Overview

This research guide includes information and resources related to child support in Texas. Child support is “a parent’s legal obligation to contribute to the economic maintenance and education of a child until the age of majority, the child’s emancipation before reaching majority, or the child’s completion of secondary education,” and it is “enforceable both civilly and criminally.” (*Black’s Law Dictionary, 11th ed.*).
