Most of the names which appear as property owners on the plat of Gainesville were early county officials and may have been those who purchased lots at the first sale of town lots. At the time the plat was made, the other lots may not have been sold. Daniel Montague was the county surveyor. He may have made the plat about 1850. Three of the town's streets were named for early settlers, Harvey Boggs, James C. Dixon, and Rama Dye. California Street was, no doubt, named because of immigrants coming through on their way to the gold fields in California.

An act to create Cooke County, from Fannin County, was approved by the legislature on 20 March 1848. The chief justice of Denton County was to cause an election for county officials on the first Monday in August, 1848. The seat of justice was to be at the residence of Aaron Hill until otherwise provided by law.

According to A. Merton Smith (First 100 Years in Cooke County), Robert Scott, chief justice of Grayson County presided over the organization formalities. The first minutes of the county court were made on 27 December 1848. The first officials were: ROBERT WHEELOCK, chief justice, ROBERT E. KEY [EAKY, EKEY], tax assessor and collector, and commissioners HARVEY BOGGS, R. D. TURNER, JAMES C. DICKSON and ADAM DOZIER. William R. Strong states, in his Reminiscences, that Mary E. Clark donated forty acres from her survey for the county seat.

At the 20 August 1849 meeting of the county court, it was ordered that the county seat be laid off as soon as possible and named "Liberty," and that a sale of town lots was to be held on September 15, 1849. At that time there were about forty-seven adults residing in the Gainesville area, according to the memoirs of Robert Bean (son of William Bean).

The first county officials, of record in the Archives Division, Texas State Library, were those elected in March, August and October, 1849, and commissioned in September and November. They were: ROBERT WHEELOCK, chief justice, MARCUS WEBSTER, sheriff, WILLIAM BROWN, district clerk, STEPHEN BROWN, county clerk, DANIEL MONTAGUE, surveyor, FRANKLIN CARPENTER, coroner, JAMES C. DIXON and RICHARD D. TURNER, justices of the peace, and ALEXANDER "SANDY" BOUTWELL and HENRY WILSON, constables. JAMES HILL replaced MARCUS WEBSTER as sheriff in August, 1849.

At the regular election in August, 1850, WHEELOCK, S. BROWN, MONTAGUE and CARPENTER were re-elected. JAMES C. DIXON was elected assessor and collector, ALEXANDER BOUTWELL became sheriff, and the commissioners were HARVEY BOGGS, RICHARD D. TURNER, WILLIAM B. CARTER, and ELIAS UNDERWOOD. JOHN CHADWELL was county treasurer. JAMES MARTIN became county clerk in 1851 and chief justice in 1852. All of these names appear on the plat of Gainesville.

The first court house was probably a crude affair. It was built by B. F. Carpenter. Jim Dixon's old steer went into it for shelter one day and tore it down trying to get out, according to William R. Strong. About 1853 a frame building was erected.

The first school was built about 1851, by B. F. Carpenter, with the help of Alexander Boutwell and William R. Strong. During the summer, when the school was not in use, Boutwell opened his saloon in the building, until his building on the square was completed. Judge McCall is said to have been the first teacher in the school, but this may have been later.

The Handbook of Texas states that the townsite was chosen in 1850 and named for Edmund P. Gaines. W. B. Parker, who saw the town in 1854, described it as "a collection of five or six cabins dignified with the name of a town." By 1858 the Butterfield mail and stage line came through Gainesville and the town had a post office which served the whole county, also serving the few settlers in what was later Montague County and some of the Denton County settlers.

WAXAHACHIE

Ellis County was created by the legislature that created Tarrant County. It also came out of Navarro County and officially became a new county on 20 December 1849. Its area included what comprises present Ellis County, plus a triangular area of present northeast Johnson County which did not become a part of the latter county until 1871.

According to the creation act, [MICHAEL] T. FLAHERTY, B. F. HAWKINS, NORMAN WHITTENBURG, [GEORGE] YOUNGER, WILLIAM DOWNING, JAMES E. PATTON, JAMES JACKSON, and WILLIAM S. MITCHELL were to constitute a board of commissioners to ascertain the center of the county, to solicit donations of land, and to nominate places from which the electorate would choose a county seat, which, when chosen, would bear the name of Waxahachie.

On 28 January 1850 and 5 February 1850, legislative acts were approved, correcting an error (pertaining to boundaries) in the creation act, and calling for an election of county officials on the first Monday in August 1850.

The first elected officials were: WILLIAM HAWKINS (Chief Justice), BENJAMIN F. HAWKINS (County Clerk), ROBERT M. BERRY (Assessor & Collector), EMORY W. ROGERS (Treasurer), WILLIAM H. H. BRADFORD (Sheriff), and CHARLES H. BARKER (District Clerk). Commissioners were: LARKIN NEWTON, JAMES S. BERRY, THOMAS HERRON, and HENRY TRIMBLE. Justices of the Peace were: WILLIAM T. PATTON, GEORGE C. PARKS, HENRY TRIMBLE, and WILLIAM IRWIN.

The donation of EMORY W. ROGERS was chosen as the county seat and was named, per law, Waxahachie. The county court held its first meeting in the home of EMORY W. ROGERS, "there being no place designated by law." Its first session was on Monday, 19 August 1850. The court ordered that RICHARD DONALDSON be employed to survey the county seat "comprising 60 acres into a public square, lots, streets, and allies" and that he be allowed the sum of \$100, to be paid in town lots. The court, still in session on 23 August 1850, appointed ELBERT C. NEWTON to superintend the advertising, auctioning-off, and executing deeds to the town lots. On the same day, the court commissioned JOSEPH H. WHITTENBURG to build a court house. He reported to the court, in November, that the building was complete, as specified by the court.

On Monday, 17 February 1851, R. C. DONALDSON, Surveyor of the Town of Waxahachie, made his report (which was dated September 1850) to the county court. He stated that he commenced the town tract survey in "the middle of Spring branch Channel where RODGERS Spring puts into the branch." He stated that the survey contained 62 acres, 1 rod, and 19 perches, including Block No. 1, which block contained something over one and three-fourths acres, indicating that this was where ROGERS lived. The report stated that the blocks were 200 feet square, except for the following: No. 1 which was 200 x 260 feet; No. 33 was 200 x 315 feet; No. 34 was 200 x 280 feet; No. 35 was 200 x 200 feet; No. 36 was 200 x 140 feet; No. 40 was 200 x 112 feet; and Numbers 37, 38, & 39 were 200 x 382 feet. The streets were 60 feet wide.

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DECATUR

In response to a petition (1855) from certain citizens of the Cooke and Denton Land District, Wise County was created by the legislature and officially became a county (30 miles square) on 23 January 1856. The act called for an election of officers to be held on the first Monday in May [1856]. Until a county seat could be chosen, courts would be held at DANIEL HOWELL'S store. The new Chief Justice and at least two of his commissioners were to select two or more places within a five mile radius of the center of the county, said places to be voted upon for a county seat. When selected, the site would be called Taylorsville, presumably in honor of General Zachary Taylor.

The first elected officials were: WILLIAM S. OATES (Chief Justice), GRANGER SALMON (District Clerk), ABSALOM BISHOP (County Clerk), JOHN W. HALE (Sheriff), ROBERT C. MOUNTS (Assessor & Collector), and JOHN T. WAGGONER (Treasurer). The commissioners were: BENJ. B. HANEY, GEORGE BIRDWELL, SAMUEL L. TERRELL, and JESSE C. KINCANNON. Justices of the Peace were: JAMES ROBERTS & BENJ. R. EARP (Pct 1), JAMES DAVIS & FRANK M. HOLDEN (Pct 2), SYLVANUS BEAN & LYCURGUS KING (Pct 3), and SAMUEL L. TERRELL (Pct 4).

By the last of May, the new county had been surveyed and the center located. Several places were put into nomination for a county seat. Eventually, after several hotly-contested elections, the site of present Decatur was chosen, and the landowner, JAMES A. PROCTOR, donated 60 acres for the townsite, called Taylorsville. It was surveyed by ABSALOM BISHOP. Business lots around the square sold for \$100 each.


In July, 1857, a petition bearing 40 signatures was sent to the legislature, asking that the name of the county seat be changed to Decatur, presumably in honor of Commodore Stephen Decatur. The act granting the change was approved 7 January 1858.

The first business in the town was that of DANIEL HOWELL and his partner H. ELMORE ALLEN. By 1860, HOWELL was the wealthiest man in the county, worth \$25,000. DANIEL WAGGONER was second, worth \$21,000.


GOOD NEWS!! We may not get much else during the rest of the fiscal year, but we are going to have new census indexes! The Bicentennial is bringing a bonanza in this much needed area. We have just blown a major portion of the book budget on indexes for the following states: Alabama - 1850; Arkansas - 1850; Georgia - 1850; Iowa - 1850; Kentucky - 1850; Maryland - 1830; North Carolina - 1850; New Jersey - 1850; New York City - 1850; New York State - 1810; Pennsylvania - 1830 and 1850; Rhode Island - 1850; South Carolina - 1820; Tennessee - 1840; Virginia - 1830, 1850 and Accomac County for 1800; and Indiana 1840. All but the Indiana census are published by Accelerated Indexing Systems and have been promised for delivery by July 4.

Hours of service at the Central Library have been shortened. The library now opens at 10:00 AM Monday through Friday instead of 9:00 AM and closes at 6:00 PM on Friday. The change is designed to facilitate an inventory of the entire central building collection before we move it to our new building. City Council has authorized the purchase of a site bounded by 2nd on the North, 3rd on the South, Taylor on the East and Burnet on the West.

The genealogical collection has been rearranged once more, in an effort to further our goal of having everything on a given state in the same place. The exchange periodicals are now shelved at the end of the state to which they pertain, instead of as a group. Family publications follow the 929.2's and general publications will be housed in the stacks with other periodicals. We plan a bibliography of all of our periodicals to help you use them more effectively.

The Fort Worth area now has an LDS Branch Genealogical Library located in the Fort Worth Stake Center, 4401 East Loop 820 North. Mrs. W. C. (Faye) Courreges is the librarian. This library offers access to the magnificent mass of microfilmed material held by the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Salt Lake City. Hours of service are Tuesday: 5:00-9:00, Thursday and Friday 10:00 to 10:00 and Saturday 9:00 to 12:00. Phone 284-4472 for further information. They have indexes to millions of rolls of microfilms which may be borrowed for two weeks for the price of the postage. Many records, otherwise unavailable to many researchers, without a trip to the county or archive where the originals are stored. Make good use of this wonderful facility!

Volunteers are still very much needed at the library. If you have a spare moment now and then - please offer to help.

COMPROLLERS PLAT BOOK OF TEXAS 1850-1874*

NEW BRAUNFELS, COMAL TOWN, & FREDERICKSBURG

The old plat book, in the Archives Division, Texas State Library, contains beautifully-done plats of the old German-settled towns of New Braunfels and Fredericksburg.

There are two plats of Fredericksburg. One is of the town and all the out-lying lots. The other, reproduced herein, is a loose map in the book and is drawn to a larger scale than the first mentioned. It was drawn by Christian Doebner, who is enumerated on the 1850 census as a 40-year-old surveyor. Note the Verein's Kirche on the town square.

The plat of New Braunfels and Comal Town (just across the Comal River) is very dim and reproduces poorly. A meticulously-done plat, it has names written on it that are almost impossible to read, even with a magnifying glass. The plat also has tiny black "squares" to indicate businesses and dwellings. The names and locations, shown on our reproduction, are the only ones that we could discern with any degree of accuracy. Note the location of the Verein.

The Adelsverein, or Association of Noblemen, also known as Meinzer Verein, was organized 20 April 1842, by German noblemen, at Biebrich on the Rhine, "for the purpose of purchasing land in the free state of Texas." Count Victor von Leiningen and Count Joseph Boos Waldeck, members of the Verein, were sent to Texas. Leiningen visited President Sam Houston, but was unsuccessful in getting a grant of land. Boos Waldeck purchased over four thousand acres in Fayette County, but he later withdrew from the Verein.

On 24 March 1844, the purpose of the Verein was modified in a general meeting, at Mainz, Germany, where an association was created for the protection of German immigrants to Texas. Leiningen was elected president. A capital stock of 200,000 gulden (\$80,000) was created, and provisions made for financial help to immigrants, until their first crops were harvested.

On 7 April 1844, the Verein purchased, from Alexander Bourgeois d'Orvanne, a large tract of land west of San Antonio. Late that year Prince Carl of Solms-Braunfels, newly appointed commissioner-general, arrived in Texas and was informed that the Bourgeois grant had been forfeited. He decided against settling colonists on the Fayette County purchase made by Waldeck. He later purchased 3,878,000 acres of the Fisher-Miller land grant, on the south bank of the Colorado River and west of the Llano River.

The first immigrants landed in Texas in late 1844, or early 1845, and eventually settled present New Braunfels, where Solms-Braunfels had

bought two leagues of land (on 14 March 1845), on the Comal River. He gave the settlers building-lots and ten-acre plots of land. The settlement was named for his home town, Braunfels on the Lahn. One group of immigrants left Germany, in October, 1845, on the ships "Neptune" and "Hurcules." They arrived on the Texas coast some fifty-eight days later, and, after some difficulty, landed at Indianola, eventually making their way to New Braunfels.

In the spring of 1846, a log kirche (church) was built at New Braunfels. It served as a church, school, Verein's meeting place, and company store house. J. M. Meriwether, a Virginian, built a grist and saw-mill. Dr. Thomas Koester, from Frankfort, Germany, built the first bakery. John F. Torrey, a well-known Texas Indian trader, from Connecticut, built a flour and textile mill, probably in the early 1850's. By 1850, the town and Comal Town, across the river, were thriving places with a variety of businesses found in few other Texas towns at that time.

The settlement of Comal Town began in 1845-1846. The town retained its original place name, although, since 1847, it has been an intergral part of New Braunfels. In 1847, it became Ward Two of New Braunfels, and, in 1852, a second polling place. For some time the towns had separate school systems.

Comal County was created from Travis and Bexar Land Districts, in March 1846, with New Braunfels as the county seat. The first election of officials was on 13 July 1846. The first county court met 7 August 1846, in the house of Conrad Seabaugh. The county originally included part of Kendall and Blanco counties (until 1858), between present Comal and Gillespie counties.

The financial affairs of the Verein went from bad to worse. In the summer of 1847 they declared bankruptcy. During its five years of operation, the Verein brought 7,380 immigrants to Texas.

Fredericksburg, northwest of New Braunfels, in Gillespie County, was founded in May, 1846, when John O. Meusebach, successor of Solms-Braunfels, led a wagon train of some 120 settlers from New Braunfels. They settled in the Pedernales River valley, where Meusebach had bought 20,000 acres of headright land the year before. Founded on 8 May 1846, the town was named for Prince Freckerick of Prussia, a patron of the Adelsverein. Soon after the colonists arrived, they erected an octagonal church, called (because of its peculiar shape) the Kaffee-muehle (coffee mill) or Verein's Kirche. It was used by all denominations and served as a town hall and school house.

To take possession of the Fisher-Miller land grants, Meusebach entered the territory on the San Saba River, where, on 2 March 1847, he made a treaty with the Comanche Indian chiefs. Several settlements, Castell, Leiningen, Shoenburg, and Bettina, were made on the north bank of the Llano River, within the Fisher-Miller grant. Of these, only Castell, in present Llano County, has survived.

In October 1845, Lyman Wight led a group of Mormans from Illinois to Texas. In the fall of 1846, they moved to south Texas, eventually settl-

ing (in 1847) at a location near Fredericksburg. They established a community called Zodiac, consisting of a gristmill, sawmill, store, school, and temple. The mill was destroyed by floods, about 1851. That disaster and political reasons caused the Mormans to remove to another section of Texas.

Gillespie County was formed and organized in 1848, with Fredericksburg as the county seat. Created from Travis and Bexar Counties, it included present Mason and part of Llano counties. Lyman Wight was elected Chief Justice of the county, in 1850; however, he was a subject of controversy and was dismissed from office in 1851. Though the Germans and Mormans were peacable in social and business affairs, they differed politically. Apparently, Wight did not understand the importance of attending sessions of the Commissioners Court.

On 5 December 1848, Fort Martin Scott was established by United States Army troops. It was located about two miles from Fredericksburg. The German and Morman settlements, and the fort, attracted many settlers of diverse occupations. By 1850, the town of Fredericksburg had a population of 754 and was probably the largest town on the western frontier of Texas. It was on the San Antonio-El Paso road, serving as a supply stop for migrants going west.

Though historians state that the Nimitz Hotel was established in Fredericksburg in 1847, that family is found on the 1850 census, living in the vicinity of Zodiac Mills and Live Oak Creek, with the head of the household (Charles H. Nimitz) listed as a farmer. The only hotel-keeper, enumerated on the census, was one Gabriel Martin, in the town of Fredericksburg.

With the building of the Verein's Kirche and subsequent structures, including the Sunday Houses, Fredericksburg's settlers contributed their own architectural designs, giving the town the flavor of a continental village -- a flavor that is still there today. Easter fires, singing fests, and marksman tournaments are customs of the early period that are still continued.

MEMORIAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
ORGANIZED JUNE 2, 1838
SAN AUGUSTINE, TEXAS

The Bethel Presbyterian Church at Goodlaw's School was organized 2 June 1838 four miles west of San Augustine, Texas, on Spur 85. Rev. Hugh Wilson, D.D., Missionary of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of the U. S. of America, organized their first church in the Republic of Texas.

The present sanctuary was built in 1887 in time for the 50th anniversary and renamed Memorial Presbyterian Church in memory of its early pioneers. Three pulpit chairs were given to the church by Miss Fanny Rankin in 1887. The hand-made pulpit, which the guest book now rests on, was used until recent years. Two of the hand-made pews are to be found in a room to the right of the sanctuary.

The original Session Minutes are now in the possession of the Presbyterian Historical Foundation, Montreat, North Carolina; however, a copy is available at the church. Quite a few old books are also to be found in the church library.

The Southwest and Genealogy Department looks pretty chaotic these days, with great gaps in the shelves and book trucks everywhere. We have gotten the word on the future of the department in the new library building; the Tarrant (local history) and Genealogy Collections will remain a special department, while the Southwest Collection will be dispersed throughout the other adult books. So we are in the process of moving all genealogically significant material from the Southwest Collection to the Genealogy Collection.

The architects are beginning the planning of the new building, which will be located on a site between 2nd and 3rd Streets and Taylor and Lamar Streets. Unfortunately, inflation has drastically eaten away the funds earmarked for construction, so that the building will be only 2/3rds of the size recommended in 1970, and will not include an auditorium as originally planned. The tentative opening date is 1979. It is estimated by architect Morris Parker that the new library will run out of space by 1988 and some library functions may have to be left in the current building.

ELLEN A. MERRELL, "third daughter of JAMES T. and MATILDA S. GARNER, was born in Dewitt county, Texas, April 24th, 1862, and fell asleep in Jesus, September 20th, 1880, in Washington county, Mississippi. At the age of seven she was removed from the place of her birth to San Patricio county, Texas, where she remained until the 23rd of May previous to her death.... Since the death of her father in 1872, she was the bosom friend and comforting counselor of her widowed mother.... Sister Ellen professed faith ... August 21, 1877, and united with the church at this place on the following Sabbath..... She was won from her mother, and married to JAMES M. MERRELL, August 7, 1879. Her stay with us now soon came to an end, for

on the 13th of May, 1880, she and her husband started on a journey to Mississippi, to visit his relatives and friends there. Soon after they had reached their point of destination Ellen was taken sick...." [Very long eulogy; poem follows.] Signed: BUTLER KIMBALL, Sharpsburg, Texas.

ROBERT H[? - crease in paper] MUHLBACH, superintendent of the Sunday school in Houston, died [date not given but probably the Sunday prior to July 4]. "Bro. Muhlback came to Texas in 1866. a Roman Catholic, was converted and baptized under the ministry of DR. BURLESON. He attended some time in study in Waco University.... He leaves a devoted wife and two little daughters. ... A large concourse of brethren and friends followed the remains to Glenwood Cemetery, the services being conducted in German and English by Rev. W. F. BECKER, assisted by Bro. C. F. JENSEN and the writer." Signed: F. KIEKER, Houston, July 4. (July 28, 1881; 3.2,3)

"The noblest man in all our ranks has fallen. Elder T. M. ANDERSON, of Cameron, wrote us under date of July 29th, ELD. J. W. D. CREATH died at 7 P.M. yesterday, at my house." (August 4, 1881; 2.3) [For biographical data on J. W. D. Creath, see J. B. Link's Texas: Historical and Biographical Magazine. 1892. 2 vols.]

"GEORGE AUGUSTUS STRICKLAND died at his residence in Coryell county, Texas, on the 14th of July, 1881, aged sixty-six years, eight months, and nineteen days, disease consumption. Before he died he made the following memorandum: George Augustus Strickland was born near Raleigh, North Carolina, October 25th, 1814. Moved with his father to Mississippi, Panola county, when quite young. Professed faith ... in the summer of 1838, joined the Union Baptist church near his father's residence. In 1843 or 1844 was elected deacon in that church.... Moved to Texas in the winter of 1866, he attached himself to the Chappell Hill church, 1867. Bought land in Coryelle County, Texas and he and his family joined the Union Creek Baptist Church, 1869. [The writer adds that on 18 August 1877 Mr. Strickland and many others organized themselves into the Eagle Springs church, where his membership remained until his death. Long eulogy, followed by resolutions of the Eagle Springs church.] Signed: P. B. CHANDLER, Mod.; S. J. MARTIN, clerk. (Aug. 11, 1881; 3.2)

Deacon JAMES S. SNELLING died 22 August 1881, "past 62 years of age. Early in life, joined Harmony Baptist church, in Caldwell Co., Kentucky.... During the years of his medical practice in Mississippi, he was constantly engaged in his peculiar way in calling sinners to repentance.... He lived several years in California, but for the past eighteen years has been a resident of Texas...." (Aug. 11, 1881; 3.2)

B. K. SMITH died June 5. "Had he lived until the 23d of July succeeding, he would have been forty-seven years of age." In 1856 he became a member of the Baptist church. "A more devoted

father, more affectionate husband, a more loving, dutiful son is rarely if ever found.... The Longview church [has] lost one of her most faithful members...." Signed: A. B. V. Longview, Texas, August 5, 1881. (August 25, 1881; 3.2)

MR. JAS. H. LANDRUM died in San Saba County, Texas, at the residence of Mr. R. E. WOOD on July 19, 1881, aged 43 years. "Bro. Landrum was born in Tennessee August 10, 1838, moved to Texas in 1863, where he was married in the same year to ANNIE BROWN, daughter of SAUNDERS and ELIZABETH BROWN. He was a faithful member of the Lampasas Baptist church at the time of his death.... He leaves a wife and four children...." Signed: Friend. (August 25, 1881; 3.2)

JOHN H. HARGIS died at the residence of his son-in-law, I. J. MILLER, near Lockhart, Caldwell County, Texas, July 29, 1881 in the seventh-sixth year of his age. "Father Hargis was born in Pearson [Person] county, North Carolina, December 14, 1805; joined the Baptist church at the age of twenty-one, moved to Mississippi where he lived twenty years. In 1853 he moved to Texas and settled in Caldwell county, where he gathered around him the few Baptists of his neighborhood and organized what is now known as the Martindale Baptist church, in which he remained a member and deacon at his death. Father H. left a wife and seven children and many grandchildren...." Martindale, August 8, 1881. (August 25, 1881; 3.2)

Mr. E. C. WILLIAMSON died July 16, 1881, at his home near Nelsonville, in the forty-eighth year of his age. "He was born in Washington County, Georgia, in 1833; married March 7, 1854 to Miss M. E. JOHNSON, came to Texas the same year; baptized in 1857 by Rev. DAVID FISHER; served as clerk of the Mill Creek church ever since its organization in 1858 up to his death, serving as deacon also from 1879 to his death...." Leaves wife and children. Signed: H. L. G. (August 25, 1881; 3.2)

"MRS. JUDITH A. ECHOLS departed this life at her residence, near Hearne, on the 14th of August, aged 70 years, 8 months, and 9 days. The separation of this pious sister from her beloved husband was narrowed into the brief space of only a few months. Over one half century they lived together. Sister Echols was raised in Virginia, was married in Alabama, lived many years in Mississippi...." Signed: R. F. (Sept. 8, 1881)

MRS. LOU GORE, wife of Elder S. R. GORE, died August 26th. "Mrs. Gore was born September 20, 1836, in South Carolina; joined the Baptist church and was baptized by Elder POWEL in South Carolina August 1852; married December 22, 1853. After a removal from South Carolina to Georgia she resided for several years, [as written; something appears to have been omitted here]. From thence Elder Gore moved to Texas, where up to the time of her fatal illness, she found work for heart and hands. ..." Resolutions by Pisgah Baptist Church follow. Copies were to be sent to the Baptist Index, Atlanta, Ga.; the Palestine Advocate; Palestine New Era; Cartersville Free Press, Georgia. (September 8, 1881; 3.2)

We have determined, from a study of the tax rolls of Parker County and a comparison of names of owners of town lots thereon, that the plat shown here was probably drawn in the 1860's.

Parker County was created by an act approved by the Texas Legislature, 12 December 1855. The act stipulated that within three months the county was to be surveyed, election precincts established, and an election-date set to choose officials. The newly-elected officials were to select three sites to be voted upon for the county seat.

The new county was surveyed by Llewellen Murphy, a deputy-surveyor for the Denton Land District. On 2 March 1856 three hundred and twenty acres of land near the center of the county was laid out by Isaac O. Headley and David O. Norton as a site for a future county seat. This site was the one chosen in the election of April, 1856.

A sale of town lots was planned for 24 June 1856. Announcements of the event appeared in newspapers, including the Dallas Herald on 24 May 1856.


The first sale of lots brought \$9,700. An additional \$2,000 came from the second sale held on 12 August 1856. The lots were of varying sizes:

- 50' x 75' or 100'
- 75' x 75', 100', or 150'
- 150' x 150', 250', or 300'
- 250' x 250', 300', or 425'
- 300' x 405'

In the center of the town was the 500' square, for the court house.

The 1856 tax rolls of Parker Co. show no owners of lots in Weatherford, since sales of lots were not held until after mid-year.



Most of the men listed in 1857 owned several lots. Those owning the most were BARKER (11 lots), NORTON (10 lots), PRINCE (13 lots), and SEWELL (10 lots). In 1858, BARKER owned 10 lots, DANIEL owned 9, NORTON owned 9, PRINCE owned 9, and SEWELL owned 10. In 1859, those owning the most lots were ANDERSON (11), BARKER (11), and PRINCE (9).

It appears that the greatest influx into the town was between 1857 and 1858. The city government was organized on 13 March 1858, with John W. CURTIS the first mayor, John P. LAYNE recorder, Joseph TUCKER treasurer, Peter S. HALL constable, and aldermen Joshua BARKER, J. B. KEARBY, D. O. NORTON and B.L. RICHEY.

The streets of Weatherford were named by the city officials on 24 November 1858. Below is a sketch with the names of the first streets:



By about 1860, the town had seven or eight dry goods stores, four groceries, three saloons, two livery stables, three hotels, several boarding houses and two mills, according to the diary of James Hamilton Baker, a resident of Palo Pinto County.

STEPHENVILLE

Erath County, which at its creation bore no resemblance to its present shape, was in territory that was first within Milam County until 1854, when Bosque County was created. In 1854, and until January 1856, Erath County was a part of Bosque County. McLennan County, created in 1850, had its western portion (west of the Brazos River) taken from Milam County, and the county seat, Waco, became a gathering-place for settlers and explorers who traversed the Bosque and Leon rivers into territory to the northwest. McLennan, Bosque and Erath Counties were in the Milam Land District.

In late May 1855, George B. Erath and Neil McLennan accompanied a group of pioneers, from Waco, up the Bosque into the central part of present Erath County. Upon land owned by John M. Stephen, one of the group, George B. Erath laid out a townsite for a town to be called Stephenville. The settlers immediately petitioned the Texas Legislature to create a new county and, on 4 July 1855, John M. Stephen offered to donate land for the county seat.

Advertisements appeared in various newspapers, to entice new settlers to the area. One such advertisement read: "50,000 acres of land on the headwaters of Kickapoo Creek and the Poluxy [sic] River in Erath County, 20 miles from the new and flourishing town of Stephenville . . . title indisputable and terms easy . . ."

The new county, named Erath, was created by an act of the legislature approved 25 January 1856, its boundaries "beginning on the north line of Bosque County, and the limits of Johnson County [which then included most of present Hood and part of Somervell Counties] eight miles from the Brazos river, then south 60 degrees west 30 miles, then north 30 degrees west 30 miles, then north 60 degrees east 30 miles, then south 30 degrees east 30 miles to the beginning . . ."

Section 2 of the creation act stated that the county seat was to be located at the town of Stephenville, . . . "provided that the owner of the land shall make the donation of said land to said county which he proposed on 4th July 1855, said proposal signed by said owner and filed in the county clerk's office in Bosque County."

A frame house was built of post oak timber, hewn and weather-boarded with burr-oak boards four feet long, made on the Leon River, dressed and put up by J. T. Dooley. This house served as a court house, school and church. On 28 July 1857, John M. Stephen was appointed Stephenville's first postmaster.

It appears that no complete tax assessment was made for Erath County for 1856. A partial list exists and a "1856 supplementary" is found at the end of the 1857 tax roll. We found no owners of town lots listed for 1856.

The recapitulation of the 1857 tax roll showed a total of 229 town lots upon which taxes was assessed. John M. Stephen owned most of the lots. The other owners had from one to two lots, each. There were seven money-lenders in the county, including A. L. Brown, S. R. Hicks and Wm F. Stephen of Stephenville. There was one store in the county, presumably in Stephenville.

I am Teaching School yet. My school will be out in July.... Give my best respects to Mr. Clifford and family and except [sic] the Same your self...."

Account Book, partially burned, and some pages blank, found in the original papers, Tarrant County, Texas. This book is believed to have been used by Samuel Evans in collecting debts due the estate of Daniel McFarland, deceased. On page 8, below the account of J. E. Philips, is the following notation: seteled by note Aug 20, 1858 Samuel Evans, Adm'r. Notations on other accounts show how account was handled, but do not bear the signature of Samuel Evans. However, the accounts in this book include names of other persons known to have had contact with Daniel McFarland in one capacity or another. Some of the accounts are included in an index on page 30. This index appears to include only names of those accounts which were at some point unpaid, as those marked "Paid" are not on this list. The following names appear in the ledger. When the index gives the name differently, it will appear here in brackets to show the discrepancy.

CAPTAIN JAMES M. WILLIAMS was born in DeSoto Parish, Louisiana, March 28, 1838. "He was the son of one of the most faithful Baptist ministers of Northern Louisiana, Rev. M. E. WILLIAMS. He was educated at the celebrated college of Clarksville, Texas, under the tuition of Rev. Dr. MCKENZIE.... Among his fellow students was Hon. W. J. HERNDON of Tyler, late a distinguished member of Congress. At the first call for volunteers from Louisiana...he joined the Confederate army, enlisting in Drew's Battalion.... He...transferred to the second Louisiana regiment commanded by his cousin, Col. (afterward brigadier general) JESSE WILLIAMS.... When Gen. MAGRUDER was sent to assume command in Texas he brought our lamented brother with him and assigned him to duty in the transportation department in Houston. Subsequent he was promoted to the quartermaster with the rank of captain and became quartermaster at Tyler, Texas, of which post he continued in charge till near the end of the war. At the close of the war he was serving as quartermaster with Gen. J. B. ROBERTSON of Brenham. In July 1864 he was married to MRS. SALLIE A. HUBERT, daughter of DR. ASA HOXIE, a patriotic citizen well known in the early struggles of the Republic of Texas. Very soon after the death of the widow of Dr. Hoxie it became necessary for him to administer on her very large estate.... On September 26, 1870...together with his wife, [he] was baptized into the fellowship of the Independence Baptist church. For benefit of those who would not attend religious services at Independence, he and his brother, W. L. WILLIAMS, built a neat little house of worship on their farms where preaching and a Sunday School are maintained regularly. An arm of the Independence church is extended to this locality, although the house is free to all denominations.... He departed this life at Burdett's well on the 11th of September last near Luling, Texas, to which place he had gone in the hope of regaining his health.... He leaves an affectionate wife and four children...."

BRO. HOLLY ELLISON was born in Madison County, Alabama, 11 March 1817 and died August 1, 1881. In the year 1835 the Master called him from "nature to grace." He was then a resident of Mississippi and there joined the Baptist church. In September 1839 he married MARTHA ROBERT, and in 1849 removed to Texas, and united with the Clear Fork Church, in which he remained until his death. He was a farmer by occupation.

Signed: G. (October 13, 1881; 3.2)

HENRY HUETER died in Houston August 31, 1881, aged 33 years, 5 months. "Bro. HURTER was born in Germany, Province Hessen, on March 31, 1848. He emigrated to this country in 1869, and lived in Houston since. Not long after he made Texas his new home...he was converted and baptized by Bro. F. J. GLEISS...." He leaves a wife and five children. Signed: F. W. BECKER. (Sept. 15, 1881; 3.3)

"Little SALLEY HURBERT LINDLEY...daughter of SAMUEL L. and Mrs. C. H. LINDLEY, residing five miles north of Anderson, Grimes county, Texas, was born October 31st, 1873, and departed this life on the 11th day of August, 1881." [Poem follows.] Signed: R. F. (September 22, 1881; 3.2)

JOHN H. HALLFORD died at Wolf's Crossing, Burnet County, Texas, September 20, 1881, aged 65 years. "He was born in the State of Kentucky...1816, removed to Moniteau county, Missouri, at about the age of six years. Thence to Denton county, Texas... 1844, then to Travis county in 1854, where he resided until a few months prior to his death, [when] he moved to Burnet county. He professed faith in Christ at the age of 18 years, joined the Baptist church in Platt[e] county, Missouri, was ordained a deacon in the Lonesome Dove Baptist church, Tarrant county, Texas...1846, and since that time has served as a deacon in the Austin, and several other churches, was a friend to the cause of Christ, giving liberally to the support of the gospel, his house long being the home of the minister. He was confined by consumption about six weeks...." Signed: A. J. H[allford]. (October 13, 1881; 3.2)

ALICE SCALLORN died May 17, aged 85 years, 2 months, 5 days. "She is the mother of eleven children, nine girls and two boys. She had kept house 63 years, five months, and six days. She is the mother, grandmother, and great grandmother of between 90 and 100 living souls now in Texas. We lived together members of the Baptist church 51 years, 30 years deacon and deaconess. All our children and generation that have arrived to the age of accountability, are members of the Baptist church but three." Signed: WILLIAM SCALLORN. (October 13, 1881)

"Died--September 26th ult. Little ALBERT CHOICE GARY, five years old, son of Bro. Gary, at Starrville, Smith County...." Signed: TULLY CHOICE, October 3d, 1881. (Oct. 13, 1881; 3.2)

Deacon JAS. O. CHAMBERLAIN died at his residence in Robertson County, Texas, on September 4, 1881, aged fifty-seven years. He leaves a wife and four children. (October 13, 1881; 3.2)

JENNIE CRUNK, wife of A. J. CRUNK, and oldest daughter of Eld. W. H. FARMER, died in Guadalupe County, Texas, August 21, 1881, in the 36th year of her age. She was born in Newton County, Missouri, in 1844, and moved to Texas in 1860. Was married in 1866. Professed religion and was baptized by her father in '61. She leaves a husband and six children. Resolutions by the Martindale Baptist Church follow. (October 20, 1881; 3.2)

MALINDA CAROLINE SMITH, wife of S. A. SMITH, Esq., and daughter of JESSE and MARY DOBBS, died at her residence near Hopewell, Smith County, Texas, 28 October 1881. "She was born in Elbert county, Georgia, December 10th 1838; was married in Cobb county Georgia 2 September 1858, and joined the Hopewell Baptist church, in Smith county, Texas, about October 1st 1867...." In eulogy husband, children, sisters, and brothers are mentioned. Signed: G. "Christian Index please copy." (November 24, 1881; 3.1 and 2)

"Departed this life at his home, near Gonzales, WILLIAM HADGES.* Was born on August the 18th, 1846, in Gonzales county, Texas. Was converted at brother PENN's meeting at Gonzales on the 14th of June and baptized by brother Penn...." He died October 6, 1881, leaving a wife and three small children. Signed: F. [or P.] KRAUSE. (November 24, 1881; 3.2)
*As published. The name may be HODGES. MBS

WILLIAM C. SHIELDS died at his home near Hickory Creek, Texas, October 29, 1881. [One sentence only.] (November 24, 1881; 3.2)

"MARY ELIZA, daughter of DR. J. H. and MRS. E. F. WILSON, was born in Newberry, S. C., March, 1837. Professed religion and joined the Baptist church at Prospect, Burleson County, Texas, under the ministry of REV. HOSEA GARRETT, in 1855. Married to JUDGE A. W. McIVER, February 23d, 1860. Died in Caldwell, September 12th, 1881. Sister McIver was in poor health for sixteen years.... Her great desire was to be spared long enough to rear her two children. The prayer was granted, for they are grown, educated, and members of the church...." In eulogy are mentioned besides her husband and children, an "aged mother." Signed: RUFUS O. KING. (November 24, 1881; 3.2)

"MRS. FANNIE CAMP VAUGHAN, wife of REV. A. B. VAUGHAN, pastor of Longview church, was born in Georgia (Cobb county, I suppose) April 15th, 1859. During the month of September, 1877, she was baptized by REV. ROBERT BAKER of Pond Springs, Ga. She was married Nov. 24th, 1878, and came with her husband to Longview, Texas, at the beginning of the present year, and died shortly after 7 P.M., Nov. 6th, leaving a heart stricken husband, and a little daughter one year old...." Signed: REDDIN ANDREWS. "Christian Index, Ga., please copy." (December 1, 1881; 3.1)

"Bro. B. F. ALFORD was born in Columbus [sic] county, Ga., November 15th, 1846. He came to Texas in 1871, and on February 21st, 1872, was married to Miss MARIA M. EVANS, of Smith co. He made a profession of religion during the month of August, 1877, and was baptized with his wife by REV. J. H. STRIBLING. He died on the morning of Oct. 25th, 1881, leaving a devoted wife and little daughter...." Signed: REDDIN ANDREWS. (December 1, 1881; 3.1)

"Died, on the 21st day of November, 1881, at the residence of her father, in Calvert, Robertson county, Texas, EMMA RACHEL

oldest daughter of CAPT. JOHN ORR, aged twelve years, two months and eleven days." (December 1, 1881; 3.1)

GEORGE W., infant son of J. T. Z. and M. E. SMITH, died at the family residence in Bell County, Texas, November 7, of typhoid fever. He was aged 7 months and 12 days. Signed: The Parents. (December 8, 1881; 3.1)

"JOSIAH N. STILL was born in Appomattox county, Va., Sept. 2d, 1840; joined the Baptist church in Henderson, Texas, and was baptized by Old Bro. F. W. ROGERS, Aug. 28th, 1873, and died... Nov. 24th 1881.... [He] was clerk of our church and was clerk of the county of Rusk, for many years.... His family, a wife and nine children, mostly girls, have sustained an irreparable loss." Signed: A. B. COLLINS. "Religious Herald, please copy." (December 8, 1881; 3.1)

MRS. AMANDA E. BARBOUR, whose maiden name was WILDER, "was born in Greene county, Alabama, Nov. 19, 1837. She died at Mexia, Texas, November 18, 1881. In her 18th year she was baptized by DR. WILLIAM HOWARD, at Pleasant Ridge, Green county, Alabama. While visiting kindred in Mississippi, she was married, April 10, 1862, to Deacon ENOCH N. BARBOUR, who still survives her. In the fall of 1865, Mr. Barbour and family removed to Limestone county, and affiliated with Lost Prairie church, remaining for a year or two, and afterwards became a member of the church at Cotton Gin.... The stricken husband and a lovely daughter just budding into womanhood, show the loneliness [sic] of her absence...." Signed: J. T. S. Park. [Cotton Gin is in Freestone County not far from the Limestone County line. MBS] (December 8, 1881; 3.1)

"WILLIAM RAGSDALE COLEMAN departed this life on the 19th of October, 1881, at his home in Lavaca county, Texas, in the 82d year of his age. He left a companion, the wife of his youth in the 72d year of her age, with whom he has lived happily for 51 years; also eight living children (three having preceded him in death, twenty grandchildren and many relatives and friends.... W. R. Coleman was born in Fairfield district, South Carolina, October 4th, 1800. He was united in marriage with SARAH N. HEAD, January 26th, 1830. Having been "born from above," he was baptized in 1832 by Eld. DAVIS (extensively known in South Carolina, in his day, as Col. Davis), and united with the Woodward Baptist church, Chester district, South Carolina, was afterward a member of the Beaver Creek church, Fairfield district, and on removing to Mississippi, became a member of Mashulaville church, Noxubee county, and afterwards for many years was a member of the Concord church, Winston county, Mississippi. He removed to Texas in 1860, and settling in Lavaca county, became a member of the Hallettsville church, where he was made deacon. He after[ward] united in the organization of the North Grove church, near his home, in fellowship with which he continued till death, and near its neat, newly erected house of worship, his body now rests in the grave...." In long eulogy wife and children are mentioned. W.H.H. (Dec. 8, 1881)

JOHN DANIEL LACKEY, son of REV. W. S. LACKEY, died on November 23, 1881, at his father's residence near Caldwell, Burleson County, Texas. "He was born in Calhoun county, Alabama, March 8th, 1868. Professed faith in Christ and united with the Cotton Wood Baptist church, in July, 1878, at Bro. PENN's first camp meeting in Burleson county...." In eulogy he is referred to as a young boy. Signed: W. E. JAMES. (Dec. 15, 1881; 3.1)

ROBERT ADAIR SMITH died near Kenny, Austin County, Texas, 12 November 1881. "He was born in Walton County, Georgia, September 5th, 1845, was the son of JAMES W. and SARAH A. SMITH, with whom he came to Texas in 1873. In 1868, he was baptized by ELD. ROBERT FLEMING into the fellowship of Barnett's Creek church, Thomas county, Georgia. He removed from thence to McLennan county, Texas, where he united with the church at Eagle Springs.... At the time of his decease he was travelling and his anxiety to pass on to the discharge of his duty, while neglecting himself, is sufficient evidence of his unswerving faithfulness to all his obligations. He was married July 10th, 1877, to Miss ADELA R. FLEMING, daughter of Elder R. FLEMING, of Texas. The family circle is again broken...." Signed: One of the Circle. (December 15, 1881; 3.1)

CALEB SIMMONS, aged about 73 years, died at his residence in Old Round Rock, Texas, November 26, 1881. He was a member of the Baptist church at Round Rock. Poem follows. Signed: A Friend. (December 15, 1881; 3.1)

Letter to the editor informing him of the death of M. F. HOLTON, at Kansas City, Missouri, on December 3. He was 39 years of age, the son of Dea. S. HOLTON, of Warsaw, New York. He leaves wife. Signed: Mrs. M. F. HOLTON, Warsaw, N. Y.; Dec. 10th, 1881. (December 22, 1881; 3.1)

MRS. SARAH GILL died at her home near Dayton, Liberty County, 29 October last, aged thirty-two years. She "was born in Catahoula Parish, Louisiana. Her parents emigrated to this State, and settled in this country when she was quite a child, where Mr. and Mrs. BRANTLY, her father and mother, died. When arriving at mature years she married Mr. E. L. GILL.... She leaves him and five children to mourn the loss of a kind and affectionate wife and mother...." Signed: D. D. FORMAN, Liberty county, Dec. 13th. (December 15, 1881; 3.1)

Resolutions adopted by the Sabbath School, First Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas, on November 27, 1881, in memory of EDWIN SCOTT BOWER. [No revealing information.] (December 15, 1881; 3.1)

CLARENCE W. GARRETT died December 24, 1881, of black jaundice. His brother died the 20th of November, of the same disease. (January 5, 1881; 3.2)

COL. CYRUS PARK died at his residence in DeWitt County, Texas, December 21, 1881. "He was born in Madison county, Ala., July 15th, 1880 - aged 81 years, 5 months, and eight days. He had

been a member of the Baptist church over 50 years. His daily walk and conversation has ever been that of an exemplary Christian...." Signed: E. F. M. (January 5, 1882; 3.2)

MRS. GERTRUDE L. PRUITT, wife of W. H. PRUITT, died in Bremond on January 9, 1882, after an illness of one week. (Jan. 19, 1882)

MRS. MATTIE EAVES, daughter of W. H. PRUITT, and wife of Dr. W. G. EAVES, died January 9, 1882, after a long and painful illness. (January 19, 1882; 3.2)

"For the first time in twenty years death has entered the College Home at Baylor, and summoned one of the fairest of the happy group.... On Thursday morning, January 12th...SEAWILLOW T. LONG, daughter of Mrs. T. S. LONG, of Beaumont, breathed her last.... She had not reached her fifteenth birthday...." (January 19, 1882; 3.2)

JNO. A. RINTZ, formerly of Georgia, died at Bosqueville, Texas, December 22, 1881, age 66 years. (January 19, 1882; 3.2)

JESSE H. CHAMBERS died at the residence of Hon. C. G. WHITE, in Tyler, Texas, November 29, 1881, in the seventy-seventh year of his age. "Brother Chambers was born in Haywood county, North Carolina, March 13, 1805. When a young man he removed to Georgia, and was married in Columbia county, Georgia, to Miss CATHARINE D. STEED, January 5, 1837. He professed religion when quite a young man, but did not unite with the church till the year 1838. He removed from Georgia to Texas in 1854, and soon after united with Ebenezer church, Smith county, and remained a...member till his death.... His last visit to Ebenezer was to witness the baptism of his granddaughter, sister MOLLIE HAYS. Brother Chambers was a landmark Baptist in every sense. And the time was when the lamented WHITE and ELKIN and when D. B. MERRILL, was pastor at Ebenezer, we believe, TULLY CHOICE, W. G. CAPERTON, and DR. KIMBALL, and ourself can all look back upon their lives with pleasure, while we drop the tear of sorrow. [I am not sure what he was saying, but it is likely that the former minister referred to as D. B. Merrill was D. B. Morrill.] Brother C. leaves our sisters, MRS. HON. F. M. HAYS and MRS. JUDGE WHITE, to mourn for him as none but children can for a devoted father, together with the dear church...." Signed: Pastor. "Index, Baptist, and Baptist Courier please copy." (January 19, 1882; 3.2)

"Died, at his home with his son-in-law, S. H. MORRISON, in San Jacinto county, Texas, on the 2d of January, 1882, DANIEL BYRD. Bro. Byrd was born in Orangeburg district, South Carolina, January 14th, 1814. After living several years in Alabama, Florida, and Mississippi came to Tyler county, Texas, in 1856. For many years of his life he was a Methodist, but... was baptized into the fellowship of the Evergreen Baptist church, during the summer of 1881...." Cold Springs, Texas, Jan. 4th, 1882. (January 19, 1882; 3.2)

"Deacon NELSON KAVANAUGH, known to all the pioneer Baptist preachers of Texas, died in Brenham, Washington county, Texas ...January 1st, 1882...in the 70th year of his age. Bro. Kavanaugh was born in Columbia, Maury county, Tennessee, in 1811; in early manhood he settled in Texas, some thirty years or more ago. He was baptized by ELD. WM M. TRYON into the fellowship of the Chappell Hill church. He was for four years a very active member of the First church, Houston, but the greater part of his religious life was spent in the Brenham church.... The later years of his life were marked by sorrow, his son and wife died in a few months of each other.... His daughter, sister PRESSLER, with more than filial affection watched over - anticipated his every want - she filled his heart with the light of her love...." Signed: C. C. CHAPLIN. (February 2, 1882; 3.2 and 3)

BOOK REVIEW

BANKS AND BANKERS IN EARLY TEXAS (1835-1875) is an excellent review of a little researched field of Texas history. 172 pages with softcover, compiled by Joe E. Ericson and published by Polyanthos, Inc., 811 Orleans St., New Orleans, La. 70116 and priced at \$15.00

The book is in three parts; the first deals primarily with banking in general prior to 1876. Second section list stockholders as well as bankers between 1835 and 1875 according to location. The third is a short biographical sketch of the bankers, making the book of importance to historians as well as genealogists.

NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

As you can see by the new book list, many of the Accelerated Indexing Service books have arrived. They are a mixed blessing: helpful to many people, but also error laden. Frequently people are not to be found on the pages shown in the index, and several users have reported that persons known to them to be on the census are not included in the index.

The family histories (929.2) have been moved to the stacks because of our ever-present space problem. We keep juggling to try to find the areas which are less used and can be "stacked" with the least disruption of our patrons' research. We will be happy to retrieve them for you, but please get the author and title as well as the call number, since our call numbers are not distinctive.

We received a handsome memorial gift from Ann Childress Long honoring her mother, Mrs. H. V. Childress. It consisted of over 40 genealogical books, mostly on Kentucky.

If the book you are looking for is not on the shelves, please be patient. An unusually large amount of money was left in the Library Bindery Budget, and we are being permitted to spend extra this year, so have hundreds of volumes at the bindery at this moment.

The inventory which the library is doing in preparation for the move to the new building in 1978, is proceeding nicely. It does have the effect, however, of leaving only one person on duty at any time on Friday, so we ask that you be patient if we are not immediately able to help you on a busy Friday.

The library staff was given a look at the plans for the new building on Friday, July 16. They are tremendously exciting! The main level of the library will be built under the two block site, with the patron entrance, circulation department, lecture hall and meeting rooms, "talk shop" (vending machine area similar to the one in the second floor lobby of the present building) and rest rooms centered in a tree bordered plaza on the east block of the site.

The collection, reference desks and administrative, technical and work areas will be on the main level underground. There will be a separate genealogy room, with nearly 2300 sq. feet of floor space, while the present Southwest Collection will be dispersed throughout the main collection of the library. The west block will have 72 parking spaces.

The architects are putting together a slide show, which we hope to bring to the Society as soon as possible, because there is no way to convey the beauty and quality of the design in writing. There is absolutely no waste space. The library will be a place of life, color and activity.

Because the main part of the building will be underground, practically no heating or air-conditioning will be required, saving greatly on utility bills. In the future, expansion can be easily effected by building over the West block with no disruption of library service.

Groundbreaking is planned for January 10, and we are to have a grand National Library Week in April 1978 when we move in.

A number of desirable things including finishing of the lecture hall and meeting rooms, are alternates and will only be done if the City Council appropriates additional money or if additional money becomes available from individual donors or foundations. So---if anyone knows a millionaire, councilman or foundation trustee....

Have you looked everywhere? Don't give up until you check the wanted posters and the County Jail rosters!

It was quite by chance that we found such records at Tarrant County Junior College, Northeast Campus, in the Heritage Room of their library. There are several very old ledger type books containing jail entries of Tarrant County, letters to the Fort Worth Chief of Police and a scrap book of various clippings pertaining to persons wanted. These books are in a deteriorating condition and very fragile, should be handled with care.

It is possible that your man took off on his own, across country, on horseback and met with foul play. During this time, anyone caught riding another man's horse was often shot or hung on the spot. No one would believe that he bought, borrowed or traded for the horse when his own played out. Some good souls could have buried him without a marker. Your man would then be a missing person.

Take the case of a father who had a wanted poster put out on his daughter. No, she wasn't a criminal. She just ran away from home and he wanted her back.

In one of the letters to the Ft. Worth Chief of Police, he was requested to hold a certain man...providing he could be found, because he was wanted for witnessing a crime.

There are many articles on missing persons and records of petty offenses. Of course, there are the more common types of criminal records, too. Believe it or not, you will be amused and surprised at some of the reasons given for an arrest.

This was our first experience with such records and believe us, it was quite an experience! Even if you don't think you have a horsethief in your family, why don't you go? You may be in for a surprise.

REGISTER OF PERSONS COMMITTED TO CITY PRISON 1886

Abstracted from the Register are some who were arrested. This register has time arrested, name, sex, age, charge, how long, meals served, costs and how sentence was served, such as Paying

Fine, Working, Escaped, one female released for sickness and some "Laid Out" the fine.

Charges include the usual being drunk, gambling, trespassing, disturbing the peace, vagrancy, theft, carrying a pistol, asleep on the sidewalk and riding on the sidewalk.



MILAM, PENDLETON & SABINE TOWNGateways to Texas

We are indebted to Helen Gomer Schluter of Westminster, Colorado, and Blanche Finley Toole, of Hemphill, Texas, for furnishing information on these three early Texas towns.

Sabine County, one of the original Republic of Texas counties, was first organized as the Sabine District of the Department of Nacogdoches in 1823 or 1824. It became the Municipality of Sabine on 15 Sept. 1835, and Sabine County, Republic of Texas, on 14 December 1837, with Milam as the county seat. The court house burned in November 1878, destroying all records for the county. A call was made for all residents to re-register their old records. Many people responded, and that is why we find many Republic of Texas records scattered throughout the present deed books.

Milam, Oldest Town, First County Seat

Milam is the oldest town in Sabine County. It is located at a point on the Old San Antonio Road (El Camino Real, King's Highway), which is State Highway 21 at its intersection with State Highway 87.

In the vicinity was the meeting place of the Caddo Federation of Indian tribes, long before the coming of the Spanish who called the settlement Los Boregas. In 1828, the white settlers changed the name to Red Mound, no doubt for the red soil of the area.

As early as 1832, Needham J. Alford, Methodist from Sabine Parish, Louisiana, and Summer Bacon, a Cumberland Presbyterian, held meetings near Red Mound, in spite of Mexican objections. Also, near here was organized the first Protestant church in the county, McMahan's Chapel.

In 1835, the name of the town was changed to Milam, in honor of Benjamin Rush Milam. It remained the county seat until 1858, when Hemphill was chosen. The 1850 census indicated a population of 2,498, which increased by several hundred before the town began to decline at the time of the Civil War.

The area saw much activity during the Texas Revolution. In response to Sam Houston's call for soldiers, Benjamin F. Bryant, of Milam, raised a company known as the Sabine Company, which joined the Texas Army at Groce's Plantation. During the Runaway Scrape of March and April, 1836, settlers poured through Milam, on their retreat to the United States, to escape the impending advance of Santa Anna's Army. The Gaines Ferry, at Pendleton, and the Isaac Low Ferry, near Sabine Town, operated day and


night, in their endeavor to get the refugees across the Sabine River and out of Texas.

W. E. Layne is said to have been the surveyor of Milam. The streets were twenty varas wide and were named Crockett, State, College, Main, Church and Gaines, according to one source. However, the plat of the town, dated 10 July 1850, reproduced herein from the original, shows streets named Crockett, State, Main and Gaines (running in a west-east direction) and Union, Sumter, Church and Branch (running in a north-south direction).

The plat, at the left, is reproduced in its original size. We note that the blocks were not numbered, but lots were numbered, beginning with 1 and running through 224.

Pendleton, Port of Entry

Pendleton was surveyed as a townsite by William McFarland, in 1837, at the request of James Gaines who operated a ferry across the Sabine River. The town was named for General Edmund Pendleton Gaines, a first cousin (not a brother, as some say) to James Gaines. Under the Republic of Texas, the town served as a port of entry, as did Sabine Town. In 1938, when Highway 21 was completed and a bridge built across the Sabine at the old crossing, the ferry was discontinued. The old Gaines Ferry location is now under many feet of water of the Toledo Bend Lake.

Michael Crow had an early ferry on the river. According to a document dated 1805, he was born about 1765. He was an American and was married to Margaret "Peggy" Le Fleur, an American of Irish descent. By 1805, they were living in the Neutral Strip of Louisiana. They had a daughter, Margaret, aged 19, who was married to an Englishman named Louis Funk. They also had four sons, ages 17, 14, 12 and 10.

In 1769, Don Hugo O'Conner, Governor of the Presidio Nuestra Sonera De Pilar de Los Adais and its citizens, granted to Miguel Viciente a tract of land called "San Miguel De Los Patrie". This land was on the east bank of the Sabine River and on either side of a highway from Los Adais to Nacogdoches, at the location of the crossing of the Sabine River. In 1799, Miguel Viciente sold this claim to Mickel [sic] Crow. The Crow home was situated on an island in the middle of the Sabine River, thus overlooking the ford of the stream.

Crow was one of the few men of the Neutral Strip to maintain an agreeable relationship with the governments on either side of the strip. From the diary (which began 4 August 1810) of Lt. Jose Maria Guadiana, during the evacuation of the Neutral Strip, he noted:

Mickle Crow's house is built on an island in the middle of the ford at Gaines Ferry. He is now married to the Widow Chabeneax, whose first name is Isabel. She has a daughter also named Isabel, married to an American, who is now at El Rapides. These people were allowed to remain as they were in the area before January 1, 1806.

In a long, drawn-out court case (Russell Heirs vs James Mason), James Gaines made a deposition, in 1844. He stated that he was sixty-eight years old, that he came to Texas in 1812, that in 1819 he purchased the ferry known as Gaines Ferry and owned the same until he sold it on 20 November 1844. (Other records show he sold to Walter Strother). He stated that he began living at the ferry in 1819 and lived there until 1843, when he removed to Nacogdoches County. This testimony has led to some speculation as to whether the old James Gaines house, which stood near the crossing for so many decades, was actually built in 1812, as some historians have stated, or built about 1819. The loss of this old house, at one of the gateways to Texas, is a sad commentary upon the historical pages of Texas.

In the same court case, David Watman [Waltman] deposed that he came to Texas in 1793, had been in the area fifty-five years [in 1848]. He stated that a man by the name of Chabinan [sic] kept what was later known

as Gaines Ferry for about one year, then he was drowned. That Michael Crow then married Chabinan's widow and moved to his ferry, and that Louis Funk [son-in-law of Crow] ran the ferry for a time, then a man named Smith ran it before James Gaines took possession. Gaines evidently bought it from Crow, when Crow moved to his own ferry north of the Gaines Ferry.

On the 1837-1838 Tax Roll of Sabine County, James Gaines is listed as owning eighty town lots, no location given but presumably in the town of Pendleton. Ed. Gaines is also listed as owning twelve town lots.

The 1840 Tax Roll shows the following persons as owners of lots in the town of Pendleton:

The Legend of Pendleton,
Nacogdoches, & Natchitoches

According to an old Indian legend, what is now Pendleton was long ago the village of an expanding Indian tribe, and therein lies the story of how Nacogdoches, Texas, and Natchitoches, Louisiana, got their names. As the legend goes, the chief of the tribe one day called to his side his two brave and stalwart sons, Nacogdoches and Natchitoches, and he said to them:

The time has come for you, my oldest and bravest sons, to go find other lands to build your wigwams and raise up your sons. You must travel away -- not too far and not too near -- that your hunting grounds will be your own. Now listen close to my words; this is what I want you to do. When the sun rises again, you will start from the middle of this great stream of water. Nacogdoches will turn his face to the west; Natchitoches will face the east. You will swim out of the river and travel through the great forest, never looking back. You will let nothing hinder your journey, and you will go straight as the bee to his hive and swift as the deer over the ground. When the sun sets you will stop and there you will make your homes.

The two sons were obedient to their father, the story goes, and each being strong and wise as the other, they each were of equal distance from their starting point when it came time to end their journey. And that is why -- according to the old Indian legend -- that today there are two cities of comparable age and twin Indian names, each an equal distance from Pendleton Bridge which joins the Texas county and the Louisiana Parish of the name of Sabine.

Sabine Town

The settlement of Sabine Town (later spelled Sabinetown) was incorporated by the Congress of the Republic of Texas on 15 December 1837. The townsite was surveyed by Harmon Frazier, on the west side of the Sabine River and the south side of Palo Gaucho (called Polygotch by the natives) Creek. It was first called Sabine, "town" being added later to differentiate between the county and river and the town. The first settlement was nearly wiped out by cholera in 1840-1841; no one seems to know the exact date.


In May, 1838, Sabine Town was declared a Port of Entry, and a customs house was established for the collection of duties. The first municipal officers were: Commissioners, Isaac Low, Elbert Hines and Matthew Parker. The latter had been appointed Chief Justice for the county by the President of the Republic on 20 December 1836.

In less than a year after the birth of the town, a river wharf was built, also a warehouse and a large retail store. Sabine Town soon became the distributing point for East Texas. The first steam boat to come up the river and unload its freight was the "Big Ben", owned by General John S. Berry. The old stage line from Natchitoches, Louisiana, to Jasper, Texas, crossed the river here. According to Dr. A. F. Beddoe, the old King's Highway entered Texas at Sabine Town, and Sam Houston used this route on his trips from Austin to Washington, D. C., stopping many times at the Beddoe Hotel.

Joseph Bays preached the first Baptist sermon in Texas in the vicinity of the town on 8 April 1821. Elbert Hines brought his family from Mississippi in 1823. He was Alcalde in 1825. Isaac Low and his large family came to Sabine in August, 1828, from Tennessee. He later established the Isaac Low Ferry at the mouth of Low's Creek at the Sabine River, two miles downstream from Sabine Town. Some say this was the site of the old Contraband Trail blazed in 1772 by Athenase De Meziere, Lt. Governor at Natchitoches, Louisiana. This trail was later used by the Bowie brothers, and others, when they smuggled slaves from the coast of Texas into the United States.

Daniel Long Richardson came to Texas about 1833, from Georgia, to fight in the Texas Revolution. At the time of his death, in February 1849, he had amassed a fortune. Since he does not appear on the 1837-1838 tax roll for Sabine County, and on the 1840 roll he is not listed as owning property in Sabine Town, he evidently made most of his fortune the last eight or nine years of his life. He had two daughters who married noted Texans of the time. Jane Baxter Richardson married David Spangler Kaufman, a Senator in the Republic of Texas Congress, and later the first U. S. Congressman from Texas. Eliza Scott Richardson married Franklin Barlow Sexton, who became the first and only Confederate Congressman from Texas. They were all residents of early-day Sabine Town. Daniel L. Richardson owned what was later known as the Dr. R. K. Goodloe home on the bluffs of the river.

Jesse J. Robinson, of Sabine Town, was another wealthy man of early Texas. he was a member of the Republic of Texas Congress in 1842-1843. S. Slade Barnett represented Sabine County in the House of the 5th Congress, taking his seat on 13 November 1840. He was probably the first owner of the old tanyard at Sabine Town. He moved to Rusk County, probably in late 1843, the year he and his brother sold to Isaac Low and David S. Kaufman block 14, lots 1 through 8, and block 23, lot 4, given in several deed records as "the tanyard, springs, & etc."

In a private collection of the Isaac Low papers, there is a deed dated 23 June 1839 that mentions the league of land belonging to Isaac Low was to "touch the town of Sabine" and part of the land "fronting on the Sabine River so as to include the town of Sabine". Another deed, dated 5 April 1844, Isaac Low sells all his right, title, etc., "to the tanyard and the nine connecting lots (Square no. 14 - 8 lots - together with lot no. 4 in Square 23) lying in the town of Sabine" to his partner David S. Kaufman, for the consideration of \$10,000. In the inventory of the Isaac and Elizabeth Low estate, in 1860, the above property was again owned by Low.

The tax rolls indicate that, by 1840, Sabine Town was the most thriving town of the county. Other early residents of the town were: Judge Augustus Hotchkiss, William P. Wyche, George L. Clapp, Isaac Deweese, Rev. Phanael W. Warriner (a Presbyterian minister), Charles K. Blanchard, Andrew J. Bateman (who owned the Sabine Town ferry in 1851), Simon Winberg, Daniel Estep, Wiley Faircloth, Horatio Rose, Bennett Upson, Wilford Oliphint. In 1866, Joseph D. Stille bought most of the town from the Jesse J. Robinson estate.

Today, nothing is left of old Sabine Town. Much of it is under the waters of the Toledo Bend Lake, around which are week-end homes.

Therefore, your petitioner prays that the said Sugg be cited by Publication in the Birdville Union for 4 weeks to appear at the next Term... and show cause why the order appointing him Guardian...shall not be recinded [underlined as shown] at which time your petitioner prays to be appointed guardian of the person and property of the said Ellen Gore his Grand-child....."

Hiram Walker, "the Grandfather and natural guardian of the orphan child - Mary Ellen Gore, the daughter of Wm Gore, decd, late of Providence in Hopkins County and State of Kentucky and Martha B. Gore, decd - late of the county of Tarrant...would represent...that he being the natural guardian as he was 'the nearest of kin' and as it was the dying request of said orphan's Mother, took charge of said child directly after its mother's death, that he has kept it under his special care and protection ever since - furnishing it with all the comforts and necessaries of life, and that he intends to do so, if he possibly can, until said child shall arrive at mature age, or so long as he or her may live should either die before that time. Your petitioner would further state that he

made application, or attempted to do so - for letters of Guardianship for said child within the time prescribed by law, but from some cause, unknown to your petitioner, he was not appointed...that said orphan child is the legal heir of some three thousand dollars, as he is informed, left it by its mother and other relatives in the State of Kentucky, and that he has also been informed that said Suggs has already obtained a portion of said money and that unless he is dismissed from the Guardianship...and another appointed in his stead, he will, ere long obtain the whole of...childs estate, and not being a resident of this State, and having no fixed permanent home it is, in the opinion of your Petitioner extremely doubtful wheather any portion of said child's estate will ever reach its hands, or come into its possession. And thus would be exhibited to your petitioner the mortifying fact in his old days, of knowing that he had been at all the expense and trouble of raising and educating said orpahn...while another had enjoyed the possession of its estate, and, perhaps, frittered it away or placed it beyond the reach, for ever, of said orphan. And, whereas the said Suggs left the State, for ever, so far as his residence is concerned, shortly after he was appointed...Guardian...without making any provision for the support and maintainance of said orphan, and continues so to act...your Petitioner prays you to dismiss said Suggs...and appoint him, your Petitioner, its Guardian...."

Petition of Hiram Walker, who represents that the present guardian of Ellen Gore "has removed from this State, and I as the next of kin petition your honour to require of her present guardian a new Bond as he is at this time a non resident of this State and one of his securities is now a non resident of this State and the other is in the act of leaving...."

from the hand of James K. Allen, former Guardian of said minors the sum of \$1299 (in Confederate Bonds)." Report shows tuition for both minors paid to Miss Fannie Evans in the year 1863.

"In submitting this Exhibit to your honorable Court, I also beg to resign my trust as Guardian of said Minors, for causes of which some are, That I am a Soldier in the Service of the Confed. States and have not the opportunities to give the necessary attention To the Control of the Person and Effects of said Minors, whilst their more immediate friend, or Persons who are not Subject to Military duty, can govern them and guard their interests, in a much more desirable manner than I can. I charge no fees as Guardian. S/ P. B. Smallwood.

P.S. Jas O Hagood is now past the age of 14 years - and will perhaps prefer to choose his own Guardian." [No caption. Dated April 14, 1865.]

PAUL POWELL, infant son of MR. and MRS. H. L. LINDLEY, died near Montgomery, Texas, on January 13, 1882. (Feb. 2, 1882)

JOSEPH VANHAM, senior partner of the firm of VANHAM & Bunting, of Flatonia, died February 4, 1882. [In eulogy, wife and children are mentioned.] Signed: A. S. BUNTING.

"J. W. COCHRAN was born in Edgefield county, South Carolina, November 18, 1819.... United with the M. E. church, just as he entered into manhood. Came to Texas, adopting it his home, spring of 1859. Scarce had the sullen notes of war been heard when he joined one of the first companies from Polk county, and enlisted in the Confederate service, August 1861.... He was united in marriage to Miss MATTIE ANDERSON, in Polk County, January 2d, 1866. She survives him with several dear children, near Georgetown where he was connected with the M. E. church.... [Here the writer explains that J. W. Cochran, his uncle, died of pneumonia on January 30, 1881, and had been dead more than one year. He had received the news only a few weeks since.] Having been bereft of a dear father in childhood's tender years, this devoted uncle was always full of fraternal like affection. So strong was his devotion that the writer nestled about him as seldom the child about its father. His presence was enough. So powerfully did I realize this that a dear mother's presence and love had to yield to his as I accompanied him to Texas, when a boy of nine summers...." Signed: J. A. BELL, Clinton, Feb. 1 1882. (March 9, 1882; 3.3)

JAMES P. LUSK, son of MRS. SALLIE LUSK, and grandson of H. C. McINTYRE, Esq., of Brenham, died in that city July 18, 1881, of typhoid fever, in the 26th year of his age. His devotion to his mother and younger brothers and sisters was touchingly beautiful. After his father's death he felt the welfare of those beloved ones was in a great measure devolving on him, and manfully he met the obligations. Signed: Pastor. (August 4, 1881; 3.2)

JONAS MORRELL GREEN, son of G. W. and M. E. Green, of Salado, Texas, died July 18, 1881, age one year, 7 months and 9 days. (August 4, 1881; 3.3)



NOTE: The date of issue of the newspaper, followed by the page and column, are given in parentheses at end of each abstract.

Elder L. T. McLEOD, pastor of the Baptist church "at this place," died on the 4th instant, of typhoid fever. He was thirty-two years of age. "He was born and raised in Pike County, Georgia. In 1870 he moved to Texas with his family; after remaining there some time he entered the ministry and in that capacity labored in various parts of the State. Several years since he came to Louisville and attended the Theological Seminary. When he finished the course... he was called to the pastorate of the Baptist church at Portland; he remained at that church one year ...then accepted a call to the...church here for half his time, last July. Shortly after he was called to the Baptist church at Smithfield for the remainder of his time.... The procession that followed his remains to the cemetery was one of the largest ever seen here; he was buried upon the lot of MRS. AGNESS ELLIS, near this place...."

"The above is from the Henry County Local, New Castle, Ky., February 8th 1882. It will be read with sorrow by all who ever knew Bro. McLeod. He was a member of Gay Hill church when I first knew him. He afterwards became a deacon of the church while I was its pastor. Shortly afterwards he commenced a course of study for the ministry, and spent four or five years in study in Baylor University, during which time he was ordained, and in his spare time and in vacations, did good work as a pastor in Union Association. He came to this State [Texas] a young married man. He took his wife back to Georgia during her last illness, where she died at the home of her childhood...." Signed: W. C. C., Independence.

MRS. JANE GROCE died at the residence of MRS. M. A. SHAVEN in Fayetteville, Fayette County, Texas, 18 January 1882, aged ninety years, six months, and fourteen days. [Long eulogy containing no genealogical data except that children are mentioned but not named.] (March 16, 1882; 3.4)

WM. J. TAYLOR, second son of Bro. WM. F. TAYLOR, died at his sister's home in Hardin County on the first day of March 1882. He was born in Colorado County, Texas, April 25, 1859. He professed religion last July and joined the Baptist church at Center Grove. He left a father, brothers, and sisters.

"ANNA McMURRAY, the subject of this sketch, was born in Yallobusha [Yalobusha] county, Mississippi, on the 7th day of November, 1849, and was brought by her parents, Elder ISAIAH and sister JENNY HARBOR, to Lavaca county, Texas, in the fall of 1853. She was married to Bro. WILLIAM McMURRAY in July, 1867, made a profession of religion and was baptized into the fellowship of New Bethel church in 1873, and continued a member until her death, which took place on the 8th day of April 1882. She leaves a bereaved husband, seven children, the eldest a daughter thirteen years, and the youngest twins seven months, an aged mother nearly fourscore and a large number of relatives.... She died of pneumonia...." Signed: LEE GREEN (June 8, 1882; 3.3)

"MRS. ELLA FERGUSON, wife of ALONZO FERGUSON, and daughter of C. C. and ELLEN CHRISTIAN, died on the 24th of May, 1882, aged eighteen years and two months. Her death was a severe blow to her parents and also to her only sister and little brothers. And the two-fold grief of her husband who beheld his dear young wife and infant laid in one silent grave, could ellicit our most earnest sympathies...." Signed: Mls. M. E. K., Winchester, Fayette County, Texas. "La Grange Journal, Galveston News and Houston Post, please copy." (June 8, 1882)

"BRO. D. M. HOLT died May 13th, at his home near Westfield, Harris county, in the 65th year of his age. He professed religion a few years ago under Maj. Penn's preaching, and joined the Willow Creek Baptist church. He had moved to Westfield only a few months ago, and soon after lost his wife. He has a son-in-law, J. C. POLK, civil engineer, a nephew of ex-President POLK. He has a brother-in-law, HON. BRUNSON COOPER, now a member of Texas legislature. Bro. Holt himself was superintendent of our Sunday-school at Westfield, and a chief helper in the church work...." Signed: H. L. G. (June 15, 1882; 3.2)

ABRAM GOOCH died April 9, 1882, in Denton County, Texas, at the home of his son, R. B. GOOCH. He was age sixty-seven years, one month and sixteen days. "Our brother, the subject of this notice, was born in Kershaw District, South Carolina, March 3d, 1815. He joined the church in Shelby county, Alabama, in 1845. He married MARY F. BROOKS, May 3d, 1846 [1846]...." S/ R. F. (June 15, 1882; 3.2)

MRS. IDA JOHNSON, nee WATERS, died at the residence of her husband, JOHN B. JOHNSON, near Livingston, Texas, on the 12th day of June 1882. "She was born in Livingston, Texas, the 1st day of April 1860.... She was baptized a member of the Livingston Baptist church in 1878. She was married to JOHN R. JOHNSON, on September 12th, 1880...." Signed: M. (June 29, 1882; 3.4)

"Died on the 21st of May, 1882, COL. LARKIN CLEVELAND, near Gonzales, Texas. He was about eighty-one years of age and was a native of Georgia, and for over thirty years a resident of Texas. He was for about fifty years a member of the Baptist church, a devoted, decided Christian, a wise and prudent counselor, an affectionate father and husband, and a good friend, neighbor and citizen. He held various positions of honor and responsibility and among them was a member of the Legislature of Georgia. In tears and in grateful remembrance of his piety and of his noble traits of heart and life and that of his lovely companion and their loved ones who have gone before them to the heavenly home we can say 'blessed are the dead that die in the Lord.'" Signed: J. H. S., Rockdale, Texas. (June 29, 1882; 3.4)

ANTHONY W. WRIGHT, died at his residence in Lockhart, Caldwell County, Texas, January 13, 1882, in the 55th year of his age.

"Bro. Wright was born in Perry county, Alabama, May 20th, 1827. He moved with his parents to Mississippi, in 1841. In July 1848, he made a profession of religion and was baptized into the fellowship of Old Concord church, by Bro. H. W. MIDDLETON. In 1860, moved to Texas, and soon after united with Zion church, eight miles east of Lockhart. At the organization of the church in Lockhart, he became a member, and was a consistent deacon of the same till his death. As citizen he was ever loyal, a county official ever true to his trust.... Our brother left a devoted wife and several...children...." Signed: R. A. SUBLETT. (July 6, 1882; 3.2)

EMILINE PARILIE ROWLAND died June 9, 1882. She was born August 22, 1858, the daughter of B. HARGIS and ADILINE HARGIS. She united with the Martindale church and was baptized by Bro. J. C. TALLY June 17, 1877. She was married to R. S. ROWLAND, by Bro. R. S. WILLIAMS. They moved to Hays County and united with the church at Science Hall. Signed: D. A. P. (July 6, 1882)

"TIGNAL W. JONES was born in North Carolina, November 25th, 1820, educated at Nashville University, and admitted to the bar in Alabama, in 1844. He was in the Mexican war and afterwards associated in law with DR. J. L. M. CURRY. He came to Tyler in 1856, and was colonel in the Confederate army. He died June 18th, 1882...." Signed: REDDIN ANDREWS. (July 6, 1882; 3.2)

S. W. NORRISS died at his residence in Eagle Lake, Colorado County, July 5, 1882, in the 37th year of his age. "He was born in Dallas County, Alabama. United with the Baptist church in May, 1865. At the time of his death he was a member of Eagle Lake church.... He leaves a wife and four children to mourn his untimely death. The writer...could but weep to see the aged mother, the wife, the...children.... Bro. Norris was a member of the Knights of Honor, who after the funeral service, took charge of his body and buried it in the cemetery at Eagle Lake, with due and becoming honors." Signed: WILLIAMSON DANIELS, Alleyton. (July 27, 1882; 3.3)

"Died at the residence of E. E. DAY's, MRS. MARTHA FORD. Sister Ford was born March 28th, 1846. Was married to Bro. POLK WEST, December 8th, 1867. Was married again to Mr. OWEN FORD, April 4th, 1876. Was baptized December 24th, 1871, by Elder C. B. HOLLIS, into the fellowship of Kicapoo church. Departed this life July 3d, 1882. Sister Ford leaves a husband and seven children...besides her mother and brothers and sisters...." Signed: C. B. HOLLIS, Pastor. (July 27, 1882; 3.3)

"S. F. NOBLE died at his residence in the Fifth Ward, of this city, on the evening of June the 13th, 1882, in the 75th year of his age. Mr. Noble was a man of true worth and high standing throughout the entire community. He was born in the State of Georgia, in 1807. He came to Texas in 1837, and settled in Nacogdoches county, where he was converted and made a profession of Christ in 1838. He came to Houston in 1842, where he lived up to the time of his death. He became a member of the First

Baptist church of this city, in 1844. Only three remain of the members of the church where Mr. Noble became a member.... Mr. Noble once had a large family. Was married twice; his second wife...still survives. He has three sons yet living, some of whom fill positions of honor and trust. He has eight children dead, seven of whom are buried in Houston along by their father and mother, and one is buried away in Mississippi. ... Mr. Noble was a member of the Fifth Ward Baptist church, of this city...." Signed: H. B. TURNER, Houston, June 23d 1882. (August 3, 1882; 3.3)

"MRS. CHLOE TALLIAFERRO died at the residence of her father, WASHINGTON ANDERSON, of Williamson county, July 13th, 43 years of age. She...joined the Baptist church in 1854, and was married to Elder R. H. TALLIAFERRO in 1855. She as well as Bro. Talliaferro, spent many years in Austin, which was her home when she died. Her constitution was delicate, and the sudden death of her husband caused a shock from which she never recovered.... She leaves father and mother and five children to mourn her loss...." Signed: L. M. (August 3, 1882; 3.3)

Resolutions adopted by Union Grove Baptist Church July 16, 1882, in memory of the Rev. E. J. ROGERS, who died on the 16th inst., age sixty-six years. Signed: S. J. SMITH, R. G. LEVELL, F. A. McAlpine, Com. "The Christian Index and Alabama Baptist, please copy." [No other genealogical data included.] (August 3, 1882; 3.3)

"BETTIE C. PATTERSON WARREN died in Dallas, Texas, July 27th, 1882.... Sister Warren's maiden name was Bettie C. PATTERSON. Born in Sumpter co., Ala., 1844. Was married to J. F. WARREN in same county -- Nov. 7th, 1865. Joined the Baptist church at Gainesville, 1871. Moved to Dallas, January, 1873 -- joined the First Baptist church by letter...." Signed: Her former pastor, J. H. Curry. (August 17, 1882; 3.4)

"S. S. HOSRA [possibly Hosta or Hoera; very indistinct], a member of the Brenham church, died in this city July 11, 1881, in the seventy-second year of his age. Bro. Hosra [?] was thrice married, and leaves a wife and seven children, most of whom are grown.... He filled the office of county clerk for many years, to the satisfaction of all, being at length displaced by the military after the war...." Signed: Pastor. (August 4, 1881; 3.2)

ALFORD C. CAMPBELL died near Wellborn, Brazos County, Texas, August 3, 1882, aged ten months and ten days, son of CHARLIE and JODDIE CAMPBELL, and grandson of A. and ANNA HILL. Signed: H. (August 24, 1882; 3.4)

"BRO. JOEL WALLACE died October the 21st, 1881, aged 76. Being a member of the church forty-five years, and a deacon for many years, and also sister JANE PHILLIPS, aged 67, being a member of the church for many years." [After this introductory statement resolutions of the "church at New Hope" follow. There is

no clue to location of the church.] Signed: E. M. CARTER, Mod.
(August 24, 1882; 3.4)

"Died on Tuesday morning, August 15th, 1882, in Longview, Texas, at the residence of Mrs. FANNIE SPEAR YOUNG, her sister, MRS. EMMA TURNER, aged thirty-three years, ten months and nine days. ... From a long and tedious illness, thirty days of which she endured in her home, near Helena, Ark., after which, having come home, as she said, to die, she succumbed.... Having been married three years, she leaves a husband...."
Signed: Fannie Spear Young, Longview, Texas. (Aug. 24, 1882)

LEE MAY GORE, the only surviving child of J. M. and C. S. GORE, "and our grandchild," died August 23d. Signed: S. R. GORE.
(September 7, 1882; 3.2)

"Cleburne, Aug. 28. -- "Our son-in-law, W. T. HAM, breathed his last at Lampasas on the evening of the 25th inst. His remains were brought here for interment, which took place on Saturday afternoon...where he now sleeps, by the side of his wife, who died nearly two years ago. Thus, in less than two years the wife, two children, and the husband have all been called home. ... We are under many obligations to the G.C.&S.F. railroad company for kindness extended, in sending a special train to convey the body to this place, and the kindly attention shown both by officers and employees...." Signed: W. D. BEVERLY.
(September 14, 1882)

"ELDER MARTIN HAGGARD died at his residence near Jewett, Leon county, Texas, on the 26th day of August, 1882, aged 72 years, 3 months and 6 days. On the 20th day of May last, he gave a dinner to a few of his relatives and near neighbors, celebrating his 72d birthday, at which time he read to me a brief sketch of his ministerial life, a part of which is, he had been a Baptist fifty-four years, had served as deacon twelve years, had preached thirty-eight years.... He was buried on Sunday, with Masonic honors, by a union of two lodges, witnessed by hundreds of persons.... His first wife and two children have gone before.... His second wife and two children survive him.... Among his numerous acquaintances, from Perry county, Ala., through Louisiana and Texas, but few knew him but to love him; but few spoke of him but to praise him.... He has, or had, three brothers long in the Baptist ministry; his father, Elder NOAH HAGARD, who died in Shelby county, Ala. eighty-four years old, had been a preacher over fifty years. His uncle, JOEL HAGARD, who lies buried in Huntsville, Texas, died eighty-four years old, had been a Baptist sixty-six years and preached forty-four years. Two others of his uncles were long Baptist ministers. Our old grandfather, Henry Hagard, who died in Bibb county, Alabama, in 1841, aged 104, had been a Baptist preacher seventy or eighty years of his life. When I was a boy, I remember he wrote to his children in Tennessee, Kentucky and other states and counted up 103 posterity--generally members of Baptist churches--but few ever known to unite with any other denomination. I have been able to count up thirty or forty

MRS. ANNIE STORR HACKETT, wife of the Rev. J. A. HACKETT, D.D., of Shreveport, died October 1, aged 43. [Taken from the Shreveport Times, from which editor quotes.] (Oct. 12, 1882; 2.3)

Resolutions of Willow Baptist Sabbath School adopted Sept. 17, 1882, in memory of ADDIE TOWNSEND. Signed: T. P. WEST, Willow Creek, Sept. 19th. (October 12, 1882; 3.2)

Deacon J. R. GRAY, of Providence church, Burleson county, died of congestion on the 6th of October, 1882. Signed: W. S. L. (October 1882; 3.2)

HATTIE, infant daughter of THOS. B. and M. L. COLEMAN, Lavaca County, Texas, died October 4, 1882, near fourteen months old. There was a large attendance at the burial at North Grove Church. Signed: W. H. H. (October 19, 1882; 3.2)

JAMES TALBOT died September 18, 1882, at his residence near Calvert, Texas, in the seventy-seventh year of his age. "Bro. Talbot was a native of Georgia, but moved from there to Pike county, Ala., in his boyhood. He lived there many years. He moved to Texas in 1853, and stopped in Washington county, one year, from thence he came to Robertson, and settled the present home where he has since lived. Bro. Talbot was twice married in Alabama, having one daughter by the first wife, and a son and daughter by the second. The second wife accompanied him to Texas but only lived two years after their arrival. He married again in two years, and had another daughter. He leaves a faithful wife, a daughter, grand-daughter, son and other relatives...." (November 2, 1882; 3.2)

MRS. ADDIE L. MUNGER died October 22, 1882, near Sealy, Austin County, Texas, aged twenty-two years, five days, daughter of Bro. and sister R. H. HILL, and wife of Mr. RANDON Munger. Signed: A. S. POINDEXTER. (November 2, 1882; 3.2)

"Elder JOHN TURNER, an aged, worthy minister of the gospel, died Sunday, Oct. 22d, at his residence in Parker County, four miles east from Weatherford. He was sixty-seven years old. Forty years of his life was spent in the ministry, thirty years of which was spent on the frontier of Texas. He was moderator of the Brazos Association for many years, and preached for the Weatherford church in its early history.... DR. I. B. KIMBROUGH, pastor of the church at Weatherford, attended the funeral." Signed: JASPER N. HANEY. (November 2, 1882; 3.2)

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
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PRESIDENT'S PAGE



This is a great research aid and we here in Fort Worth are very fortunate to have access to the Federal Records Center. Mr. Kent Carter, the Archivist, has a limited staff and a small area for the researchers to use, however, the staff is most courteous and cooperative.

I urge you all to follow the regulations and be sure to call for an appointment before going. There is a two hour limit unless you are fortunate to go on a day when there are no solid appointments booked.

SIX GENERATION ANCESTORS TABLES - BICENTENNIAL PROJECT, BOOK ONE. Just received for review from the Central New York Genealogical Society, Syracuse, New York is a beautifully done book, 127 pages softcover, containing some 96 six generation charts. It is fully indexed and very easily read. Copies are limited and sell for only \$3.00, which is very reasonable for armchair genealogists. The society members' overwhelming response to this project resulted in so many charts being offered, they intend to print several more books. At the Board of Directors Meeting on October 25, 1976 the following motions carried:

To purchase the 1880 Mortality Schedule of Texas for the Fort Worth Public Library. This is on order at present.

To purchase a microfiche reader and to replace the Virginia State Papers for the library. These are also on order.

To purchase an electric stapler for use in collating FOOTPRINTS...this should be here in time to use for this issue of our publication.

ENGLISH CROWN GRANTS. During the past few years the State of Georgia printed complete volumes of the English Crown Grants. FWGS was able to purchase a set of these which have been placed in the library. Those of you with early Georgia ancestors will be happy to read about this.

Some early issues of the Bulletin (now called FOOTPRINTS) will be placed on microfilm soon. They will then be available to libraries and individuals.



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Many new reels of microfilm have been placed in the South Carolina Department of Archives and History. There are 63 rolls of Edgefield County records and 31 cu. ft. of Court of Equity of Abbeville County. These are now available for research. Other counties represented are Chester, Colleton, Fairfield, Lexington, Spartanburg, Union, Kershaw and York. The Texas State Library announces they have moved the Genealogy Department to the first floor, formerly in the space occupied by the Reference Division. Reference has moved to the third floor.

The Oklahoma Genealogical Society has published a special edition with Volume 21, No. 3, September 1976 issue of the Quarterly. It contains the entire 'Table of Contents' of all volumes which OGS has published from Volume 1 in 1955 through Volume 19 in 1974. A handy desk aid for Oklahoma researchers.

If you are having trouble with early wills in a Virginia County, check the court order books for a lawsuit involving your surnames. The suit may be continued from one term of court to another for several years. When it is dismissed or determined, ask for loose papers on the suit filed under date of dismissal. Some of the affidavits, depositions, etc. may state the relationships.

Our society continues to grow in many ways. These past three years have contained successful workshops with outstanding speakers. We have carried out teaching programs at Tarrant County Junior College campuses, as well as the ones currently in progress. Many items have been placed in the Southwest History and Genealogy Department of the library. The services available to the growing membership include various charts, maps, Ancestor Referral Cards and books.

We would like to have a file made up of pedigree charts from each member. If you do not have yours on file, please send one to our P. O. Box 864. The editor needs these for future reference.

The time has come for me to say "Thank You!" for these three years as your president. It has been a rewarding and learning experience for me in many ways. I have made a lot of new friends along the way. It was possible for me to attend several area workshops and keep in touch with other societies in this manner.
