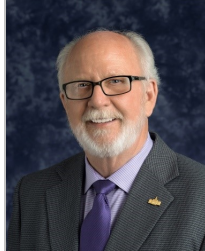

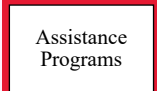

Carl L. Johnson, P.E.
Fort Worth District Engineer
Texas Department
of Transportation



Carl L. Johnson, PE is the district engineer for the Fort Worth District of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), which comprises nine counties: Erath, Hood, Jack, Johnson, Palo Pinto, Parker, Somervell, Tarrant and Wise. Johnson oversees the planning, designing, building, operation and maintenance of the state transportation system for the Fort Worth District.

A graduate of Texas Tech University, Johnson began his career with TxDOT in the Lampasas Area Office of the Brownwood District in 1995. While in Lampasas, Johnson was involved with many design and construction projects. In 2012, he was promoted to Director of

Operations for the Brownwood District, where he oversaw maintenance and traffic functions for the district. In addition to his district duties, Johnson was also a leader in many statewide initiatives, such as the development of the Statewide Winter Storm Plan.

Johnson was named the Abilene District Engineer in 2017. As district engineer, he worked to improve pavement scores and served as a member of the Ports to Plains Advisory Board and a member of Abilene's Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). He was instrumental in maintaining a collaborative working relationship between the MPO, TxDOT and the city of Abilene. While in Abilene, Johnson also had several statewide assignments, including participating on TxDOT's district peer review committee.

Appointed as Fort Worth District Engineer in September 2020, Johnson serves on NCTCOG's Regional Transportation Council working to address Metroplex-area transportation challenges and opportunities. Under Johnson's direction as district engineer, he oversees more than \$4 billion in construction including major projects

such as I-35W, the I-30/SH 360 Interchange, and the Southeast Connector. Johnson also serves on TxDOT's statewide sealcoat committee.

Regional Transportation Council

The Regional Transportation Council is the independent transportation policy body of the Metropolitan Planning Organization. RTC meets the second Thursday of each month, and the 44 members inside local elected or appointed officials from the metropolitan area and representatives from each of the area's transportation providers. RTC oversees the metropolitan transportation planning process. Primary activities include:

- ◆ Guiding the development of multimodal transportation plans and programs.
- ◆ Determining the allocation of federal, state, and regional transportation funds.
- ◆ Selecting transportation projects for some programs and recommending projects to the Texas Transportation Commission for other programs.
- ◆ Ensuring transportation providers coordinate services.
- ◆ Ensuring the metropolitan area complies with state and federal laws and regulations regarding transportation and air quality.

Question of the Month

The Fifty Cent Act - Question: So, you think land and housing costs are outrageous now? Look what you could have bought in Texas in 1879.

Answer: The Fifty Cent Act advocated by Governor O.M. Roberts was approved by the Texas Legislature July 14, 1879. It provided for selling Texas public land at fifty cents an acre, one half of the proceeds to be used for paying the public debt, and the other half to be used to establish a public school fund. The Act opened to settlement about fifty-two West Texas counties, out of which 3,201,283 acres were sold for \$1,600,645.55. The Act was repealed in January 1883. (Treasury of Texas Trivia, 1997)

Tarrant County Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

The 2020 Care 4 Tarrant program provided rental assistance to over 2,300 households within Tarrant County, but a large need still exists. Through ERAP, Tarrant County hopes to continue providing rent and utility assistance to residents financially hurt by COVID-19. ERAP is open to Tarrant County renters outside the cities of Fort Worth and Arlington.

Applications opened on Monday, March 29th, 2021.

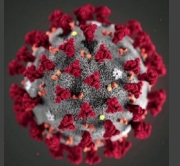

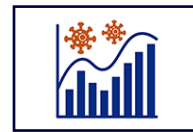

Precinct 3 Maintenance Center News February 2022



This year our construction schedule is jam-packed with LOTS of projects – more than ever before. We have 72 ILA (city) projects estimated and scheduled throughout all thirteen of our cities, as well as a project proposed in the BISD School District. Currently, most project requests are in the process of getting the contracts approved through City Councils and Commissioners Court. We already have a strong start, and have completed several projects. Below is a list of projects proposed for this fiscal year, thru next December 2022. These 72 projects will yield an estimated \$6.4M in saving to the Cities by using County equipment and personnel for construction.

The City provides the material funding and the County provides the labor and equipment to perform the work. TAX PREPARATION ASSISTANCE

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)



VITA is an IRS supported, free income tax preparation program for low- to moderate-income individuals and families. Community volunteers, certified by the IRS, help taxpayers prepare their tax returns at no cost and make sure they claim valuable tax credits for which they're eligible, including the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and Child Tax Credit (CTC).

VITA helps taxpayers who make less than \$60,000 per year and need to file a return for the prior or current tax year.

VITA helps individuals keep more of their hard-earned money and brings millions of dollars back into the local economy through refunds and tax credits.

There are three ways to apply for VITA services: in-person at select locations, curbside drop-off and online.

In-person Help

Traditional, in-person service will be offered at three locations. Taxpayers must have an appointment; no waiting rooms are available. Schedule an appointment [online](#) or by calling 682-428-2939. **Do not call the centers directly**, you will be redirected to the appointment line.

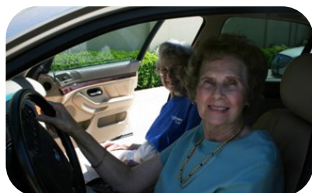
