Precinct 3 Maintenance Center News February 2024



One of the major functions of county government is to build and maintain a network of roads and bridges in the county's unincorporated areas. In Tarrant County, our four county commissioners are responsible for constructing and maintaining approximately 430 miles of county roads, with 41.34 miles of these roads located in Northeast Tarrant County, Precinct 3, which our Maintenance Department maintains.

The Transportation Services Department supports these efforts by providing engineering, planning, environmental, and right-of-way acquisition services to each County Commissioner's Precinct and other County Departments.



In addition to maintaining roads in the unincorporated areas of Tarrant County, each maintenance department collaborates with the cities located within their precinct on interlocal agreements. An interlocal agreement is a collaborative contract between public bodies to provide more efficient, less costly public services. Interlocal agreements between public agencies result in mutual benefits for all the parties and usually consist of the city funding the project and our maintenance department providing the workforce and equipment to complete the project. Our Precinct 3 cities include Bedford, Colleyville, Euless, Fort Worth, Grapevine, Hurst, Keller, North Richland Hills, Richland Hills, Southlake, Watauga, and Westlake.

We take our commitment to the safety of our community seriously, especially during winter weather conditions. During these times, we create a rotating 12-hour shift schedule to implement road maintenance solutions. We are well-prepared to handle any winter weather that comes our way with two pickup sanders and one tandem dump truck to spread a sand/salt mixture on our county roads. Our loaders and motor graders are strategically stationed at our stockpile locations and ready to go into action when needed.

Our team is always in communication with the cities in our precinct and ready to assist them whenever possible. We are committed to keeping our roads safe for you during the winter months.

Answer: Air passenger service in Texas began in 1928 when Air Transport Service initiated service linking Dallas, Fort Worth, San Antonio, and Galveston. Service expanded rapidly with additional line and routes.

TAX PREPARATION ASSISTANCE



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is an IRS-supported, free income tax preparation program for low to moderate-income individuals and families. Community volunteers, certified by the IRS, help taxpayers prepare their tax returns at no cost and make sure they claim valuable tax credits for which they're eligible, including the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and Child Tax Credit (CTC).

VITA helps taxpayers who make less than \$64,000 per year and need to file a return for the prior or current tax year.

VITA helps individuals keep more of their hard-earned money and brings millions of dollars back into the local economy through refunds and tax credits.
