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TOWNS OF HISTORIC INTEREST THAT HAVE BEEN ABANDONED OR REMAIN
SMALL TOWNS TODAY. - "GHOST" TOWNS AND "LOST" TOWNS*

Breckenridge-located one mile east of the present town of Richardson in Dallas County. Named for John C. Breckenridge, Kentucky statesman. It was one of the principal towns on the route traveled by freighters between Central Texas and Jefferson and Shreveport. Abandoned in 1873 when the H. & T. C. built a station at Richardson.

Cedar Springs-in Dallas County, settled in 1842 and contested with Dallas for location of county seat in 1850, losing. Now within the corporate limits of Dallas.

Kingsboro-in Kaufman County near King Creek; county seat. Later called Kaufman.

Prairie Point-in Wise County. Described as a flourishing village before the war and "beginning to look up again in 1867." - Texas Almanac.

Town Bluff-in eastern part Tyler County on Neches River; temporarily the county seat.

OBITUARIES AND DEATH NOTICES
FROM
THE TEXAS BAPTIST

General James Davis departed this life on the 9th day of February, aged about 70 years. "...a worthy and esteemed member of this church...full of years and honors." "General Davis' life was an eventful one. He was born in the State of Georgia. The subject of this sketch loved his country. He was a devoted patriot; in the war of 1822, he held a commission in the United States Army, and was attached to the regiment commanded by the late Col. Benton. At the close of the war he resigned his commission notwithstanding he was the peer of Gen. Taylor, and would have ranked him had he remained in the Army. After leaving the army he began the pursuits of private life, and located in Franklin County, Alabama. Here he was not long permitted to enjoy the sweets of private life, but was elected without his knowledge or solicitation, by the Legislature, Judge of the County Court, which at that time exercised a large jurisdiction. He was several times, after the termination of his judgeship returned a member of the Alabama Legislature. Here his talents and untiring devotion to the cause of his constituents greatly endeared him to the people of his adopted State, and soon he was required by the suffrages of the Legislature to fill the office of District Attorney, the duties of which he discharged with his accustomed energy. In this field he displayed his native talents, and won for himself considerable reputation as a criminal lawyer. When the Chickasaw purchase was opened he removed with his family to Mississippi. Here his talents and energies were called into requisition, to endeavor to undertake the forlorn hope of saving the Democratic party from the overthrow that threatened it, from the gifted and eloquent Prentiss - they were competitors for Congress. But the future of the party, at that period, had so far waned, that no human effort could rescue it from defeat. In 1841, General Davis emigrated to the then Republic of Texas. In 1842 he was appointed by Gen. Houston, the then President, to the command of the army. The year 1842 was a precarious period in Texas history. He applied himself with his indomitable energy to aid the executive in his efforts to save the country from the national enemy that threatened its overthrow and misguided partisans, whose policy was at war with the views of the Executive. Gen. Davis, in 1843, was elected a member of the Texas Congress. As a member he bore a conspicuous part in legislation of the country, and acted nobly with those whose wise counsels prevailed, and succeeded in the end in restoring confidence in the Government. Gen. Davis was a devoted friend of annexation, and exerted his powerful influence in inducing his fellow citizens to accept that measure. After annexation the Government underwent a change. A convention was called to form a State Constitution. The people of Liberty District elected him a delegate to the Convention. That assembly was a noble body of men, and Gen. Davis was the peer of the noblest; here his great experience, and sound principles, were of great value to the country; many of the most conservative features of our present excellent constitution were matured and carried through that body by

his influence. For several years he represented the Liberty District in the State Senate, the journals of which, show that he took a lively interest in the deliberations of that body. In all stations of life his conduct was highly creditable to his head and heart - but nowhere did he shine with more lustre, than in the church of Jesus Christ. He was conscientiously prompt in filling his seat at the prayer meeting and the church conference. Brother Davis was baptized into the fellowship of the church at Cold Springs, by Elder Creath, very soon after it was constituted, and remained a consistent and devoted member up to his death. On the day of his death, he called the members of his family around him, and with great composure delivered to them his dying charge. His faith was unshaken. His death was a Christian triumph. "Precious in the sight of God is the death of saints."

(Feb. 24, 1859)

Elder Jesse Witt died suddenly at Marshall, Texas November 21, 1858. He was "born in Bedford County, Virginia (the date we have not) and in his native state he spent the youth and vigor of his useful life. More especially in the Middle and Western portions of it, did he labor...(Note: as a minister.), until he was called, in 1836, to succeed Elder Edward Baptist in the pastoral office in Powhattan County, with Fine Creek and Muddy Creek Churches. After serving these churches for some six or seven years...he was appointed General Agent for the General Association of Virginia, to raise funds for Home or State Missions, in which relation he continued until he came to Texas in the fall of 1857 as a Missionary of the Board of the Southern Baptist Bi-annual Convention, and settled in San Augustine County, in Eastern Texas." He remained in San Augustine County for one year, after which he settled in Marshall, Harrison County, Texas where he was pastor of the Marshall church and one or two others in that county. Elder Witt was baptized into the fellowship of Liberty Baptist Church, Bedford County, Virginia in December, 1821, by Elder William Harris. He was ordained to the office of the Christian Ministry on 15 September, 1827 by Elders Wm. Leftrich, Wm. Harris, James Leftrich, and A. C. Dempsey.

"To whom and when Elder Witt was married, we do not know. Our impression is that he had ten children by his marriage. Five of which we knew personally - four sons and one daughter. The latter (Harriet) died in 1847, in Virginia, and two of his sons (Daniel and Henry) died in Texas. The former sleeps with his pious father in the Marshall Cemetery, and the latter in the town of Montgomery.

"Edward and Luther Jeter (Witt) are all that remain to weep over a departed father, with other relatives and friends in his native state.... The writer has often mingled in the family circle of our departed brother. He was a kind and affectionate husband, a devoted parent..."

John J. Brown died at his residence in Fannin County, Texas on Sunday evening, December 26, 1848(sic). At a called meeting of Mt. Zion (formerly Pleasant Grove) Church, a resolution, dated December 28, 1858, was presented by Lewis Whitfield -upon decease of their fellow member. Signed: S. J. Wright, Moderator. J. M. Sivells, Clk.

(Feb. 17, 1859)

Mary Ellen Swaim, daughter of R. W. and Rebecca E. Swaim, died at Springfield, Limestone County, Texas, age 7 years, 7 months.

Signed: W. B. C. (Apr 12, 1860)

Sarah Mayfield, daughter of S. C. and E. Mayfield, died 5 April 1860, aged three and one half years.

(Apr 12, 1860)

Mrs. Mary E. Kirkpatrick died 14 February 1860. She was the wife of Brother Pinkney Kirkpatrick and a daughter of Brother Robert and Sister Margaret Moore. Sister K. was a consistent member of the Cow Bayou Baptist Church. Signed: W. A. M.

(Apr 19, 1860)

Tribute of Respect. Issued by St. Paul's Lodge, No. 177, on the occasion of the death of one of it's members, William Jones. Widow and children mentioned. Copies to be sent to the Texas Free Mason, Texas Baptist, and Eldorado (Arkansas) Union, and the Cameron Centinel."

Copy to be sent to the Texas Baptist and "request the Tennessee Baptist to copy."

Mrs. Mary Kent died in Brazos County, Texas May 3, 1860, "in the seventieth or seventy first year of her age." She was born in the State of Virginia,"and was moved to the State of Tennessee by her parents and settled in Wilson County, Tennessee. In the 14th year of her age she was married to Luke Kent. In 1829, moved to Hinds County, Mississippi. In 1842 was baptized by Elder J. Denson, and joined New Hope Church of Christ. In 1843 she moved from thence and to this state and settled in Washington Co., where she deposited her letter with Washington Church until 1857, when she withdrew her membership and united with Minter Spring Baptist Church...." Resolution done by order of the church on Saturday before the 2d Lord's day in May, 1860. Signed: Thos. Eaton, Moderator, and J.H. McGrgor.

(June 28, 1860)

"Brother William McWhorter was born in Casey County, Ky., June 20, 1833, made a profession of religion in the fall of 1847, and was received and baptized into the fellowship of the Baptist church in Casey Co., Ky., by the writer the same year; emigrated to Texas with his parents, William P. and Polly McWhorter, in the spring of 1853, and united with Friendship Church, Collin County, the first opportunity. He died the 11th day of December 1859. He came to his death from being thrown from his horse, (or, rather, his horse fell and was killed and the

rider fatally injured) but lived three months.... In the death of Brother McWhorter his parents have lost a kind and dutiful son."

She emigrated to Texas in 1847 and settled three miles from Independence. At her death she left \$1500, as a permanent fund to the Baptist State Convention - the interest to be used in sending missionaries (torn). Signed: Rufus C. Burleson.

Mrs. Ann Elizabeth Terrell died 16 July 1860. She was born in Virginia in 1829, daughter of James E. and Malinda L. Bauldin. Her "parents moved to Howard Co., Miss in 1833." Ann Elizabeth was educated in the female academies of Boonville and Monticello. "After her marriage to Judge A. W. Terrell they settled in St. Joseph, Mosuri, and thence removed to Austin, where the seven last years of her life were spent." She was baptized in her fifteenth year into the fellowship of a Baptist Church in Howard County, Misouri. Children mentioned.

Elder William Clark "was born (from the best information we can obtain) in the State of Georgia, March the 30th, A. D., 1793) was married to E. M. Crenshaw, in Jasper County, Ga., October the 8th, 1811, moved to the State of Alabama in the fall of 1816, professed faith in Christ, and was immersed by Elder I-saac (faded) Little in Perry County, Alabama in the fall of 1820, was ordained to the gospel ministry in Green County in the fall of 1831, emigrated to Mississippi in 1836, and from there to Texas, in the winter of 1849, and located in Falls County," where he lived until his death on the 8th inst. "Brother Clark was severely wounded in an early day in the back and hips by the falling of a tree...." He left a devoted wife, one son and family." Signed: J.J.H. Eutaw, Texas, August the 19th, 1860.

Mr. John Hamilton died 23 July in the 53rd year of his age. The deceased had been a member of the Baptist church at Webberville for the last six years. Survived by widow and children. Signed: R.

R. L. Grandberry died 14 July 1860. He was born in Mississippi in 1823, thence emigrated to Louisiana. In 18 he united with the Baptist denomination, moved thence to Tyler County, Texas, and "joined the Bethel Church at Woodville, and in the organization of the new Bethel Church, 1849, Brother G. was one of the 18 that went into the constitution of that church, and on the same day...was elected Deacon, and was ordained by brother D. M. Jordan and the writer...." Survived by wife and rela-

tives. Signed: S. C. Martin. "The Mississippi and Louisiana Baptist please copy." (Sept 27, 1860)

"Died, at Independence, on Friday, the 14th inst., Jona the), the only child of Georgianna J. and Rev. Rufus C. Burleson, President of Baylor University, aged 1 year, 8 months, and 25 days." Signed: O. H. L. Independence, Texas, Dec. 18, 1860. (Jan 3, 1861)

Benjamin Graves Camp, son of M. and Eliza Camp of Grimes County, died of scarlet fever on the 13th inst., aged three years and twenty-four days. Signed: J. M. Perry. Hollandale, Dec. 24, 1860 (Jan 3, 1861)

Mrs. Eliza L. Maxcy, wife of the Hon. Walter S. Maxcy, of Polk County, Texas, died at the residence of her husband 13 November 1860. She professed faith at a revival "in the Baptist church at Cold Springs last summer." "...the heart-stricken husband, and the weeping father and bereaved brothers and sisters to whom she had supplied the place of a fond mother for several years." Signed: J.W.D. C(reath). Cold Springs, Texas, Dec. 24, 1860. "South Western Baptist please copy." (Jan. 17, 1861)

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Aston died July 29, 1860. She was born in Powhatan County, Virginia in November, 1822. She was married September 6, 1838 to John R. Aston. About the year 1843 she was baptized into the fellowship of Muddy Creek Baptist Church in Virginia by Elder Jesse Witt. She moved with her husband to Grayson County, Texas in 1856, and soon after her arrival united with the church at Kentuckytown. Survived by husband, children. (Feb 7, 1861)

Brice M. Pistole died at his residence in Kent---town, (torn) Grayson County, Texas 15 November 1860, aged 28 years, 11 months, and 3 days. He joined a Baptist church in the state of Kentucky at an early age, and for sometime prior to his death, he served his church at Kentuckytown (Texas) in the capacity of clerk. He leaves a widow and tender orphan. (Feb 7, 1861)

Departed this life on the (torn - about 1½ lines) Dotson, at their residence (torn) with croup, aged 18 months." Tennessee Baptist please copy. (Mar 7, 1861)

Mrs. Anna Marsh died at her residence in the southern part of Austin County, Texas on the 2d of February, 1861, of pneumonia. She was born in the state of Illinois in February, 1842, daughter of Frederick Rook, and moved to Texas at an early day. On December 25, 1851, she was

married to D. L. Marsh. She was a member of the Baptist church at New Providence. Survived by husband and four small children.

"Deacon Isaac Guyton died on the 21st of November 1860 in the sixtieth year of his age. He was a native of Union District, South Carolina, from whence he removed in 1832 to Alabama, and from the latter place to Texas, in 1850. He was married 1815 to Mrs. Martha Persons (who died 1837), widow of Amos Persons. "...did not make a public profession of religion until he was 75 years of age. We are having growing pains. Due to the success of our microfilm matching program, we've found it necessary to rearrange our cabinets in order to make the best use of space available to us. The films are now arranged by census years, rather than by states. The drawers are marked as to their contents, but if you have trouble finding a film, please ask a staff member.

Several of our patrons have taken advantage of our matching policy to help themselves as well as the library. To restate the policy briefly: We will purchase a census microfilm of equivalent value of the patron's choice whenever he donates a roll of new or replacement film to the library. The cut-off date for matching by the library will be June 15, since we must order all film by this time to insure its arrival during the current fiscal year.

Now-it-can-be-told-Department.--Did you see the newspaper story that said that the library board was thinking about buying the old Winfield Scott home on Pennsylvania for a branch library? The reporter only got two basic facts wrong: the Scott house has been proposed as a home for the Southwest and Genealogy Department; and an angel with golden pockets is needed to finance the venture. If any of you know any millionaires..... We's certainly like to move your ancestors into these gracious quarters.

The house would lend itself very well to our purposes. The bulk of the genealogical collection could be housed on the first floor, with manuscripts and work areas in special quarters on the second. The grounds are spacious enough to provide ample parking, bus service is good, and restaurants are close by. House of service could be tailored to the needs of our users, enabling us to have a full staff on duty at all times to give you better service.

The organization working to make it possible is the South Side Planning Council. Whether or not they are successful, we would all be grateful for their efforts.

Note of caution when visiting the department: please be careful of your belongings. One of our regular patrons' purse was snatched almost from beneath her feet. Caution is the only remedy for this situation.

ABSTRACTS OF OBITUARIES AND DEATH NOTICES

FROM

THE TEXAS BAPTIST HERALD

The following records were abstracted by Mrs. Stanley C. Smith from newspapers on microfilm at Fleming Library, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. The Texas Baptist Herald was privately published at Houston, Texas, by J. B. Link, Editor and proprietor. Volume 1, No. 1, was published Wednesday, December 13, 1865. Volume 1, No. 2, is dated March 29, 1866. In an editorial Mr. Link replied, in part, to his many subscribers who had written concerning the lateness of the second issue of this weekly, "The present number has not been issued sooner, because our type did not come sooner." Publication of this newspaper was again suspended on September 25, 1867, but was resumed on November 20, 1867. In a small Extra edition dated September 25th the editor announced the suspension, giving these reasons: the prevailing epidemic of yellow fever, the illness of his printers and their families, and the further fact that "almost every post office in the interior towns has either been closed or interrupted."

In parenthesis following each abstract will be found the date of the newspaper, followed by two numbers. The first number indicates the page on which the obituary may be found, although the pages are numbered in the paper itself. The second number indicates the column.

Capt. W. W. DICKIE died at his residence in Walker County, Texas February 4, 1866, in the 68th year of his age. He was a native of Virginia, but in childhood moved to Spartanburg District S. C., where he was married. After a sojourn to Alabama he moved to Texas and resided at the place where he died for over twelve years. Reference is made to the death of his wife (whose name is not given) some four years ago, and to a large family who survive. Signed: Pastor. (Mar. 29, 1866; 3.3.)

Mr. Reden Simmons HARTFIELD died at Osage, Colorado County, Texas, July 16, 1866, aged 39 years, 5 months, and 29 days. He was born in North Carolina, January 17, 1827. When he was quite young his parents moved to Gibson Co., Tennessee, where he remained until 1851 or 1852, moving thence to Columbus, Texas. Mention is made of his having been in the army. He leaves a wife and three children. Signed: A neighbor. (Aug. 8, 1866; 3.4.)

Mr. W. A. PARISH, born in North Carolina, November 12, 1805, died July 27, 1866. "He settled in Perry County, Alabama, in early life, and joined the Baptist church at Marion, in 1839. Bro. Peter CRAWFORD baptized him. He was married to Miss Catherine E. BROWN, December 12th 18-5 (crease in paper). She died in 1860. "He came to Huntsville, Texas, in 1845 and immediately joined the church here." Children mentioned. Signed: A. E. VANDIVERE, Huntsville, Texas. August 13th, 1866. (Aug. 29, 1866; 3.4.)

Mrs. Lucy Pope MAXEY died in Paris, Texas, July 8, 1866. She was the wife of General Rice MAXEY, and mother of General S. B. MAXEY, late of the Confederate Army. "When about 24 years of age she was baptized by the Elder

Wm. WARDER, and united with the Baptist church in Glasgow, Ky. In the year 1821, she was married to Rice MAXEY, and settled in Thompkinsville, Ky., where she united with the Mill Creek Church. About 14 years after this her husband united with the same church. About this time, her husband having been appointed clerk of the Circuit Courts of Clinton County, they located in the latter place, and united with the old Clear Fork church, which, however, they left in 1841 on account of its anti-mission principles. Then they went into the organization of a new church in the town of Albany, which soon became large and flourishing. This she left in 1857, settled in Texas, and united with the Paris Baptist Church.... The writer of this notice commenced his ministerial career as pastor of the aforementioned Albany church, and has been her pastor in the Paris church since the year 1860. Her house was his home from the time he left the paternal roof until his marriage...." Signed: R. C. B. (Aug 29, 1866; 3.4.)

Jerome Conroe McMILLAN, only son of D. G. and Nancy McMILLAN, died August 9, 1866. Signed: A. E. VANDIVERE. (Aug 29, 1866; 3.4.)

Little Sarah LACY was born in 1855, and died June 30th, 1866, after several weeks of confinement for measles. Signed: B.F.E. (Sept 5, 1866; 3.5.)

William F. HARRISON died 30 August 1866, age 47 years, 2 months, 29 days. He was born in Virginia, June 1, 1819, emigrated to Texas in 1850, and settled in Washington County. "Here he lived until his death except a few months of the present year, which was spent at Houston, he having just returned to his old home." He was married November 28, 1859 to Miss Frances Lenora BOWEN, daughter of a Baptist minister. He united with the Washington Baptist Church in August, 1864. Signed: J.E.P., Washington, Texas, August 31, 1866. (Sept 12, 1866; 3.5.)

Samuel Thomas CHILTON, the youngest son of the Rev. Thomas CHILTON, died at Montgomery, Montgomery County, Texas, on the 16th day of August, 1866. He was 13 years of age. (Sept. 12, 1866; 3.5.)

Mr. Alansum TRIGG died at his residence near Bastrop, Bastrop County, Texas, on September 19th, aged 42 years. He was born in Franklin County, Tennessee in 1824, married in 1853 Miss Olley E. ARNETT, and in 1855 moved to Texas and settled near Bastrop. He left a wife and 5 children.

Mrs. Gertrude J. WOOD died at the family residence in Grimes County on the 20th inst., aged 25 years. She was the eldest child of W. M. and M. F. FORRESTER, and had been married to Rufus W. WOOD for a little more than three years. Signed: J. (Oct. 17, 1866; 3.3.)

Mr. John BARTON died November 4, 1866. He was born in February, 1818, and became a member of the Baptist church in Marlin in 1861. "He served the county as sheriff with honor for his term." (Dec. 5, 1866; 3.3.)

Elder Benjamin CLARK died at his residence in Leon County, Texas, on Nov. 10, 1866. "This veteran soldier of the corss...had been supported by the Trinity River Association up to the time of his death." (Note: References to Eld. Benjamin CLARK may be found in the minutes of the Trinity River Association, which were published in The Texas Baptist, a newspaper published from March, 1855 to June, 1861. MBS) (Dec. 5, 1866; 3.3.)

The Hon. Charles J. HUMPHREYS died at Independence, Texas, on October 20th. He was a well known citizen of the Louisiana Legislature, and Notary Public for Bienville, Parish, La. He was a prominent and efficient trustee of Mount Lebanon University until he removed to Texas, September, 1863. (Jan. 9, 1867; 3.4.)

"Departed this life Thursday morning, Nov. 28th, little Mattie, infant daughter of George and Fanny R. HARRIS." (Jan. 9, 1867; 3.4.)

Robert S. SIMONTON of Montgomery, Texas, died in the city of Houston, Dec. 11, 1866. He had been a member of the Montgomery Church for sixteen years. He leaves a wife and 8 children. Signed: Pastor. (Jan 9, 1867; 3.4.)

Duncan M. McINTYRE died January 2, 1867, aged 23 years, 1 month and 20 days. He was a son of H. C. and Sarah McINTYRE. Sisters and brothers mentioned. Signed: S. (Jan. 16, 1867; 3.4.)

"Elder Thomas U. TOLER...died at my house in Grayson County, Texas, on the 1st day of November last, at about the age of 60 years. He was born in Caroline County, Va., and having obtained a fine education, spent about 30 years of his life in teaching school.... At about the age of 21, he joined the Baptist church at Mangohick, King William County, Va., and was baptized by Elder A. BROADDUS. Not very long after that A. CAMPBELL came to that church and preached several days, the result of which was, what was too common at that day, a split in the church. Eld. TOLER went off with the Campbellites, with whom he continued a pattern of piety and leader in their church the balance of his life...." The writer refers to a recent conversation between Elder TOLER and his son, Henry TOLER, and in another place to "his sons." He also writes that he had been intimately acquainted with the deceased for more than 40 years, and mentions that "his children and many friends here and in Virginia and Kentucky mourn his loss." Requests that "The Western Recorder," Ky., and the "Religious Herald, Va., copy. Signed: J. C. H. (Mar. 27, 1867; 3.4.)

Thomas KING, a native of North Carolina, died at Navasota, Texas, April 4, 1867, aged 60 years. (April 10, 1867; 3.4.)

Mrs. Bertie Blount WALLER, daughter of Reading S. BLOUNT and Louisa LONG, died April 3, 1867, aged 37 years, 6 months, and 13 days. Mrs. WALLER was born in Halifax County, North Carolina, "and descended by both parents from families boating the best blood of the old North State." Reared in the Baptist faith, she was baptized in 1845, and on the 10th of October, 1848 was married to Hiram B. WALLER, Esq., eldest son of Judge Edwin WALLER of this state. Mentioned (in eulogy) "her sisters and her son." "In three years death has entered this family and borne away its head and crown and prop. The father first, then the mother and now the eldest sister." Signed: M. J. Y. (Note: No clue is given as to the place of residence of the deceased, or of the writer. MBS) (Apr. 17, 1867; 3.3.)

Dr. J. M. PALMER died at the residence of Mr. F. M. BROWDER, six miles west of Lexington, on the 6th of February last. He was a native of Tennessee, and was baptized 12 years ago. He came to Texas 10 years ago, and united with the Lexington Baptist Church, of which he remained a member until his death. He was married in 1857 to Miss Sallie J. BROWDER. In his Masonic fraternity one of its brightest ornaments. "He leaves a wife

and two small children (boys) as well as a widowed and childless mother...."
Signed: Pastor, Lexington, Texas, March 23rd, 1867. (Apr. 17, 1867; 3.2.)

James L. GREENE died at his residence near Plantersville, Grimes County, Texas, on April 7, 1867. He was born in Jones County, Georgia in 1814, and emigrated to Texas in 1841. He was a Mason. Family and servants mentioned. Signed: T. W. BLAKE, Plantersville, April 9th, 1867. (Apr. 17, 1867; 3.3.)

"Elder J. C. PORTMAN was born in Casey County, Ky., Sept. 2d, 1805. He professed faith in Christ and joined the Green River Baptist Church, and was immersed by Elder WARNER, in 1827. He was ordained to the work of the ministry, October, 1832, by Elders CHILTON and QUIN, and served several churches... as pastor.... From a biographical sketch in my possession I find that he baptized in his native state 1500 persons, built up several large and flourishing churches, and acted awhile as missionary two or three years for the District in which he lived. He removed to Texas in 1853, and lived a while in Collin County, and died in Denton County, August, 1866, after a protracted illness.... The writer was well acquainted with the deceased for many years.... He was a kind and affectionate husband, father, neighbor and minister. He has left his companion and children...." Signed: J. M. MYERS. (May 8, 1867; 3.3.)

Mr. Joseph F. HOWARD, the only son of DR. W. H. and Mrs. Emma HOWARD, of this city, died Monday morning. (Note: News item, so probably Houston. MBS) (May 29, 1867; 3.2.)

J. M. ALLISON died in Harris County, Texas, March 18, 1867, in the 30th year of his age. He was born in Winston County, Mississippi. He joined the Baptist church at New Bethel, Tyler County, Texas, in August, 1861, and was baptized by Eld. S. C. MARTIN. He was married August 13, 1865. "He leaves an aged father and mother, together with a devoted wife and babe...." Signed: S. C. M. (June 5, 1867; 3.3.)

Died - May 25th, 1867, in Montgomery County, Texas, James Calvin, son of William S. and Elizabeth TAYLOR. He was born September 9, 1855. "Tennessee Baptist please copy." (June 19, 1867; 3.3.)

Died - on Willow Creek, Harris County, Texas, May 1, 1867, Daniel DOUGHTIE, in the 61st year of his age. The deceased was a native of Hartford County, N. C. He moved to Texas in December, 1848. (Note: It is stated that "he professed faith in 1842, but name of church, if any, to which he belonged is not given. MBS) Signed: L. O. D. (June 19, 1867; 3.3.)

Mrs. Ellen A. DOOLEY, wife of Jas. A. DOOLEY, died at the residence of Dr. CAGE, near Chatfield, Navarro County, Texas, on the 19th of March 1867, in the fortieth year of her age. She was the daughter of Susan A. Baldwin, late of Panola County, Mississippi. She professed faith on Aug. 29, 1841, and joined the Baptist church at Enon, Panola County, on September 9th of the same year, then about 14 years old. She was married to Mr. DOOLEY on December 10, 1846. In the fall of 1866 Mr. Dooley emigrated with his family to Navarro County. She leaves a husband, five children, and an aged mother. Signed: J. L., Chatfield, Texas. (July 3, 1867; p. 2)

Died in city of Houston, July 3, 1867, Miss Texana THOMPSON, daughter of Sister Mary A. THOMPSON, in the 16th year of her age. (July 10, 1867; 3.3.)

Washington, July 5. Judge WAYNE is dead. He was born in Savannah, Ga., 1790; appointed to the bench in 1835. Current News. From The Telegraph. (July 10, 1867; 3.3.)

Current News: Killed - Hon. C. C. HERBERT, at Columbus, Texas, by a shot from a pistol in the hand of SPEERS. The Federal guard is reported to have killed Speers afterward. Mr. HERBERT was a member of the Confederate Congress. (July 10, 1867; 3.3.)

Mrs. Olivia Eugenia, wife of Professor Wm. M. LONG, and daughter of the Rev. Wm. MANNING, died at Wadeville, Texas, March 20, 1867, in the 24th year of her life. She was born in Marion County, Alabama, October 11, 1843. In early life her father moved to Mississippi, and was pastor of churches in Noxubee and Clark counties, where Olivia was educated. At age 19, she was baptized by her father. From Mississippi, she moved with her father to Louisiana. During the war they were driven from home by the Yankees, and settled near Waco, Texas. On the 29th of November 1864, she was married to Prof. Wm. M. LONG by the Rev. R. C. BURLESON. Survived by parents, husband, and two children, one only 13 days old. (Note: Yet, in his eulogy, the Rev. Burleson does refer to her brothers and sisters. MBS) Signed: R. C. B. (July 24, 1867; 3.3.)

Mrs. Josephine SPEIGHT, wife of Gen. J. W. SPEIGHT, died at her residence in this city of the 21st inst. She was the only child of Mark and Sallie A. PREWETT. She was born and raised in Aberdeen, Mississippi. In 1854 the family moved to Waco, and in 1857 she joined the Baptist church. Mentioned: her aged mother, her bereaved husband, her daughters. Signed: R. C. B., Waco, Texas, July 28, 1867. (Aug. 7, 1867; 3.3.)

Resolution by the Houston Medical Association, in memory of their deceased vice president, Dr. R. J. BRECKENRIDGE. Signed: D. F. STUART, M. D., Secretary. It was dated: Hall Houston Medical Association, July 9, 1867. (July 16, 1867; 3.3.) (Note: A news item published July 10, 1867, stated that Dr. Breckrenridge died on the 8th inst. MBS)

Resolution to the memory of Deacon Vincent T. ASBURY, signed August 18, 1867, by order of the Clear Creek Baptist Church, Leon County, Texas. He had been a member of the Baptist church about 24 years, and a deacon for 22 years. Copies to be sent to "his aged father, his bereaved family, and to the Texas Baptist Herald." Signed: John CLABOUGH, Pastor and Wm. H. FLETCHER, Church clerk. (Sept. 4, 1867; 3.2.)

"Sarah Ballinger DAVIS, daughter of John M. and Bettie Talbot DAVIS, died August 3d, 1867...in the 3d year of her age, at the residence of her parents, Burnam Beach, Bayland, Texas." (Sept. 11, 1867; 3.3.)

"I am called...to make the saddest record ever written in the volume of my life history. A brother...has been suddenly torn from my bosom and my sight. David LINK was my youngest brother.... He graduated at Rochester University in 1856. His time was mainly devoted to teaching until the war begun. He enlisted in the service of the South under General Price of Missouri, and shared the fortunes of the army until it crossed the Mississippi river. He then went to Virginia to visit our aged father and mother, and the home of our childhood, in Rockbridge County. He immediately joined the Rockbridge Artillery, and remained with it under Stonewell Jackson.... Nearly a year

ago he came to this city to assist me in my labors here.... He was baptized by his brother (the writer) in Rochester, N. Y. in early 1855, where they were attending the University together. He united with the church here a few weeks ago. He was taken with yellow fever on Sunday evening, the 15th, and died on Sunday following." (EXTRA, Sept. 25, 1867; 1.2.) (By J. B. LINK, the Editor)

Col. W. W. DIAMOND was born in DeKalb County, Ga., September 6, 1831; was educated at Maryville College in East Tennessee, afterwards studied for the profession of law, and was admitted to practice in the State of Georgia. In the summer of 1838 he united with the Baptist church at Mill Town, Chambers County, Ala., and was baptized by the Rev. Lewis TOWERS. In November of the same year he was married to Miss Lizzie TOWLES, after which he removed to Stone Mountain, Georgia. He there engaged in the practice of law until the winter of 1858, when he removed to Texas and settled in Sherman, Grayson County, Texas. He resumed the practice of law, and joined the Baptist church at that place, where his membership still remained. At the breaking out of the war, he joined the southern army and served until the surrender. After the close of the war he came to Houston, where he was engaged in the publication of The Houston Journal. "He was stricken with yellow fever on the 9th of Oct...he died on Sunday morning, Oct. 2d.... His family were all down with the fever at the time he died. He is survived by a wife and 3 children. His youngest child, a girl, aged 3½ years, preceded him in death two weeks previous. Signed: J. B. L. (Nov. 20, 1867; 3.2.)

Matthew J. McDONALD died of yellow fever October 1, 1867. He was born in Florida, March 10, 1849, and had come to Houston several months prior to his death, where he was employed as a clerk in a drug store. In a letter to a friend in Houston, his father stated, in part: "He was baptized in Atlanta, in 1860 at the age of fourteen years and 4 months, he joined Wheeler's Cavalry; was in the army 2 years; 5 months in Fort Delaware prison, and 2 months in the hospital.... He returned to our home in July, 1865, a convalescent, went to a classical school, but being ardently fond of a drug store, he resumed his occupation with Dr. J. L. HAMILTON, in this village. He was 18 years old on the 16th of last March." Signed: J. B. L. (Nov. 20, 1867; 3.2.)

Dr. J. R. HAND was born March 23, 1834, in Georgia, and died of yellow fever in Houston, Texas, on Sept 11, 1867. He was the only remaining child of Eld. J. R. HAND, now residing in Troupe County, Ga. In his sixteenth year he united with a church near Tuskegee, Alabama. He came to Houston several months ago and entered the drug business. Signed: J. B. L. (Nov. 20, 1867; 3.2.)

Thos. Porter EVERETT, son of the late Alexander EVERETT of Georgia, died at this house of his uncle, Elder D. P. EVERETT, Fort Bend Co., Texas, on the 18th of October, 1867, aged 21 years. Signed: D.P.E. (Nov. 20, 1867; 3.2.)

Lilliam Bochan, second daughter of Alan H. and M. C. ALLEN, died September 16, 1867. She was born January 28, 1854. "Lillie, as we called her, was a child remarkable...." Signed: S. G. O'BRYAN, Pastor. "Selma papers please copy." (Nov. 20, 1867; 3.3.)

OLD SPRINGFIELD CEMETERY
Limestone County, Texas

This cemetery is in Fort Parker State Park five miles south of Mexia, Texas. It was copied April 17, 1971 by Mrs. Byron P. Pattie.

Marker erected by Texas State Historical Survey Committee reads:

"Established as a ten acre Community Burial Ground in town plat dedicated January 6, 1838 by Moses Herrin. Oldest graves probably never had stone markers because of primitive frontier living conditions. It is recorded that twelve families were driven out of Springfield late in 1838 by Indian hostilities. The towns growth was halted materially until 1846. The oldest stone is dated 1849.

Another early marker is for a native of New York State "Slain in 1854 violence for his gold". This burial ground was open for use by surrounding areas, and many strangers found a final resting place here along side veterans of the Texas War for Independence, the Mexican War and other conflicts.

Since Springfield was the county seat of Limestone County 1846-1878 and a center for church and businesses, it attracted persons of distinction. Some of them are buried here. Although the town lost its means of growth after it was by passed by the Houston and Texas Central Railroad in 1873, families of old residents often have returned to bury their dead in their established lots, beside pioneer forefathers." BIBLIOPRINTS NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

by Patricia Chadwell

All you Yankees and New England Women can rejoice; the film ordered with the Society's gift of three hundred and ten dollars has arrived, completing our holdings of U. S. Census Microfilm through 1820. We have had a growing demand for early records of the northern states. Please let me take this opportunity to thank the members of the Fort Worth Society who have made it possible for us to fill it.

The Society's money through my discretionary fund has also purchased a roll of microfilm from the Weatherford Public Library containing films of the "Weatherford Democrat", April 11, 1895-January 14, 1897. Those of you who are interested in Parker County may want to see this.

Several of our patrons have recently purchased film of county records from the North Carolina Department of Archives and History, which they eventually plan to donate to the library. Needless to say, we welcome this news.

At the request of one of these ladies, I wrote to see whether a price list, or holdings list was available. Mr. C. F. W. Coker, Division Administrator for Archives and Records, replied that since the microfilm holdings of the Archives number some 40,000 reels, with an annual increase of around 1,000 reels, no such list was available. The enclosed brochure, however, referred the person interested in North Carolina genealogy to Draughon and Johnson's North Carolina Genealogical Reference: A Research Guide. (Gen 016.9756D). Anyone doing North Carolina research should use this book almost constantly. The section on county research lists for each county a detailed breakdown of records existing, showing what records are available in each office in the courthouse, and what records are available at the Archives, in the original form, and on microfilm.

Other information given for each county includes a history of County formation, population data, location and hours open of the Courthouse; record losses; fees charged for copies of records; published source material; local libraries; church records extant; cemetery records; and genealogists, historians and researchers.

We should get back to the subject of microfilmed records, however. Inquiries must be made on an individual basis for costs of records desired. According to our local source, the records run about nine dollars per reel, which is roughly the same as National Archives film.

In scanning Draughon, it appears that the early records most generally available for most counties are wills and deeds. Early marriage records are in the Archives in the original form; the staff of the Archives will check these and other indexed records if the following information is sent: (1) full name of the individual (2) County (3) specific information desired. The counties retain only the indexes to marriages. The brochure containing this and other useful information

is titled "Genealogical Research in the North Carolina Department of Archives and History". It may be requested from the North Carolina Department of Archives and History, Division of Archives and Manuscripts, Box 1881, Raleigh, North Carolina 27602.

One of our local genealogists, Mrs. DeWitt Yost, published in 1970 a book, The Gose Book; the Descendants of Stephen Mathees and Mary Frances Gerking Gose, which has unwittingly been overlooked in this column. She has done a beautiful job, having been in on the "labor pains" attendant upon the birth of the book, I can testify to the meticulous care she took to have it right. Allied families are Perrin, Sillars, and Harding.

Extracts from the book won a prize in the creative writing contest recently sponsored by the Woman's Club.

Jack Geddie has just published another family history, Southern Pollard Families. Those of you who are familiar with his earlier books will be glad to know that this book is up to his usual standard. Copies may be ordered from Henry L. Geddie, Trans-American Life Bldg., 7th and Main, Fort Worth 76102, at \$5.00 each.

Lorin A. Boswell has recently given the library a copy of his book, Gustavus Boswell and Descendants, which was published in a limited edition in 1970. Since the Boswell family has long played an important part in Fort Worth and Tarrant County, the book includes much local history as well as genealogy. The Gustavus Boswell of the title was a revolutionary soldier who resided in Charles Co., Maryland, later migrating with is wife, Zerua Ward, to Virginia and the Carolinas and on to Alabama. Children of this family lived in Alabama and Mississippi before coming to Texas.

One last family history deserves mention. Threadgills in America: A Colonial Virginia Family, compiled by Janis H. Miller and Dr. Francis Dycus Threadgill. Mrs. Miller is a professional genealogist who does research in Washington, D. C. The high quality of this family history recommends her. Allied families include Adams, Campbell, Gilmore, Henderson, Kimbrough, Kindred and Threlkeld.

With the beginning of the new fiscal year in October, we will resume our program of matching. Response since the beginning of this program has been gratifying. Funds will be limited during the next year, since we must replace the 1880 census for Texas, so make your requests early.

Resolution: GEORGE BALL "was born in Lawrence District, S. C. January 5th 1801. Was immersed by ELDER HENRY WITT, into the fellowship of Bethabara church, in said District, on the second Sunday in August, 1824. After several removals, he located near this place and united with this church, Osage, on Saturday before the 3d sabbath in June, 1866...until removed by death on the 27th September, 1867 - aged 66 years, 8 months and 23 days." Mention: bereaved widow, fatherless children. Signed: J. J. SLEDGE, W. L. ADKINS, ROWAN GREEN. Osage, Colorado County, Texas, Oct. 31, 1867. (Nov 27, 1867; 3.3)

In a letter to the Editor, J. A. KIMBALL (Place of residence not mentioned) writes, in part, that on 2d October his wife, previously worn down with cares and ill health, became ill and at the same time "my niece, ANNA CRAWFORD, whom we had adopted as our child, was taken ill." Anna was age 9 years and died on the 4th day of her illness. "The angel of death was again to fold his wings at my door, and Miss MARY S. DICKIE, my wife's sister, a member of my family from her father's death nearly two years ago, was summoned from the walks of life." She became ill 13th Oct., and died on the 28th - "some seven years age." December 14th, 1867. (Dec 11, 1867; 2.5)

Editor's Note: Although the writer implies that his wife died of yellow fever, that fact is not so stated. The Texas Historical and Biographical Magazine, Vol. 1, 1891, Edited by J. B. Link, carried an article by the Rev. J. A. KIMBALL, D. D., entitled "Recollections of Early Days in Texas." This will be found on Pages 443-454, and continued in a later issue on page 565.

JOHN C. ROUTH - the son of JACOB and L. A. ROUTH, was born October 13, 1864, and died on the 2d of November, 1867, aged three years and 20 days. Signed: J. R. (Dec 14, 1867; 3.3)

FELIX FARQUHAR - son of J. L. and HULDAH FARQUHAR, was born June 3d, 1843, and was murdered by Federal soldiers at Brenham, Texas, Nov. 27th, 1867. (Dec 14, 1867; 3.3)

JANE AUGUSTA, the only daughter of JOHN and JOSEPHINE RENTZ, of near Waco, Texas, died October 12, aged 6 years, two months and a half. Signed: D. P. E. "Index and Baptist, Atlanta, Ga., will please copy." (Dec 14, 1867; 3.4)

Excerpt from a letter from W. B. EAVES, dated Bryan City, Nov. 25, to the Editor, "Bro. S. G. O'BRYAN'S name appears on the obituary of our beloved and promising little Lillie. Your brother is gone; my father is gone...." Editor's note: At this time, no obituary of the father of the Rev. W. B. EAVES has been located.

Died - at his plantation residence Dec. 9th, 1867, Dr. GEORGE M. MOSELEY, of Cold Springs, Polk County, Texas. (Dec 26, 1867; 3.3)

Mrs. MARGARET M. HOUSTON, consort of the late General SAM HOUSTON, died December 3d, at Independence, of yellow fever. She was born in Perry County, Alabama, 11 April 1819, daughter of Temple and Nancy Lee. She was baptized in her 14th year. In her 21st year, in 1840, she was united in marriage to Gen. Sam Houston, the President of the Republic of Texas. Four sons and four daughters survive. (A daughter, Mattie, mentioned.) The writer states that he has known her since 1839. Signed: W. CAREY CRANE, Independence, Texas, Dec. 12, 1865. (Dec 26, 1867; 3.3)

Elder SOLAMON GREEN O'BRYAN died 25 September 1867. He was born Warren County, N. C., 22 January 1821, son of DENNIS G. and MARY O'BRYAN. He was baptized into the fellowship of Brown's Baptist Church in Warren County, by Elder W. HUDGINS 23 December 1840. He entered Wake Forest College in 1844, and was graduated 14 June 1849. "On 7th Dec. 1848 he was married to Miss L. ELLA SWAN of Denmark, Iowa and in the fall of 1849 settled in Sumpter County, Alabama, and preached and taught school until his removal to Independence, Texas, in 1852, and accepted the Professorship of Mathematics at Baylor University. Here he remained two years. While here he was called to mourn the death of his beloved companion." In the spring of 1854 he settled in Waco as the pastor of the church in that place. In 1860 he moved to Huntsville, as pastor in that place, and in the fall of 1864 he accepted the presidency of Bosqueville Academy. In 1867 he settled in Port Sullivan as pastor of the church, and was also supplying the church in Cameron, and at Little River where he died, in the 47th year of his age. "He preached his last sermon on Tuesday night at the old Providence Church, Burleson County, September 24th.... He has left a deeply afflicted widow, and three sons and one daughter to contend with the ills of a changing world. She is the dau. of Elder P. B. CHANDLER of Fayette County, Texas, and is a woman of a cultivated mind and of deep piety. She mad a ministers wife. Their union was a happy one on earth. ...his body rests in the graveyard of Macedonia Baptist Church, Burleson County, Texas. ...the writer had known him twenty-five years, personally." Signed: J. W. D. C., December 19th, 1867. (Jan 1, 1868; 3.3)

Editor's note: A biographical sketch, signed S. A. G., appeared in the Texas Historical and Biographical Magazine, Vol. 1, 1891, p. 389. The writer of this sketch states that the Rev. SOLOMON GREEN O'BRYAN was married, twice, the first time to Miss L. ELLA SWAN, "by Rev. JAMES LONGAN - ACRE, Halifax county, Virginia. She died the 27th of August, 1852, and sleeps in the cemetery at Independence. She left no children. On the 20th of February, 1854, he was married the second time to Miss SARAH ANN CHANDLER, eldest daughter of Rev. P. B. CHANDLER, of Fayette County, Texas. He left three sons and one daughter, the eldest, WILLIAM CAREY, eleven years old, MARY P., eight years, JOHN CHANDLER, five years, and SOLOMON GREEN, JR., six months old at the time of his death." Two of these children, Mrs. MARY P. GILLESPIE, and SOLOMON G., deceased. Two are left: W. C. O'BRYAN, McGregor, Texas, and J. C. O'BRYAN, Alleyton, Colorado County, Texas.

NOAH HILL was born 16 June 1811, and died at his daughter's near Brenham, 26 November 1867, in his 57th year. He came to Texas as a missionary in 1841, and from that time on his name appears prominently among the Baptist preachers of Texas. Mention is made of his living at Matagorda where,

during the sojourn of his family there, he travelled extensively over the state. "He removed from Matagordo to Brenham several years ago.... As the writer entered the pastorate of the church at Brenham a year ago he formed for the first time the acquaintance of this good man.... He leaves a wife and five children...." Signed: M. V. SMITH (Jan 1, 1868; 3.3)

Editor's Note: The Texas Historical and Biographical Magazine, Vol. 1, 1891, p. 212, states that the Rev. NOAH HILL was born in Virginia, June 11, 1811 and died in Austin County, Texas. A part of his childhood was spent in North Carolina and part in Georgia "where he grew to manhood among the mountains." He married Miss J. C. HEEFLY, July 25, 1833.

Died - at Brenham, Texas, September 12th 1867, of yellow fever, GEO. Mc DONALD, son of BLUFORD AND ANNIE McDONALD, aged 7 years, 3 months and 18 days. A poem follows, signed A. McD (Jan 15, 1868; 4.2)

WILLIE P. ROGERS, JR., second son of the brave and lamented Col. ROGERS and his wife, M. L. ROGERS, died 25 October 1867. He was born 27th January 1847 in the town of Aberdeen, Miss. "With a heroic father far away on the fields of Mexico, battling for his country's honor, this little one was given as a comfort and solace to a mother's lonely heart.... In his boyhood when an insulted country called for revenge and father and an elder brother responded to the call, Willie was left with the heavy responsibility as head of the family...left fatherless, ... but soon a wounded... brother claimed his attention, and at 14 years of age (he brought the brother home). As his brother improved, he enlisted, and was given the position of Lieutenant in his company, belonging to the regiment commanded by Col. D. S. TERRY. After the war he labored to give comforts to a widowed mother, sisters, and brothers. Signed: R. L. M. (Jan 15, 1868; 4. 2 & 3)

Editor's Note: This obituary was very lengthy and contained much eulogy. The obituaries of this period are greatly reduced, and have been further reduced in microfilming. They must be read in their entirety with a high powered magnifying glass.

EDWARD J. AMERSON died September 23, 1867, a victim of the prevailing epidemic. He had been baptized during the late war, and united with the Baptist church "in this place" several weeks ago. "He and another young man united with the church at the same time, and on the same day were consigned to their final resting place. The writer had several conversations with him.... One temporal interest seemed to give him trouble, that was the destitute condition of his parents in one of the older states. Every dollar he could spare was sent to them. The following tribute to his memory has been sent by them for publication. Signed: J. B. L. (Following the signature of J. B. L (ink) was a long poem, entitled "Reflections on the Death of E. J. Amerson," by E. ROBERTS, with at bottom a dateline: Conyers, Ga., Nov. 28, 1867. The parents names not given.)

TERRELL J. JACKSON died of typhoid pneumonia at his residence near Chappell Hill, Texas, October 26, 1867, in the 62nd year of his life. He was the son of Joseph and Esther JACKSON, and was a native of Greene County, Ga., but was raised mainly in Alabama. At the age of 27 years he was married to Miss JULIA A. COLEMAN, who survives him. He was baptized into the fellowship of Mount Enon Church, Pickens County, Alabama, in 1838. In 1841 he moved with his family to Texas and settled in Washington County. The next year the writer him. Signed: H. GARRETT. (Jan 29, 1868; 3.3)

"ROLAND WEBB - son of J. A. BLACKSHEAR (deceased) and L. A. BLACKSHEAR, of Leona, died at the residence of Mr. Stevensons, in Washington County, December 19, after an illness of three days, aged 8 years, 3 months and 18 days. The Angel of Death has again entered this household, and borne from the lone widow her last treasure, her only remaining son. Little Roland, with sister LIDY and brother JOE, now sleeps undisturbed by the cares of this world." Mentioned: that his mother was "absent on duty, not allowed the consolation of ministering to his wants.... She little thought as she kissed him good-bye a few evenings before.... Signed: BY ONE WHO LOVED HIM, Leon County, Jan. 15, 1868. (Feb 5, 1868; 3.3)

Elder J. C. TEAS, a native of Tennessee, died suddenly at the residence of Mr. Jonas Baker in Navarro County on January 18, 1868, aged about 60 years. He was for many years a member of the bar and practiced the legal profession. The writer regrets that he does not know more of Elder Teas history but from conversations with him he gathers that "he was a considerable time engaged in preaching in the State of Missouri. At the commencement of our terrible Civil War, he espoused the cause of the South, and was compelled to leave home as (a) proscribed Southern sympathizer. As long as his feeble health would permit he remained with the Army as Chaplain, frequently taking a place by his sons in battle, especially at Oak Hill and Elk Horn. When General Price crossed the Mississippi, and his health became impaired, he asked permission to come to Texas. This was in the summer of 1863, and the first time I ever met him. A few months after he came back from a visit to some relatives in Western Texas.... For the last two years he has been employed as missionary for Richland Association, and a portion of the time as an agent for Waco University.

"All this time he had been an exile from his house and his family. At the cbse of the war he went back to Missouri, hoping to be allowed the poor privilege of settling up his affairs, and to remove his family to this State, but not so. His persecutors were relentless, and he was compelled to save his life by flight, not even allowed to stay 24 hours with his family. In a few weeks from this time he was looking for his wife and sons to join him." He was a Mason. Signed: J. ELIOT. (Feb 19, 1868)

Mr. JAMES C. GRADY, son of Capt. DANIEL and SARAH GRADY of Bastrop, died at the residence of Elder R. C. BURLISON in the town of Waco, December 28, 1867, aged 19 years, 8 months, and 21 days. He left a father, a mother, a sister. Signed: P. H. BASTROP. Feb. 15, 1868. (Mar 18, 1868; 3.3)

A letter fo the Editor from the wife of the Rev. D. B. MORRILL, at Ladonia, Fannin County, Texas, states that her husband died February 10, 1868. (Mar 4, 1868; 2.3). A resolution from the church at Ladonia, dated Feb. 21, 1868, states that D. B. MORRILL was born at Bath, in the state of New York, 17 May 1825, and died at Ladonia 10 February 1868. He emigrated to Texas in 1845, was educated at Baylor University and went forth as a missionary to Guadaloupe (sic) for one year, then served churches at the following places: Crockett, 2 years; Montgomery, 4 years; Boston, Bowie County, Texas; Tyler, Smith County, Texas. Signed: C. P. RICHARDSON, W. P. SANDERS, Wm. B. FEATHERSTON. (Apr 15, 1868; 2.4)

JOHN H. BLACKSHEAR was born July 28, 1836 and died January 20, 1868. He was a native of Alabama. He united with the church at Willow Creek, Texas, April 7, 1867. (Apr 1, 1868; 3.3)

Elder WM. OLIVER, of Shelby County, died 8 March 1868, aged about 45 years. A native of Tennessee, he moved to Texas many years ago. He was licensed to preach about seven years ago, and ordained in 1865. He leaves a widow and children. Signed: J. C. MOTT.

"The Memphis (Tenn.) Baptist please copy." (Apr 15, 1868; 2.3)

Mrs. SARAH J. DOWZER, wife of H. K. DOWZER, of Grimes County, died April 5th at the residence of her father, S. D. DRENNAN, Esq., in Independence. She was born in Talladega County, Alabama, Sept. 12, 1841, and was married March 17, 1867. She leaves a husband, an infant, a beloved father and mother, and a large family of brothers and sisters. (Apr 29, 1868; 3.3)

Mrs. IRENE C. LEAKE died near Anderson, Grimes County Texas, 3 April 1868, in the 23d year of her age. The deceased was an affectionate daughter, a devoted wife - leaves a lovely babe, a husband, and relatives. Signed: J. H. S., Anderson, Texas. (May 13, 1868; 3.3)

ISAAC M. BOWEN died at his residence in Collin County, Texas, 5 February 1868. "He was born in South Carolina, raised in Georgia, lived in Alabama, afterward in Mississippi, where in 1847 he was married to Mrs. MORIAH BELL, daughter of SHERWOOD HOLLY, with whom he lived until his death." He died in the 53d year of his age, having been a citizen of Texas for 16 years, a member of the Baptist church 29 years, and an acting deacon 9 years. Mentioned: his three children - two sons and one daughter. Signed: H. E. C. (May 27, 1868; 3.2)

Rev. EDWARD HARRINGTON was born in Mississippi, and died in East Liberty, Texas, 21 April 1868, aged about 46 years. He came to Texas about 1850 and located in Harrison County. He moved to Travis County in 1853, and in 1866 to near Bastrop, on the Colorado, where now his widow and four children live. For several years his health had declined and this spring his friends advised a visit to Sour Lake. In company with his cousin, E. H. HARRINGTON, the trip was attempted, but within twenty miles of the lake he became prostrate and died at East Liberty, where he was buried. Signed: E. H. H., Houston, Texas. (May 27, 1868; 3.3)

Mrs. JANE E. MCGINIS, consort of O. H. P. MCGINIS, died at the residence of C. H. MCGINIS in Travis County, Texas, 18 April 1868, in the 42d year of her age. She had been a member of the Baptist church for several years. "In all the relations of life as a wife, sister, relative, and friend...." (June 24, 1868; 3.3)

Towash, Hill County, Texas. April 18, 1868. Deacon JAMES H. BELL died at the residence of S. C. DYER, in the 86th year of his age. He was born and reared to manhood in South Carolina where he married MARTHA ODELL, with whom he lived for many years. From South Carolina he moved to Madison County, Alabama, where he lived some seventeen years, and joined the Baptist church at Indian Creek. "From thence he moved to Decalb County, Ga., and became a member of the church at Nancy's Creek, where he remained several years.... Following our brother, we next find him in Cherokee County, Ga., where he became one of the constituent members of New Bethel Baptist Church, with which he spent some 20 years of his life. While here, he lost his first wife, and married his second, Mrs. Rebecca DRUMMOND. About 10 years since we find this veteran soldier of the Cross taking his journey to the west, settling in Hill County, Texas. Here he was called to give up his second wife, and for several years he has

resided with his son-in-law, and only surviving child, Sister SARAH DYER" --Tribute of Respect by the Union Baptist Church at Towash, "of which Bro. Bell has been a member since he removed to Texas." (May 13, 1868; 3.1)

Mrs. CARRIE McGUIRE, age 26, died in Washington County, Texas, on the 18th of April last. She was for twelve years a consistent member of the Baptist church. (July 29, 1868; 3.1)

JNO. B. CAMP died at his residence in Grimes County, 29 February 1868, in his 62d year. He was born in Georgia, migrated to Alabama in 1835, and to Texas in 1850 (?-faded) - joined the Baptist church at Anderson in 1857, and was a member of the church at Bedals at the time of his death. (July 29, 1868; 3.1)

"Died, May 15, 1868, in Brenham, Washington County, Texas, at the residence of Eld. V. SMITH, ELIZA L. CAMP, wife of JOHN B. CAM /p/, in her 60th year. She was born in Georgia and emigrated with her husband to Alabama, and thence to Texas. She had long been a member of the Baptist church and at the time of her death was a member at Bedals, Grimes County.

"A father and mother in Israel have passed away, leaving their community, church, and family to mourn their loss. They were married when quite young, and became the parents of twelve children, only four of whom are now living." (July 29, 1868; 3.1)

E. HAMPTON BAILEY, son of brother and sister E. H. HARRINGTON, died June 18th, aged 2 years, 2 months, and 25 days. (Aug 12, 1868; 3.2)

Mrs. B. W. BILLER, wife of Mr. T. P. MILLER of Houston, died 4 September 1868, aged 30 years, 6 months, 22 days. She had been married about 8 years and leaves 3 children. She united with the church in Burleson County, in the spring of 1864. Signed: J. B. L. (Sept 10, 1868; 3.2)

Mrs. ELIZABETH WHITE (formerly NIX) died 22 August, 1868, ag 61 years and 6 months. She was born in Edgefield District, South Carolina, 22 February 1807, was married to B. H. WHITE 11 December 1828, joined the Baptist church in South Carolina in 1831. She moved with her husband to Pike County, Georgia in 1837, thence to Texas in 1854, and settled in Smith County, near Canton. Signed: J. T. H., Tyler, August 25, 1868. (Sept 23, 1868; 3.2)

Editor's Note: Canton, Smith County, Texas, was renamed 8 June 1880, and was given the name of Omen. It is located in the southeastern part of the county, near the town of Arp, and is sometimes referred to as "old Canton." MBS.

Elder S. J. WRIGHT died 14 October 1868. He resided near Bonham, Fannin County. "We hope that soon a suitable notice in memoriam will be furnished us for publication." (Nov 4, 1868; 2.3)

JANE, the wife of GEORGE EDWARDS, departed this life at her residence near Anderson Texas, on 25 September 1868, aged 38 years. A poem follows this notice which is signed NOEL (Nov 4, 1868; 3.2)

"Our beloved sister, ELIZABETH SMITH, a member of the Baptist church for 40 years, departed this life Sept. 28rd, aged nearly 71 years." Henderson, Texas, Oct. 5, 1868. (Nov 4, 1868; 3.4)

TO THE HON. SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

We the Undersigned Citizens of Hill County, State of Texas, would most respectfully represent, that some years ago, a forage plant known as JOHNSON GRASS, was introduced into this County. This grass is now known to be almost ineradicable and spreads rapidly, both from the seed and root. Instead of a blessing it is a curse. It threatens the most serious damage to the Agricultural interest of the County. Our people are making strenuous efforts to check its spread and destroy it where practicable. To aid these efforts, we ask for the enactment of a law, prohibiting under severe penalties, the sowing of Johnson Grass seed, the hauling of the Grass, green or dried, along the public high-ways, or over the lands of another, or the using or disposing of the Grass in such a way that it may be carried by water or by stock on the lands of another.

News from the Library

Perhaps the biggest news around the library these days is our new Assistant Director, Mr. Robert Joyce, who comes to Fort Worth from the Dallas Public Library. Mr. Joyce has indicated that he is impressed by the number of people who use the Southwest and Genealogy Department daily.

When our new fiscal year began October 1st, funds became available once more for matching microfilm. Our budget for this year is very small, so get your requests in early.

An old friend of Fort Worth genealogists, Arless B. Nixon, formerly Director of the Fort Worth Public Library, will speak at the closing luncheon of the Texas State Genealogical Society's convention in Austin on Thanksgiving weekend. It will be my privilege to introduce him.

Mr. Nixon's generosity in apportioning the book budget is mainly responsible for the size and strength of the genealogy collection; his wholehearted co-operation with local genealogists was vital in the forming of both the Fort Worth and the Texas State Genealogical Societies.

The last titles in the Ione Nolan Memorial Collection have been ordered. Target date for making the collection available in the department is January 1. The collection will consist of more than 100 volumes, many of them recent reprints of long unavailable material.

Jan Hart Cohen, formerly of the Southwest and Genealogy staff has recently been made Assistant Archivist at the University of Texas at Arlington. Benjamin Chang, another former staff member, returned to Fort Worth last year after two years in Taiwan. He is now employed by the Fort Worth schools Media Center, and has recently been joined by his wife, Helen.

The most outstanding book which has been added to our collection in recent months is the new third edition of volume I of E. Kay Kirkham's A Survey of American Church Records. This volume covers major denominations before 1880.

Kirkham discusses each major denomination (Baptists, Roman Catholics, Episcopalians, Congregationalists, Lutherans, Mennonites, Methodists, Moravians, Presbyterians, and Quakers) briefly, giving a bibliography of historical works for further study. Then, state by state and county by county, he presents a check-list of existing church records and tells where the records may be found. A glossary of religious terms, and a list of abbreviations used in the book complete the text.

Church records frequently contain that last shred of information that makes or breaks the identification of an ancestor. Using this book will greatly facilitate their location.

Ben Griffin, born 11 May 1832, died September 27. He served in the war, was taken prisoner at Franklin, Tennessee, and confined a prisoner on Johnson's Island for about two years. He entered the ministry after the close of the war. Devoted wife and orphans mentioned. Signed. J. C. R., Henderson, Rusk County, Texas, Oct. 6, 1868. (Nov. 4, 1868; 2.3)

Resolution to memory of Thomas Carson, who died 8 September 1868, at age of 49 years. He was made a Mason in Twin Sisters Lodge, No. 216, in the year 1860. The Lodge extends sympathy "to the surviving family and relatives." Signed, Jno. M. Watson, Sec'y, Twin Lodge, No. 216. (Nov. 11, 1868; 3.2)

Mary S. Garnett died near Chappell Hill 18 August 1868. She was born in Columbia County, Georgia, daughter of Thomas and Mary Hogan; married in Pickens County, Alabama, 15 October 1840 James Garnett, with whom she lived happily till the day of her death. In early youth she joined the Presbyterian Church, afterwards, in 1844, the Baptist church, and has been for many years a member of Chappell Hill Baptist Church. She leaves a husband and a daughter. Signed, F. M. L., Oct. 1868. (Dec. 2, 1868; 3.3)

Pleasant Young, of Bold Springs Church, died 28 October 1868, in the 38th year of his age. He was born in Georgia, and baptized by Brother Creath at Huntsville, Texas about 15 years ago. He leaves a wife and children. (Dec. 9, 1868; 3.2)

Nancy Eps. Bourland, daughter of Claiborn C and Lucinda Chisam, was born in West Tennessee, January 22, 1822, was married to B. F. Bourland in Lamar County, Texas, April 16, 1839, trusted in Christ July 28, 1846, and in October, 1850 joined the Baptist Church of which her husband was a member. Survived by husband and 10 children. Signed, B. F. B. "The Baptist please copy." (Jan. 6, 1869; 3.4) NOTE, MBS: Date of death not given.

News Item entitled, "Death of Judge Crane" - George W. Crane, Esq., of California, fourth son of the late William Crane of Baltimore, died on 5 November, of smallpox, at his home near San Juan, California, in the 41st year of his age." Religious Herald (Jan. 13, 1869)

Rev. Basil Manly, Sr., D. D., died in Greenville, South Carolina on the 21st ult., having nearly completed his 71st year. He was a native of Chatham County, North Carolina, a "fellow-countyman of the late Dr. Brantley, through whose influence...his attention was drawn to the ministry, and under whose direction he was, in part, prepared for his ministerial work, having resided as a student for some time in the family of the late Dr. B." The former died in 1845. After finishing school, he was a minister in Edgefield, South Carolina for more than five years. In 1827 he became

pastor of the First Baptist Church in Charleston, the pulpit having become vacant by the death of Dr. Furman. He was there about ten years. In 1837 he became president of the University of Alabama at Tuscaloosa, where he remained about twenty years. In 1856 he returned to Charleston, S. C., where he was pastor of the Wentworth Street Baptist Church for several years. He then became pastor of the Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama, from which he retired "at the close of '62." His brothers, Gov. MANLY, and Judge MANLY, of North Carolina, are known in the political world as among the most gifted men in their state. -From the Index and Baptist. (Jan.20,1869;2.5,6)

A. A. POWELL died November 19 of typhoid pneumonia, in the 29th year of his age. "The church has lost a valuable member, his wife an affectionate husband, and the community a worthy citizen." Signed, W. T. C. (Jan. 20, 1869; 3.2)

REV. JAMES H. T. KILPATRICK died at his residence near Augusta, Georgia 9 January, in the 76th year of his age. He served as a volunteer in the battles around New Orleans in 1814-15. In 1816 he began to preach near Alexandria, Louisiana. In 1821 he moved to Georgia and continued in the service of his master up to the time of his death, a space of fifty-two years. He spent his life laboring in the Lord's vineyard shoulder to shoulder with such men as JESSE MERCER, ADIEL SHERWOOD, CHARLES MALLARY, BRANTLEY, BAKER, DAGG TUCKER and others. He left three sons, one of whom is a practicing physician in this state, the other two eminent Baptist ministers in Georgia, and three daughters, heads of Baptist families in Georgia. Louisiana Baptist, please copy. Signed, A. (Jan. 27, 1869; 3.2)

"Extract from a sermon preached by Elder R. H. TALIAFERRO, in memoriam of Mrs. M. L. BOULDIN." Malinda L, daughter of COL. DAVID SAUNDERS, was born in Bedford County, Virginia in the year 1805. In the year 1825 she was married to JAMES E. BOULDIN of Henry County, Virginia. The family emigrated to the state of Missouri in the year 1832. A home was selected in Glasgow, in Howard County. There was a Church of Christ which worshipped near the homestead. She was baptized into the fellowship of this church by that "good and great man, A. P. WILLIAMS." This church gave a letter of dismission in full fellowship when she moved to Texas in the year 1852. This letter was given in to the church in Austin, in the membership of which she has since continued.

"A merciful providence preserved the husband and wife, as fellow pilgrims, during the period of fifty-three years. In the Pilgrim's Progress, Bunyan represents the husband as the first to begin the journey to the celestial city. ...All of the children and a number of grand children, were present during her last days. When they left their far distant homes, and travelled hundreds of miles by land and water, to cheer their mother in her last days, they thereby testified their gratitude for the many sacrifices she had made for their welfare." (Feb.3,1869;3.2,3).

Died, January 23d, 1869, ELIZA KELLY, wife of J. C. KELLY, and daughter of JOHN and FANNY SMITH, formerly of Perry County, Alabama, aged 52, and for 38 years an exemplary member of the Baptist church. She was baptized by Elder ABNER McCRAW in 1836 at Concord Church, Perry County, Alabama, and married J. C. KELLY in the same year. With him she emigrated to Union Parish, Louisiana in 1840, where they united with Concord Church in that parish. In 1854 they moved to Walker County, Texas, and became members of Union Grove Church. In 1860 they settled on Cedar Bayou, Chambers County, Texas, where

they aided in constituting Cedar Bayou Baptist Church of Christ, and where she died. She leaves a husband and children. Signed, ANDREW GODDARD, Cedar Bayou, Texas. (Feb. 24, 1869; 3.2)

In a column entitled Our Private Letter Box, the editor, J. B. LINK, states that in the future all letters except those requiring a written answer will be acknowledged in this column. These letters were, largely, acknowledgements of money received from subscribers or agents. In the issue of March 10, 1869, in reply to D. D. SWINDALL, he states, "I regret to hear of the death of COL. WHITE. He had sent two lists of names but no money - said he expected to do so soon. (p.2, col 4)

In the same column the editor writes to T. J. HEFLIN: "Your letter and remittance received. I deeply sympathize with you in your great affliction and loss. None, but those, however, who have experience of a loss like yours - the companion of years, the joy of your life, the light of your eyes taken away - can realize what you must feel under the circumstances. You doubtless she (sic) is better off and a kind heaven will help you provide for the little ones bereaved." (Mar.10,1869;2.4)

NANCY S. SCARBOROUGH died near Brenham, Washington County, Texas, February 14th. She was born in Kentucky, July 14, 1833, was married in 1852 to JAS. W. SCARBOROUGH, and in the same year became a member of the Baptist church. Three children and a husband are left behind, while she has gone to dwell with...two little ones gone before her. Signed, R. V. SMITH, Brenham, Texas Louisiana Baptist and paper at Natchitoches please copy. (Mar. 10, 1869; 3.3)

MRS. BETTIE HUFFMAN, consort of JOSEPH T. HUFFMAN, died 6 February 1869. She was born in Spencer County, Kentucky, 14 September 1833, daughter of JOHN T. and ELIZA STOUT. When about 16 years old she was baptized by Elder WM. HOBBS, and united with Elk (?) Creek Baptist Church in her native county. She was graduated at W. F. HILL's College, Shelbyville, Kentucky, 8 June 1855 (?), was married to JOSEPH T. HUFFMAN 26 October 1858 and moved to Texas in the spring of 1860, living in Collin County until her death. Her husband and six little children survive. Signed, W. H. P. (Mar. 10, 1869; 3.4)

Little Lucy, "eldest daughter of GEORGE and FANNIE R. HARRIS, and first grandchild of the brave and lamented COL. ROGERS," died on the 2nd inst., aged 4 years and 3 months. (Mar. 31, 1869; 3.3)

MARY C. FORRESTER, wife of E. A. FORRESTER, and daughter of the late ROBERT S. and SUSAN D. SIMONTON, was born in Robertson County, Texas on the 5th day of January 1845; joined the Baptist church in July, 1861; was married 8th December 1864, and died in Montgomery, January 30th, 1867. In usual health, while working in the store of her husband, her clothes accidentally caught fire, and burned with such severity that her death ensued.... Signed, A. Friend. Montgomery, Texas. (May 12, 1869; 3.4)

JAMES T. CALAHAN, son of H. E. and R. C. Calahan, of Athens, Texas, died of peneumonia in Colorado Territory, March 12, 1869. He fell in the 22d year of his age, far from home and relatives. (May 26, 1869; 3.4)

COL. CHARLES POWER died at Independence, Washington County, on Saturday, June 12th, aged sixty-four years. An obituary of the deceased will appear at an early day. (June 23, 1869; 3.4)

ELDER G. E. NASH died at his residence in Leon County, May 27, 1869. He was born in Abbeville District South Carolina, August 27, 1799, and had been preaching for more than four_y years. He died in the faith and leaves a large circle of friends.... (June 23, 1869; 3.4)

MRS. MARTHA A. HUBBARD, wife of B. M. HUBBARD, died of measles, near Bastrop, May 28, 1869. Four years a member of the Baptist church. (Note: This is a very long eulogy. Husband and children are mentioned, but not named. MBS) Signed, W. HOWARD. (June 30, 1869; 3.3)

DR. W. H. COOPER died 23d May. He was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, and was a graduate of Yale College. He moved to the State of Texas in 1869 (sic) was baptized into the fellowship of Macedonia Church by the pastor, B. E. Lucas, in September, 1858. He leaves a wife and two children, the oldest of which is at Yale College. He was a true and faithful friend, a noble physician.... His remains, with those of his infant son, sleep in one corner of his garden. "May our dear sister and brother, the wife and son of the departed, find strength and comfort...." Signed, W.H.H. HAYS (July 7, 1869; 3.4)

SARAH M. COOK, wife of J. D. COOK, died at her residence of Dewitt County, Texas, aged 31 years, 1 month and 20 days. She was for 19 years a pious member of the Baptist church. (July 7, 1869;)

Notes: Dora Petty Rodgers, owner of the Bible in 1962, now deceased, was the daughter of James Wyatt and Patsy (Manley) Petty, whose family inherited the Bible. At the time of our interview, she made the following remarks about the people of the Bible record. The information in brackets is mine. Nancy T. Samuels.

Patsy Kinslow's mother was an Olliphant. (Incorrect; she was probably Barbara Coffman who married Ambrose Kinslow 17 Feb. 1803, Barren Co., Ky.)

Jonathan Manley's mother was a Coleman. (Probably incorrect; Rachel is thought to have been an Oliphant, but the Coleman family was of some relation.)

Dick Johnson's mother was also a Coleman and sister of Jonathan Manley's mother. (This does not seem likely from the standpoint of generations.)

Rachel and Dick Johnson were first cousins. (It is known that Jonathan, Ben and William Manley had at least one sister; did she marry a Johnson? This is my line. NTS)

Elizabeth Manley and Gabe Manley were first cousins. (True.)

Grandfather Jonathan Manley lived in Warren, Allen and Barren Counties, Kentucky; he is buried in Barren County on his farm.

My grandmother is buried near the so-called Pruitt's Knob. This is on the Louisville & Nashville Stage Line and was later called the L. & N. Pike.

My grandparents lived near the place called Cave City, and Scottsville and the Mammoth Cave.

I was reared in Kentucky and came to Texas when a young woman, so we already had relatives here.

The children of Jonathan Manley who came to Texas were Rachel and Dick Johnson, Elizabeth and Gabe Manley, Joe Manley who married a Price, and Elisha (sic) Dru Berta and A. Larrence. Dru Berta married second John Oliver.

Aunt Isabell Harlows lived in Barren County, near the Warren County line.

Aunt Barbara and Henry Mansfield lived near Glasgow. Their son Joe Mansfield married his first cousin "Sis" Mirum Osborn.

Three of Aunt Nancy Osborn's children are still living (1962): Ewing, age about 93, of Scottsville; Mrs. Ann Moore, about 88, of Scottsville; and Douglas Osborn, the baby, age about 82, also of Scottsville.

The granddaughter of "Sis" and Joe Mansfield (Marietta Mansfield) is pastor of Brooks Methodist Church, Brooks, Kentucky. She was a missionary in India for fifteen years.

Patsy and James Wyatt Petty lived in Allen County, near Scottsville.

Mary Manley and J. J. Osborn (he was nephew of R. B. Osborn) lived near Bowling Green in Warren County.

Jonathan F. (John) Manley married "Can" Carter.

Gabriel G., the other son of grandfather by his second marriage, went to Missouri where his uncle William was.

The Carvers were related. Mrs. Carver was a Wheeler. A Manley girl married Wheeler, out of the Oliphant family. (?)

The Manleys always said they were Dutch.

Joe Manley lived near Graford in Palo Pinto County, Texas.

Dru Berta married first at the age of nineteen A. Lawrence who was older than she by some years. They lived at Glasgow, Kentucky. She married John Oliver in Kentucky and they lived near Bonham, Texas.

Rachel and Dick Johnson lived in Parker County, Texas.

Annie Houtchen's mother was a Wheeler and was first cousin to Patsy Manley Petty. Annie married Emerson (?).

Few genealogists whom I know need to be motivated, but motivation and discipline are the twin engines of success. Lacking either, a life otherwise full of promise can end with little fulfillment.

Without motivation, meaningful goals in research are not sought. Without discipline aims are only partially achieved. A brilliant genealogist may attain only half his potential if he lacks either strong desire or discipline of action.

Of the two, motivation is almost impossible to start, if it isn't already going. But discipline is by far the harder to keep going.

Self-discipline is especially hard to keep in tack after a few years of unsuccessful research. Tragedy stalks many a retired person when escape from self-discipline seems at first to be the rule.

The kind of discipline involved in leading a satisfactory research career can be defined as "development of the faculties by exercise." Most important is training one's self to set short-term goals. When discipline to this end becomes a habit, major benefits occur to the beginner, the mid-streamer, and the advanced researcher alike.

Such goal-setting discipline creates an environment in which other self-discipline can be made useful. It stimulates that ability to put first things first. This is probably the greatest success a person can achieve.
