Road and Bridge Update

Welcome to Tarrant County, Precinct 4, Road and Bridge Department! There is no better place to be than right here in Tarrant County, Precinct 4.

Tarrant County Precinct 4 is responsible for overseeing the maintenance and rehabilitation of approximately 161 miles of paved county roads. Precinct 4 also maintains over 2500 signs, 1,057 storm culverts, and drainage in the county right-of-way. In addition to maintaining our county infrastructure, we serve our taxpayers by providing labor and equipment costs through interlocal agreements with our local municipalities, local school districts, and various other non-profit partners.

Since January, Tarrant County Precinct 4 has completed 15 interlocal projects and has 12 more projects in development. Our county exclusive road projects include four completed projects, seven projects in production, and eight projects that have been planned and scheduled. These projects vary in scope and difficulty from reconstructions, paving, crack sealing, tiger mowing, and earthen berms. Each scheduled project is allocated using a needs-based system, and schedules may be impacted by a number of factors, including weather and material availability.
