This notice concerns the 2026 property tax rates for Tarrant County.

This notice provides information about two tax rates taxing units use in adopting the current tax year's tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, the taxing unit calculates these rates by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Taxing units preferring to list the rates can expand this section to include an explanation of how they calculated these tax rates.

Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustments

State Criminal Justice Mandate

The Tarrant County County Auditor certifies that Tarrant County County spent \$ 20,511,205 (minus any amount received from state revenue for such costs) in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Tarrant County County Sheriff provided Tarrant County information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for the reimbursement of such costs. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$ 0.001751 /\$100.

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures

Tarrant County county spent \$ 0.00 from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026, on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$ 0.00. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$ 0.00 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

Tarrant County county spent \$ 31,906,044 from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026, to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants. In the preceding year, the county spent \$ 32,125,399 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year's indigent defense expenditures is \$ (\$219,355). This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$ 0.00 /\$100 to recoup expenditures.

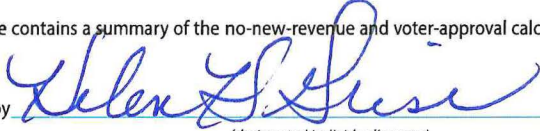
