Mayor Lindamood was elected as Mayor in 2022 and has served on the Colleyville City

2023 NATIONAL WORK ZONE AWARENESS WEEK

April 17 - 21




In recognition of National Work Zone Awareness Week, April 17-21, 2023, this is a friendly reminder to drive safely through the state's more than 3,400 active work zones. The Texas Department of Transportation reports there were 26,000 traffic crashes in work zones in 2021, resulting in 244 deaths, a 33 percent increase over the previous year. Another 856 people were seriously injured. The majority of those killed were drivers and passengers.

Driver Safety: Work zones often present a challenging environment for drivers to navigate. Drivers may encounter uneven pavement, narrow lanes, concrete barriers, slow-moving heavy equipment, and vehicles that make sudden stops. Driving too fast and not paying attention are the leading causes of work zone crashes. Watch for warning signs and stay alert when driving through work zones. We want to ensure everyone and their passengers get home safely.

Please keep the following tips in mind when driving through work zones:

- Plan ahead to avoid delays.
- Pay attention and put the phone away
- Don't tailgate
- Obey road crew flaggers
- Slow down and follow posted work zone speed limits
- Remember, traffic fines double when workers are present and can cost up to \$2,000.00

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



North Richland Hills, Tx

North Richland Hills recently announced a significant project planned for the former Mountasia Family Fun Center on Boulevard 26. The property, which has been for sale since 2019, was purchased by Merlin Entertainments and will be redeveloped as a Peppa Pig Theme Park. The 14-acre park, designed to be the ultimate theme park experience for little ones, will feature multiple rides, interactive attractions, themed playscapes, and shows, all based on instantly recognizable locations from the globally popular television series.

Opening in 2024, this will be only the second Peppa Pig Theme Park in North America, with the other location in Florida. Peppa Pig Theme Parks is a partnership

between Hasbro, owner of the Peppa Pig brand, and Merlin Entertainments, which operates more than 140 attractions in 25 countries, including LEGOLAND and SEA LIFE® Aquariums.



The City of NRH had originally been working with Merlin in 2019 to bring this project to the city, with plans stalling due to the pandemic. The theme park will be open 280 operating days per year, attracting over 400 thousand annual visitors and adding 16 full-time and 75 seasonal employees.

North Richland Hills Mayor Oscar Trevino said “North Richland Hills is known for its family-friendly amenities

and activities – we could not be more thrilled to add Peppa Pig Theme Park to the mix. This will be a great addition to our community. Conveniently located next door to NRH2O Family Water Park, Peppa Pig Theme Park will bring more energy to an area already known as a destination for family fun. I’m certain it will provide unforgettable entertainment that keeps families coming back again and again.”

Weather Preparedness

Severe weather can occur with little or no warning. Taking precautions before the storms, such as developing an emergency plan, learning the warning signs, and monitoring tornado watches and warnings, can help you stay safe.

Understanding Severe Thunderstorm Risk Categories

THUNDERSTORMS (no label)	1 - MARGINAL (MRGL)	2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)	3 - ENHANCED (ENH)	4 - MODERATE (MDT)	5 - HIGH (HIGH)

* NWS defines a severe thunderstorm as measured wind gusts to at least 58 mph, and/or hail to at least one inch in diameter, and/or a tornado. All thunderstorm categories imply lightning and the potential for flooding. Categories are also tied to the probability of a severe weather event within 25 miles of your location.

Historical Moment In Time

"History of JPS Hospital"

In October 1877, future Fort Worth mayor John Peter Smith deeded five acres of land, now 1500 South Main Street, to provide a place where individuals from Fort Worth and Tarrant County "could have the best of medical care." It would be many years before his vision for a facility in that location would be realized, but only a short time before the first public hospital for the community was established.

In 1906, a hospital affiliated with the Fort Worth Medical College was opened in Fort Worth, free to all accident cases and any other cases that the authorities would accept, forming the foundation for JPS Health Network. Seven years later, county commissioners agreed to match city funds to operate a city and county hospital, which soon opened with 25 beds.

By 1938, the downtown location was well past adequate for the demands of the region's demands, and construction of the new hospital on the land donated by John Peter Smith began. The 166-bed City-County Hospital rose to many challenges, including the polio epidemic, and served as the main trauma center for Tarrant County.

In 1954, the name of the hospital was officially changed to John Peter Smith Hospital, and in 1959 the Tarrant County Hospital District was created to give the organization a sound financial footing.

The 1970s and 1980s saw tremendous expansion as John Peter Smith Hospital grew. By the 1990s, the need for growth in the community was apparent, and health centers were established across the county.

Today, JPS Health Network continues to serve the needs of the families in Tarrant County, working to improve health status and access to healthcare. The facilities on Main Street have grown to a hospital licensed for 582 beds attached to a Patient Care Pavilion – a five-story acute care facility, an outpatient care center, and a dedicated facility for psychiatric services.





Though Texas is thought of by many as flat and prairie-like (and some parts indeed are), at one time, Texas had some great ski slopes. An 1836 map shows that the Republic of Texas included that portion of Colorado in which is located one of today's most popular ski resorts, Crested Butte.



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

United Way of Tarrant County provides FREE income tax preparation assistance at its Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Free Tax Centers. With multiple locations, low-income working individuals and families can receive help with their taxes. For many years, this successful program has helped Tarrant County residents with financial stability and resiliency.

VITA helps taxpayers who make less than \$60,000 per year and need to file a return for the prior or current tax year.

Curbside Drop-off Service will be offered at two select locations:

- Grace In Grapevine 837 E. Walnut St. Grapevine, TX 76051
- Opening Doors for Women In Need 3600 Horne Street, Fort Worth, TX 76107

Curbside Drop-off allows taxpayers to drop off their tax documents beginning in early January at your choice of several VITA locations. Remain in your vehicle at all times; no one will be allowed to wait inside facilities. A staff member will come to your vehicle, copy your documents, and return them to you. No originals will be kept.
