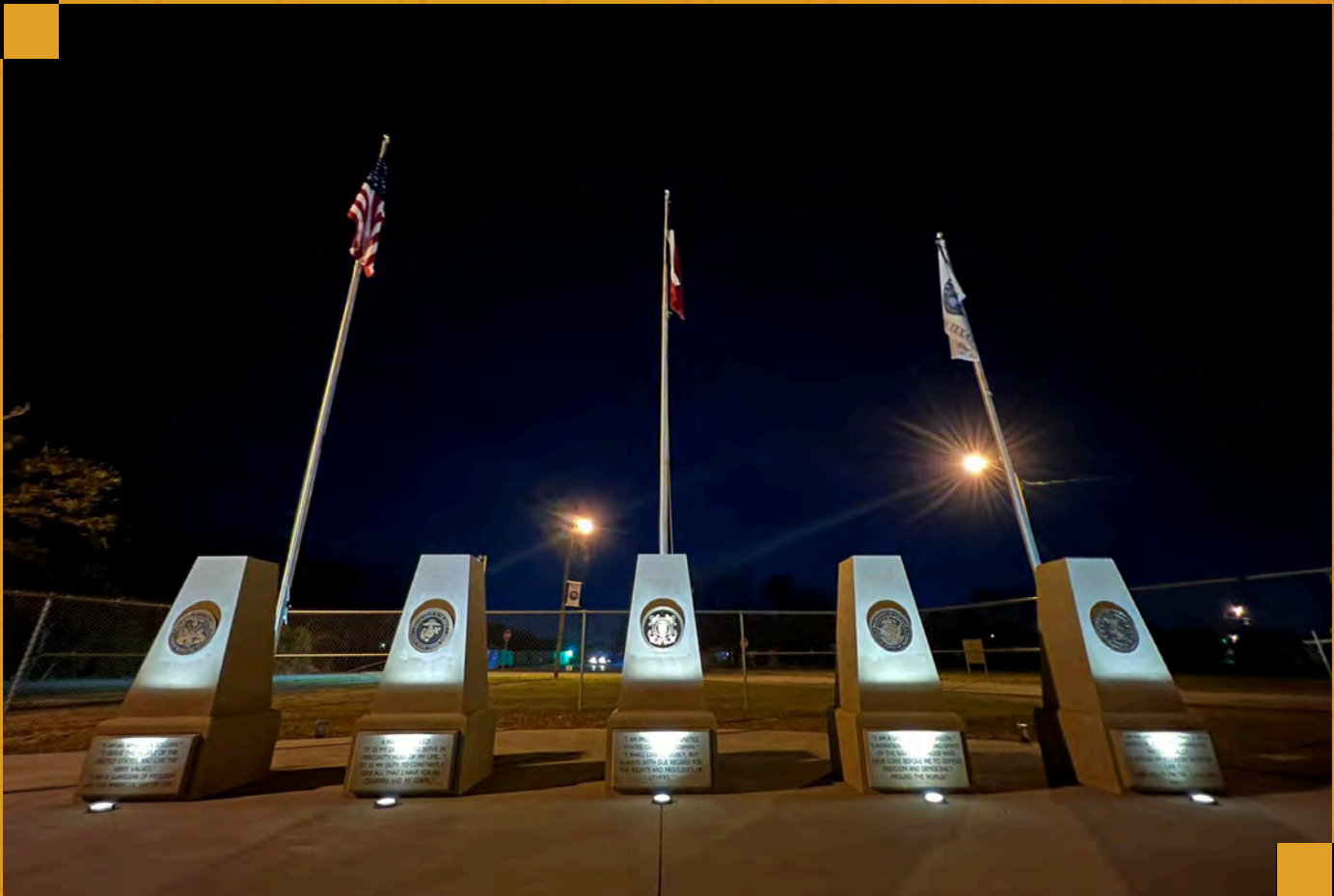



While this change was unprecedented, it also expanded the territory of Precinct One and brought new neighborhoods, new voices, and new priorities into our community. Whether your family has been here for generations or you're newly connected to our precinct, you deserve responsive county government, clear communication, and a Commissioner's Office that treats your concerns with urgency and respect.

One of the most important lessons from 2025 is that the best decisions are made when residents have a real seat at the table. That's why we launched the Miles Across the County Community Listening Tour. We didn't just host meetings—we went into communities to hear directly from you about what's working, what's not, and what you need from your county government. Those conversations continue to shape our priorities, from basic quality-of-life issues to long-term investment strategies that strengthen neighborhoods across the precinct.

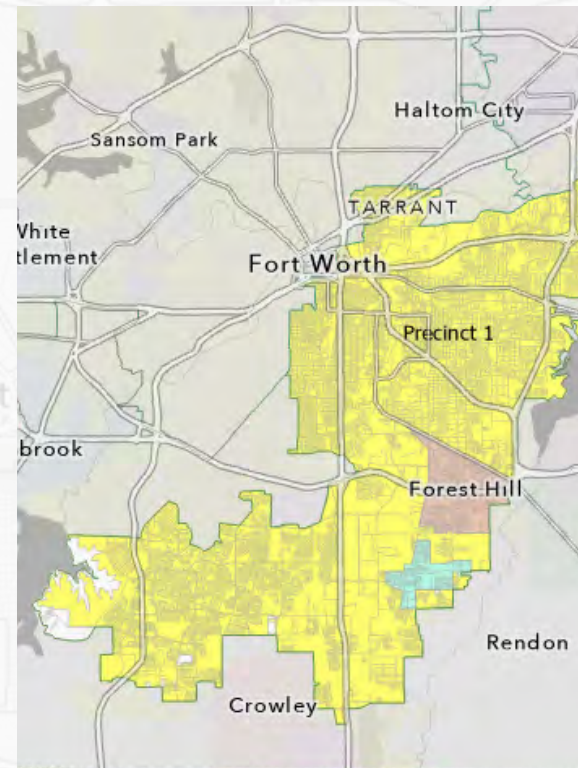
We also worked to ensure that critical support reaches residents in practical, dependable ways. In 2025, our office supported the transition of Utility and Rental Assistance services to the Center for Transforming Lives, helping improve coordination and access to assistance for families navigating financial hardship. And during the government shutdown, when uncertainty and strain hit many households at once, we prioritized immediate community needs by directing \$200,000 in funding to local community organizations to help address food insecurity and support residents where the need was greatest.

As we move into 2026, our focus remains clear: expand access to resources, strengthen partnerships, and deliver solutions that meet people where they are. Precinct One is growing, changing, and full of possibility—and in this next year, we will continue to work alongside you to build a healthier, safer, and more connected Tarrant County.

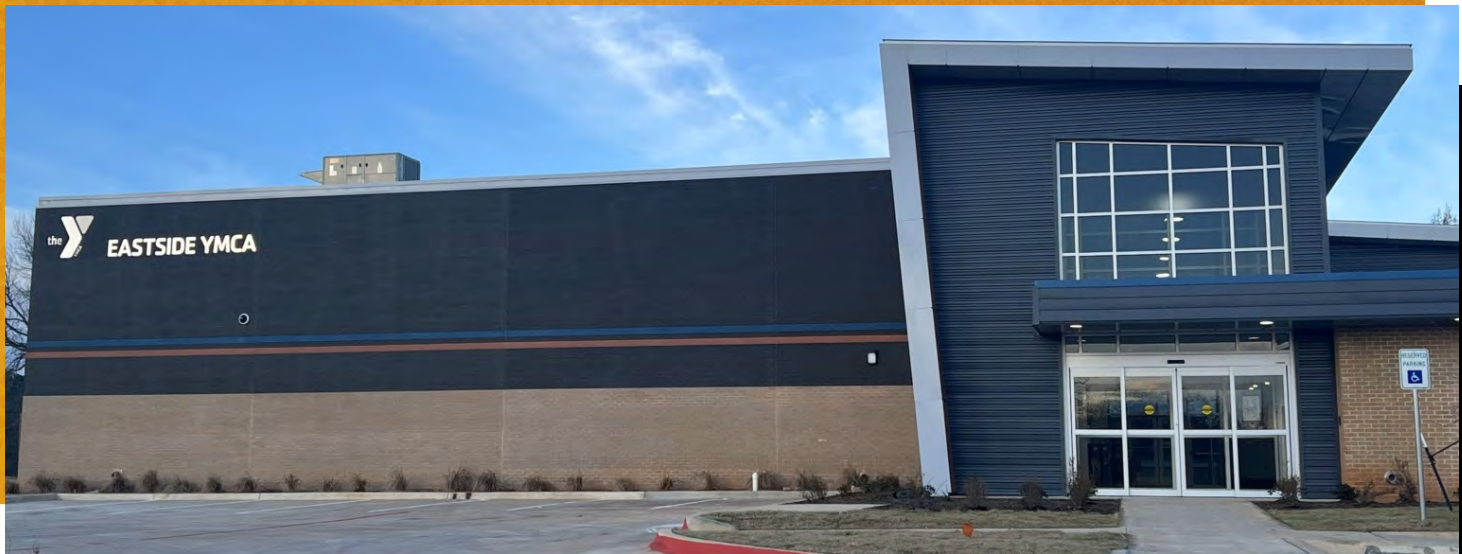
We are incredibly proud of the men who prioritized their health and celebrate their courage! Together, we are saving lives – and look forward to building on this momentum to make an even greater impact next year.

The heartbeat of a neighborhood is often found in its gathering spaces – where stories are shared, lessons are learned, and futures are shaped. After a transformative \$16 million revitalization, the Eastside Community Impact Center reopened on January 27, 2025.

The story of this transformation is one of resilience. Like a band regrouping after a hiatus, the Eastside YMCA temporarily closed its doors in 2020, another casualty of the global pandemic. But that pause set the stage for a more ambitious comeback. A dedicated team of advocates and community leaders began listening — really listening — to the neighborhood's needs. What they heard shaped every corner of this revitalized space.

Phase one of the three-phase project focused on breathing new life into the existing 16.4-acre property. The walls now echo with energy from fitness and wellness spaces, a community demonstration kitchen, and dynamic areas where teens and youth can dive into technology and fitness. This isn't just a face-lift it's a full-blown reinvention. But the story doesn't end here. The next chapters promise a full-sized gymnasium, revitalized outdoor sports fields, and an on-site childcare center, all designed to serve as pillars of support for families. On top of this, income-based scholarships and financial assistance will ensure that everyone has a seat at the table.

Transportation Updates

St. Francis Village Creek Road



Precinct 1 began the St. Francis Village Creek Road reconstruction project on November 3, 2025. The project will include drainage improvements, restabilization of the base material, new pavement for the existing roadway, new headwalls, new metal beam guard fence and driveways, as necessary.

The drainage improvements include upgrading of the existing culverts under the roadway from corrugated metal pipes to reinforced concrete pipes, reshaping and clearing debris located in the ditches (shrubs, trees, etc.) and existing driveway culverts.

The anticipated completion date is April 1, 2026.

Miller Sub-Courthouse Parking Lot



Precinct 1 began the Miller Sub-courthouse parking lot project on December 15, 2025. The original overall project included improving drainage runoff improvements and a 2" mill and overlay with Type D HMA.

The drainage improvements included replacing depressed sections of curb and gutter within the parking lots that held water. This work was coordinated by the Facilities Department and contracted with Reliable Paving.
