Parmer County Texas February 5th 1851
Sir on the Receipt of your letter informing
me of the informality of the Bond of the Assessor
and Collector of our County I immediatly
presented to our Hutton a New Bond he informed
me that he had already concluded to Resign which
he did at once I then called a Court to deliberate on
the matter who proceeded to appoint a Successor
under the ^{provisions of} first section of an Act to provide for
the assessment and collection of Taxes Approved
February 11th 1850 I have with transmit to you
the Bond of John A. Hutton who received the appoin-
tment ^{February 11th 1851} as approved by the County Court as I have
doubts whether it is my duty or not to satisfy the
Secretary of State of said appointments for the
purpose of having said assessor and collector Comitted
under the provisions of an Act to Prohibit assessors
and collectors of taxes from exercising Official functions
before they are ~~dearly~~ qualified Approved September
5th 1850 you will pleas. have said Comition forward
as soon as convenient if said Recited Act
doe apply to assessors other than those elected
in case of defaulters Pleas give my Hutton instructi-
ons on the Subject
