Our office was notified by a group of concerned citizens about an application for a landfill permit at 3411 Silver Creek. After careful research and listening to the concerns of the residents potentially affected by this development, Commissioner Ramirez reached out to Representative Charlie Geren. Through a united effort we were able to petition the TCEQ to hold a public hearing to allow citizens to voice their concerns to the commission in a public hearing. We will continue our efforts to protect our community and hope you will join us at this hearing.

The hearing will be held Tuesday, December 5, 2023, in the Brewer High School Auditorium, 1025 W. Loop 820 N, Fort Worth, 76108, time: TBD.

Bonds Ranch Fire

Unified Response to Bonds Ranch Brush Fire

On the afternoon of July 19th, with temperatures reaching as high as 106°, a construction company cutting rebar northwest of Bonds Ranch Rd & Saginaw Blvd, sparked a massive grassfire. The 20 mph winds coupled with 17% humidity caused the grassfire to spread so rapidly that the construction crew had no choice but to call 911 for help! This intense emergency presented a significant challenge but ultimately showcased the collaboration between municipal, state, and county partners, highlighting the effectiveness of their response.

Details of the fire:

According to the Texas A&M Forest Service, 184 acres of land were damaged by the fire. Six homes and approximately four other structures were at risk during the blaze, but thankfully none were harmed. **One Tarrant County Brush** Truck battling the fire did sustain minor damage. The 9-1-1 call was received at 3:35 P.M., and just 8 minutes later over a dozen fire units were on the scene. By 8:05 P.M. the fire was contained and fire units were able to issue an "End of Alarm" call for the situation.

Teamwork:

- Several Firehouses responded: Saginaw, Eagle Mountain, Blue Mound, Haslet, White Settlement, Azle, Briar/Reno, Lake Worth, Fort Worth, North Richland Hills, Haltom City, Rhome, Justin, and a Denton County Task Force which was made up of Roanoke, Flower Mound, Little Elm, Southlake, Denton County ESD #1 and Denton.
- Texas A&M Forest Service provided 3 Fire Boss Aircraft each carrying 3,000 gallons of water along with 2 bulldozers, while their public information officer assisted with the media.
- County Commissioner Manny Ramirez deployed Precinct 4 maintenance personnel & heavy equipment.
- Tarrant County Sheriff's Office & Constable's Office assisted with traffic control & evacuation.
- Tarrant County Fire Marshal's office coordinated the incident & available resources.
- Tarrant County Office of Emergency Management notified the State Operations Center & was on standby to provide additional resources when/if needed.
- Haslet/Saginaw Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) provided a 'Rehab' station for all first responders to hydrate, cool off & sit down to rest during the extreme heat conditions at hand.

This well-organized, decisive coordination among state & local fire departments, law enforcement agencies, and emergency management offices played a crucial role in preventing a dangerous situation from becoming even more destructive. Tarrant County is strongest when county, state, and municipal organizations work together to solve problems. We stand united and ready as partners to protect our community from any future challenges that may arise.

FEMA Test Alert

Wednesday, October 4th, 2023, Text Messages will be sent to all TVs, Radios and Cell Phones.

FEMA, in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), will conduct a nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) this fall.

The purpose of the October 4th test is to ensure that the systems continue to be effective means of warning the public about emergencies, particularly those on the national level. In case the October 4th test is postponed due to widespread severe weather or other significant events, the back-up testing date is October 11th.
