dropped dead at the Waco poor house the other day. (Sec. Dept.)

H. D. HIGGINS, a prominent young lawyer of Bastrop County, died last week. (Sec. Dept.)

COL WADE HAMPTON, JR., died in Mississippi recently. He was the only son of GEN. WADE HAMPTON, of South Carolina. [The following notice appeared in the issue of August 28, 1879: "Mr. Wade Hampton, Jr., of Mississippi, and Miss Kate O. Phelan, of Memphis, were married in Louisville on the 12th ult."]

The Hamilton Herald reports that J. J. SCHUMAKER, an old gentleman residing on Cowhouse creek, in that county, committed suicide on Wednesday last by hanging. (Sec. Dept.)

JOHN W. ADAMS, recently a school teacher in Fayette and Williamson counties, was found dead in his bed at the McIntyre house, Brenham, on the 29th ult. It was a case of suicide. (Sec.Dept.)

At Burnet, New Years day, the boiler of the steam mill of JOHN SMARTE, at Lampasas, exploded. BRICE SMARTE was killed on the spot, and a young man named Blackburn and the engineer were fatally injured. (Sec. Dept.)

January 15, 1880

Died, at Independence, on the 4th of January, 1878, infant daughter of E. M. and A. E. FORMAN, aged 9 days.

January 22, 1880

"The subject of this memoir, MRS. ELIZABETH DAWSON, wife of D. D. DAWSON, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. JOHN CHAPMAN, and

was born October 13th, 1837, in Clarke County, Ala., where she remained until Feb. 1876, when she removed to Brazos County, Texas, where she died Dec. 12th, 1879. Sister Dawson became a member of the Baptist church early in the fall of 1858... The writer has been intimately acquainted with her family since his boyhood..." Husband and children mentioned as surviving.

"Alabama Baptist and Clarke Co. Democrat please copy." Signed: P.

January 29, 1880

Died, at the residence of A. S. WIRTZ, in Columbus on the 13th of January, 1880, MRS. MATTIE V. P. WIRTZ, consort of Mr. LEWIS M. WIRTZ, and daughter of Mrs. E. M. NEIL. She was born August 18, 1858. Was baptized into the Baptist Church at Martindale in August, 1873, and was married to Mr. Lewis Wirtz May 13, 1879.

MRS. SUSAN CAMERON died Jan. 20, 1880, aged nearly sixty-eight years. She was born in Kentucky in 1812, and was married to BRO. D. R. CAMERON, now of Dallas county, in 1829. She had been a church member for thirty years, and has raised a large family. Bro. Cameron is himself seventy-four years of age. Signed: J. B. L.

S. P. HOLLINGSWORTH died at Thorp Springs, Hood County, Texas, 9 December 1879 in the 66th year of his age. "He was a native of Habersham county, Georgia, but was partly raised in Texas, whither his father removed. When about 20 years of age he went to Alabama. In 1835 made a profession of religion and joined the Baptist church in Jacksonville. He first came to Texas in 1837, and in 1845 was married to MISS ELSTON in Calhoun County, Alabama, after which he settled permanently in Texas...." He leaves a wife, two daughters, and a son. Signed: F. M. LAW.

"Our little WILLIE EMMA, age 1 year and 1 month, took leave of us this night at about 12 o'clock... Our family, of five children, hitherto unbroken, has at last a representative in Heaven..." Signed: W. H. LOGGINS, Courtney, Jan. 20, 1880.

WILLIAM MERSIFIELD, an old settler, died last week, seven miles east of Dallas. (Sec. Dept.)

MRS. NANCY BERRYMAN, one of the early settlers of Grimes County, died at her home near Anderson last Wednesday morning of typhoid pneumonia, aged about 67 years. (Sec. Dept.)

February 5, 1880

Deacon J. C. BRUTON departed this life at Harwood, Gonzales County, Texas, 26 November 1879. He was born in Franklin County, Alabama, 16 May 1824. Moved to Tippe [Tippah] County, Mississippi, in 1846. He united with the Baptist church at age 14, and at the time of his death was superintendent of the Sabbath School. Signed: A. S. BUNTING, Pastor.

News from the Library

The really outstanding news from the library is that we are surviving, cut back as we are. In fact, after having had a bit of vacation, both Paul Campbell and I are almost back to normal, and have quit biting patrons.

Because of our staff cuts, we have had to cut back on services. Genealogists will probably be most affected by our having to use a form letter in reply to requests for written information (our service policy—no research for anyone, but quick checks whenever possible—remains the same) and by our having to give up doing programs for community organizations.

We are back to being open for the full library schedule, 9-9 Monday-Friday, 9-6 Saturday, and 2-6 Sundays. Because of lack of staff (although we are fortunate to have occasional help from Miss Beatrice Grant, the Central Building Floater), professional help is not always available. This is particularly true during some lunch and supper hours, and on Sundays. The Library Clerks are not permitted to answer reference questions, although they can help in finding material on the shelves, retrieving material from closed areas, use of microfilm readers, and making copies. We hope that you'll be patient with our clerks and we especially recommend that, if you need reference or advisory service, you check before coming on Sunday.

A big Thank You to all members of the Society who rallied round during our recent problems with City Hall. The Library Board effected a compromise which left the branch librarians at their former grade but permitted those of us in the Central Building to be downgraded. Although we came out losers this time, there is always next time; your support really helps.

Last month we received a book of a type which usually does not impress me: Pedigrees of Some of the Emperor Charlemagne's Descendants, Volume II, published by the Order of the Crown of Charlemagne in the United States of America. Since no documentation is provided for the lineages, I do not find the body of the book of great use, but the foreword, written by Timothy Field Beard, Genealogist General of the Order and Librarian of the New York Public Library, is the best bibliographical essay on American Genealogy I have ever read, and should be carefully studied by every serious genealogist.

REV. J. B. JETER, D.D., of Richmond, Virginia, died on the 18th inst. Dr. Jeter, born in Bedford County, Virginia, died at age 78. [A long list of his writings is cited.] (Page 2)

MRS. ELIZABETH KEARSE, wife of Mr. G. H. KEARSE, died near Huntsville, Texas 8 February 1880, aged fifty-six years. "Sister Kearse was born in 1824, in Barnwell District, South Carolina, and in early life, with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. DANIEL LIGHTSEY, moved to Perry county, Alabama, where in 1841 she ... was baptized into the fellowship of Union Baptist Church. The same year was married to her now bereaved husband, G. H. Kearse, and with him moved to Texas in 1859, and by letter connected herself with the Ebenezer Baptist Church, of Walker county, where until her death she lived a consistent member.... Only a few hours before her departure she said to her truly devoted daughter, Amanda, 'I'm almost home.' And though the weather was unpleasant the following day, quite a congregation of relatives and friends assembled at the church, where, according to her request, religious exercises were held, conducted by the writer. After a short sermon ... she was carried a short distance to the grave." Signed: G. M. DANIEL

"MR. JOSEPH H. SMITH was born March 22nd, 1840, in Alabama. During the late war he ... united with the Baptist church. W. F. LANCASTER, messenger for the Southern Express Company, on the East Tennessee route, committed suicide on the 24th inst., at Bristol, by shooting himself through the head. The cause is as yet unknown. (Sec. Dept)

MISS FANNIE L. LINDSEY, only daughter of DR. I. A. and ALMEDA LINDSEY, died at her residence in Lancaster, Texas, 16 February 1880, aged 21 years, 4 months, and 6 days. "Fannie was born in Bolivar, Polk County, Missouri, October 10th 1858. Moved to Texas with her parents in the fall of 1866, and settled in Lancaster in 1867. She ... was baptized into the fellowship of the Lancaster Baptist Church by Eld. JOSIAH LEAKE, on the 25th of August, 1878, together with 22 others."

"Alice Stella Evans, daughter of JAMES C. and ELIZABETH M. BOGGS, was born at Leona, Leon County, Texas, on the 11th day of October 1849--professed religion and united with the Baptist church in 1863, and was married to J. A. EVANS [in] Dec. 1868, and died ... at the residence of her mother, E. M. CURTIS, in Leon County, Wednesday, February 11, 1880, aged 30 years and 4 months..."

Last Sunday while asleep in his chair, Hon. W. H. HAYS, Judge of the Sixth United States District Court, Kentucky, died suddenly of heart disease. (Sec. Dept)

March 25, 1880

Biographical sketch of Rev. FRANCIS WAYLAND CARROLL, prepared by a committee appointed March 6 by Independence Baptist Church, who were: Brethren G. W. CAPPS, HARRY HAYNES, and WM. CAREY CRANE, pastor of the church.

FRANCIS WAYLAND CARROLL died March 6. "He was born in Carroll county, Mississippi, July 3, 1847, and came with his father, Elder B. CARROLL, to Texas in 1859.... He was baptized

by Elder T. S. ALLEN and united with the Caldwell church in 1867. He was married by Elder B. H. CARROLL to MISS S. J. WOMBLE, August 12, 1869. In the winter of 1874 he moved to Yellow Prairie, Burleson County, and united with Yellow Prairie Church. In March following he was ordained deacon of said church. In May of the same year he was licensed to preach, and in November following was ordained to the full work of the ministry, the presbytery consisting of Elders G. W. CAPPS, JAMES M. CARROLL, and J. W. McCULLOUGH. Shortly afterwards he was called to the pastorate of one of the best churches in the Little River Association, which he served ... for two years. CAPT. J. W. PICKENS, a Waco lawyer, died recently while on a visit to Corinth, Miss. (Sec. Dept)

"The announcement of the death of the venerable mother of the late MRS. HOOD [wife of Gen. John B. Hood] will fall with sorrowful weight upon many loving and pitying hearts in Texas. MRS. HENNEN was sixty-two years of age and clung with a mother's loving tenacity to her tender charge, the care of the helpless orphans of the dead hero. DR. J. H. MATHEWSON, originally from Tarboro, N. C., died recently at his home in Bastrop County, of neuralgia of the heart. (Sec. Dept)

A respected farmer of Eastland County, named W. N. NOEL, accidentally shot and killed himself near Fort Worth late Saturday night. (Sec. Dept)

The little child of Mr. J. J. GILLESPIE, county surveyor of Harris County, was bitten last Saturday night by a tarantula and died Sunday morning. (Sec. Dept)

COL. A. H. MANGUIN gave his five year old child a dose of morphine at Yazoo City, Miss., mistaking for quinine. The child died in a few hours. (Sec. Dept)

MRS. LUCRETIA A. HINES, wife of DR. ROBT. B. HINES, and daughter of J. W. D. and FRANCIS A. CREATH, died in Lampasas County, Dec. 4th, 1879, aged 25 years, 1 month, and 6 days. "Her father came from Virginia to Texas as a missionary in 1846, and while living with his family in Huntsville, Texas, the subject of this notice was born October 28th 1854 [as written]. She was educated at Baylor Female College, Independence, and was baptized by her father into the fellowship of the church at Brenham in 1870.... She was married to DR. HINES by Elder W. C. CRANE in 1871.... She left three little boys in the care of a bereaved husband, but the Lord whom she served took the youngest to heaven and to his mother in seven days after her death..." Signed: M. News from the Library

We have a lot of thank yous to say in this issue: first, to Lucille Miller and Doris Dobbins, who gave up hair appointments to help us get the exchanges into shape; second, to Mattie Blaine, who is helping with the bibliography for the workshop; and third, to those who contributed to the binder fund. With the thirty dollars recently contributed, and the remainder of the "slush" fund which the Society gave me several years ago, we were able to purchase 100 binders at 58¢ each, a very good price.

Several donors of material are due thanks also. Through the Society we received gifts from Don E. Ransom, Jr. (Three Ransom books on microfilm); Mr. and Mrs. Tom Murphy (Several mauvedecade annuals from LBJ's alma mater); Logan D. Wilson (No Beginning -- No End; My Family History); and Charles S. McClesky (Descendants of Thomas Trammell, Revolutionary Soldier). J. A. Doggett, of Greensboro, North Carolina, has donated a copy of The Lambert, Lambeth Family of North Carolina, by Mary Norton Doggett. Arthur Hart gave us his 1974 issues of Footprints, a most fortunate gift, since when we went to bind ours, all but the May issue had been taken. Mrs. Cy Martin, who is doing research on the history of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, gave us The Episcopal Church in Northern Texas. Last, but not least, Jean Park Hazlewood has given another of her indexes to the 1880 Texas census, this time for Franklin County. May they all receive stars in their crowns.

The annual skull-busting preparation of budget requests has just been finished; some statistics which came to light during that period may be of interest to our readers. First, although we have shown only a slight (about 5%) drop in the number of registered users, reference assists are down 32.5%, which is so close to 1/3 that it seems graphic proof that the two of us don't stretch as far as our previous staff of three. The average price of the books which we purchase for your use has risen during the last year from \$10.11 a volume to \$13.72, a staggering 35%. Microfilm has gone from \$6, \$7 or \$8 a roll (National Archives) to \$12; newspaper microfilm to \$15 a roll. This represents a doubling of costs. Needless to say, we have had no corresponding increases in our material allotments.

A penciled paper captioned "Description of Land" refers to 200 acres of the Wm Norris Survey, beginning at the N W corner of said Norris 220 acre survey [boundaries described], and on the reverse side, also in pencil, is the following chart:

Torrey and Lewis G. Tinsley. Another paper recorded shows that Rebecca Norris (at some point—the date not recorded) relinquished all her right to administrate on the estate of "my deceased husband W. Norris." The relinquishment was witnessed by Kesiah Cox.]

We missed a volume of <u>Valley Leaves</u> between the time they stopped exchanging and our getting a subscription okayed. Can anyone donate Volume 8, so that we will have a complete set?

Probably the most significant addition to the Genealogy collection this year is Marion J. Kaminkow's United States Local Histories in the Library of Congress: A Bibliography. there is a copy of a local history that you are interested in at the Library and if the book is no longer in copyright, this means you will be able to obtain a microfilm copy of that book. Since the Library of Congress's collection is probably the most inclusive in the country, this bibliography becomes the first place to look to see if a local history is available on any The work is in four volumes: I. Atlantic place of interest. States, Maine to New York; II. Atlantic States, New Jersey to Florida; III. The Middle West, which also includes the Southern States as far west as Texas; and IV. The West, which includes Oklahoma and all states North and West. The call number for the set is GEN 016.9291 K.

We are making progress in collecting census indexes. The 1830 Kentucky is now complete, and the third volume of Sistler's index to Tennessee 1850 is here, covering names through Jonas.

The following three Bibles are very lovely old books, the kind you like to find for your family. They are presently in the possession of Mrs. Frank Bennett, 4074 Hampshire Blvd., Ft. Worth, Texas. They are full of obituaries, newspaper clippings, scraps of dress material and many other helpful tidbits. There was also a family genealogy written in 1834 on the Morgan Bryan-Boone Family with an addition added in 1915.

The Bryan Bible is a large leather $8-1/2 \times 11-1/2$ book printed in 1839 in Philadelphia by Thomas, Cowperthwait and Co.

COMPTROLLERS PLAT BOOK OF TEXAS 1850-1874

An old plat book of Texas towns, found in the Archives Division of the Texas State Library, has been reproduced and placed in the Fort Worth Public Library as a Memorial to Betty Coburn Winchester, late Editor of Footprints.

The office of Comptroller of Public Accounts, as a state office, was first created by the Constitution of 1845 and superceded a similar office established during the Republic of Texas in 1837. Among the duties of the office are to keep the general accounts of the state, collect the taxes, supervise the county tax assessor-collectors and audit their accounts, audit the state treasury, and serve as ex officio member of several state boards. [Handbook of Texas, Vol. 1, p. 389]

Under the constitution of the Republic of Texas, an assessor of taxes was simply hired by the county board and the sheriff served as collector, but the Constitution of 1845 set up a separate, elective office of assessor and collector which was retained by the Constitutions of 1861 and 1866. Under the Constitution of 1869, the functions were separated, with the justices of the peace serving as assessors and the sheriffs, as collectors. In 1875, however, a separate office of assessor and collector was again established. [Handbook of Texas, Vol. 2, p. 713]

The Constitution of 1845 provided that taxation should be equal and uniform throughout the state and that the legislature had the power to levy an income tax and to tax occupations other than mechanical and agricultural. The main levy was the general property tax, called then, as now, the ad valorem tax. The most productive of the occupational taxes were those on liquor, various mercantile businesses, and the professions. [Handbook of Texas, Vol. 2, p. 710]

For tax purposes, plats of the towns were needed by the Comptroller's office. It was the responsibility of the tax assessor and collector of the various counties to see that such plats were forwarded to Austin.

Towns were located in various ways, because of some attraction to a certain area by settlers, because of a railroad, a crossroads, or some other commercial endeavor such as a mill or a trading post. Sometimes an individual would start a town if he thought that there was sufficient interest in an area. In the case of newly created counties, the land for the county seat town was often donated by one or more individuals, as an inducement to bring business. In any case, towns had to be surveyed and platted. The town's area was divided into streets and numbered blocks, and the blocks were divided into numbered lots. Then a sale of town lots was held, usually at public auction. Deeds pertaining to ownership of property in a town will mention the block number and lot number and perhaps the name of the street on which the property was located. With this information, and with a plat of the town, one may locate where a man lived or had a business in the town.

We are indebted to newspaper man Sam Kinch for first calling our attention to the old plat book in Austin. The Fort Worth Star Telegram's evening edition, October 21, 1965 (Sec. 1, p. 6), contained an article entitled "Early Map Found - County Paid \$2 To State in 1851," by Sam Kinch. The early map, referred to, was a plat of Birdsville, first county seat of Tarrant

County. Some of the historical facts and conclusions in the article were not quite correct, but mention was made that the town's plat had been found in a yellowing book that had similar information about towns of other Texas counties. At that time (1965), the old book was in the office of the Comptroller, in Austin, but that office was planning to give it to the Texas State Library.

In October, 1973, Mrs. I. Neal Samuels and Mrs. Leonard Ingalls showed the newspaper article to Mrs. Marilyn von Kohl at the Archives Division. If the book had been presented to the archives, it was not catalogued. It was finally located and catalogued "Comptroller's Plat Book, 1850-1874," since these are the years of the earliest and latest plats.

The book is quite large and in very bad condition. Some of the pages may have been lost. In the front, an incomplete index indicates that the book contains plats of towns from about forty-five counties. Actually, there are sixty-eight plats, representing some fifty counties, most of which are undated, but the majority of them are probably of the 1850's vintage. Some of the plats are worn and torn. Some are so darkened with age that reproduction is very poor. Mrs. Ingalls photographed each page of the book. Later, through the courtesy of Mr. John M. Kinney, Director of the Archives Division, Texas State Library, the Fort Worth Genealogical Society was able to have the entire book photocopied. The society purchased the positive copies and the archives kept the negative copies. The positive copies, together with other information, have been bound in a large blue book and placed in the Fort Worth Public Library. The blue book contains an index with comments on the condition of the originals of the various plats.

A volunteer group of FWGS members has traced all of the plats on white vellum. With this issue of <u>Footprints</u>, we begin the publication of a selected series of the plats, photographically reduced from the tracings.

BIRDVILLE

Before its creation Tarrant County was a part of Voting Precinct 9 of Navarro County. Elections were held at Johnson's Station which was the only settlement that had a name at that time (1848-1849).

Fort Worth was established in May, 1849. A few months later the Texas Legislature passed an act (signed into law on 20 December 1849) creating Tarrant County. The act stipulated that an election for county officers was to be held on the first Monday in August, 1850, that the county seat would be located within five miles of the center of the county, that the location would be chosen by the electorate, and that the said location would bear the name of Birdsville. Presumably, the name was in honor of Major Jonathan Bird who had established Bird's Fort in 1841 on what was later called Calloway's Lake, some nine or ten miles to the east of the later site of Birdsville.

The election for county officials was held on 5 August 1850. Those elected were: Seaborn Gilmore (Chief Justice), Archibald F. Leonard (County Clerk), Henry Suggs (County Treasurer), Sanders Elliot (District Clerk), Francis Jourdan (Sheriff), Vincent J. Hutton (Assessor & Collector), and Isaac Thomas

(Coroner). Hutton resigned in December, 1850, and the county court appointed John A. Hust to take his place.

There were three voting precincts. Their elected officials were: Justices of the Peace George Akers and John W. Ellison (Pct. 1), B. P. Ayers and [James W.] Lane (Pct. 2), and Walling Rogers and Robert Smith (Pct. 3). Constables were John B. York (Pct. 1), John Goodwin (Pct. 2), and Berry Hall (Pct. 3).

The organization of the county seems to have been less of a problem than the locating of the county seat. The 1849 act creating the county had stipulated that Vincent J. Hutton, Walling R. Rogers, [Edmund or William] Little, M. T. Johnson, and Sanders Elliot, or a majority of them, were appointed commissioners to lay off the site chosen into blocks and lots, and to proceed to sell the lots at auction, the income from the sales to be used for the erection of public buildings.

A month after the election of county officials, the Texas Legislature passed an act (approved 4 September 1850) "defining the time for holding an election for the county seat of Tarrant County . . ." The election was to be held on the first Monday in August 1851. Until that time the county courts were to be held at the house of E. M. Daggett in the vicinity of Fort Worth. The date set, almost a year away, was not to the liking of the settlers already established in the northeastern part of the county. In November, 1850, they petitioned the legislature, stating that the date was "too remote a day" and asking that a law be passed "bringing on said election as early a day as possible." No action was taken in response to the petition; the election was held in August, 1851.

The location of Bird's Fort was not near the center of the county, nor was the settlement around Johnson's Station, thus they could not be considered. William Norris and George Akers offered to donate forty acres, each, from their respective adjoining surveys, for the county seat, their land being within five miles of the center. It is entirely conceivable and probable that Fort Worth, from the very beginning, had its eye on the county seat. It was also near the center and, from the beginning, influential people favored the area. But, at that early date (1850), Fort Worth had borne its name hardly over a year, was still a military post, and the creation act had stipulated that the new county seat would be named Birds-ville.

Exactly what locations (if any), other than the Norris-Akers site and possibly Fort Worth, were put into nomination or voted upon is unknown, or unproven. At any rate, the Norris-Akers donation received the majority of votes and was, according to law, named Birdsville. Thus, the only thing that the new county seat had in common with Bird's Fort was a name.

On 1 December 1851, John A. Hust, the assessor and collector, sent to the comptroller's office, in Austin, a plat of the newly-laid-out town of Birdsville. Beside the plat, he wrote:

Sir, I here send you a map of the town of Birdsville in Tarrant County as the law requirs me so to do. I have only \$2 of State revenew on hand at this time. I have not received the opinion of the Aturney General that you promised to send me on the case of the Setlers at fort Worth. I am in vary Bad helth at this time. Vary Respectfly Yours, John A. Hust, ass^r & $coll^r$

The plat of Birdsville shows twelve blocks, each divided into eight lots. Thus, there were 96 lots in the original town. The north-south streets were named Johnson, Rogers, Main, Hutton, and Elliot. Main Street, now called Carson, lay on the dividing line between the Norris and Akers surveys. Elliot Street is now called Bewley. A small portion of Rogers Street still bears that name. The extant portion of Hutton Street is now incorrectly called "Hutto" on the Haltom-Richland area maps. Johnson Street has been taken in by the school system of the area.

The east-west streets were Edwards, Broadway, Akers, and Walker which was inadvertently unnamed on the plat. A short portion of Edwards still exists, also a portion of Walker, but Akers Street (which was nearest to present Highway 183) is no more, having been taken in by church and school lands. Broadway was the main thoroughfare which passed through the town from the east, going west to intersect the road coming south from Alton, in Denton County, and into Fort Worth via Cold Springs. With the exception of Broadway and Main, the streets of Birdsville were named for early county officials.

The Birdville Baptist Church stands on Block 11 and has a historical marker in front, facing Carson (then Main) Street. The north half of Block 7, the Public Square on the plat, is now occupied by the Church of Christ. The Birdville Coliseum occupies Block 8; in front, facing Broadway Street, is a historical marker indicating the site of Tarrant County's first court house. The correct site was more likely on Block 7, the Public Square, not on the block where the marker is located. One statement in the Texas Writers Project at the Fort Worth Public Library tends to support this, stating that "the foundation for the court house was dug in the block bordered by Walker, Carson [then Main], and Broadway Streets," thus positively indicating Block 7 on the plat.


Legal wheels turn slowly. Not until 1854 were town lots offered for sale. The Texas Legislature passed another act (approved 10 February 1854) "to change Section 5 of the [1849] act creating Tarrant County." The 1854 act stipulated that the county court was to have control of the sale of town lots and that all documents pertaining thereto would be delivered-up "within sixty days after the passage of this act." In reality, it seems, Birds-ville had only a couple of years of active service as the county seat, for on 26 August 1856 another legislative act ordered that an election be held on the first Tuesday in November to locate the county seat. In this hotly-contested election, Fort Worth was (probably fraudulently) elected as the county seat, and several years of litigation ensued.

By 1860, the tax list of the county showed twenty-one persons owning one or more lots in the town of Birdsville, and forty-two owners of one or more lots in the town of Fort Worth.

Plat of Birdsville



DALLAS

In 1841 John Neely Bryan settled on a trail-crossing of the Trinity River, pitching his tent near what his plat later showed to be Main Street of Dallas and the waterfront on the east side of the river. Not long after, the family of John Beeman also settled nearby. In 1843 John Neely Bryan married Margaret Beeman, and their one-room log cabin is said to have been the first dwelling in Dallas.

Jonathan Blair Billingsley, whose family contingent passed through the village in 1844, on their way to settle in what later became Ellis County, noted in his journal, "We soon reached the place we had heard of so often, but the town, where was it? Two small log cabins -- this was the town of Dallas, and two families of ten or twelve souls was its population."

In 1845 the western-most Republic of Texas postal route ran from Franklin, via Alta Springs, Parker's Point, Melton's, and Chambers' Creek to Dallas. Another route ran from Dallas to Bonham, via McGarrah's. In 1849, when Fort Worth was established, Dallas was still the nearest post office.

The first legislature of the new state of Texas created Dallas County on 30 March 1846, from parts of Robertson (that part west of the main Trinity) and Nacogdoches (that part east of the main river) counties and designated Dallas as the temporary seat of justice. Two elections were held in 1850 to fix the permanent county seat. Dallas won over Hord's Ridge (Oak Cliff) and Cedar Springs. In 1851 the Dallas Herald reported an urban population of 163, including 37 negroes. By 1871 the one-half mile square town had expanded to one and one-half miles square and Dallas was incorporated as a city.

The original of the plat of Dallas (shown here) is in such poor condition that reproduction is very bad. A negative copy is more legible than a positive copy. The plat was likely drawn around 1850 and may have been compiled by Felix G. Eakins who is shown on the 1850 census as a surveyor.

Among those living in the Dallas area in 1850 were: John Beeman, James M. Patterson (merchant), Thomas Crutchfield (inn keeper), John J. Eakins (lawyer), Felix G. Eakins (surveyor), J. W. Latimer (editor and lawyer), Lucy Latimer (school teacher), John N. Bryan (lawyer, worth \$10,000.), Adam C. Haught (ferryman), Heustice Brooks (printer), John C. McCoy [who was also a lawyer], Perry Dakan (physician), Nat Burford (lawyer), John W. Smith (merchant), James B. Bryan (dentist), Anton Kuhn (blacksmith), and John Scurlock (chairmaker). The town had more than the usual number of lawyers and was the seedbed from which sprang much discontent and litigation with Peters Colony agents.



Plat of Dallas



WACO VILLAGE

The county of McLennan was created by an act of the Texas Legislature approved 22 January 1850. Organized in August, with Waco Village as the county seat, the county was not enumerated (as a separate county) on the 1850 census. Its residents will be found within the enumerations of the counties of Milam (on the west side of the Brazos River) and Limestone (on the east side of the river).

McLennan county was originally occupied by the Waco Indians, whose principal village was located near Waco Springs, site of present Waco. As early as 1837, a ranger company established a temporary camp called Fort Fisher. By 1840, surveyors, including George Barnard Erath, had begun surveying in the area.

In the Spring of 1843 the Torrey brothers, Indian traders, established a trading post on Tehuacana Creek (east of the Brazos River), with George Barnard in charge. Leonard H. Williams was the Indian Agent at Tehuacana. Jesse Sutton was hired as a blacksmith for the Indians. He established a residence within the present east Waco area, in late 1845 or early 1846. By 1850 he was enumerated on the 1850 census of Navarro County and, by 1854, was serving as a smithy on the Brazos Indian Reserve, in present Young County. In 1845 Neil McLennan settled a few miles from present Waco. About 1849 Shapley P. Ross opened a ferry across the Brazos, between Waco Village and Sutton's. In 1849, George B. Erath laid off the embryo of what became Waco Village, probably the Ferry Block, the River Block, and perhaps Block Number One, dividing them into numbered lots. The earliest settlers chose "Lamartine" as the name of the new town, but Erath persuaded them to call it "Waco Village." The location was chosen, in 1850, for the county seat of McLennan County, Waco Village later being shortened to Waco.


Waco Village, the county seat, was surveyed, on the west side of the Brazos, about 1851, possibly by George B. Erath. The east-west streets ran in a southeasterly direction from the river and were named Columbus, Washington, Main, Franklin, and Mary Streets. Main Street ran from the spring, near the river, to the Public Square, then took-up again on the other side of the square. The north-south streets were River Avenue, Front, Second, Third, Fourth, and Prairie Streets. Southeast of the spring was the Ferry Block, and below that the River Block. On the north side of the square, a half-block was numbered "3." Another half-block, on the south side of the square, was numbered "A." Block numbers were 1 through 22. The Public Square was between Second and Third Streets, below Washington and above Franklin Streets, and was intersected on each side by Main Street. The lots of half-block "A" were numbered 1 through 7, and those of half-block "3" from 8 through 14. Upon these half-blocks were probably located the chief businesses of the town.

PRESTON

The site of Preston, on the Red River in Grayson County, is now covered by Lake Texoma. It was one of the gateways to Texas for settlers coming from the northeast. Many Peters Colonists entered Texas by crossing Red River at Preston Bend and stopping first at the minute village in the bend. The town had its beginnings with the establishment of one of Holland Coffee's trading houses on Red River in 1837, and later became the site of Coffee's historic two-story mansion, Glen Eden.

In 1840 Colonel William G. Cooke and a company of men were assigned to lay out that portion of the Military Road from the Brazos to Red River. From Waco Village they went northeast, crossing the Trinity at Porter's Bluff (in later Navarro County) and angling slightly northwest towards Red River. They established a post known as Fort Johnson and a supply base called Fort Preston. Some writers have given the impression that this road was a thoroughfare in the early 1840's, but it was little more than an often difficult-to-find trail. Though the Republic of Texas Congress appropriated \$25,000 in paper money for the construction of the road, the project failed. It was not until around 1850, after the creation and organization of the various counties on the western fringe, above the Brazos, that the road became a main road of travel.



Sir, In compliance with your Instructions of Dec 24th 1850 I have sent you the plat of Sherman & I now send you the plat of Preston all that Is in my Co. & as you requested that I would render to you the amounts rec'd on the non resident assesment of 1846 & 1847, I here inform you that there has not been any Collections made . . . I now Close . . ."

June 3, 1880

The only son of E. B. McGowan, of Brenham, was drowned near that city in a water hole a few days ago. (Sec. Dep't)

FRANCIS FLEMING, an old citizen of the Birdsdale neighborhood, died last Saturday and was buried the day following. -- Belton Courier. (Sec. Dep't.)

During a storm in San Saba Co., R. M. ROUNTREE and his family took refuge in a cave near his house. Two of his little boys were drowned in the cave. (Sec. Dep't)

Lampasas, May 28. -- The stage from Georgetown to Lampasas last night about 12 o'clock, while crossing Rocky Creek, about ten miles from here, washed down stream and the driver was drowned. His name was SWAB. (Sec. Dep't)

June 10, 1880

"Died - At the residence of her brother-in-law and sister, E. L. CARSON, in Montgomery, Texas, on the 20th of May 1880 ... in the 47th year of her age, MRS. SMITHIA K. ROGERS. Mrs. Rogers was a native of North Carolina. She made a profession of religion in Texas in 1862 and was baptized by Eld. JONAS JOHNSTON into Bethel Baptist Church near Montgomery...."

"Died - On the 15th of May, Mrs. SUSAN LIVELY, aged 79 years, 5 months and 8 days. She was born in Amherst County, Va., on the 7th day of December, 1800. Moved to Tennessee at an early day, stayed there only a few years, when she removed to Texas (about the year 1839) where she resided till her death. She was a descendant of a noble family, the YOUNGS of Virginia, her father being among the early Baptist ministers who were imprisoned for preaching the gospel of Christ...."

HARDY PACE, a citizen of Texas since 1828, died recently in Jasper County, aged 73 years. (Sec. Dep't)

Ex-Lieutenant Governor DAVID C. DICKSON died suddently from heart disease at his home in Anderson, Grimes County, on the 4th inst. (Sec. Dep't)

A son of Gov. COKE, about 22 years of age, died in Waco last week. (Sec. Dep't)

A storm passed over Paris late Saturday night doing considerable damage to fencing. The lightning struck and killed a young man named WILLIAM RHENDASIT [? - film scratched], five miles from Paris and badly injured a man named PRESTON, also slightly wounding another young man named PRESTON. The two Preston's are recently from Alabama. (Sec. Dep't)

June 17, 1880

MR. SAM ALLEN died at Marlin last Monday of erysipelas brought on by a tick bite. (Sec. Dep't)

A child of RUDOLPH PIEHL, living near Brenham, was recently scal[d]ed to death by the accidental pouring of hot coffee upon it. (Sec. Dep't)

The little son of MR. THOMAS WILSON, living near Corsicana, shot and killed himself by the careless handling of a pistol last Monday. (Sec. Dep't)

E. R. MORRIS, county judge of Baylor County, was shot and instantly killed on the 10th inst., while presiding in his court, by W. A. TAYLOR, a saloon keeper, who, after committing the murder, rode leisurely out of the town. (Sec. Dep't)

Memphis, June 13. -- Ex-Gov. ALBERT G. BROWN, of Mississippi, was thrown from his horse in a pond near his home last evening, and drowned. Deceased resided near Jackson, Miss., and was 67 years old.... (Sec. Dep't)

June 24, 1880

"Bro. JESSE WOMACK was a native of Pulaski county, Georgia, born Nov. 27, 1813. Married to MARTHA EMANUEL of Decatur county, June 10th, 1836. Moved to Louisiana in 1840, to Bee County, Texas in 1862 and thence to Fayette in 1863, to Travis 1870, where he spent the remainder of his days.... He was baptized by the writer second Lord's day Sept. 1875. Ordained deacon of Walnut Creek Baptist church, of which he was a member, second Lord's day in July 1876.... He fell asleep in Christ on the night of the 27 of May, in his 67th year.... He leaves an aged and devoted wife, three sons, and six daughters...."

S/ THOS. H. BACON. Merrelltown, May 29th, 1880. [Resolutions follow the biographical data. They were signed by W. S. THOMPSON, WM. McCOWN, and O. G. JONES, Committee of Merrilltown Baptist Church.]

To the Memory of Dr. H. W. Harrington. "Dr. H. W. HARRINGTON is no more. On the night of the 22d of March, 1880, as he was going on a mission of mercy to alleviate the sufferings of an afflicted woman, his life was taken from him by the hand of a dark, cruel, blood-thirsty assassin.... Dr. Harrington was a

native Texan, born Nov. 27th, A.D., 1847. At an early age, before sixteen summers had scarcely bloomed upon his youthful head, when the tocsin of war sounded its alarm over the hills and vales of our Sunny South; he enlisted as a soldier under her banners following the leadership of that world-renowned and famous chieftain, General FORREST.... After the struggle was over he returned to his father's home in Cherokee County; and his opportunity for obtaining an education having been precluded by the war, at once entered Waco University After his return from Waco, he entered upon the study of medicine, graduated in this department of science at the University of Louisiana; when he married MISS LEONE CAMPBELL.... "Died - June 14th, 1880, MRS. MARY S. BUTLER, wife of DR. J. F. BUTLER of Collin County, Texas. The deceased was born in McMinn County, Tenn., and was baptized by Eld. JANEWAY, was a member of Bethel Church, Collin Co., and a useful, consistent Christian." S/ E. S. H.

Tribute of Respect to W. R. RAGSDALE, a deceased member of Flatonia Lodge, No. 436, Accepted Free and Ancient Masons, who died suddenly. It is mentioned that he was "a good Mason, citizen, husband and father." S/ L. J. LANE, T. R. FOSTER, and J. F. SULLIVAN, Committee. Dated June 24, 1880.

Brenham, June 28. -- DANIEL McINTYRE, who was city attorney last year, died of consumption last night, and was buried this afternoon... (Sec. Dep't)

July 15, 1880

"Died - Near Fairfield, Freestone County, Texas, June 18th, 1880, Little SUDIE WILLIAMS, daughter of Rev. J. D. WILLIAMS and E. C. WILLIAMS. She was a promising child of five years, and the only daughter.... She has left a bereaved father and mother and four brothers...." S/ SALLIE WOOD.

"Died - Near Hallettsville, July 4th, 1880, little FANNIE EIDSON, aged 8 years, 4 months and 5 days. Her widowed mother mourns the loss of her youngest child...."

DR. JOSEPHTHAL, the oculist, died at Waxahachie July 14th. (Sec. Dep't; July 22, 1880)

July 22, 1880

MR. NEAL, postmaster at Agnes, Parker county, was bitten on the hand by a large snake about a week ago. After a week of terrible suffering, he expired. His case baffled medical science. (Sec. Dep't)

July 29, 1880

Died - On the 12th of July, at Lockhart, Caldwell Co., Mrs. M. M. ELLISON, wife of Judge WM. ELLISON; aged 64. The deceased was a daughter of Eld. J. TUCKER, of Mississippi, and professed religion at 12 years of age.... [A second obituary appeared in the issue of October 21, 1880]: "Departed this life at Lockhart, Caldwell county, July 12, 1880, MRS. M. M. ELLISON. She was born near Athens, Limestone Co., Ala., and enjoyed in her girlhood such advantages of education as the country In her fifteenth year... [she] was baptized into the afforded. fellowship of the Baptist church by her father. Rev. JEREMIAH TUCKER. In 1842 she was married to GEO. W. ELLIS, who died near Webberville in 1856. The writer became acquainted with her when he was President of Mississippi Female College and pastor of the Hernando church, and remembers her as a faithful wife [and] a devoted mother.... With her first husband she resided afterwards in Arkansas, and in Independence, Texas. 1869 she was married to Judge WM. ELLISON, of Lockhart, Caldwell County. She was the niece of Rev. GEORGE TUCKER, of Keachi Female College, Louisiana. Her son, GEO. W. ELLIS, of Hockley, and other relatives unite in presenting these facts as an affectionate testimonial of undying remembrance of a tenderly loved kinswoman." S/ W. C. C. Judge JOHN C. McKEAN, one of the first settlers of Caldwell County, died at Luling last Sunday, aged 83 years.... (Sec. Dep't)

Mrs. EMMA BROOKS, wife of DR. W. S. BROOKS, died at Fort Worth last Tuesday from the effects of an overdose of morphine, which she had taken for a sick headache. (Sec. Dep't)

As MRS. ANDREWS and her grandson were driving home from Savoy the horses became frightened, and by a sudden spring threw her out of the wagon, killing her instantly. Mrs. Andrews was the mother of our townsmen, A. R. and M. H. ANDREWS, and an aunt of SENATOR MAXEY. — Sherman Democrat. (Sec. Dep't)

Notice directed to "Bro. Editor: Our beloved and affectionate daughter, DAMARIS ELIZABETH, breathed her last ... on last Tuesday night.... She became a Christian and was baptized by her pa in 1864 when a little girl.... She was buried on Thursday

morning.... Service conducted by our old pastor and special friend, Eld. S. C. ORCHARD.... S/ LEE GREEN, LUCRETIA GREEN, Hallettsville, Texas, July 26, 1880.

MR. JAMES BAILEY, one of the oldest citizens of Houston, died last Saturday. (Sec. Dep't)

September 2, 1880

"Died - My wife, MRS. L. A. MOORE ... on the 23, at Eureka, where we had come with the hopes of benefitting her health. She professed religion at 16 years of age, was baptized by Eld. JESSIE WOODALL, of Hines Co., Miss...." S/ J. A. MOORE.

COL. THOMAS M. JACK, one of the most distinguished lawyers of Galveston, died in that city last week. (Sec. Dep't)

MRS. PLULA W. JOHNSON, of this city, wife of JUDGE J. W. JOHNSON and mother of G. B. JOHNSON, proprietor of the <u>Post</u>, died on the 17th.... (Sec. Dep't)

Austin, Aug. 28. - REV. O. FISHER, a well known preacher of the Methodist church, died here today. Dr. Fisher has been in the ministry 58 years and preached in Texas 40 years.... (Sec. Dep't)

Born in Alabama, the daughter of a useful and well known Baptist minister; the sister-in-law of a distinguished member of Congress for Mississippi (HON. REUBEN DAVIS of Aberdeen) and the wife of Hon. W. P. ROGERS, a citizen of political distinction in Mississippi, a captain in Jeff Davis' Mississippi Regiment celebrated at Monterey and Buena Vista, a heroic colonel who surrendered his life for his country at the battle of Corinth.... The writer's acquaintance with her commenced in 1844, at Aberdeen, Miss.... Her presence and earnest attention was a genuine inspiration to her pastor in Mississippi and Texas, notably among the former, W. H. HOLCOMBE, S. S. LATTIMORE and L. H. MILLICAN. She has left two sons and three daughters; a large circle of relatives and friends, and every member of the Broadway Baptist church, Galveston, to mourn her loss.... S/ W. C. C.; Oct. 18, 1880.

"Died - MRS. AMANDA RUSSELL, daughter of Mr. A. REYNOLDS, at her residence in Fayette county, Texas, Oct. 2nd, 1880. She was 20 years of age Dec. 30, 1879, had been married nearly one year. She left sad parents, husband, brothers and sisters and friends, and a little babe...."

The Rise and Progress of Baptists in Alabama, by Rev. Hosea Holcombe, published 1840:
Athens, Liberty Association - Athens, Limestone County church, was first called Elim but in 1827 the name was changed to Athens. It was constituted in August 1820 by Elders J. Tucker and W. Bird. The former became their pastor and served until 1838 with the exception of about one year; Mr. J. H. Thompson was called in consequence of Mr. Tucker's health. Round Island - 10 or 12 miles west of Athens. George Tucker was ordained in the church in 1828, and in 1830 served as past pastor. [page 279]

In Madison County Elders R. Shackleford, W. Eddins and Bennet Wood were early ministers. Others settled about the same time were Jeremiah Tucker, John Smith, J. C. Latta and J. Thompson, all of whom have left the country or have since died. [p. 42] Flint River Association (Limestone and Madison Counties) - 1824, Jeremiah Tucker moderator. [p. 106]

They moved to Tipton Co., Tenn., reared a family, and both died in that county. My Jeremiah is son of Jaret Tucker. The Rev. Jeremiah Tucker of Limestone Co., Ala., is son of George Tucker who came to Wilson Co., Tenn. early in 1800 and died there in 1823. I believe Jaret is brother of George. Jeremiah of Limestone married in Wilson Co., Tenn., and so did George, Jr. Jeremiah, son of George, Sr., was appointed administrator, with Nancy Tucker, of Jaret Tucker's property, and guardian of Jaret's children.

Jeremiah, son of George Tucker, married in Wilson Co., Tenn., and took up claim in Mississippi Territory, now Limestone Co., in early 1800's. He is an uncle to my Jeremiah Tucker, born 1800."

She married Elisha Uzzell in Marengo Co., Alabama Sept. 4, 1833, as his 2d wife. His first wife, Chelly, died in Mar. 1833 (Bible records) leaving him with four small children ranging in age from Eliza Ann, age 8, down to Wm. M. who was born Oct. 7, 1832. In 1839 Elisha Uzzell and wife Lydia May removed to Montgomery County, Texas. In 1868 the entire Uzzell clan went down into the state of Vera Cruz where Elisha died. Lydia (May) Uzzell returned to Texas about 1870 and made her home with her son-in-law and daughter, Edward Cook and wife (Mary Ann "Molly" Uzzell Cook) near Groesbeck, Limestone County, Texas. Children of Elisha and Lydia (May) Uzzell were:

Major May Uzzell, born 1835; married Arrena Cook.
Matilda Winifred Uzzell, born 1838; married Dr. J. A. McQueen.
Sarah Louisa Uzzell, born 1843; died 1862.
Lydia Uzzell, born 1847; died 1848.

My Elisha Uzzell was son of Major Uzzell and wife Rebecca Dunn. Major Uzzell had quite a large family, including my Elisha, one Major, and two Thomases. Major Uzzell had a brother Elisha and his father was also named Elisha."

In 1814 at Charleston, South Carolina, Thomas Bennett the elder made his will whereby he devised a lot of land, situated in Charleston, and bequeathed two slaves as well as \$3000 in money to Thomas Bennett, the younger, in trust, to go for support of testator's son John S. Bennett and his wife jointly during their lives; after the death of either, to the survivor in the same manner; and upon the death of survivor to the children of John S. Bennett and his then present wife. But should there be no children surviving, then to revert to the rightful heirs of testator. Will was admitted to probate in South Carolina and trust assumed by Thomas Bennett the younger who continued to act until the year 1834, during which year he resigned the trust, and the complainants being then substituted. Sometime in 1834, John S. Bennett being about to remove with his family to this state, applied to Bennett, the trustee, for heirs [?] to invest funds so bequeathed in slaves.

The first wife of John S. Bennett died in 1817, leaving two children surviving, who are now respectively the wives of complainants, and he afterwards married another, who was living when the bill was filed. Had a plantation in Dallas Co., Ala. Deed in Dallas Co., Ala., from John S. Bennett for natural love and affection he bears his children, being nine in number. The trustee declared [the plantation] is for use of grantor and wife during their joint lives ... in conformity with the will of their grandfather, Thomas Bennett. The first deed is dated 23 March 1836. Another deed by John S. Bennett to complainants is dated 19 October 1839.

Of great interest to all genealogists is the recent opening of the 1900 Federal Census of the United States. July 1, 1975 was the first day this census was available and I spent a tremendous afternoon at the Federal Records Center. This facility has Alabama through Kansas complete. As the rest of the census comes in, a few rolls at a time, it will be made available to you.

Please call or write for an appointment. The telephone number is 334-5515, hours from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM Monday through Friday. Mr. Kent Carter is the new Chief of the Archives Branch. He and his staff will make you welcome and do all they can to assist you. There is a special form to be filled out, and you must read the Rules for Use of 1900 Census. Also, there is a pamphlet titled "Regulations for the Public Use of Records in the National Archives and Records Service." You are to have one of these in your possession when using the Federal Record Center facility and the pamphlet may be obtained through the mail or in person from the center.

Volume I of the Chronicles of Old Navarro District will go to press sometime in 1976. We are very happy to announce that the Bi-Centennial Committee of Fort Worth has recently approved our project as worthy of recognition.

Of interest to many will be the course titled "Intermediate Genealogy" which the society is planning. The North East Campus of Tarrant County Junior College will sponsor this under their Continuing Adult Education Program. Beginning September 16th and ending November 11th, 1975, at a cost of \$20 per registration, a different lecturer will present a different topic each week. Mr. Weldon Hudson is the coordinator of this course.

By the time this issue reaches you, most of you will have had your annual fling in court houses, cemeteries and libraries. The one thing you must not give up is when people say "I don't know anything about the family." It is not always true. They do know something, but what they are really telling you is they do not know what YOU WANT TO KNOW. After some visiting and perhaps taking a couple of snapshots, you can begin to ask a leading question or two ... then listen! Take Notes. Use a tape recorder.

Always ask if the person has any old letters, diaries or pictures you could see, or if they know of anyone else who might have something. I was fortunate to ask the right question and it turned out there was a photograph of great-grandpa in the box on the lady's coffee table right in front of me. Such excitement. On the same trip we located a photograph of my husband's third great-grandmother Holt and visited the cemetery where second Great-grandpa Holt is buried out in the Ozarks. All this from just a few timely questions.

The society plans projects and programs months ahead. Work has already started on next year's workshop, and the "Footprints" staff is working ahead all the time. Thanks, Staff!

FOR YOUR INFORMATION.....

Have you hit a snag in your researching? Are you really using all of the aids that are available to you--some at no cost?

All libraries that have a genealogical section have a surname index mostly 3 x 5 where all researchers may complete cards on the lines on which they are working. Always check these files, fill out cards with your own problem lines and leave at the library. Many good contacts have been made this way.

If you belong to one, or several, genealogical societies, make use of their surname file as well as their query section in their periodicals.

Many, many newspapers throughout the United States carry free genealogical columns. This is another aid free for the price of one stamp. Through this medium you may contact a relative or friend who is not necessarily a genealogist but knows about the family.

Some societies such as the Ft. Worth Genealogical Society have a free hour before each meeting to help anyone, beginner or advanced, in any way that they can. Make use of this service.

Did you know that for as little as 25¢ for one-half scale or \$1.00 for full scale, you can obtain a county map from the Highway Department. These maps are NOT auto travel maps, but show every county road, church, cemetery, creek or other landmarks in the county in which you are interested. These are a must for anyone seeking a cemetery or other special place as a river or creek, etc. Service from the Texas State Highway Department is most prompt, almost by return mail.

There is a column in the Genealogical Helper which offers free help wherein many subscribers offer to search their copies of rare books, certain cemeteries, even some courthouses for you for just a self-addressed stamped envelope. Many unexpected leads have been found through this column.

Are you writing letters correctly? Are you enclosing a SASE (self-addressed, stamped envelope)? Are you writing too much? Too little? At least one date and place? Do you have a workable filing system?

Do you 'belong' to a society, or just pay dues? Have you helped at the library? In so doing you make wonderful friends as well as good contacts. It is surprising where you find new clues. A neighbor, not a genealogist, living across the street for years was discovered to have the family Bible in the attic.

For help in any area--all you need to do is ask!
