E-file Sensitive Data



This is a quick reminder that when efiling, you have the option to select "contains sensitive data" for any document you upload.

Checking this box will automatically make that filed document unavailable for public view on research.txcourts.gov.

Simply check the "contains sensitive data" checkbox when uploading your

document in Efile Texas. The clerks will then restrict that document from public view once processed.



A Note to Attorneys: Please Spell Out Acronyms in Filings:



We often see filings littered with acronyms and abbreviated initialisms that are not clearly defined. While these shortcuts may save attorneys a few keystrokes, they can potentially confuse or mislead the court.

We kindly ask that attorneys take a moment to spell out any acronyms or shortened

initialisms on first reference, followed by the abbreviated version in parentheses. This helps ensure clarity and transparency for the court. The extra few seconds needed to type these terms out is time well spent to prevent confusion.

We understand legal documents often require precision and shorthand to cover complex topics concisely. However, courts and the public are better served when briefs, motions, orders and other filings are immediately clear and comprehensible. We appreciate attorneys' consideration of this request in future filings.
