


WHAT IS AYA?

Cancer affects all ages differently. Therefore, there are different approaches to treating each age group. Unfortunately, as we leave childhood and reach adolescence and young adulthood, our bodies are still developing and in constant change. It is for this reason that AYAs, or adolescent and young adults, require special attention when determining the best approach to treating cancer. In addition, they have unique social issues that impact care.

Did you know that AYA cancer patients are an underserved population? It is for this reason that the Fort Worth Adolescent and Young Adult Oncology Coalition was established. FWAYA is a community of more than 100 healthcare professionals, young adult cancer survivors and their families, advocates and dedicated volunteers. The coalition works together to improve the lives of adolescents and young adults, ages 15 - 39, diagnosed with cancer. In May of 2016, the FWAYA opened America's first community-supported AYA oncology inpatient unit

and infusion center. Located inside Baylor Scott & White All Saints Medical Center—Fort Worth, the center serves patients 18-29. They also have dedicated staff that supports outpatients throughout the community.


