News from the Library

One of the most famous genealogists of the old school said in print that he used to shudder every time he visited a genealogical library and saw all the people copying busily away from the books. Many people seem to have an idea that if something is in print, it must be true. One very nice regular patron of ours has compiled eight generations on all her lines in two years, using only books in this library; her pedigree may be accurate, but knowing some of the sources she has used, it is doubtful.

No librarian is going to tell you not to use books. This librarian is going to tell you to use them, judiciously. What really counts in proving a pedigree is direct evidence, which comes from primary sources, such as public records, Bible records, and materials contemporary to the event in question. The main role of the genealogical book is to lead you to the primary sources, or to fill in the background for your ancestors' story.

Compiled family histories are the greatest offenders against genealogical accuracy. A good family history can save you much time; if you can establish its accuracy, there is no need to repeat the research. A family history that is questionable may still provide valuable clues, but should be used only to direct the researcher to sources of original records. The most well-researched family histories may include some questionable conclusions, since genealogists are human and may make mistakes.

Here are four rules to be used in evaluating family histories.

1. Does the author list the sources from which he has gotten his material?
2. Does he present evidence to back up each conclusion?
3. Are there any glaring discrepancies in dates? One family history in our collection includes a man who died 120 years before the birth of his wife.
4. Does he quote frequently from primary source materials? (The best family histories include the full text of the most important ones.)

Other genealogical books have usually been reviewed in genealogical periodicals. The reviews in the *National*

Genealogical Society Quarterly and *The American Genealogist* are the best; other periodicals tend to be descriptive, rather than critical.

The reaction that the library staff frequently gets when we caution a patron about a book is "Why do you keep it in the library if we can't trust it?" The answer of course is that books by men like Weis, Wurts, Browning, and Boddie contain much good, accurate genealogy along with many errors, and that they are invaluable as clues. They must be used only as such.

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A new periodical in the Southwest and Genealogy Department promises to be one of the most useful since the *Helper*. *The Family Tree* is published in Denver by a company called Genealogical Heritages, Ltd., which has developed an automated method of genealogical research. A most impressive account of the company's computerized operations appears in the first issue.

Some of the regular features of the periodical will be ship passenger lists, early maps, heraldry, where to write for help, and an indexed query section.

The ship passenger lists section will for sometime to come be devoted to republishing Hotten's Lists. This is regrettable, since this book is available in an inexpensive reprint edition. What is needed is publication of lists which have never been published. We hope that *The Family Tree* will soon turn to this material.

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The Texarkana Public Library recently sent us a pamphlet completed for the dedication of a historical marker for the Old Harrison Chapel Cemetery in Bowie County. This cemetery is the only evidence of Mooresville, an 1840 settlement on the Sulphur River. The pamphlet includes a list of those buried in the cemetery and an illustrated history of the family of Charles and Mary (Harrison) Moores. This pamphlet is in the Bowie County folder in the Vertical File.

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B O O K - N O T E S

Zora Petty Billingsley, *The Petty and Francis Families*, 1967, 175 pp. Supplement, 1969, 11 p. Available from the author, 1003 W. 48th, Amarillo, Texas 79110 \$15.00.

It is obvious that this book is the result of much research. Four families, the author's paternal, and three of her maternal lines, are featured. Lines of descent are traced from Thomas Jefferson Petty, born 1801 in South Carolina; Robert Henry Francis, born 1805 in Virginia; John Nelson, Sr., born 1719, of Prince William County, Virginia; and Peter Stevens, born 1690 of Frederick County, Virginia.

The book is profusely illustrated with photographs and reproductions of facsimile documents, and is well-indexed. An eleven-page supplement showing births, deaths, and marriages since the publication of the book, as well as additions and corrections to the text, was published in January, 1969.

Mrs. Billingsley has, unfortunately, failed to list sources for her genealogical conclusions, other than a few deeds and wills published in facsimile in the book's first section. This is a serious deficiency in an otherwise good book.

Jesse Harold Neal and Mary Haller Neal *John Wesley Neal, Descendants and Ancestors, 1653-1968*. 1969. (source and price not available).

John Wesley Neal, of Kansas, devout churchman, staunch Republican, loyal G. A. R., was descended from Lieutenant Daniel Neale, a forfeiting landowner of Ireland, who was transported to Virginia in 1653. His grandson has written and illustrated a most interesting account of his ancestry and progeny.

The major part of the book is made up of a careful account of the descendants of Neal. One small section is devoted to his ancestry. References are not cited, although a brief bibliography is included. The book is well-indexed, and seems to be carefully compiled.

Lela Wolfe Prewett, *The Dawkins and Stewart Families of Virginia and Kentucky*. 1969. 154 pp. Available from the author, 501 Carpenter Street, Fairfield, Iowa 52556. \$8.50.

Mrs. Prewett traces the descendants of John Dawkins of Berkely County, Virginia and James Stewart of King George County, Virginia, in this meticulously researched genealogy. She includes many excerpts from original source records. The book is organized in an unusually concise fashion. It employs one of the clearest numbering systems this reviewer has yet seen. Its index is a thing of beauty. Descendants of these men will prize this book for its wealth of information.

David was a Revolutionary soldier and is buried in Tuscaloosa County. 1850 census gives his age as 87, born N.C. [The only thing I don't understand is that Anthony died 6 December 1855 and David's will was made 26 August 1856, but it could be that he did not know Anthony died eight months before. I suppose it is the same Anthony--the only Anthony I have found in Tuscaloosa records.]

JAMES B. WOOD (p. 110). [I have many references to his father, Rev. Bennett Wood. At various times the family lived in Madison and Lawrence Counties, Alabama.]

The following records were abstracted by Mrs. Stanley C. Smith from newspapers on microfilm at Fleming Library, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas. The date of issue in which the notice appeared is shown in parenthesis at the conclusion of each abstract.

"Mary Frances, infant daughter of J.V. and E.A. Wright, departed this life on the morning of the 25th December 1856; aged one year and eight days." (January 14)

J. Thomason Autry, aged 17 years, 8 months and 7 days, died on the 29th of December last. Signed: H. Green. Caldwell, Texas, January 5, 1857. "Tennessee Baptist please copy." (January 14)

Owen J. Aldridge died 20 December 1856. "He was a young minister of fine promise, and a recipient of instruction in our University at the time of his death. The father of the deceased sacrificed his life upon the altar of freedom at the 'massacre of Goliad' and the son had come to christianize the land dedicated to liberty by his father's fall." Signed: A Student. Baylor University, Jan. 6, 1857. (Jan. 14)

"We have just received a letter from brother J.N. Halbert, of Bastrop, giving us the mournful intelligence that brother J.B. Stiteler is dead. He died at Savannah, Ga. on the 25th of December last. . . . no other particulars at present." (January 28)

Dr. Joseph Morton Evans died 9 January 1857. He was born Edgefield District, S.C. 10 May 1805, and married 27 January 1833 Miss Mannerva S. Harrison. Joined Big Creek Baptist Church in Pickens County, Ala. in the fall of 1841 and was baptized by Elder O. Stuart. Moved to Texas 1846 and joined the Huntsville Baptist Church in the fall of 1847. [Mention is made of the "deeply afflicted wife"] Signed: W.D.C. (January 28)

Mrs. Leonard D. Oliphant died 22 December 1856. She was born 7 May 1817; married 30 December 1835 B.A. Oliphant; moved to Texas in 1840. She united with the Huntsville Baptist Church in 1748 [sic]. Survived by husband, eight children, and aged mother, one sister and brother. Signed: J.W.D.C. (Jan. 28)

Abstractor's note: It is possible that the name of the deceased was Leonora D. Oliphant?

At a called meeting of Terrill Lodge, No 83, held in the town of Alto, Cherokee County, Texas: A tribute of Respect written in memory of Willis Selman, Jr., deceased. It was stated that copies were to be sent to the following newspapers: The Texas Baptist, Cherokee Sentinel, and The American Freemason of Louisville, Ky. Signed: M.H. Leppmins, D.A. Gates, W.M. Gates, E. Harvy, and John A. Amonett. (January 28)

Mr. Solomon H. Larkin died 24 December at the residence of Dr. W.A. Reavis. He was a native of Franklin County, Tenn., "where his parents now reside." He came to Texas in 1853 or 1854, and was a teacher. He was married 6 weeks prior to his death to Miss Mary A. Reavis. "His age was 27 years." (January 28)

Mr. Joseph House died in Waco, Texas 11 January 1857, of pneumonia. "Mr. House was a stranger among us. He had brought a load of goods from Houston to Waco. He had taken a severe cold on the road, perhaps in Washington coun-[3 words illegible] mother now lives. I have written to his mother at Brenham." References indicate that he was buried at Waco. Signed: S.G. O'B. (February 11)

Willie, only son of E.J. and Frances Chance, died on the 23 inst. He was aged nine months, nineteen days. Signed: M.K.S. Caldwell, Jan. 24th, 1857. (February 11)

Mary Collins died 21 December 1856 in the 26th year of her age. "She was the adopted daughter of John and Mary Gillespie, by whom she was raised." She was married 4 February 1847 to J.L. Collins. "She professed religion in 1855 at a Methodist meeting. She was afterwards baptized by D.B. Morrill, and became a member of Oakland Baptist Church. . . ." Survived by husband and three children. Signed: A Friend. (February 18)

Mrs. Nancy Dulany became ill on 7 July 1856 and died several days later, "in the 43rd year of her age." She was married in 1838 to Isaac Dulany and moved to Jackson County, Ala., where she remained until the autumn of 1853, when she moved to Texas. "Her husband died on Galveston Island with cholera and left her 'a stranger in a strange land,' but she met with kind friends and came on to Austin County, where her relatives lived. Here she remained nearly three years." [The writer refers to the deceased as a beloved sister, and of their childhood together - gathering flowers, and nuts, and going to Singing or Sabbath School on Sabbath morn - and to her baptism at age 20.] Signed: J.B.B. Belville, Austin County, Texas, Feb. 15th, 1857. (March 4)

Mary A. Jackson files administrator's notice upon estate of W.B. Jackson, deceased, stating she has filed her final account with said estate, and petitions for discharge therefrom. (March 11)

Wm. W. Walker, of Boyle County, Kentucky, aged about nineteen years, died at the residence of J.M. Davis near San Marcos, Texas on the 14th instant. "The deceased came to Texas about eighteen months ago on a visit and expected to return to Ky. again this spring, which appeared to be his whole desire." "Western Recorder and Danville, Kentucky Tribune will please copy." (March 25)

Mrs. Malinda G. Goodson, consort of the late B. W. Goodson, died at her residence near Chappell Hill, Washington County, Texas on the 10th of October last, aged forty-one years. "Her maiden name was Anderson. Mrs. Goodson was a native of Triggs County, Georgia [sic], where she resided about ten years, when her parents moved to Conecuh County, Ala., thence to Montgomery County, Ala. where she was married to Mr. Goodson in her eighteenth year. In 1850 Mr. Goodson and family moved to Washington County, Texas. Here they lived quietly until death invaded the family circle, first a beloved son, then the venerable father, and last, the lamented mother. They now sleep quietly, side by side in Providence church yard." Survived by a son, a daughter, some grandchildren, and many relatives. Signed: C.

Chappell Hill, Texas, March 5th, 1857. (March 25)

Miss Mary Braden died in Leon County February 1st, of winter fever, according to letter received by the writer. Signed: H., Belton, March 1857. (April 1)

Bernard Brewster died 9 November 1856 in Denton County, Texas. He was born in Vermont in 1791, emigrated to Ohio in 1815, and was graduated from Miami College. He was married to Miss Charity Heser, with whom he lived until her death. Emigrated to Texas, settling near Crockett, where he was employed as a school teacher, and less than one year before his death moved to Denton County. Survived by "an only son." Signed: J.M. Myers, Farmer's Branch, March 11th 1857. (April 1)

J. J. Richards died February 1857. He was born in Jasper County Ga. 16 February 1815. He moved with his family to Tuscaloosa County, Ala.; joined Salem Church in Alabama, and in 1851 moved with his family to Anderson County, Texas. Survived by wife and children. "Alabama Baptist please copy." (April 1)

Benjamin Harris died October 1, 1856. He was born in Blount County, Tennessee. ". . . came to Walker County, Georgia where he was married to Miss Margaret H. Renfro, Sept. 4th, 1845. . . . Bidding a long adieu to his widowed mother and to all his heart held dear . . . , he removed to Texas in the fall of 1851." He was a member of Cross Timbers Church. Survived by wife and three children. Amanda mentioned as deceased. Signed: H.C. Renfro. (April 8) [See *Footprints*, Vol 12, No 4, p. 143, for obituary of Amanda Sophronia Harris.]

"Departed this life on the 30th of March last, little Tabitha Anderson, daughter of Dr. C.L. Anderson, of Montgomery, and the last, save himself, of a once happy and interesting family." April 18)

Allen B. Hall died at his residence in Washington County, Texas "in the thirty-third year of his age", leaving a wife and five little chil----[torn]. He was among those members constituting Mt. Zion Church, of which he was a member at time of his death. Survived by wife and children. (April 15)

William C. Smith, administrator of estate of John Trant, deceased, has filed his final account with said estate, with petition praying a discharge. Petition to be heard at next term of the County Court for probate of wills, etc., at Anderson, Grimes County, on the last Monday in April, 1857. (April 22)

Mrs. Sophia Walton died at Caldwell, Burleson County, Texas on the 15th inst., in the sixty-sixth year of her age. She was born in the State of Virginia. She has lived in different states. For a number of years she has been a member of the Baptist church; and for the last five or six years her membership has been at this place." Signed: J.G. Thomas Caldwell, April 20th, 1857 (April 29)

"Sister Sitnah Tucker [illegible]. This venerable mother in [illegible] companion of Elder Jeremiah Tucker, of such ministerial distinction in Tennessee and Mississippi, and who died in Marshal County, Miss.; and the mother of our esteemed brother, George Tucker, so generally and favorably known in Texas and other southern states. She was born in South Carolina June 30, 1787; moved to Wilson County, Tenn., and joined the Baptist church about fifty years ago, and thence to Marshal County, Miss. She came last spring to visit some children in Bell County; but age and general debility so paralyzed and prostrated her physical system that death soon marked her for his own. She died at her son, Dr. Tucker's, near Belton, Bell County, Texas, April 11th, 1857, aged 69 years, 9 months and 11 days. She had expressed but one regret of dying here, and that was that she wished to be buried by the side of her husband, but according to her request and from a sense of filial duty, her sons started with her remains to Marshal county, Miss." Signed: John Clabaugh, Belton, April, 1857. (May 20) "From Special Request, the Tennessee Baptist will please copy."

P. Garrett, wife of John Garrett, was born Columbia County, Georgia in 1790, where she lived until 1824. She then moved to Pickens County, Alabama, where, in 1844, she united with the Garden Baptist Church. In 1849 she moved to Nacogdoches County, Texas where she died 6 May 1857 at the home of a son-in-law, M.M. Sanders.

"By special act of the New Salem Baptist Church on May 16th

1857, the Texas Baptist is requested to publish the above, and the Tennessee Baptist, South-western Baptist and Christian Index are requested to copy." Signed: N. Conner, Moderator (June 3)

Lucy W. Johnson, consort of the late Jesse Johnson, was born Oglethorpe County, Georgia 14 January 1798. At the age of eighteen she wished to be baptized "but she was told that she would be discarded by her father." In 1848 moved to Texas, joined the Missionary Baptist Church at Gonzales - subsequently moved and joined the Lockhart church, where she lived until her death on 13 March 1857. (June 24)

"Dear Brother Baines: Before I send you for publication, the painful intelligence of the deaths of most of old brother Giles Martin's family.

"In April last, I went to Sardis Church as usual, and on Sabbath many were complaining of being unwell, and some had to leave and go home, and in a few days the measles broke out in the neighborhood, and during that month the most of the people to took it. I went back Saturday before the third Sabbath in May, and found most all sick. Had no meeting on Saturday. Sabbath, preached to a few at a distance; and then spent the day in visiting the sick, and found the measles running into the flux; and then the work of death commenced. Brother John H. Martin (oldest son of brother Giles Martin), his three oldest children, and one servant died; leaving a wife and one child to mourn their loss. The next was his second sons wife, the wife of William Martin and her two youngest children, leaving him and his oldest child to mourn. The next family was a son-in-law, brother G.W. Jennings*. He lost his wife and youngest child; leaving him and one child to mourn. Then the work of death came next to the old man's dwelling. Two of his servants first died, then three orphan children, Marion, John and Emily, the orphans of Jesse Martin, leaving the oldest orphan to mourn. The next, D.A. Martin, his fourth son, then his youngest daughter, Ruth, then last of all, old sister Nancy Martin, formerly of Edgefield District, South Carolina. She was named Coleman before marriage. Was married to G. Martin Feb. 20th, 1820; and in the fall of 1830, she was received into the Salem Baptist Church, Edgefield District, South Carolina. In the fall of 1847, brother and sister Martin moved to Cherokee County, Texas, and settled where she died in the fall of 1853. She was one of the number in the constitution of the Sardis Baptist Church near where she lived and died. . . .

Robert Atchison died 26 June 1857. "At a regular meeting of the Baptist church at this place, Elder J.G. Thomas, by request, in the Moderator's chair. . . . A.K. Dodd, J.H. Mundine, and O.H.P. Garrett were appointed a committee to draft resolutions expressing the grief of the church at the loss by death of her beloved member and deacon. . . ." Lexington, Burleson county, Texas, July 11th, 1857. (July 29)

William T. Streett died at his residence in Freestone County, Texas on August 1, 1857, aged 47 years and 3 days. He was born in North Carolina, removed from there to Alabama, and thence to Texas. "Early in life he married Mary W., daughter of Joseph Hartley, of Alabama, whom he now leaves a widowed mother, and eight children. . . ." Before her death she desired much to see an absent sister." (Sept. 2)

A.S. Richardson was appointed administrator of the estate of Archibald McKee, deceased, at May term of Probate Court, Grimes County, Texas. (Sept 2)

Cyrus E. Jones, administrator of estate of John Rice Jones, deceased, advertises public sale of one fourth league land, the headright of James Darwin, located 12 miles from Hempstead. Mr. Shelton lives on the land. (Sept. 9)

W.A. Rennolds, administrator of estate of Emily M. Adkins, deceased, has filed his final account with said estate. (Sept. 9)

A.S. Richardson appointed administrator of estate of Ellen O. Smith, dec'd., at August term of Court 1857. (Sept. 9)

Elder Hampton Whatley died at his residence on North Sulphur, in Fannin County, on the 3d day of March 1857. He had been a minister for 30 years, and moved with his family from Georgia about 5 or 6 years previous to his death. (October 14)

LIBRARY OPENS IN DALLAS

The newest address for your genealogical directory is Number One Turtle Creek Village, Room 410, Dallas, Texas. This the new LDS Branch Genealogical Library, a facility which promises to bring the world to North Texas, genealogically speaking. Through the Branch Library we area genealogists will have access to the vast microfilm resources of the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

The shelves of the library are still relatively bare (note: donations are accepted, which is one way for us non-LDS genealogists to show our appreciation for the generosity of our Mormon friends in providing this facility); however, its main treasure is the microfilm copy of the locality section of the card catalog of the great library in Salt Lake City. Not only does this index show film available through the Branch but through extensive analytical references it leads the researcher to material in books and periodicals in other genealogical collections which he might otherwise never have found.

Besides the films of local, county and state records filmed by the LDS Genealogical Society, all federal census films and National Archives passenger list films are available through the Branch Library.

Films may be ordered in two ways: for a two-week period, at a cost of fifty cents plus ten cents postage, or for an indefinite period (another way to help build the library) for \$2.50 plus postage.

The library opened on November 3rd. It is staffed by volunteers who give four hours once a week to operating it. The librarian is Mrs. Della Taylor. Hours of Service are 9:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and 9:00 to 5:00 on Saturdays.

For those who are less than enthusiastic about driving in Dallas, the library is easily accessible by public transportation. Take the turnpike express bus to the Continental Trailways Station, then walk four blocks north to Commerce Street and catch a "36" (Preston Hollow Express). Get off one stop past the intersection of Oak Lawn and Blackburn. The library is in the large office building in the center of the shopping center.

From the Dallas Herald, 30 April 1870, page 2, column 3:

"On night of Monday, April 11, about 1:00 o'clock Captain John Salmon, Fayette Latham, Joseph Brady McDow & _____ Morrison, hearing the noise of mares whose colts had been killed which were being driven off by Indians, lay in wait for the red thieves. The Indians coming up were charged three times by the party above named. There were 9 Indians and 4 white men. The fight resulted in the rout of the Indians with one killed. The hardest of the struggle was over the body of the dead Indian which the whites failed to get. Fayette Latham was badly wounded in one of his legs. No whites killed. This hot fight took place 12 miles north west of the village of Stephenville in Erath Co. Twenty-five of the stolen horses were recovered by the brave men we have mentioned."

Mrs. Am . F. Featherston, wife of Wm. B. Featherston, died at Boston, Bowie County, Texas, 12 October 1857, aged about 30 years. "She was the daughter of Allen and Martha R. Talbot, of Lynchburg, Va., at which place she was born, raised, and educated, and was married to her now bereaved husband the 28th of March 1844." She joined the Baptist church in Lynchburg in 1843. Survived by husband and five children. (Nov 4, 1857)

Mrs. Martha Jane Vanderslice died in Harrison County, Texas 30 August 1857, aged 26 years. She was the daughter of Isaac and Nancy Beck. Professed religion when about 18 years of age "at Oak Mulgee in Perry County, Alabama. Married to rother (torn) B. Vanderslice in June 1847, emigrated to Texas in the month of December following." Member Ash Spring Church. Leaves 3 children (part torn) mother and a host of friends. Signed: W. A. Smith (Nov 11, 1857)

Mrs. Clementine Patterson died "at the residence of Col. S. Atchison, her brother-in-law, in Caldwell, Texas, on the 16th ult." She was a native of Chatham County, N. C., born 4 Feb 1810, daughter of James C. and Catherine Barber. When she was 15 years of age she became the wife of Dr. John T. Patterson. Joined Mt. Moriah Baptist Church, near Chapel Hill, in N. C. "Subsequently she emigrated with her husband to Robertson County, Tenn., thence to Hardeman County, Tenn., thence to San Augustine in this state, where for want of a Baptist church she was induced to join the Methodist Episcopal connection, with whom she remained to the time of her death. She left a son in California and a daughter (Mrs. Dr. Spencer) residing in New Orleans. Her husband, Dr. Patterson, died some years ago in Shreveport, La."

Signed: J. G. Thomas. "P. S. Tennessee Baptist is requested to copy, as many of her relations are in that state and read that paper."
J. G. T. (Nov 11, 1857)

Andrew Oliver, born Pendleton District, South Carolina, 22 February 1771, died in Williamson County, Texas, 27 October 1857, aged 86 years, 8 months, and 5 days. He had been a Baptist for about 42 years. Signed: W. A. M. (Nov 11, 1857)

"Died, on the 13th of September, 1857, while his parents were on their way from Missouri to Cook County, Texas, Lorenzo, son of brother Ezekiel and sister Elizabeth Lindsay, aged 9 months and 26 days." (Nov 11, 1857)

Harriett Mooring, age 15, second daughter of G. M. and L. Mooring, "died 6 November ... (torn)." She was born in Liberty (now Polk) County, Texas, Dec. 5, 1842, and "died at Independence, Washington County, Texas, 5 Nov. 1857." (Nov 11, 1857)

Dr. John L. Graves, born Caswell County, N. C., 12 Feb. 1793, died 30 August 1857. "His relative, Dr. George W. Graves," was with him. He was graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1814 "and commenced reading Medicine with Dr. Edward Fowlkes, and graduated in Medical Dept. of the University of Pennsylvania in March, 1817." Returned to his native county to practice medicine; moved to Georgia in 1824, having just married Miss Martha Groves. "Remained in Newton, Ga., until winter of 1854 when he moved to Independence, Texas. Mentioned: a bystander was called in to witness his will. Signed: Rufus C. Burleson. Baylor University, Nov. 1, 1857. "Biblical Recorder and Southwestern Baptist please copy." (Nov 25, 1857)

Died: in Collin (torn) October 30th 1857, the little (torn) John M. Holly, son of J. W. (torn) Holly, aged 6 years and 5 months. Signed: H. C. Cates (torn) Teacher. (Nov 25, 1857)

Mrs. Martha West died Sept. 1857, age 54 years. "She was the youngest daughter of Isham Nettles, a Baptist minister, and among the first to preach the Gospel of Peace west of the Mississippi.... Her husband was taken from her in 1837, when she was left the earthly guardian of seven children, six sons and one daughter, the youngest of which, a son, died in infancy...." Signed: W. B. P., Moscow, Oct. 24, 1857. (Nov 25, 1857)

Wm. T. Glenn departed this life on the 5th inst. He emigrated to Texas with his father-in-law, brother Isaac Pool, from Mississippi in the fall of 1851. In 1855 he professed faith at Black House Springs, Milam County, and joined Little River Church. Survived by wife and four children. Signed: J. J. H., Willow Springs, Dec. 8, 1857. (Dec. 16, 1857)

Major Cullen Andrews died at his residence in Victoria Co., Texas, 4 Nov. 1857, in the 61st year of his age. He was born in North Carolina and married in or near the city of Raleigh. He and his wife joined Raleigh Baptist Church in 1823 or 1824, and in about the year 1834 he emigrated to the Western District of Tennessee where he lived eight years. He moved about 1842 to Mississippi, where he resided several years, and in 1850, he moved to Texas. In Texas he was a member of the church at Mission Valley. "Brother Andrews had been in Texas about seven years during which time he had lost his wife, four grown sons, one daughter, one daughter-in-law, and two grandchildren. Signed: J. J. Lowdermilk. "The Tennessee Baptist and Raleigh Register will please copy." (Dec 16, 1857)

Mr. Henry Bates died at his residence in Shannon Prairie, Grimes County, Texas on the 31st ult., aged 72 years and 8 months. He was born in Barnwell District, South Carolina, and emigrated to Texas in 1840. Survived by wife and children. (Jan 6, 1857)

Mrs. Rebecca Ellison, consort of Judge Wm. Ellison of Caldwell County, Texas, died 16 November 1857. She was born 3 November 1805 in the state of Kentucky; joined the Baptist Church in 1833 in the state of Mississippi; emigrated to Texas in 1849. "A bereft and heart stricken husband, a numerous family and the Lockhart Church mourn her loss." Signed: R. E. Calahan. "Southern Recorder please copy." (Mar 11, 1857)

Seaburn Shaw died at his residence near Millwood, Collin Co., Texas, 7 Oct. 1857, in the 61st year of his age. He "was born in North Carolina and raised in Kentucky; was married to Miss Melinda Hail in 1830; professed religion and united with the Baptist Church at Franklin, Ky., in 1834; emigrated to Texas in 1853; united with the Mount Pleasant Church at its constitution in June last." Family mentioned. Signed: R. E. Calahan. "Southern Recorder please copy." (Mar 11, 1858)

Mrs. Amanda C. Bowdon, wife of Elder W. J. Bowdon, and daughter of S. R. and Martha A. Barns, died in Limestone County, Texas, 24 Jan. 1858. She was born in Dyer County, Tenn., 9 Nov. 1827; made a profession of faith in De Soto County, Miss. in August 1845, and was baptized into fellowship of Bethel Church by Elder George Tucker; was married Dec. 31, 1845." Survived by her husband and four small children. Signed: R. (Apr 8, 1857)

"Died - at his residence near Wharton, after a short illness, brother Alfred Caraway, in the fifty-fourth year of his age." Member, Baptist Church 26 years. Survived by large number of friends and relatives. Signed: J. H. S. Wharton, Wharton Co., Texas, March 26, 1858.

(Apr 8, 1858)

"Brother Walter Barkley departed this life in Tyler County, Texas, at his residence, on the 25th of June 1857; aged 82 years. Brother Barkley was born in Roan County, N. C., the 29th of April 1775. He moved from there to Kentucky, and was baptized into the fellowship of the Vine Fork Baptist Church. He was married to Miss Elizabeth McQueen, in 1803, or 1804. In 1807 he removed to Franklin County, Tennessee, and in Limestone County attached himself to Round Island Church. From Tennessee he removed to Lawrence County, Alabama, and in 1837 he removed to Tyler County, Texas, and attached himself to a Predestinarian Church, and not being satisfied with their doctrine, he quit them; and as soon as Bethel Church, At Woodville, Tyler County, was organized, he cast his lot with them, with whom he lived in full fellowship until his death." Survived by his widow, "the companion of his youth." Resolution signed by: M. M. Willey and J. S. Riley, Clerk, and G. Sumrall, Moderator. "The Tennessee Baptist will please copy." (Apr 8, 1858)

Mary K. Lusk, youngest child of Major Sam. Lusk and his wife, A. Lusk, died the last day of February, age 14 years and 10 months. She was born 7 May 1843, and was a student at Baylor University - staying with her sister, Mrs. Crumpler, while attending school at Independence. Signed: R. C. Burleson. Baylor University, April 3, 1858. (Apr 15, 1858)

Capt. James Whaley died at Kentucky Town, Texas, 19 Dec. 1857. He was born in Kentucky 25 March 1846 (faded). "He has left his wife, Sister Nancy Whaley - many friends, relatives." ("Dear little daughter" mentioned). Signed: John M. Gentry. "Western Recorder please copy." (Apr 15, 1858)

Tribute of Respect to Morton R. Garrett who died 9th day of May 1828 (sic), "and although not a member of this lodge, was known to be a zealous Mason, and was regularly admitted from the Oakland Lodge in the State of Tennessee." (His widow is mentioned, but not named.) Resolution adopted by Montgomery Lodge, No. 25, 12 June 1858. Signed by A. Hemphill, S. Martin, and D. Dealy, Com.; and C. Jones, Secretary. (July 22, 1858)

Mr. Cornelius C. Cox departed this life July 2, 1858, "at Mrs. Dr. J. M. Evans', near Huntsville, Texas. He was the son of Samuel and Narcissus Cox, and was born November 30, 1834, in Bibb County, Ala. Mr. Cox had been in our community some two years. (Reference is made to death of an uncle in June 1857.) Survived by widow and children. Signed: J.W.D.C. (July 22, 1858)

Editor's Note: The following obituary is not in order in which copied. It appears, however, to be a corrected version of the one immediately above, although that fact was not stated. It is placed here for the convenience of interested persons. MBS.

Columbus C. Cox died July 2, 1858 "at Mrs. Dr. J. M. Evans' near Huntsville, Texas. He was son of Samuel and Narcissa Cox, and was born Nov 3, 1834, in Bibb Co., Ala." He had lived in the community some two years. (Reference is made to death of his uncle-his name not stated-which occurred January 9, 1857.) Mr. Cox was married in the fall of 1855 to Miss Frances P. Roberts and moved to Texas in 1856. Survived by widow and child. Signed: J.W.D.C. Huntsville, Texas, July, 1858. (Sept 2, 1858)

Dr. T. J. Hargis died at his residence in Caldwell County 15 June 1858, at age 32. He was a native of Missouri and emigrated to Texas in November, 1854. He joined the Baptist church at age 16. Survived by wife and three children. (July 22, 1858)

Mrs. Mary Ann Berry died near Victoria, Victoria County, Texas, July 4th in the thirty first year of her age. She was born Upson County, Va.; (sic) raised in Talbot, Ga.; joined the Baptist church at Mt. Vernon, Talbot Co., Ga. in the year 1845. Her father, Granberry Clay, moved to Texas in 1849. At time of her death, Mrs. Berry was member of the church at Mission Valley. Her father, mother, and one sister are deceased. Survived by husband and one son, age 18 months. Signed: J. I. Loudermilk "Christian Index will please copy." (Aug. 12, 1858)

Henry Wise, in the sixth year of his age, died in Austin County, Texas, at the residence of his father, J. L. Wise. "Mississippi Baptist will please copy." (Aug. 12, 1858)

Resolution: upon the death of the Rev. Gilbert D. Morgan, former professor of Mathematics at Baylor University, by some of his friends and fellow professors. Copy to be sent to his aged father, to The Texas Baptist and to The Tennessee Baptist. Signed: R. C. Burleson, Chairman, and D. R. Wallace, Secretary. Independence, Washington Co., Texas, Baylor University Building, July 16, 1858. (Aug. 12, 1858)

Abram W. Frear, Attorney at Law, of this place, died 6 August 1858, aged about 29 years. He was son of Elder Wm. Frear of Eaton Trope, Wyoming Co., Pa. He was "far from kindred and the land of his nativity." (It is implied that his father was living, but name not given.) Signed: Jno. P. Osterhout. Bellville, Aug. 14, 1858. (Sept. 2, 1858)

Elixabeth Lawson, daughter of Dr. I. M. and J. A. Fort, died at Boston, Bowie Co., Texas, August 1, 1858, aged 7 years and 5 months. (Oct. 7, 1858)

Linda Diane Coleman, age 2 years and 11 months, died "just two weeks after the fond and devoted parents had been called upon to commit to earth their first born." (Oct. 7, 1858)

Nancy L. Farquhar died near Boonville, Brazos Co., Texas, August 1st in the 29th year of her age. "Sister Farquhar was born in Wythe County, Virginia. Her parents moved to Hindes County, Mississippi, when in her fifth year, where she was principally raised. She joined the Baptist church in Hindes County about the year 1845, moved to Texas in 1849." At time of her death she was a member of Minter Spring Church. Survived by husband and "two little boys." A resolution followed the obituary. It was signed by: A. W. Elledge, Moderator, and J. H. McGregor, Clerk. Third Sabbath in August, 1858. (Oct. 14, 1858)

Mrs. Elizabeth Pearce died near Boonville, Brazos County, Texas, 2 Oct. 1858. She was born Warren County, Ga., 1799, daughter of Jacob and Darcos Johnson; moved to Twiggs County about the year 1812. She was married in 1824 to Jacob Pearce and moved to Texas in the fall of 1846.

(Oct. 28, 1858)

John Adkins, infant son of Wm. L. and Susan Adkins, of Colorado Co., Texas, was born July 9th 1856, and departed this life August 6, 1858." (Oct. 28, 1858)

William Castles died at his residence in Nacogdoches County, 3 October 1858, age 60 years. Survived by three children, John, James, and Mary (a "sweet little girl"). Signed: A friend. (Nov. 4, 1858)

"William D. Norton, who came to Texas from Bedford County, Tennessee in 1852, died at his own residence in Anderson, Grimes County, Texas, on the 12th day of October.... At the request of Mrs. Norton, her son, William G. Whitney, son of James G. Whitney of Shelbyville, Tennessee, who came with her and his stepfather to Anderson in 1852 and died the next year, was taken up and his remains buried in the same grave with Mr. Norton's...." (Nov. 11, 1858)

Mrs. Mary M. A. Nowlin, wife of J. W. Nowlin, Esq., died 27 Oct. 1858 "at her father's house-B. D. Arnoul." Survived by husband and two small children. Signed: Pastor. (Nov. 11, 1858)

Annette C. Ray died 26 September 1858 at her father's residence in Kentucky Town, Texas. She was age 10 years, 7 months and 15 days, daughter of Z. and Elizabeth A. Ray. Signed: S. J. Wright. (Oct. 28, 1858)

"Col. Timothy Pillsbury, the first Representative in Congress from the Eastern District of Texas, died at his residence, near Henderson, Rusk County, on the 23d ult. Col. Pillsbury was in the 69th year of his age." (Jan. 13, 1859)

"B. F. Tankersley, Esq., died at his residence in Houston on the 1st inst." (Jan. 13, 1859)

"Died-at Waverley, on the 13th ult., Almira Ildegert, infant daughter of Mr. G. Gustave and Mrs. Partima O. Fitze, aged one year, three months, and one day." (Jan. 13, 1859)

W. G. Ray died October 1858, three days after returning from a trip to Eastern Texas. Wife mentioned (not named): "Though far from her father's house, she is among true friends, and brother Ray's brother and sisters can truly be said to be hers." Signed: J. C. H. (a minister who had baptized W. G. Ray 18 months before his death). (Jan. 20, 1858)

John Haggard died 11 December 1858 in the 65th year of his age. "He emigrated from Virginia to Kentucky, when that flourishing State was in its infancy-knew what it was to endure the trials and hardships of frontier life-raised a large and respectable family, part of whom are still residing there, and part in Missouri. Two years ago he emigrated to the Far West with his youngest son, and settled in Collin County.... The chosen one of his youth, the partner of his joys and sorrows, was called to her reward about eleven years ago, leaving the father and son alone with none but the servants." The son was but a little boy when his mother died. John Haggard united with the Baptist Church in Clark County, Kentucky at about age 17. His funeral service was conducted by "Brother Portman." Signed: R. R. Shelburne. (Feb. 17, 1859)

John J. Brown died at his residence in Fannin County, Texas, on Sunday evening, December 26, 1848 (sic). At a called meeting of Mt. Zion (formerly Pleasant Grove) Church, a resolution, dated December 28, 1858, was presented by Lewis Whitfield-upon decease of their fellow member. Signed: S. J. Wright, Moderator. (Feb. 17, 1859)

Mary Stringer, aged 19 years, 9 months and 7 days, died in McLennan County, Texas, 11 September 1858. She was born in Daviess County, Indiana, 24 November 1838, daughter of L. D. and Susan Stringer. She emigrated, with her parents, to Texas in the fall of 1854. "When Liberty Hill Church was organized on 23 June 1855, her father and mother went into the organization. Mary joined the church 4th Sabbath 1856 while her father was serving as pastor of a protracted meeting, and was baptized by Elder S. G. O'Bryan, the pastor of the church. Signed: J. K. Helton, Bosque County, Jan. 29, 1859. (Feb. 17, 1859)

Death of My Sister "In 1810, my last earthly parent, my mother, died leaving two children, myself, a few weeks old, and my sister, two and a half years old. We were raised under the same roof, by our uncle, Temple, and Aunt Catherine Elliott, who in kindness to us, fully supplied the place of parents. We have never been separated, for any length of time." Mary C. Toler (the sister of the writer) died 16 January 1859. On the 13th the writer spoke to her of the meeting she would "soon have with our uncle and aunt, and many other friends, and with old brother Andrew Broaddus, by whom she was baptized, more than thirty years ago, into the fellowship of Mango Brick Church, in King William County, Virginia...." (Children are referred to, but not named.) Signed: J. C. C. "The Religious Herald, Richmond, Va., will please copy." (Mar. 17, 1859)

Died: On the 2d of February, 1859, at the residence of her husband, Robert Masterson, in Travis County, Texas, Elizabeth Ann Masterson. (Mar. 17, 1859)

SARAH GROVE CEMETERY
CRAWFORD COUNTY, ARKANSAS*

Sarah Grove Cemetery is located in the Dripping Springs neighborhood on the outskirts of the little Figure Five community about ten miles north of Van Buren. It is at the end of a dirt lane just south of the Arkansas Civil War Centennial Commission marker commemorating the skirmish at Dripping Springs.

Copied in the summer of 1969 by Miss Patricia Chadwell, a Woosley descendant, the inscriptions listed were enumerated row by row, working south from the entrance in the northwest corner.

Family tradition says that this cemetery was named for Sarah Woosley, the young daughter of James and Patience Woosley, who was the first person buried there. Her grave, like many others, is marked only with field stone and could not be identified.

Mr. Roy E. Gibson, 4517 Coffee Road, Fort Worth, Texas 76118, submitted the Heffington Bible records and family notes. Mr. Gibson, when submitting the information, stated that the owner of the Bible died in June, 1963, and suggests that anyone interested in this family should contact him.

Mary A. C. (Harvey) Heffington was the daughter of Bennett and Bente(o)r Harvey, who were living in Tishimingo County, Mississippi, as early as 1840; therefore, Mr. Gibson feels that all the marriages recorded in the Bible took place in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. These marriage records are most important because the court house records for that county were destroyed in 1888/9.

Mr. Richard McGehee said, "So far as we know these children were all born in Tishomingo County, Mississippi."

Mr. W. Tom Southward, P. O. Box 43, Tishomingo, Mississippi, was another person who helped Mr. Gibson in his research. He passed away in June of 1963, but advised in a letter dated April 28, 1960: "Roy, I had the papers fixed but the firl made a mess of them. I will send them to you; so I am sending you the papers and you can have them fixed out there and return them to me when you get them made. P. S. The old pages are badly torn hope you can read them." In a letter dated October 7, 1960, Mr. Southward said: "I can't tell you where the Heffingtons were born nor where they were married. They came to Mississippi from S. C. in their early married life. Grandmother Heffington's name before she married Grandfather Heffington was Harvey but her given name I don't know." In a letter dated October 28, 1959 he said, "W. A. Heffington died Jan. 18, 1882; M. A. C. Heffington died Jan. 25, 1890. They are buried at Old Salmen (sic) Church about 9 miles south of Iuka, Miss." January 15, 1960 Mr. Southward said, "Yes, the old Salem Church is Methodist Church and about 2 miles from where the Heffington lived."

Albert Henry Gibson, son of Robert and Maria(h) (Walker) Gibson, natives of Tennessee and Alabama respectively, was born September 9, 1843 near New Hope, Madison County, Alabama. He married Nancy Catherine B. Heffington February 14, 1866 in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Their issue: William Robert, Edward Fletcher, J. Felix, Marvin Festus, Frank H., and Benjamin. Albert Henry Gibson, Civil War veteran, served in Co. K, 2nd Regiment, Mississippi Infantry, C. S. A. He was taken prisoner at the Battle of Gettysburg and remained a prisoner at Fort Delaware till the end of the War. His brother, Jarrett Walker Gibson, served in the same company. He was killed in action at Sharpsburg, Maryland, September 17, 1862. Of this immediate family Albert H., Nancy., William Robert, Marvin F., and Frank H. are buried in the cemetery at Coalgate, Coalgate County, Oklahoma. Edward Fletcher (Mr. Gibson's grandfather) is buried in Bell Springs Cemetery where the little town of Massey in Hill County, Texas, was located, he having died February 28, 1902. J. Felix is buried somewhere in Oklahoma. Albert Henry Gibson died October 12, 1909; Nancy C. Gibson died September 1, 1923; William Robert Gibson died July 9, 1942; Marvin F. Gibson died January 20, 1933; Frank H. Gibson died about 1903. J. Felix Gibson died in the 1940's, and Benjamin Gibson possibly died either as a baby or as a young child before

1892. Albert H. Gibson and his family moved from Tishomingo County, Mississippi to Hill County, Texas in 1892 where they lived for about ten years then moved to near Cairo, Coal County, Oklahoma. In 1907 they moved to Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas. He returned to his son Felix Gibson's home during the summer of 1909 where he passed away about one mile west of Coalgate, Oklahoma. His widow lived in Cleburne, Texas, until 1913 when she returned to Coalgate, Oklahoma, where she died.

A LIST OF REGISTERED VOTERS OF TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS FOR THE YEAR 1867 *

After the demise of the Confederacy, President Andrew Johnson appointed A. J. Hamilton as the provisional governor of Texas in June, 1865. Governor Hamilton had to establish a new state government in its entirety. He appointed new state and local officials, issued a proclamation for assessing and collecting taxes, and set in motion the reconstruction plans of Andrew Johnson.

A newly-elected legislature met August 9, 1866, and shortly thereafter the new governor, J. W. Throckmorton was inaugurated. On August 20, 1866, President Johnson proclaimed the insurrection at an end. In the Congressional elections of 1866, however, the radical Republicans gained control of the Congress and proceeded to upset President Johnson's plans of reconstruction by passing their own reconstruction acts in March of 1867.

The Congressional plan of reconstruction established five military districts and placed the entire area under military control. President Johnson's reconstructed government was set aside. General Philip Sheridan, commander of the military district of Texas and Louisiana, removed Governor Throckmorton, as well as all other elected officials, from office and appointed E. M. Pease as governor.

In February, 1868, a constitutional convention under the Congressional plan of Reconstruction, assembled in Austin. In November of 1869 the people of Texas voted on the constitution and also elected officers for the new government. General Sheridan, about a month after the election, announced that E. J. Davis had defeated A. J. Hamilton in the race for governor. The constitution was also adopted.

Since the voter list was prepared prior to the election of November, 1969, the voter's signature attached to the register constituted an "ironclad oath" to the government of the United States. It has been said that Davis was placed in office by an electorate that included no former soldiers of the Confederate States Army, however, some of the men from Tarrant County who signed the 1867 voter registration list did indeed serve in the Confederate Army.

One thousand one hundred sixty-nine citizens of Tarrant County were registered between July 27, 1867 and November 26, 1869. The voter list was submitted to the Headquarters of the Fifth Military District, the Office of Secretary of Civil Affairs, Austin, Texas, on April 16, 1870 by Charles E. Morse, Captain of the United States Army and Secretary of Civil Affairs.

With the loss of three courthouses prior to March 29, 1876, extant records of Tarrant County are very limited. For this reason the voter list will be very helpful to those interested in Tarrant County families.

*The volume containing the voter list for Tarrant County is to be found in the Archives Division of the Texas State Library, Austin, Texas. A part of the collection of the papers of the Secretary of State, the volume is catalogued as 2-1/170. The transcriber did not examine the entire file to see which county lists were preserved. It should be noted, however, that the volume, because of its size, can not be reproduced except by photostatic process.

News from the Library

The hardest thing about writing one of these columns is remembering the lag between time of writing and time of publication. Your friendly librarian sat down at her typewriter determined to peck out a piece telling you which books to use to plan your vacation; suddenly, she remembered that when you read this, you'll be getting the kids ready for school.

When the school bells ring, and you're wondering what to do with yourself in that silent house, plan to spend several days at the library, because there'll be a flood of interesting new genealogical books during the late summer and early fall. We ordered 92 new titles, nearly all of interest to genealogists, during the month of June.

Two arrivals during June were of special significance. The first, American and British Genealogy and Heraldry; A Selected List of Books, was compiled by P. William Filby, Librarian and Associate Director of the Maryland Historical Society because "Genealogical research was on the increase, and it occurred to me that there must be many librarians throughout the country besieged by genealogists with but few versed in genealogy and with meager collections in the field. So was the idea of the work conceived--to give the librarian a list of books necessary to operate efficiently in the face of this new onslaught."

Although designed as an aid to librarians (the book's publication by the American Library Association bears this out), Mr. Filby's bibliography will be an invaluable aid to the genealogical researcher, if for no other reason than that the entries are bibliographically correct, as they are not in many guides. Incorrect or insufficient bibliographic information makes it virtually impossible to locate a book.

Also, bless his heart, Mr. Filby has included brief notes, descriptive and critical, about most of the titles included. Use these to help you decide how far to trust a title, or to find a better book.

The second item of interest received during June was the 1850 Census of Texas, compiled by Mrs. V. K. Carpenter, and published by Century Enterprises. There are four volumes of census, transcribed completely with the exception of the column markings, and an index volume. The transcription and indexing have been carefully done; use of this set should save many hours at the microfilm reader.

The library staff is at one sad and happy; we are losing Wyman Jones, who, in his six years as Director of the Fort Worth Public Library, has developed it into a busy, vital metropolitan library system. We will sorely miss Mr. Jones, but we are happy for him as he goes to meet the challenges of directing the largest public library system in the world, that of the City of Los Angeles.

Preliminary planning for the new Central library building has been completed. Construction of this building is, of course, contingent upon the bond election to be held in September. Mr. Clark Gillespie, President of the Library Board, recently announced that a site in the north-western part of downtown, near Leonard's home store has been selected. The new building will have 200 metered subterranean parking places, and will thus be far more accessible and useful than our present quarters.

Mrs. Malinda M. Crory died on February 19th. She was a member of the Methodist Church. Survived by husband and eight children. Signed: T. R. M. (March 11, 1858)

Moses Collins died 14 March 1858 in the 73d year of his age. He was born in Barnwell District, S. C., 21 March 1785. "At an early age he moved and settled five miles east of Tuskaloosa, Ala. There he professed religion and joined the Hopewell Baptist Church, in which he lived until about two years before his death...." Signed: Ira M. Camp (Apr 8, 1858)

James H. Robertson died "at the residence of Mrs. R. Wilson, near Austin, Travis County, Texas, on March 16, 1858, in the thirty first year of his age. He was born in Tenn., and carried when young by his father, to Cape Giradeau County, Missouri, where his relatives, except a brother-in-law, now reside." Signed: D. M. W. (Apr 15, 1858)

John O. C. Ferrell, age 12 years, died in Freestone County, Texas, 7 July 1858; son of B. P. Ferrell. Mother mentioned. (July 22, 1858)

Elder Jesse Witt died at Marshall, Texas, November 21, 1858. He was "born in Bedford County, Virginia (the date we have not) and in his native state he spent the youth and vigor of his useful life. More especially in the middle and western portions of it did he labor...until he was called in 1836 to succeed Elder Edward Baptist in the pastoral office in Powhattan County, with Fine Creek and Muddy Creek Churches. After serving these churches for some six or seven years...he was appointed General Agent for the General Association of Virginia, to raise funds for Home or State Missions, in which relation he continued until he came to Texas in the fall of 1857 as a Missionary of the Board of the Southern Biannual Convention, and settled in San Augustine County, in Eastern Texas." He remained in San Augustine for one year, after which he settled in Marshall, Harrison County, Texas, where he was pastor of the Marshall church and one or two others in that county. "Elder Witt was baptized into the fellowship of Liberty Baptist Church, Bedford County, Virginia, in December, 1821, by Elder William Harris. He was ordained to the office of the Christian ministry on 15 September 1827 by Elders Wm. Leftrich, Wm. Harris, James Leftrich, and A. C. Dempsey.

"To whom and when Elder Witt was married, we do not know. Our impression is that he had ten children by his marriage. Five of which we knew personally--four sons and one daughter. The latter (Harriet) died in 1847, in Virginia, and two of his sons (Daniel and Henry) died in Texas. The former sleeps with his pious father in the Marshall Cemetery, and the latter in the town of Montgomery. Edward and Luther Jeter are all that

remain to weep over a departed father, with other relatives and friends in his native state.... The writer has often mingled in the family circle of our departed brother. He was a kind and affectionate husband, a devoted parent...." Signed: J. W. D. C(reath). Huntsville, Texas, December, 1858. "The Religious Herald will please copy." (Jan 13, 1859)

Elder Richard Pace died 28 November 1858 at the residence of his son, Virgil H. Pace, near Huntsville, Walker County, Texas. He was born in Edgefield District, S. C., August 9, 1785, and moved to Georgia in 1794. In 1813 he was baptized into the fellowship of Crooked Creek Baptist Church, Putnam County, Georgia, by Elder Elijah Moseley. He was ordained to the work of the Christian ministry February 15, 1823, by Elders Joel Colley, Benj. Bussey, and John Robertson, by request of the Concord Baptist Church, Morgan County, Ga., which he served as pastor for eight years. Elder Pace moved to Benton County, Alabama, and united with the Jacksonville Baptist Church. He served the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, as pastor, for 15 years. In 1854 he emigrated to Texas and settled in Walker County. He was married in 1806 to Miss Anny Bussey, by whom he had nine children--seven of whom grew to maturity--all of whom were baptized by their father. He is survived by several children and a number of grandchildren. Signed: J. W. D. C(reath). Huntsville, Texas, December, 1858. (Jan 13, 1859)

James P. Davis died of yellow fever at Port Isabel. He had just been appointed to a clerkship in the Customs House for the Rio Grande. He was born in Hardeman County, Tennessee. "While he was an infant, his father emigrated to Texas, in 1835." While a student at Baylor University, he was baptized in September, 1858. "Brother D. was one of those young men whom brother Baylor loves as a brother, and whom he encourages by his friendship. As a congenial spirit, brother Baylor had invited him to his house to study law." Signed: T. (Jan 13, 1859)

Gilbert L. Morgan, former professor of Mathematics at Baylor University, died (date not stated, but July, 1858). In a letter to "Dr. Eaton", Rufus C. Burleson writes of the desire of the deceased to become a minister--his having been licensed by the church at Independence, 14 June 1856--his having been called as supply minister to the church in Houston for six months, and his consecration to the "full work of the ministry by Elder James Huckins and myself on 24 June 1857. "At the end of six months he asked to be relieved from the church, feeling, no doubt, that the peculiar condition and importance of the church in Houston demanded a more experienced preacher. In a few weeks he was married to Miss Mollie, the eldest daughter of Dr. Eddins, formerly of Greensboro', Alabama.... He left Texas a few weeks after, on a visit to his father and relations, near Murfreesboro', Tennessee. While on a steamboat, he contracted a violent cold, which settled in his lungs.... ...returned here in December, 1857.... I called to see him at his father-in-laws, fifteen miles below this place, about the 8th of July...." He was a former student of Dr. Eaton and Union University were names ever dear to his heart." (March 10, 1859)

"Died - on the 9th ult., in Fannin County, Texas, Gideon Manly Smith, aged 6 years." (Mar 10, 1859)

"Died, on the 22d of January, 1859, Robert Rowland, son of Elder J. H.

and Agness H. Rowland, aged one year, one month, and fifteen days." (Mar 10, 1859)

Resolutions adopted by Harmony Church to the memory of Elder M. Lepard, deceased. Copies were to be sent to Almedia Lepard, the Tennessee Baptist, and to the Texas Baptist. "DOne in conference on Saturday before the second Sabbath in February, 1859." Signed J. H. Rowland, Moderator, S. B. Rogers, Clerk. (March 10, 1859)

Abstractor's Note: In October, 1855, Mathias Lepard was minister of Harmony Church, Bellvieu, Texas.

Emily A. B. Thomas died at the residence of her father, Elder J. G. Thomas, in Burleson County, Texas, on Feb. 8, 1859, in the 17th year of herage. She was baptized into the Baptist Church at Caldwell, Burleson County, by Elder D. Fisher about eight years before her death. Survived by ~~father~~, step-mother, brother, and sister. Resolution presented by James Reynolds, Ths. T. Goodwin, J. P. Hill, and T. M. Anderson, Committee, Providence Church, Burleson County. (April 7, 1859)

ABSTRACTOR'S NOTE: A poem, attributed to her brother, J. B. Thomas, was found after he had returned to Cameron where he was a school teacher.

John F. Hall died 19 February at the home of his father in Victoria, Texas, aged 20 years and 19 days. "He was the oldest son of C. G. and Elizabeth Hall, was born and partly raised in the State of Kentucky; removed with his father and thence to Victoria, Texas, when but a boy, with whom, and where, he continued to live...." He was baptized in Victoria by Elder D. B. Morrell. Signed: J. H. Thurmond (who refers to having met the deceased shortly after his arrival in Texas "four years ago." "Tennessee Baptist will please copy." (Apr 14, 1859)

"Elder William B. Prewitt--at a meeting of the Baptist Church at Cold Springs, on Saturday before the 2d Sabbath of this month, the undersigned was appointed to prepare an obituary notice of our deceased pastor, Brother W. B. Prewitt, who died in the full assurance of (part illegible) the 23d ? day of March 1859 in (illegible) year of his age." He was baptized into the fellowship of Bethel Church by J. V. Wright, pastor. Signed: ...Davis, M. S. Hogen, J. M. Maxcy. (Apr 21, 1859)

A. A. Hyde departed this life February 11th, 1859, at the residence of his sister, E-iza (faded) Hatchet, Gonzales County, Texas." He was about 29 years old, a native of Ohio. He joined the Methodist Church at about 18 years of age. In 1858 he joined Ebenezer Baptist Church and was licensed to preach. (Apr 2, 1859)

Elizabeth Putman died 6 February 1859, aged 45 years. She was a consistent member of the Baptist Church. (Apr 2, 1859)

Mrs. Frances Hardin died on the 3d of March, 1859, at the residence of her husband, on Richland Creek, Navarro County, of pneumonia, in the fifty-second year of her age. She was one of the seven who went into the organization of Pin Oak Church on the fourth Sabbath in September, 1858. (May 19, 1859)

John Humphrey died on the 1st day of March, 1859, at the residence of his father, on Richland Creek, of pneumonia. He was in the twenty-seventh year of his age. (May 19, 1859)

Owen C. Brown, age 10 years, died near Anderson, Grimes County, Texas, on Thursday evening, at the residence of his parents, Owen and Cynthia Brown.
(June 2, 1859)

Mrs. Sarah Margaret Willis, wife of Elder Joseph T. Willis, pastor of the church at Mount Zion, Denton County, Texas, died "17th February last, after an illness of 17 days." She was born in Hart County, Kentucky 29 July 1829, daughter of Jesse and Martha Gaddie. She united with the Baptist Church at the Three Forks of Bacon Creek, Hart County, Ky., while young. She was married 28 August 1849 and moved to Texas in the fall of 1853, where she lived as the wife of a pioneering minister. Survived by husband three children. Her two brothers (not named) mentioned as having been present some time before her death. Resolution "done by order of the Church at Mount Zion, Denton County, Texas, the Saturday before the first Lord's day in May, 1859." Signed: Z. B. Carroll, M^{Od}. pro tem; Johnson Walks?, C. Clk. (June 2, 1859) (Note: In a letter to the Editor dated Speer's Mill, Denton County, Texas, Sept. 1, 1859, the Rev. J. T. Willis writes that he expects to leave Texas in a short time to return to Kentucky, the state of his nativity.)

Died in Burleson County, Texas, June 19, 1859, Livinia Bettie Davis____, daughter of Isaac N. and Doreen C. Hitchcock, aged one year and seven months.
(Aug 4, 1859)

Died at Willow Springs, Milam County, Texas, 3 June, Kate Steadman, daughter of Alsey H. and M. C. Allen. Aged 9 months and 4 days. (Aug 4, 1859)

George T. Petty, aged about 45 years, died at his residence near Douglass, in this county, last month, (of injuries sustained from accident, which is described in detail). He was born in Franklin County, Tennessee, in 1817, the eldest child of Alfred and Mary Petty. In 1833 he moved to Pickens County, Alabama, and in 1837 to Noxubee County, Mississippi. He there joined Salem Church. He was married in 1842 to Mariah Sanders, and in 1850 moved to "this State and County" where he helped organize New Salem Church. Survived by his wife and three children. Signed: T. Sanders, Church Clerk. Nacogdoches County, Texas. June 20, 1859. (Aug 4, 1859)

Osborn Goad died 4 July 1859, near Tennessee Colony, Anderson County, Texas, in the 49th year of his age. Mr. Goad was born in Maury County, Tennessee, 30 November 1810. He joined Knob Creek Baptist Church in 1832. In 1850 he moved to Nacogdoches County, Texas, and united with Mount Moriah Church. In 1856 he moved to Anderson County, Texas, and became a member of Macedonia Church at Tennessee Colony. Survived by wife and several children. Resolution signed by: John Vannoy, A. M. Anderson, and R. M. Mynott, Committee, of Macedonia Church. (Aug 4, 1859)

Died at his residence in the town of Helena, Karnes County, Texas, on Thursday, the 7th inst., Mrs. Tempa Spencer, widow of Elijah Spencer, deceased. She was the daughter of Daniel and Martha Brown, and was born in Randolph County, North Carolina. "She had lived in this place since first settlement of the county in 1830, and was one of the small band who united into a Baptist Church at Helena, in 1855, having entered the organization by virtue of a letter from the Baptist church in Harrison County, Texas." Her husband died in 1854, and "a daughter died in April of the present year." She leaves a family of small children. Helena, July 12th, 1859. "Tennessee Baptist will please copy." (Aug 4, 1859). (Editor's Note: Karnes County was created in 1854. The reference, which follows, to a letter from a church in

Harrison County, should lead interested researchers to question the date 1830.)

Mrs. Tabitha Harriett Jarmon died at the residence of her husband in Fayette County, Texas, 13 September 1859. She was born in Maury County, Tennessee, 18 August 1812, and "was raised by parents who were members of the old Presbyterian church, and at one period of time, she was a member of the old Presbyterian church herself. After she came to Texas she joined the Missionary Baptist Church, to which her husband belonged...." Survived by husband and 7 children. "Tennessee Baptist will please copy." (Sept 29, 1859)

"Departed this life on the evening of the 27th July, A. D., 1859, little Mary Bettie, aged eleven summers, eldest daughter of the Rev. Dr. James H. and N. H. Reeves of Polk County, Texas." Signed: J. R. H. (Oct 6, 1859)

Mrs. Elizabeth E. Spiller died at Danville, Montgomery County, Texas, 11 August 1859, in the 34th year of her age. "She was a native of Rockingham Co., Virginia, where she was married to Dr. S. G. Spiller, in 1842, and was baptized into the fellowship of the Liberty Chapell Baptist Church in April 1845, and moved to the place of her death in 1846. She leaves to mourn her loss four orphans, yet the Lord has provided for them a home in the house of their Uncle Preston H. Spiller...." Signed: J. J. (Oct 6, 1859)

"Died, on the night of Wednesday, the 19th inst., at the Fannin House, of the prevailing epidemic, S. H. Skiff, Esq., of the firm of S. H. Skiff & Co., of this city." He had been married fourteen days earlier to "one of the loveliest flowers of our city." (Oct 27, 1859)

"Again, has the fell destroyer visited the household of Lewis and Susan Crim. On Saturday, 29th of August, their beloved son, Thomas Crim" died. 'Mentioned: his sister Fannie, who had also died. (Bottom of page partly torn off) Signed: E. H.? Shelborne. Collin County, Texas, Oct. 9th, 1859. (Nov 10, 1859)

Miss Mary Ann West died at Sumpter, Trinity County, 26 Oct. 1859, aged 27 years, 5 months, and 3 days. She was born St. Landry Parish May 22, 1832. In November, 1852, she moved to Trinity County, Texas, with her brother, J. J. West. She was baptized 3 June 1853 by Elder John Talbot of Alabama. She is the only daughter of Martha West. Signed: M. "Louisiana Baptist, please copy." (Nov 10, 1859)

Charlotte Humble, aged 18 years, died 30 September 1859 in Tyler County, Texas. She was born Chatahoula Parish, Louisiana, 8 January 1841, daughter of Isham and Sarah B. Humble, with whom she emigrated to Texas in 1846. Her parents joined Rocky Hill Church shortly after its organization. The deceased joined 1858, and was baptized by Elder John Bean. She is survived by her father, mother, and three brothers. "Done by order of the Rocky Hill Church...." Signed: John Reid, E. Bass, and F. H. Reid, committee. (Nov 10, 1859)

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR: Regarding the city of Beaumont, the Encyclopedia Britannica says that Noah Tevis of Tennessee, who had established a town called Tevis Bluff, sold 50 acres to Henry Millard in 1835, who "alledegly" named the place for his brother-in-law, Jefferson Beaumont. Handbook of Texas, Volume I, page 132: Jefferson Beaumont, the son of William Henry and Elizabeth (Cooper) Beaumont, was born in Carter County, Kentucky on March 12, 1801. On January 5, 1823, he married Sarah Greenleaf and in 1845 brought his family to Texas, accompanied by his brother Franklin and his family. Handbook of Texas, Volume II, pages 194-195: Henry Millard was born in Mississippi in 1807. In 1835 he moved to Liberty, Texas, which he represented in the Consultation and on the General Council. Commissioned by the Consultation as lieutenant colonel of the 1st Regiment of the Texas Army, he served from December 5, 1835, to December 16, 1836, commanding the right flank of the Texas forces at the battle of San Jacinto. In 1835 Millard laid out a town on the site of Tevis Bluff and named it Beaumont for the family of his wife, Mary Warren Beaumont, whom he married in 1826.

News from the Library

Many people are aware that we have a large group of personal papers collected by the late Mary Daggett Lake. Since finding aids for this material have not yet been completed, very few people know about the genealogical material included in this collection. Mrs. Lake worked for many years on her families and those of her husband; in addition, she compiled priceless material on the early families of Tarrant County, gleaned from their children and contemporaries. Since so many of Tarrant County's early records have been lost through courthouse fires, this material may help to fill gaps for researchers interested in early Tarrant County families.

The lines which Mrs. Lake researched were the following: Daggett-Doggett, Palmer-Parmer, Ferguson, Loughmiller, Lake and Glasscock. There is also much material on the Crockett family, and on the Becton, Epperson, Gilmore, Moorehead, Quayle, Smith, Farrar, Driskill, Hawkins, and MacKinnon families from other parts of Texas.

We hope eventually to have a name index to this material and a subject index to the historical material in the collection. In the meantime, if you are working on a Tarrant County family, or on one of the other families listed, you may use the Lake material in the department office. Because this material is unique, we ask that you take only pencil and note-taking materials in to the office with you.

We have recently received a gift of genealogical materials from an anonymous donor which includes the surname index comprised of three file boxes of 4 x 6 cards. The people are mainly from the midwest and New England. The emphasis of the collection is on the Dillon and Hodgson families. These papers were left with one of the custodians who did not get the donor's name. If he or she is reading this, or if any society member knows who this might be, we would appreciate having the name so that we could acknowledge the collection. Those of you who are working on midwestern families will want to check these surname index files, since there are many families included.

Mrs. Mary Farmer, wife of W. A. Farmer, died 12 December 1859. She was born in Wilson County, Tennessee, 9 February 1828, daughter of Milton M. and Elizabeth Maxwell, and was married in Tunica County, Mississippi, 7 October 1851, by Elder Thomas Davis. She is survived by her husband and three children. Signed: L. Autry, Pastor. Near Caldwell, Burleson Co., Texas. (Jan. 5, 1860)

William Lawson Fort, born 20 June 1858, died 24 December 1859. "Billy was the son of Dr. J. M. and J. A. Fort." Signed: Lewis Ward Davis. Boston, Texas, Dec. 28, 1859. (Jan. 12, 1860)

Died, at her residence on old Caney, in Wharton County, Texas, on the evening of the 7th inst., Sister M. A. E. Calaway, the wife of Elder Calaway. The deceased was born 14 March 1811; married to Elder L. C. Calaway, 26 October 1826; admitted into Baptist church in Greensborough, Alabama in August, 1834. Signed: J. H. Stribling. (Jan. 12, 1860)

Wm. W. Evans died at his residence 12 December 1859, aged 41 years, 9 months, and 29 days. He was born in Jones County, Georgia, 13 February, 1818. He "removed to Macon County, Ala., where he, in 1845...joined the Missionary Baptist Church." In 1854 he removed with his family to Freestone County, Texas, where he remained until his death. "The deceased has left a disconsolate wife and seven children, an aged mother, three brothers, and two sisters, and numerous relatives and friends." Signed: B. P. H. [illegible] /illegible/. (Jan. 26, 1860)

Mrs. Rebecca Allen died January 23rd, aged 79 years, 3 months, and 12 days. "The deceased emigrated to Texas on the 22d of Nov.. 1839, from Alabama. She made aprofession of religion in South Carolina, her native state, and united with the Baptist Church." Survived by children (names not given). "Alabama Baptist please copy, as the deceased had many friends in that state." Signed: A Friend. (Feb. 2, 1860)

Mrs. America Leflet, aged about 34 years, died December 17, 1859. She joined the Baptist church "in Missouri in the early part of 45 and on the 1st of Sept. of the same year she was united in marriage to Bro. Francis Leflet, whom she now leaves with four children and many brethren, sister, and friends...." She was a member of Mount Zion Church. "Western Watchman please copy." Signed: N. T. B. (Feb. 2, 1860)

Mrs. M. M. Fortune, wife of C. V. Fortune, died at Marlin, Falls County, Texas, on the 15th inst., in the 25th year of her age. She was the

daughter of John and Elizabeth March of Lincoln County, Tennessee. She joined the Baptist church at Marlin at age 25. She died very happy, taking an affectionate leave of her relatives, and then of her husband and children...." Resolution signed by W. B. Eaves, Mod.* (Feb. 2, 1860) Abstractor's Note: See letter from W. B. Eaves to the Editor, in which the husband of M. M. Fortune is said to have been O. V. Fortune.

William Green died at his residence in Lavaca County, Texas, Feb. 20, 1859. He was born in the state of Mississippi, December 11, 1833. "Whilst very young his parents moved to Arkansas, and from thence to Bastrop County, Texas in 1850, where the deceased resided at the time of his marriage, which was in 1856, to Miss Lucy A. Jones, daughter of Judge Maryind Jones of Lavaca Co., Texas, after which he removed with his family and settled in the western part of Lavaca County where he resided at the time of his decease. He was "baptized by the writer" into the fellowship of Rocky Creek Church, Lavaca County. Survived by wife and two sons. Signed: John H. Thurmond. Hallettsville, Texas, Jan. 24th, 1860. (Feb. 2, 1860)

Letter from W. B. Eaves, dated Marlin, Falls County, Texas, January 30, 1860, to the Editor, George W. Baines. He writes of the following "severe afflictions that we have been called to pass through in the last few months, as a community and church."

Miss Julia Morrill, sister of D. B. Morrill, died (no date given). She had come to Marlin "to teach a female school."

Mr. C. A. Barber died (apparently in November - not specifically stated). He was married in May, 1858, to Miss Anna Brown of Mississippi, and left in a few days after their marriage for Texas - "settled in this place" and commenced to practice law. "In June, 1859, his wife left him to pay a visit to her mother, relatives, and friends. He got to Alto Springs, was taken sick. The disease progressed for a few days, and alas! when his young companion got to Owenville, in the place of meeting her husband she met the sad news that she was a widow."

"Brother Aycock, the father of brother Thos. P. Aycock, of this place, paid us a visit last spring, and determining to leave his old home in Georgia and move to this country, and spend his last days with his sons, made his arrangements accordingly. On his way from Houston up, he was taken with that dreadful disease, pneumonia. Sister Aycock, his wife, wrote to their son, in Marlin, that his father was quite sick. He started to meet them. He got to Owenville, and found that his was father was sick even unto death." Mr. Aycock was buried "under one of those beautiful live oaks near Marlin. After which, we left, with the weeping company for the home of brother John A. Fortune, senior. And alas! What do we behold? Sister M. M. Fortune has just departed this life. Sister Fortune's health had been declining for several years. She left last spring to visit her relatives in Tennessee...returned home eight days before her death." (Mentioned as present: her 4 year old daughter). "Next day the funeral was preached in the meeting house, and the remains deposited under that beautiful liveoak." (Feb. 16, 1860)

Richard M. Aycock, late of Dade County, formerly of Walker County, Ga., died of pneumonia at Owensville, Robertson County, Texas, "on the 18th of January, last." He had recently moved from Georgia, and was on his way to Marlin, Falls County, Texas. "He was attacked soon after getting off the railway, but not appreciating the force of his attack, travelled on. Reaching the house of an old friend of his youth, Lewis Harris, he could go no farther." "...His manhood was mostly spent in the county of Walker, in Georgia. Here he was prominent as an advocate of temperance, and joined almost every organization to promote it. He was long a deacon and clerk in the Baptist church at LaFayette which he assisted to organize...." Signed: T. P. A. (Feb. 16, 1860)

Mary E. M. Tinsley, daughter of O. T. and Catharine E. Tinsley, died on the 10th of December, 1859, at Port Sullivan, Milan County; aged 4 years, 10 months, and 25 days. (Feb. 24, 1860)

Milton Rogers died at his residence eight miles from Gatesville, Coryell County, Texas, 20 October 1859. He was from Union County, Georgia, and was the son of Elisha and Mary Rogers. He joined the Baptist Church at Macedonia, Union County, Ga., in 1851 - came to Texas in 1852, and united with the Baptist church at Gatesville at its organization 8th June 1857. "He leaves an affectionate wife and four children...." (Feb. 24, 1860)

Mrs. Martha Adaline Tockwell, aged 19 years, died in Coryell County, Texas, 19 October 1859. She was born in Cass County, Georgia; joined the Baptist church at Van West, Polk County, Ga. She emigrated with her husband to Texas in 1857 and united with the Baptist church at Gatesville, Coryell County, September 10, 1857. "She has left another to mourn her loss...." Resolution: by order Gatesville Baptist - on Saturday before the 1st Sabbath in Nov., 1859. Signed: G. F. Adams, T. S. Nettles, H. Logann, Committee. "The Georgia papers please copy." (Feb. 24, 1860)

"Moses P. Jones died at the residence of his brother, Lamar County, Texas. The subject of this notice was born in Obion County, Tennessee, March, /missing, torn/ with his parents to Pontotoc County, Mississippi, in 1849. Professed religion and joined the Baptist church at Oak Hill where he lived...until January 1353, when he moved to Lamar County, and lived until Jany 7, 1860," at which time he died of typhoid pneumonia. Signed: John A. Fuller. "Tennessee Baptist please copy." (Mar. 8, 1860)

Asa J. Chandler, student at Baylor University, second son of the Rev. P. B. Chandler, died at the residence of Dr. D. R. Wallace on 25 February, 1860. He was born 16 June 1839, and was "baptized by Elder Michael Ross, in Independence, last spring." Signed: Rufus C. Burleson. (Apr. 12, 1860)

At a stated meeting of Warren Lodge No. 56, Caldwell, Texas, 21 January 1860, resolutions adopted in memory of Thomas D. Wooldridge, deceased. It is stated that he was a member of the lodge from its organization and served as the first senior warden. Copy to be sent to his "aged companion." Signed: T. W. Munson, Sec'y. (Apr. 12, 1860)

We know they lived in Tenn. and Ala. Walter and Elizabeth are buried here."

It is possible that the Robert "Bartley" - also sometimes spelled Barclay - is the father of Robert. He applied for pension in Morgan County, Ala., 1832, and was born in Ireland, settled in South Carolina; after the Revolution moved to Kentucky, Tennessee, and Alabama, where he had resided for fifteen years by 1832.
