
Platt of the Town of Sherman in Grayson County Texas
North





The county of Red River was created by the First Congress of the Republic of Texas in 1836. (See Footprints, Vol. 20, No. 4, November 1977). Fannin County was created from Red River on 14 December 1837 and included the present counties of Fannin, most of Hunt, Grayson, Collin, Cooke, Denton, and a vast area directly west. In 1846 Grayson, Collin, and Denton counties came out of Fannin, and in 1848 Cooke County. All were in the Fannin Land District until the Cooke and Denton Land Districts were created.

Several settlements were made in 1836-1837. In Tulip Bend of Red River, in northern Fannin County, Dr. Daniel Rowlett, John and Edward Stephens, Daniel Slack, Richard Locke, Jabez Fitzgerald, Mark Roberts, and others, established a settlement called Lexington (later known as Tulip). They reported that Charles Quillan, Stephen Westbrook, and others were in the area earlier. Abel Warren established his first trading post in northwest Fannin County. Daniel Dugan, Nathaniel Journey, Charles Smith, and John Russell settled on middle Bois d'Arc. Bailey English, Mabel Gilbert, John P. Simpson, and others settled at Fort English (later Bonham). Holland Coffee and Silas Colville, in 1837, established a trading post at Preston Bend of Red River, in present Grayson County, and a mail contract was let to J. A. Caldwell to run from Preston to Warren.

When Fannin County was created in 1837, Jacob Black's cabin at Lexington was named the seat of justice, but a log court house was built at Old Warren in 1840. In 1843 the county seat was moved to present Bonham.

In 1840 the Republic of Texas established two forts in present Grayson County, Fort Johnson (four miles north of Pottsboro) and Fort Preston, a supply post at Preston Bend. The town of Preston grew up around Coffee's and Colville's post and became a gateway into Texas for Peters Colonists, who began arriving in the early 1840s, setting the stage for the creation of Grayson, Collin, and Denton counties, also Dallas and Hunt counties, in 1846.

Other early settlements in present Grayson County included the Sister Grove community, in the southeast part of the county, out of which later grew Van Alstyne (Grayson County) and Mantua (Collin County). In eastern Grayson County was Annaliza, later called Kentucky Town, settled in the late 1830s and supposedly named for a daughter of Dr. J. F. Heiston, who donated land for a townsite in 1850.

In 1853 Benjamin F. Colbert established his ferry some eight miles below Preston on Red River, after the supreme court had restrained him from operating it at Preston in competition with one operated by George N. Butts. Butts had married Sophia, the widow of Holland Coffee.

Sherman, the county seat of Grayson, was first laid out a short distance west of its present location but was moved to the present site in 1848. A Masonic lodge was organized in 1850 and the Odd Fellows in 1854. The Butterfield Overland Mail Route passed through in 1858.

The plat of Sherman (p. 1) was made prior to 18 March 1851. On that date, Henry Slack, Assessor and Collector for the county, wrote a letter to the state comptroller, stating, ". . . I have sent you a plat of Sherman and I now send you a plat of Preston" (See Footprints, Vol. 18, No. 4, November 1975, town of Preston).

The first (1846) tax roll of Grayson County reveals a number of persons owning lots in the town of Preston. 1850 is the first mention of lot owners in Sherman, but until at least 1853 Preston seems to have been a more thriving trade center. The 1853 tax roll also shows lot owners in the town of AnnaEliza.

Merchants in Preston in 1846 were J. B. Galloway, Thomas M. C. Gookin [not clear], and Coffee & Murphy. The 1850 census indicates merchants William Bean, who was in Cooke County by 1860, R. P. Murray, William A. Watkins, A. M. and R. C. Alexander (the Alexanders had a store in McKinney by 1849), Ware Benge and George Jewell, who were in Johnson County by 1860 and in Young County by 1880. J. P. Bailey and M. B. Reynolds were blacksmiths. The latter was in Denton County by 1860.

The 1850 tax roll indicates these owners of lots in the town of Sherman: L. G. Burns, E? Barnard, Charles Carter, Uel D. Fox, John Hendricks, David Harbolt, E. T. Isbell, Rulon Morrison, and F. Richards. All owned lots around the square. Morrison was an attorney. Frank Richards was a merchant, according to the 1850 census, and his business is indicated on the plat of the town (lot 1, block 5) on the corner of Travis and Houston streets.

In 1851 these people owned town property: Samuel Blagg, Charles Carter, Bradley & Bernard, John R. Bean, John Brooke, Fielding Bacon, William D. Fitch, William L? and George R. Reeves, F. Richards, Jesse J. Shelton, Tabitha J. Shannon (widow of J. B.), William C. Twitty, and Josiah Watson (all owned lots in blocks around the square and some owned other property also). Other lot owners were R. L. Bullock, James P. Coffee, Harrison Harris, John and Reuben Hendricks, Abraham Myers, James Pierson, and John Stover. The merchant Richards had stock valued at \$700. The town plat indicates the firm of Bacon & Burns on lot 3, block 5, and the tax roll shows that Bacon owned one-half of the lot.

In 1852 we find: John and Jane Bean, R. L. Bullock, R. E. Butridge, B. W. Bradley (he had lots 2 and 3 of block 8, the same location as the firm Bradley & Bernard in 1851), M. C. Davis, William D. Fitch, J. D. Frazer, Reubin and John B. Hendrix, Nelson and Thomas H. Howeth, Abrah Myers, Tabitha J. Myers (formerly widow Shannon), B. F. Proctor, James Pearson, William S? Reeves, Norman Stewart, F. Richards, William C. Twitty (he was in Cooke County in 1860), and S. C. Wood.

In 1853 we find: R. E. Butridge, J. S. Burnes, Elisha Barnard, Jane Bean, John R. Bean, G. R. Bone, R. L. Bullock, William D. Fitch, J. A. Fitch, William D. & J. A. Fitch, J. D. Frazar, John Groves Sr., F. M. Hackney, John Haning?, John Hendrix, Joel W. Hagee?, W. L. Lewis, A. R. Loving, Abraham Myers, Tabitha Myers, Jessey Myers, A. D. Moore, William S? and G. R. Reeves, T? Petty, Frank Richards, J. C. Shackelford, G. W. Stamps, P. L? Wells, and S. C. Wood.

Note: These tax rolls are very difficult to read. Question marks, above, indicate uncertainty as to interpretation. We may have missed some names and may have misinterpreted some of those found. Many names on the county tax rolls are later found in Cooke County, and other counties west. (See Footprints, Vol. 19, No. 1, February 1976, town of Gainesville).

The first legislature of the new state of Texas convened on 16 February 1846. During the short period between 17 March and 11 April, Collin and four adjacent counties were created—Collin, Grayson, and Denton, wholly from Fannin County; Hunt County, mostly from Fannin and partially from Nacogdoches; and Dallas County from Nacogdoches and Robertson Counties. Collin County was created by an act approved on 3 April 1846.

The creation act stipulated that John McGara [McGarrah], J. C. M. Hodge, Thomas Rattan, Ashley McKinney, and Pleasant Wilson were to serve as organizing commissioners of Collin County. They were to locate the center of the county and select two places within three miles of the location, to be voted upon for a county seat. The selected place was to be "known and called by the name of Buckner." The commissioners were to lay off said town and sell lots therein.

The place selected was at John McGarrah's settlement about three miles northwest of present McKinney. It was named Buckner, per law. On 13 July 1846 an election was held to choose county officers. Elected were: Z. Roberts, chief justice; Moses G. Wilson, district clerk; Tola Dunn, county clerk; King Custer, sheriff; John Fitzhugh, Godfrey Baccus, Peter Lucas, and John Wilson, county commissioners. On 1 August 1846, McGarrah donated fifty acres of land for a townsite which was laid off. Lots were sold on 21 September, and on 18 October a log court house was erected. On 25 November 1846, John McGarrah became the first postmaster.

On 12 and 24 January 1848, the legislature passed two acts, one defining the northern boundary of the county and the other relative to locating the county seat within three miles of the center. The center was found to be three miles southeast of present McKinney; thus, Buckner was six miles away and too far from the center of the county. Two places were voted upon, with present McKinney being chosen and so named as a result of a legislative act (approved 16 March 1848) stating that "the County Seat . . . shall be known and called McKinney . . . to take effect from the 1st day of August, next." The post office at Buckner was discontinued on 3 May 1848, and McKinney became an office on 31 May, with Joel F. Stewart as postmaster. On 24 March 1849, William Davis conveyed 120 acres of land to the commissioners, the consideration being that he and his wife were to keep Lot 13 in Block 2, Lot 27 in Block 4, and Lot 65 in Block 8.

The legislative act creating Collin County did not state for whom the county was named, nor did the act changing the name of the county seat to McKinney, but it is presumed that the names were to honor Collin McKinney (1766-1861), who arrived in Texas in 1824 and was a signer of the Declaration of Independence in 1836. He moved to present Collin County in 1846. An act passed by the Republic of Texas Congress in 1838 had provided for the creation of Colon [sic] County from Red River, but it was vetoed by Sam Houston.

Not until 1850 do the tax rolls mention the owners of town lots in Collin County. Only the names and number of lots owned were given, no town mentioned by name. Not until 1851 was McKinney mentioned on the rolls. In 1849 J. M. Bounds had merchandise valued at \$300., and G. W. Barnett was agent for A. M. Alexander & Co., with merchandise valued at \$3000. These could have been the first merchants in the new town of McKinney.

In 1850 these persons owned lots in McKinney: H? C. Ballard (5 lots), Glick? Bery? (3 lots), John Clay (2), Samuel Coleman (1), Robert Fitzhugh (5), Abner Fickle (2), Gabriel Fitzhugh (5), Alford Johnson, agent for Daniel Kit-chens (2), L. W. Lesenbee (3 lots, also tools), John L. Lovejoy (6), Larkin Meartz? (3), William Pulliam (2), Marshal Pulliam (1), Joel F. Stewart (2), A. J. Tucker (3), E. Whitley (4), R. Peter Waller (4), Daniel Wetsel (8), J. B. Wilmeth (6 lots and a mill). J. W. Barnett had a stock of goods, also Lovejoy & Fickle. Thomas M. Rowland appears to have been a smith or had a mill [not clear]. Marshal Pulliam, Addison Wilson, Henery Hahn, George Herndon, Henery Cook, and Joseph Crutchfield had money loaned out at interest.

In 1851 the tax roll gives the names of lot owners and the lot and block numbers, but the roll is so dim that it is almost impossible to read the numbers. These persons owned town property: A. M. Alexander & Bro., Francis L. Blanton, J. M. Bounds, Sam Bogart, Alex Berry, S. P. Coleman, ----? Deem?, G. A. Foote, John, Wm, Robert, Gabriel, and G. H. Fitzhugh (they owned many lots), H. C. Hendricks, Martha Herron, Alfred Johnson, L. W. Lessenbee, John L. Lovejoy Sr., Wm C. McKinney (several lots), J. T. Martin, Thos Phillips, Marshall Pulliam, Thos M. Roland, J. O. Straughan, A. J. Tucker, Mrs. Ann Terry, E. Whitely (several), Jno. L. White, James, David, and ----? Wetsel, J. H. Wilson, Peter Wallis, and Silas Yarnell. The recapitulation of the tax roll indicated 91 town lots and two merchandise stores.

The several Fitzhughs seem to have bought up many, many town lots. In 1852 and 1853 they still owned many. J. B. Wilmuth and Alfred Johnson also owned many lots by 1852. The recapitulation for 1852 showed 121 town lots and three stores taxed. For 1853 there were 198 town lots and eight stores indicated. It appears that 1853 was about the time the town began to "boom."

At the bottom of the plat of McKinney is a lengthy certification [not reproduced herein], written by Joel F. Stewart, Clerk of the County Court. He stated that the plat "is a true and correct copy . . . of the town of McKinney, certified by J. B. Wilmuth, J. M. McReynolds, Wm McKinney, and John Fitzhugh, as being a correct map . . . as far as laid off and surveyed by them." This was in reference to blocks 1 through 55. He further certified that the remainder (blocks 56 through 87) was surveyed "by me in March A. D. 1850 under the direction of Geo. B. Scott, Town Commissioner." Still further certification stated that "George White, whose name is subscribed to the certificate at the foot or bottom of this map or plat . . . appeared before me and . . . solemnly swore that the statements therein contained is true and correct." /s/ Joel F. Stewart, 12th day of August, 1850.

Book Reviews

ARLINGTON COUNTY, VIRGINIA, A History by C. B. Rose, Jr. published by Arlington Historical Society

This is a comprehensive history of the area known today as Arlington County, Virginia. It tells of the early Indian occupation, the days when explorers, traders, and land speculators came up the Potomac River from Jamestown to this new frontier. The county acquired a separate identity in 1801 when it became part of the District of Columbia, then back to Virginia in 1846 occupied by Federal troops during the Civil War. It is now part of the core of Washington Metropolitan Region. All of these events are set against the background of the times in which they occurred so that the history of Arlington can be seen in perspective.

During the French regime, the responsibility of drawing up a legal document was the domain of a notary. They prepared postmortem inventory, marriage contracts, exchange of property for pensions (mostly elderly people in favor of their children), agreements to take apprentices, and many other type legal transactions. Even take an occasional census.

This is another valuable genealogical tool, however, its use is limited to the average person as it is written entirely in French.

He recites that "your petitioners Estrayed according to Law a certain Horse [described] on the 23rd day of August 1861.... At the time the said horse should have been sold the Legislature had suspended the Law authorizing the sale of Estrays, and your petitioner Rode said horse to the army and that the time said property was authorized to be sold your petitioner was still in the Army and could not sell said horse as required by the Law." S/ H. C. Johnson, by G. Nance, acting for him. Filed 3 Oct. 1864. Oct term 1864.

Purchasers at sale held at the residence of deceased 17 October 1864: A. J. Lee, S. Terry, Charles Turner, C. Collins, Mary C. Collins, F. C. Wims, Wm S. Johnson, W. T. Ferguson, Jenny Johnson, W. P. Burts, and A. Bayles. Adm'r further reports that there was certain property on the inventory which was not sold but disposed of as follows: one work horse apportioned to Mary C. Collin to make her equal with the other heirs by an advancement made by her father valued at \$100; one horse to Wm S. Johnson to make him equal in said advancement valued at \$100. Also one grey horse charged to H. C. Johnson by consent of heirs at \$100; Said horses was not taken in the division of the horses among the heirs. The balance of the horses wer awarded by order of the cou[r]t on Monday 17th day Oct. 1864 equally between the heirs. There was one table appraised that belonged to Mrs. Collin. One pepper mill which did not belong to the estate valued at 75¢. One large Looking Glass broke before the sale valued at \$1.50. Four hundred lbs of sugar to be divided between the heirs. The boards and shingles was reserved to improve the Houses. One Ward Robe belonging to Caly and Billy Johnson valued at \$20. The four Bed Stads and the Beds and all the clothing inventoried wer given to some the heirs to make them equal in the advancement. One saddle appraised that did not belong to the estate... One foot AAz that belonged to James Marquis.... The wool and cotton were used for the family. Filed 31 Oct. 1864.

On the same day adm'r reported names of those who gave notes for their purchases at sales held Sept. 9 and 10 and Oct. 17. A comparison of the names shows that Mrs. H. Armstrong was Mrs. Hibernia Armstrong; Ben Bedford was B. C. Bedford; Thomas A. Moody was called T. O. Moody. One J. C. Gardner is listed by adm'r as having given a note. He may have been the purchaser shown as Capt Garman or John Garann?.

Also, a large portion of the claims due the estate were claims held against individuals in Spottsylvania County, Virginia, who by the casualties of the late war are now dead or insolvent. The bulk of decedents property being in negro slaves set free by the war, and there being but a small portion of the estate remaining (and some of that in litigation) application was made, by consent of the surviving heirs, to set aside the remaining assets of the estate for the use of the surviving widow, which petition was granted May 30th 1868. Petitioner would long since asked to be discharged from further administration but from the fact that some law suits were commenced by his father for the recovery of money due him and continued by me as administrator. I once moore take the pleasure of Riting a few line to see if I can find you. I have Rote so many times to you and I got no answer that I give it up, that you did not intend to answer my letters or that you were all dead, then I Rote to Abxr McNeell to no what had become of you and got no answer from him. I yet would not give it up. I then Rote to the post master at San Augustine Texas - to no what had become of you. He Rote to me and told me that you had left there and gone to a place neear fortworth Taurant County and I now send my letter to see if I can find you theare if it finds you I can say to you that we are all in common helth with the exseption of your sister. She is now confind to the Bed but is giting alonge as well as could be exspected after having a fine son last Saturday night - hoping those few lines may find you and find you all well - I will not Rite along letter as I am not surtin this will find you if it doz Rite to me and I will give you all the news of this contry. I have anotion of travling to your state next winter if nothing happens.

Brother Ransom Steell [Stull ?] is now living in Alabama and I exspect is now on a visit to Texas - after he returns and gives me the Strict accoun of that State I may come to look out place to moove to and if I come I shall call and see you I will say to afew words about your Lots of land you hear it is much worsted the timber is all cut off of it that is worth anything of note Mr. Martine Willson is living on it and I am told he has rewnd it very much. Your sister Cary ses you must give it to her to put with her part of land and it all will sell better - and allso Mary Luiazer and Sarah Louvena [?] ses you must give it to them I think you had better give me apower of attorney and let me sell it for you and send or bring you the money tho do as you think proper with it I exspect to sell Carys part as it is in two small apiec for to settle on of its self Mary and Sarah ses again give it to them and for you to come hear and see them and they will give you three times as much and perhaps go back to Texas with you. Frances is dead and her many run away from hear. You mother and all you connections are all well - times hear is hard as to many matters provisions is scarce [?] After you Rite to me I will no whare you are and then I will Rite to you and tell you all the nuse. . . . James Cavness has set his time to die that is after corn is laid by he as big afool as he was when you left hear and Just as contrary you no as much or moore than I can tell you about him Mary Lueazer and Sarahlouisa ses you must Rite to them and tell them why you have not answered their letters they Rote to you Dirrect your letters to Gold Reagon Moore County N. C. I will close my letter by saying I am yours with Respect untill Death.



RECORD BOOK OF THE GRAPEVINE FARMERS ASSOCIATION ORGANIZED

APRIL the 20, 1880

The following excerpts are from an old ledger kept by George Robert Jones of Tarrant County and Baylor County, Texas. Copied and submitted by Mrs. Jo Buck Jones, daughter-in-law of the above and who has the ledger in her possession.

* * *

There was apparently little or no law enforcement, which resulted in these residents of northeast Tarrant County forming their own local protective organization.

On the flyleaf is written "The Chord American Baptist Pub (Puf?) Sosiety". On the back side of the flyleaf:

"I, of my own free will and acord do solemnly pledge myself in the presence of God and this association to sacredly keep all the secrets of this association and not communicate them to any one except members of this or a kindred society and to them after due trial and I further promise to obey all orders of the officers of this society and to pay all dues assessed by the society as long as I am a member therein and I further agree to abide by the bylaws and constitution of this sosiety."

first Be it resolved that whereas our county is suffering greatly on account of horse thieves and all other manner of thieving we organize ourselves into an assosiation to be known as the Farmers Assosiation for the purpose of protecting our property

(There followed 19 more bylaws - one stating all persons becomeing members of the association shall pay an admittance fee of twenty-five cents)

The first officer elected was G.R. Jones, Secretary.

J. Edmonson was both recommended for membership and elected as vice-president at this meeting.

W. R. Terrell was recommended at the same meeting and elected president. He apparently did not choose to serve, as Edmonson became president.

M. A. Beall, the Chairman, presided over the first five meetings.



Book Reviews

1860 and 1870 U. S. CENSUS OF BENTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE. 436 pp.

Would that our ancestors had chosen to live in Benton County. The Browns have made a substantial contribution to genealogy by publishing not just the general population schedules for the three census years, but special census data: slave, mortality, and special railroad census for 1860 and mortality schedules for 1880. Both books are well indexed with maps showing civil districts used for enumeration during each of the three censuses.

Transcribed and indexed schedules are particularly important for these years, since no state-wide indexes have been done for 1860 and 1870, and the 1880 Soundex covers only a portion of the population.

These books are a must for those with Benton County families, and should be purchased for every major genealogical collection including Southern States. Prices were not available to us at this time but books can be ordered from the compilers, P.O. Box 37, Eva, Tennessee, 38333.



NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

By the time you read this column, the Fort Worth Public Library will be in the throes of its move to the New Central Building at 300 Taylor Street. We will start May 22nd, and plan tentatively to re-open July 15, 1978. We may be able to open the genealogical section a little earlier since we will be the first to move, but really don't know yet. If you are planning a visit from out of town during this period, you might want to call ahead.

We will have microfilm readers galore in the new building, so we expect our perennial waiting lists to disappear. We will also have, for the very first time, all of our books on the open shelves for your use.

Visiting librarians, in town for the recent Texas Library Association Convention were amazed by the quality and ease of use of our collection, especially since they had been told by our opposite numbers across the Trinity not to bother visiting Fort Worth Public Library because we had nothing of value, and what we had was not organized in a professional manner. As you know, our major objective is to make our material as easy to locate and use as possible. We are certainly open to constructive criticism, and welcome suggestions from our readers as to how we can improve our services.

Two new interlibrary loan opportunities have just come to our attention. It is now possible to obtain the 1880 Soundex on microfilm from the Federal Archives. You request this material in the same manner as you order other census films.

The Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary can now obtain microfilm from the Southern Baptist Historical Commission in Nashville. We have a 1969 catalog of available materials in our collection; we're sure that the Seminary has supplementary material. Because of its outstanding collection of church and denominational histories, including those of other states, the Seminary library should be a familiar haunt for local researchers.

We made a hurry up trip to Weatherford early this month when we discovered that they had the 1850 Accelerated Indexing Service Volume for Missouri. While ours is ordered, along with all the others published to date, it will probably be a while before we get it. If you're waiting for that one as anxiously as we were, you might want to run out there or drop a note to Evelyn for copies.



NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

The biggest news from the library, of course, is that by the time you read this, there will once again be a Ft. Worth Public Library. We closed down June 6th for the move to the new central building at 300 Taylor Street, and will open at 9:30 AM on July 21, 1978.

The Genealogy and Local History Division (our new name) will also have new hours. Because of problems of staffing the larger part of the library, we have lost (except in times of dire emergency) the services of Nan Sprester and Beatrice Grant. The clerks will be placed in a clerical pool, so nothing but public service work will be done in public areas. We will not have Shirley Carter or Phillip Hallmark in the room to help with the phone and the microfilm readers. Since we are down to Paul and Pat, the only way we can give you good service is to arrange for both of us to be on duty at the same time, and the only way we could do that was for us to shorten our hours of service. Essentially we are adopting the pattern used by the Houston Public Library at the Clayton Library; when we are open nights, we will not open until noon. The schedule is as follows: Monday-closed (to enable both of us to continue to participate in the affairs of the society), Tuesday and Wednesday-12PM to 9PM; Thursday, Friday and Saturday--10 AM to 6PM.

Right after we closed for the move, the log-jam in Catalog broke and we began receiving new books, so we will have much to offer you, including what seems like hundreds of the Accelerated Indexing Service Census Indexes. Plan to pay us a visit at your earliest convenience.

The catalog will be on microfiche, rather than the familiar cards, and will probably take some getting used to. We brought the family files, so those will be available on cards, but our basic tool will be the fiche.

Speaking of fiche, our newest goody is the Index to North Carolina Marriage Bonds in the North Carolina State Archives. This is going to be a treasure for those with North Carolina ancestry. It indexes, by both groom and bride, marriage bonds from the colonial period to 1868.

The move was surprisingly easy in some respects, and very difficult in others. Getting the books over went smoothly, but we had to reshift them to get them to fit right and allow for growth. The movers Conlee Brothers Mayflower of Bryan, specialize in doing library moves, and go hence to Corpus Christi to move the library there. They have been unbelievably helpful, and after a month and three weeks with them, will miss them like family when they leave.



FORT WORTH'S JUBILEE YEAR

The year 1923 was the 75th anniversary of the founding of Fort Worth, Texas. There were many celebrations, wearing of costumes, speeches and all other things contingent with such celebrations. On September 28, 1923 there started in the Fort Worth Star Telegram daily newspaper a series of interviews with the old pioneers still living at that time. Some of these contain lots of information, some just interesting events that occurred in their life, but if it is your ancestor, it will be very important to you.

October 1, 1923 - Monday

T. M. Britton age 78 years, died Sunday September 30, 1923 was born Alabama 25 August 1847 was a courier for the Confederacy.

October 5, 1923 - Friday

E.C.D. Willburn of Benbrook born 70 years ago [ca 1848] in Dallas County, Texas...came to Ft. Worth in 1853. [article was concerning experience with indians.] His father came to Texas in covered wagon from Jacksonville, Mo. Brother-in-law Tom Snyder built first house in Parker County. Listed four sons C.O., F.E., I.B. and R.B. Willburn.

October 7, 1923, Sunday.

Article "Pony Mail Service" regarding George H. Mulkey, also his picture. Named his wife Fannie E, stated they lived in Ft. Worth since 1860, served in Confederate Army in April 1864. George Mulkey's father was born in Georgia and his father and mother helped settle the Choctaw, Cherokee and Chicasaw Indians in the Indian Territory.

October 8, 1923, Monday

Mrs. J. H. Leach told of people waiting up all night to see first train into Ft. Worth. No information.

October 9, 1923, Tuesday

John M. Moore as a boy of eight came to Texas from Cole County, Mo., in 1861 "when the Yanks chased them out of Missouri". Father plowed couple of furrows, built a cabin and went back to the war. Mother, eight year old son and a nine year old negro kept place going until his return. Stated he had brother M. H. Moore.

October 10, 1923, Wednesday

The day after Sarah Holden of Booneville, Missouri married J. E. Johnson they left in covered wagon for Texas... an eight week honeymoon ...settling in Wise County, Texas later came to Fort Worth in 1872.

October 11, 1923 Thursday

Mrs. Henry Byrne lived at 4th and Taylor for 50 years...remembers crying because she had to drink from muddy Trinity, washing clothes and laying on bushes to dry. Came from DeSoto, Illinois covering five states in a covered wagon. Had one son, Patrick Henry Byrne.

October 12, 1923

Mrs. Sue G. McKelvey came Ft. Worth with father John W. Berry...her husband was a railroad man.

October 14, 1923, Sunday

Mrs. A. M. Williams born Smith County, Texas 1844 near Tyler, came west at seven years of age with father Jake Matthews. Indians in 1858 killed her uncle Jim Cameron, his wife and 3 boys living in Jack County. They left 3 children which her father raised. She attended school at Veal Station and married a soldier...had eight children.

October 15, 1923, Monday

F. C. Holden, son Edgar Bell Holden, mother, brother, sister and 12 year old negro boy came to Texas in fall 1873 from Rutherford County, Tennessee...mother ill all the way.

October 16, 1923, Tuesday

Mrs. Maggie Oliver was born 69 years ago near Rhome, Texas. Her family, the Youngs, went to Lexington, Missouri then back...she grew up in Texas. Said she rode 10 miles to church and men wore guns and walked around the church during services to guard against indian attacks.

October 17, 1923, Wednesday

Dr. W. A. Durenger born Oct. 29, 1861 in Pickneyville, Illinois... been in Ft. Worth 39 years...studied at Tulane University in New Orleans.

October 19, 1923, Thursday

The engineer on the first work train into Ft. Worth was George Walpole, 77, resident county poor farm. His son, Jack Kelly is engineer today (1923). Also rode first street car which jumped tracks every couple blocks...everyone got off and put it back on tracks.

Mike McCarthy, 75, also resident of poor farm, was on the work gang and has been in Ft. Worth for 38 years.

October 19, 1923, Thursday

Picture and article about A. J. Edwards lived in Boyd during war and went to school in log schoolhouse where indians scalped a schoolmate, Logan Higgins. Told of indian raid on Dozier Creek... he was a teacher in public schools. His neighbors were Hoyenkamps, Barkleys, Boazes and Poppelwells. Witnessed the "falling of the stars".

October 21, 1923, Sunday

C. P. Berry, 1413 California Street was born in Buchanan, old county seat of Johnson County, in June 1860. His father died when he was four. Stepfather was N. M. Ennis, sister Nanie Jones Leverett, 65, lives in Handley. Another sister Sue S. McKelvey, 67, lives in Ft. Worth. Worked for a freighter named Mormon when Ft. Worth was full of buffalo wallows. Worked in Cleburne for ten pin alley where Sam Bass used to come and play.

October 23, 1923, Tuesday

W. A. "Dad" Shelton was born January 15, 1853 in Polk County, Tenn. left for Ft. Scott, Kansas in ox wagon as a boy. He drove stage from Ft. Scott to Humbolt, Tex....came to Dennison in 1872, then San Antonio. Drove stage there 1874-75...heldup twice, so returned to Ft. Worth 1876 and drove stage for Jim Johnson from Ft. Worth to Granbury.

Hotel was the Transcontinental run by Col. Fairfax, S. T. Bibb, clerk. Dad Shelton drove first hearse ever used into Pioneer Rest Cemetery. He married in 1877 Dora Robertson who was born in Louisiana in 1859 coming to Texas in 1872.

October 24, 1923, Wednesday

S. D. Hartman of 1424 Maddox arrived in Ft. Worth in 1859 at nine years of age.

Esther T. Gantt, daughter of a Georgia family came in 1871. They were married 23 October 1873. Children were W. T. Hartman, S. O. Hartman, Mrs. B.E. Looney, Mrs. G. O. McClure and Clarence L. Hartman. There were only 150-200 people in Ft. Worth at that time, F. M. Daggett had a farm between Houston and Sante Fe Station and considered it out in country. He was 15 yrs. a peace officer. Members of bar: J. Peter Smith, Capt. J. C. Terrell, Junius W. Smith, Jim Smith, Dr. W. P. Burt (first mayor) and Marshall C. C. Fitzgerald.

October 26, 1923 Friday

Mrs. George P. Lytle (Sallie E. Moore) 69, of 1202 New Orleans St., daughter of Mrs. Mary A. Moore...came to Longview in wagons in 1873, lived in tents until rails reached Ft. Worth. George P. Lytle, 70, came to Texas in 1875 and to Ft. Worth in 1876...charter member Panther Volunteer Fire Dept. They were married in 1882, daughters Mrs. J. B. McCline and Mrs. S. L. Jackson.

October 30, Tuesday

Mrs. Ermine Louckx, 200 College St., daughter of W. M. Robinson was born 14 January 1855 on a farm where Swift's Packing plant is now. Her teacher was Peter Smith. Father came from Dallas in 1849 where he had married Ann Madison, cousin of President Madison. Neighbors were Capt. M. B. Loyd and Dr. Shelton. Her elder sister married W. C. Turner...other sisters Mrs. Frances Patrick, Flora Griffin...brother Dolphus Robinson. Had a sweetheart Charley Louckx...didn't marry him till 40 years later. Another brother was Volney Robinson born in 1855.

October 31, 1923, Wednesday

T. R. Sandidge, 66, 2603 Vickery...said only cowboys wore big hats...city fellows wore derbys...came on four horse stage in 1874 and hauled freight between Dallas and Ft. Worth. Cleburne was rival. Hauled stone for First Baptist Church with John Hanna, W. H. Taylor, W. H. Davis and old "Good" Miller. Rev. John Gaugh first minister at church where city hall now stands (1923) T. R. Sandidge's father made the bricks.

November 1, 1923, Thursday

George W. Graham was stage coach driver...fare 10¢ mile...no personal data.

November 2, 1923, Friday

W. J. Ozee, 70, 2017 Ross Avenue, came to Texas 1856 from Indiana with his father Michael Ozee and Dempsey Simpson, his brother-in-law. They left Big Spring, Indiana in 1850 with two-two horse and one four horse wagons...went St. Louis...Ft. Smith, Arkansas...arrived in Ft. Worth December 1856. He had two brothers and sister, Mrs. N. A. Tucker of Taylor County.

November 4, 1923, Sunday

J. W. Hancock of Waco...father died in Civil War when he was small...mother soon after. His uncle brought he and his brother to Texas heading for gold field...when he reached Weatherford gave the boys away...J.W. to Mex Moss and his brother to a Mr. Johnson. Didn't see each other for 10 years. Brother ran away to Mr. Rippy, who indians killed and scalped. Orphans came to Ft. Worth went to Bear Creek School.

November 6, 1923, Tuesday

Mrs. B. M. Burchell, 76, Lucerne Apartments, born in New York, lived in Illinois, came Ft. Worth 1874...railroad people. No personal info.

November 8, 1923, Thursday

Mrs. M. G. Ellis, 75, Ellis Apartments, arrived in Ft. Worth after three month journey with covered wagon train from Alabama. She said her family came in a buggy and surrey with furniture and belongings in ox-drawn wagons. No personal information.

Mrs. J. A. Pharr of Waco, visiting in Handley will celebrate her birthday on Nov. 11. Her parents, Dr. and Mrs. P. K. Phenix came to Texas in covered wagon in 1849 from Tennessee and first settled in Lamar County near what is now Brookston, Mrs. Pharr was born there. She stated she brought second cat to Ft. Worth...she had brother Tom...family moved on to Jack County and obtained land from Daniel Tucker who was going to California. After two years moved to central Texas because of indians. One family the Masons had all been killed by indians but small infant. Neighbors were Newtons, William Wise, Duncan Hays, Reagan, Vandeburg, and Burns.

November 9, 1923 Friday

Mrs. Harriett Elliott, 71, born May 17, 1852 believed to be the first child born in Tarrant County. Father James Cate of Tennessee came to Texas from Missouri in 1849...she was born May 17, 1852. Has lived most of her life in Tarrant County, her husband Benton Elliott ran livery stable at Seventh and Houston. Had seven children, three of whom live in Fort Worth Cal, Frank and Mrs. H. A. Bredow.

November 11, 1923, Sunday

George Harris gave list of early pioneers, indian fighters and Texas Rangers...some still living in 1923:

George Harris, 80, came to Ft. Worth in 1851 as a boy of seven ...two deserted Caddo Indian villages were in what is now [1923] city limits. In 1852 his father Arno L. Harris and an uncle John Farrar bought a section in Village Creek...sold later to Johnson who established Johnson Station. He was born 2 August 1844, seven miles southwest of Duval's Bluff in Monroe County, Arkansas.

In 1849 his family arrived in Shelby County, Texas enroute to California when word was received an entire wagon train was massacred west of Ft. Scott, Kansas...they decided to remain in Texas. From Shelby County they moved to Ellis...then Ft. Worth. Stated old man Louckx (father of Charley) lived where the library is now...witnessed fight on Rock Creek in Young County in fall 1859 in which Charley Reeves was killed.

C. J. Gambrell and wife came to Fort Worth in September 1867 from Pontotoc County, Mississippi...settled on farm in West Fork of Trinity but indians so bad had to move. Moved to Marine Creek five miles from Fort Worth, then in 1870 moved to Fort Worth and ran grocery store. C. J. died in 1874 buried in Pioneer Cemetery.

J. M. Morris, 85, of Castleberry area, served in Confederate Army from 1862 to 65 came to Texas in 1873. Related how Bud Davis who now lives in Reno, Texas was captured by indians near Azle and held captive for a year until they traded him for some coffee and sugar.

Mrs. Martha C. Quayle had honor of making the flag carried by Gano's Squadron in Civil War. Her father was James T. Morehead...moved to Texas from Virginia in 1853...when B. C. Evans ran general store and court house was a wooden shack. She married A. M. Quayle.

Mrs. Peter G. Davis and her brother R. L. Creswell are survivors of eleven early settlers who came to Fort Worth in 1858 from Tennessee.

November 14, 1923 Wednesday

W. L. Simpson was on second cattle drive from Texas to Wyoming... John Sparks was on the first.

Rev. B. F. Hall, pioneer preacher, son of Peter Hall who brought his family of five boys to Tarrant County by covered wagon in 1855, B. F. was 3 years old...settled on Live Oak...taught at Walter's Creek... in 1877 married Annie Granstaff and had eight children.

[His obituary was in the paper two days after this interview]

November 15, 1923 Thursday

Interview with John M. Thorne but no personal information.

J. Willis Johnson of San Angelo, 67, born in Paris, Henry Co., Tennessee on February 16, 1857...was Lt.Col. in Confederate Army. Left home at age 16... on 14 September 1887 married Lou Elizabeth Holmsley of Commanche...had one son J. Willis, Jr. and two daughters. His brother was W. Clint Johnson.

November 16, 1923 Friday

Picture of C. O. "Cass" Elliott, 74, oldest living pioneer in Tarrant County...no personal information.

November 25, 1923

This was a large 1/2 page interview with Henry Strong, guide in the famous McKinzie Campaign 1873-4 and one of the few survivors now living (1923) in Wichita County...came to area in 1870...served in the Civil War though very young.

Jake Doffelmeyer had been murdered by indians shortly after Strong came to Texas in 1870 in Coleman County. Later Young and Lot Ellington, brother-in-law of Doffelmeyer were hunting when Lot was killed by indians.

A man named Lynn living 1½ miles south of Cambrons went to visit his neighbors...found all killed by indians but a two month old girl and two year old girl...he hurried back home to find his own family killed, the Jones family at Trinity and at the Babb home...Mrs. Babb killed, Dot Babb and sister Marjorie and a Mrs. Luster captured.

This petite periodical, sponsored by a number of imposing sounding societies, all of which add up to the Hartwells, should be extremely useful to them in building up a personal genealogical library, since all books which are to be listed must be contributed to them; however, we doubt seriously that it would be of much use to anyone else, since the "reviews" of the books are not at all critical, simply brief listings of contents, and the slight articles which accompany the book listings are rehashes of articles found better done elsewhere.

This is a very well documented family history of Edward Legg (1748) from Manchester, England to Maryland and his many descendants. It is easy to follow the line of descent in this book, unlike many where you need to be a mathematical genius. It also tells where information has been found.

I want this thing closed up in some way. I have the children to take care of and I want the property to help me do it. I have already expended more than twice the amt the property is worth, and the expense of clothing and schooling two of the Heirs (the youngest) only just commenced.... S/J. G. Smith [Attached are four pages of accounts]:

Page 1. "William Jackson is second son of V. E. Smith
Age 18 years."

James B. Smith. For board in Weatherford 1868 and 69; to Mrs. Carson, tuition; paid Prof. Davis 4 mos. tuition.

Orin D. and James B. are my own children by Mrs. V. E. Smith - the first was 6 years and the second 2 years of age when their mother died. The above account is the amount cash paid out and nothing charged for clothing or Board - since Jan. 15th 1870 over three years. I will put down their board at \$50.00 per year each subject to decision of the Court.

[Page No. 4 is statements of expense; covered in pages 1 - 3.]

He reviews actions taken, and further represents that on 7 January 1870 he transferred property on Marys Creek ... for property of more than equal value situated in the town of Weatherford in Parker County ... ROCK SPRINGS METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH
SOUTH MINUTES BOOK AND MEMBERSHIP LIST

Rock Spring Methodist Church, South located at Scottsville, Harrison county, Texas, was in existence as early as 1841. The connecting cemetery, called Scottsville Cemetery, is a four acre burial ground, deeded in trust in 1904 to the Church by Ripley Rose Scott, son of W. T. Scott, who first established it as a family cemetery. It became a community cemetery in 1867. This minutes book is incomplete. The partial records were copied several years ago by my brother-in-law, Demar Therrell (now deceased), from the original book owned by Mrs. Barry Rosborough of Marshall, Texas. A later request to copy the entire book went unanswered, but in an effort to reconstruct some of the families herein listed, I have added some footnotes.

Sister MARY M. JONES and MARY R. SCOTT were appointed a Committee to see Sister PATIENCE ROSE and enquire into the causes of her absence from the Church for three successive months...The meeting was adjourned with Benediction. W. T. Scott, Sec't

(Note: PATIENCE MATILDA (TAYLOR) ROSE, widow of RIPLEY R. ROSE, who was the son of WILLIAM PINCKNEY ROSE and born 11 Dec. 1828 in Mississippi/ died 17 Feb. 1855 in Harrison county, Texas. He married Patience on 1 Nov. 1849 in Marshall, Texas, where they had one son, WILLIAM PINCKNEY ROSE, born 9 July 1852 and died on 11 May 1866. All are buried in Scottsville Cemetery....cme)

Rock Spring Church, May 26th, 1867:

Church meeting called to order by Rev. J. S. MATHIS, Preacher in Charge. The roll was called and absentees either excused or mark made...The committee appointed to see Brother R. SCOTT reported that he stated his absence from the church on the days of public worship, resulted from the fact that his children or some of their wives living with their relations at a distance from his home and that since he had been in the habit of visiting them instead of coming to church but that he was trying to make arrangements to get them home and if he did that he would be more _____ in attending Public Preaching...It was resolved that the class bear with Brother Scott and the Preacher in charge promised to see him and inform him of the same...The Committee appointed to see Sister Patience Rose reports that she now lives at Marshall, too great a distance for her to travel to church without company, and that she attends church at Marshall Station and desires to have her membership continued at Rock Springs to which the class consented. Rev. J. S. Mathis reports the work upon the Circuit about as it was at his last round, lively in teaching on the subject of religion at the Sabbath School causes good congregations at the

various preaching appointments...No report from the Steward or others. The sabbath School at Rock Springs progressing well...punctual attendance by officers, teachers and schollars...there is two Bible classes, one of males and one of females and four other classes, all with zealous teachers...all making respectable progress in their studies and appropriate Sabbath school address was this day delivered by Dr. J. F. JOHNSTON to the members of the Sabath School at Rock Spring and Willis Chapel at this place...all was orderly attention and evinced by their conduct and expressions a high degree of satisfaction and delight. W. T. Scott, Sec't

Rock Springs, Jan'y 24th, 1869:

Church meeting called to order by Brother G. W. COTINGHAM the preacher in charge...roll called-14 members present-35 absent. W. T. Scott elected secretary..report of F. M. SCOTT, stuard, showing \$1218.00 to be raised by the Circuit for Preacher in Charge including Bishops and widows and orphans allowances and \$228.00 apportioned to Rock Springs appointment...on motion stuard was directed to adopt the usual plan for counting the money to be raised. W. T. Scott, Sec't

Rock Springs Church, Nov'r 29 AD, 1869:

Church meeting called to order by Rev'n Mr. G. W. COTTINGHAM.. upon motion W. T. Scott was elected secretary for the present conference year...Upon motion of Rev. F. M. Scott seconded by Bro. J. M. FINLEY...resolved that a committee of the Trustees of the Church at Rock Springs to consist of not less than three members be directed to be present at the regular appointment for Preaching to the Freedmen whose duty it shall be as far as possible to have good order preserved in the Church.. Rock Springs Church, Dec'r 26th, 1869:

Church meeting called together by Rev'r G. W. Cottingham for the transaction of business...Brother T. P. COLLIER appointed secretary Protem...Brothers P. B. PARCHMAN, W. T. SCOTT and F. P. COLLIER appointed a committee to revise the list of membership of this Society...Sister SARAH GRAVES desiring membership in this Society was received. G. W. Cottingham

Rock Springs Church, January 23rd, 1870:

Parchman reported that the brothers and sisters whose absence had considered had been seen as far as possible or convenient and that JESSE JONES, LOUISA JONES and EMILY JONES desires their membership to remain with this Society and also Bro. and Sister WHARTON wishes their membership to remain and that Sister Sarah Graves membership had never been changed on the Church Book and it was ordered that it should be noted that Sister MARTHA M. DANIEL had removed from the neighborhood and the secretary was directed to make a new revised list of the membership of this Society...a call was made for subscriptions to the Galveston Christian Advocate and the following names was by order entered on the church book as subscribers to the Advocate viz. Mr. A. E. BRIGHTWELL, Mr. GILBERT WILSON, Mr. D. T. AUSTIN, Mr. F. M.

Church Minutes

Rock Springs...1884:

(Note: Written on side margin of page-"The present church building was built in 1848 or 1849)

A School House of hewed oak logs was erected at Rock Springs as early as 1841, which was also occupied as a church building. Occasional preaching by transient Preachers some of whom were Dr. JOBE BAKER (deceased by 1878), Rev'r W. E. DOTY, FRANCIS WILLSON, LITTLETON FOWLER and others. The church first organized at Rock Springs neighborhood consisted of but few members. Some of them now remembered were Mrs. CATHERINE SCOTT wife of SAMUEL T. SCOTT and mother of F. M. SCOTT. She occupies the first grave that was opened at Rock Springs Cemetery. Brother JOHN GRAVES and his wife ELIZABETH GRAVES, Mr. and Mrs. BARBEE and Sister SUSAN GILL wife of JAMES M. GILL were amongst the first members joining the church here. About the year 1843 James M. Gill joined the church and soon became an exhorter and after a very years was recommended by this Society and was licensed to preach. He lived for many years in the neighborhood and often occupied the pulpit at Rock Springs and acceptable local preacher. He moved to Starville, Smith county and thence to Tyler. He was a faithful class leader, a good worker and always punctual to his appointments and very liberal in support of the church and an acceptable local preacher. Some of the preachers serving the Harrison Circuit as now remembered are as follows: Revr. WM. CRAIG, 1842, CRAWFORD, 1843, M. DOUGLE who died upon the circuit in early part of 1844, N. W. BURK and HARRIS in 1847, N. W. BURK and WM. JAMISON in 1848. ~~J. W. FIELDS~~ in 1849 about this date was J. C. WOOLEM. FRANK M. STOVALL and HICKMAN in 1855. J. W. FIELDS PC and W. J. JOICE AP in 1859. W. B. HILL PC and A. B. MARION AP in 1861. NEIL BROWN PC and W. C. COLLINS AP in 1863 and 1864. JOHN PATILLO and JOHN L. MATHIS PC in 1865 and 1866. JOHN L. MATHIS PC in 1867, G. W. COTTINGHAM PC in 1870. G. W. COTTINGHAM time filled out by JAMES B. HALL PC in 1873. H. H. BOOTHE PC in 1874. DANIEL CROUSE PC in 1875. A. M. BOX PC after the death of A. M. BOX in 1876 time filled by DANIEL MORSE to 1877. In 1877 JAS. B. HALL PC in 1878 J. C. WOOLAM PC in 1879 LACY BOON PC. In 1880 H. M. BOOTH PC in 1881 and 1882 F. J. BROWNING PC in 1882 F. J. BROWNING. THOS. W. ROGERS, E. P. ROGERS, R. W. THOMPSON and perhaps others filled the Harrison Circuit appointments but the dates of their service not remembered. Some of the Presiding Elders on the District and filling appointments on Harrison Circuit now remembered are as follows: LITTLE FOWLER from 1841 to 1844, ROSS from 1845, SAM'L A. WILLIAMS 1846 to 1848, J. T. P. ERWIN 1859 and 1860, RICHARD LAW 1861 to 1863, JOHN B. TULLIS 1864 to 1865, R. L. DENNIS 1866, JOHN L. MATHIS 1867 and 1868, LEWIS P. LIVELY 1869 and 1870, DANIEL MORSE PE from 1872 to 1876, R. W. THOMPSON PE from 1877 to 1882, JOHN ADAMS PE 1883, L. W. TURNER PE 1881 and 1882, RICHARD W. THOMPSON PE 1884 to 1887. This circuit was served by the following preachers at dates not remembered at this time: JOHN NEWTON HAMIL, J. W. HAMIL, MOSS PE (?), CLARENCE FINLY AP and CARTER PC and perhaps others. Rock Springs Church besides the regular ministers appointed on the work was often accommodated with preaching from such local divines as Dr. JOB TAYLOR, Dr. JAS. H. JOHNSON and Dr. R. P. HAMIL. J. M. WASKOM and during the years 1862 and 1864 heard gospel sermons from

Bishop E. M. MANERU? and Bishop KUNER. The above and foregoing four pages was written down by me from partial records and memory to supply to some extent the want of better history and record of the church at Rock Spring.

Another minister of the gospel has fallen at his post; Rev. ALLEN MARION BOX departed this life in Harrison county, Texas on the morning of the 8th inst., at one o'clock. He preached his last sermon on his circuit at Andrew Chapel on the 4th Sabbath in Feby. left the church feeling quite unwell, was barely able to reach his family, suffered much for ten days, without a murmur, when he was taken from the active duties of itinerant life to the joys of life eternal. He died in great peace; a near neighbor and clever gentleman who was with him during his last hours (though not a professor of religion remarked to the writer as we were going to the burial) that if he could die as happy and resigned as did Brother Box, he would have no fear of the future state. The same precious promises he had so long and zealously quoted from the sacred Scriptures for the encouragement of the people of God he was enabled by faith to appropriate to himself in the dying hour. He was conscious to the last and talked sweetly of heaven. He was born in Beaufort district, S. C., August 8, 1824; grew up fond of amusements with but little inclination to be religious, prepared himself for the practice of medicine, but was converted and called to the ministry; married his now bereaved widow; was licensed to preach and received into the Alabama Conference from which he was transferred to the Texas Conference and traveled the Bastrop Circuit in 1852. Since then he has traveled many circuits in the Texas, West Texas and East Texas Conferences, and filled many agencies. He is well known in the Conferences where he has traveled. I presume we have few, if any, preachers in any of the Texas Conferences who have received as many members into the church during the period of his labors as has our departed brother. He was decidedly a revivalist preacher, seemed never so happy as when he saw the power of God manifested in the awakening and conversion of sinners; to this end he ceased not to labor night and day. His sermons were plain and pointed; his exhortations such as moved the hearts of his congregations. He could relate stirring incidents which had occurred under his own observations and in the history of others, with pathos, which would awaken the tenderest emotions in the hearts of his audience. He possessed power and eloquence in prayer in an eminent degree; with strong voice he would implore mercies and the grace of heaven; Jacob like, he would not be stilled until the Lord would hear, answer and bless. The readers of the Texas Christian Advocate have become familiar with his urgent and graphic accounts of revival meetings furnished by his own pen to cheer the hearts of the friends of Zion. Without favoring himself in the least, his utmost unceasing labors induced a bronchial infection of which he died. He has left a devoted companion, who for thirty years shared his joys and privations, and greatly aided him in the itinerant work with eight

children to mourn the loss of an affectionate father. His last resting place is near Sentell's Chapel where in a neighboring burying ground his body will quietly repose until awakened by the hand of God to rally with all who have a part in the first resurrection.

In a letter, written just before his death, he said "I think it will be very well when I am gone for you all to know that I was born in Murray co., Tenn. July 7, 1813; moved with my parents to Fayette county, Tenn. about 1826. My father died in 1831, and I, with my brother, moved to Giles co., Tenn. In 1835 I went to Noxubee county, Miss., married Miss NANCY A. THOMPSON, Nov. 26, 1836. In the winter of 1839 and 1840 we moved to Houston county, Texas. In November, 1844, we moved to Harrison county, Texas where we now reside. We, your mother and I, joined the M. E. Church, at Old Border, under Brother Bellamy's pastorate, in Oct. 1852, and have been trying to live consistent lives ever since. Your mother was born Jan. 3, 1819 in the State of Kentucky; moved with her parents to Lauren co., Kentucky, when she was small; and from there to Noxubee county, Mississippi in 1835. The rest of her life she has spent as an agreeable companion for me. To tell you of our joys and sorrows, our trials and tribulations, would require quite a book. We have been blessed with good health, and the good Lord has let us live to raise all our children, who are doing as well as could be expected for two old, uneducated parents." My parents both died the death of the righteous. God help the children to follow.

DR. JAMES HOWARD TAYLOR DEAD-Well Known Physician Dies at Home in Marshall

Special to the News:

Marshall, Texas, July 6 - Dr. James Howard Taylor, probably the oldest native physician of this county and one of the most prominent and father of Dr. HOLMAN TAYLOR, editor of the Texas Medical Journal, died here Monday. Dr. Taylor was born in Marshall Jan. 4, 1851. Dr. Taylor's mother was a cousin of Luther Burbank. During the receivership of the Texas & Pacific railway he was head of the hospital department, his position terminating with the end of the receivership. For thirty years he had been grand medical adviser of the Ancient Order of United Workmen, which, when he first took hold of it, had a jurisdiction including Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma and Louisiana. He made it a safe organization in which to become a member, but resigned four or five years ago. Dr. Taylor and Miss MOLLIE A. HOWARD were married in Marshall in 1873, and to them were born three children, Dr. HOLMAN TAYLOR of Fort Worth, Mrs. E. B. HAYES* of Marshall and Mrs. R. Y. WALKER of Belton, all of whom (*MABEL TAYLOR HAYES, also grand-daughter of JAMES F. TAYLOR)

were with him at the end. He is survived also by two sisters and two brothers, the former being Mrs. SALLIE HORTON of Shreveport and Mrs. W. W. FIELDS of Haskell and the brothers, H. H. TAYLOR and L. _____ TAYLOR of Marshall. Dr. R. C. HALL, son of Mrs. Horton is his nephew. He held membership in all the local Masonic bodies.

Dr. John B. Bush, of Carroll, Pope, Johnson, Franklin, and Sebastian Counties, Arkansas, b. 1801 in Ky, d. 18 March 1859 in Ark., married Rachel Monroe, b. 16 December 1805 Mo. or Ky., d. 27 March 1864. Of their children, Dr. Palemon Cage Bush came to Denton County, Texas, and is buried in the Elizabethtown Cemetery in that county. William and John A. Bush also came to Texas. Two daughters remained in Ark, Sarah Elizabeth Bush Turner (some of whose family came to Texas) and Adelia AnnEliza Bush Davis Huckel. Another daughter, Rachel Caroline Bush married Samuel Thomas Hagar.

Samuel Thomas and Rachel Caroline Hagar came to Texas in the 1870s, are on the 1880 census of Travis County, Texas. He died 9 July 1897 in Stephens County, Texas, and is buried in the Acker Cemetery. She died 3 February 1927 in Eastland County, Texas, and is buried in the Simpson Cemetery.

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
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
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President's Page
