NOTICE OF E-FILING REQUIREMENT

Effective Monday, July 1, 2019, Justice Court Precinct One Implemented E-Filing (as the preferred method) for ALL cases with limited exceptions.

On May 16, 2019, the Court officially designated all electronic Court documents as the official Court record. Since November 2018, more than six months prior to this implementation, multiple notices had been posted throughout the 1895 Old Courthouse, 100 W. Weatherford St., and in Justice Court Precinct One, Room 450. Additionally, a notice had been published on the Court's website regarding the July 1st transition to mandatory e-filing.

LOCAL RULE ELECTRONIC FILING

All **Pro Se litigants** (individuals not represented by an attorney) and attorneys **are strongly encouraged** to submit all filings, including but not limited to **Eviction**, **Small Claims**, **Debt Claims**, and any subsequent case filings or response pleadings, via **E-File Texas Self-Help** or **E-File Texas**.

Any litigant who is **unable** or **elects not** to file electronically may make a **request** to the Court seeking to file in person. The Court will **evaluate each request on a case-by-case basis** and, at its discretion, **determine whether an exception** to the mandatory e-filing requirement will be granted based on the litigant's individual circumstances.

Any litigant who does not have online computer access shall be provided access to a computer kiosk located in the Justice Court office for the purpose of electronically filing documents. In the event that a case cannot be processed through E-File Texas Self-Help or E-File Texas, the litigant will have to submit the filing in person
