Operation Rescue BEVO

When a strong winter storm hit Tarrant County in January, the Precinct 4 Road and Bridge team mobilized quickly to keep our roads safe and passable. Crews worked long hours in freezing conditions, sanding and clearing key routes across the precinct to ensure access for residents, emergency services, and essential travel.

Their professional response was critical to maintaining public safety during the storm, and their work didn't go unnoticed. Among the



many calls that came in during the weather event was one from the University of Texas at Austin. BEVO, UT's mascot, was staying at a ranch in Precinct 4 and needed to be transported to the national championship game. Due to the icy roads, UT staff couldn't reach him—until our crews stepped in to clear the way.



It was a great reminder that our team doesn't just serve roadways—they serve people. Whether it's helping our neighbors get to work or helping BEVO get to the big game, Precinct 4 is always ready to respond when needed. Their dedication kept Tarrant County moving when it mattered most. We're proud of their professionalism and commitment to serving the public; no matter the conditions.

Corporal Don Graves signed up to serve in the United States Marine Corps when he was 17 years old. He fought in the battle of Iwo Jima during World War 2 and is one of the few men from his unit to return alive.

He now spends his time motivating veterans and first responders all across the nation.

It was great to see so many of our Tarrant County business leaders in Austin for the Fort Worth Chamber organized Tarrant County Days. We are looking forward to working with them alongside our partners in the Texas House and Senate to ensure that Tarrant County has a great legislative session.







In 2022, Tarrant County Sheriff's Office Deputies faced a dangerous situation when an armed suspect opened fire on them with a rifle, forcing them to seek cover behind their patrol vehicles. The delayed arrival of up-armored backup resulted in one deputy being shot in the helmet during the ambush.

Recognizing the need to enhance the safety of our law enforcement officers, Tarrant County has taken a significant step forward. Last December marked a historic moment as we welcomed the arrival of the first Bearcat Armored Vehicle in TCSO history. This new addition equips our deputies with enhanced protection, empowering them to effectively respond to high-risk scenarios and safeguard both themselves and the community they serve. In Tarrant County, our commitment to supporting and prioritizing the safety of our law enforcement personnel remains unwavering.





The Tarrant County Commissioners Court was proud to present a resolution honoring our incredible Tarrant County Sheriff's Office Deputies from the Warrants Division for their valor, bravery, and courage under fire during a shootout in August of 2024. We displayed the actual shield that took more than 7 rounds during the shooting and were able to recognize Deputy Todd Tipton, who was shot three times during this incident and survived. In Tarrant County we will always honor those who sacrifice everything the keep us safe. Thank you for your service!



Commissioner Ramirez had a great visit to Washington D.C. He represented Tarrant County at the Annual NACo Legislative Conference, was able to catch up with Senator Ted Cruz and attended President Trump's historic State of the Union address.




Employee Spotlight

Stay Hydrated

- *Don't wait until you are thirsty to drink water.

Repell Insects

Weather Safety



What are Transparency Stars?

The Transparency Stars program recognizes government entities that further their transparency efforts by providing clear and meaningful financial information through documents, visualizations and other formats.

The Transparency Stars categories are: Traditional Finances, Contracts and Procurement, Economic Development, Public Pensions, Debt Obligations, and Open Government and Compliance.

The Boswell High School Lady Pioneers basketball team made history on Saturday, March 1, by winning the UIL Class 6A Division 2 State Championship, the program's first-ever state title.

In a thrilling game at the Alamodome in San Antonio, the Lady Pioneers defeated Fort Bend Hightower with a final score of 51-42. This victory capped off an outstanding season, with Boswell finishing 39-2 overall, boasting a perfect 12-0 district record and an undefeated home record of 14-0.

Head Coach John Reese praised the team, stating, "This is such a special group of young women who worked hard every day to achieve something no other Boswell team has done. They believed in themselves and never backed down from a challenge."

Principal Vaughn Flagler added, "This historic accomplishment is a moment of pride for our entire school and district. These student-athletes have set an example of leadership and perseverance that will inspire future generations."
