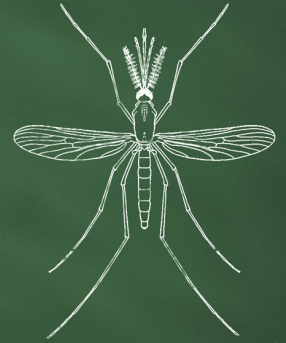

Week 27 Summary

140 mosquito pools* have been tested in NTRL from week 27

- Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 1429 mosquito pools

8 mosquito pools tested positive for WNV this week:

Arlington (2) Euless (3) Fort Worth (2) Grapevine (1)

Average number of mosquitoes/trap include:

- Culex spp: 36.8
- Aedes aegypti and Aedes albopictus: 4.6

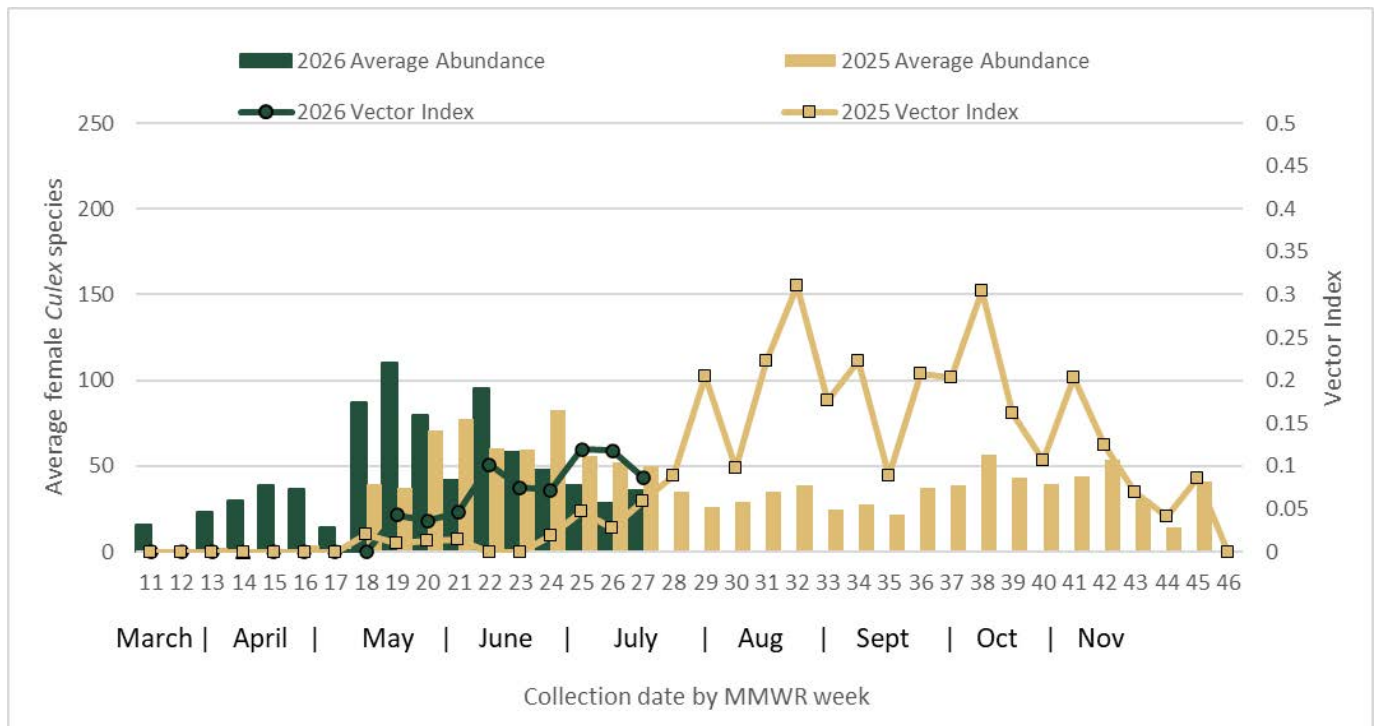

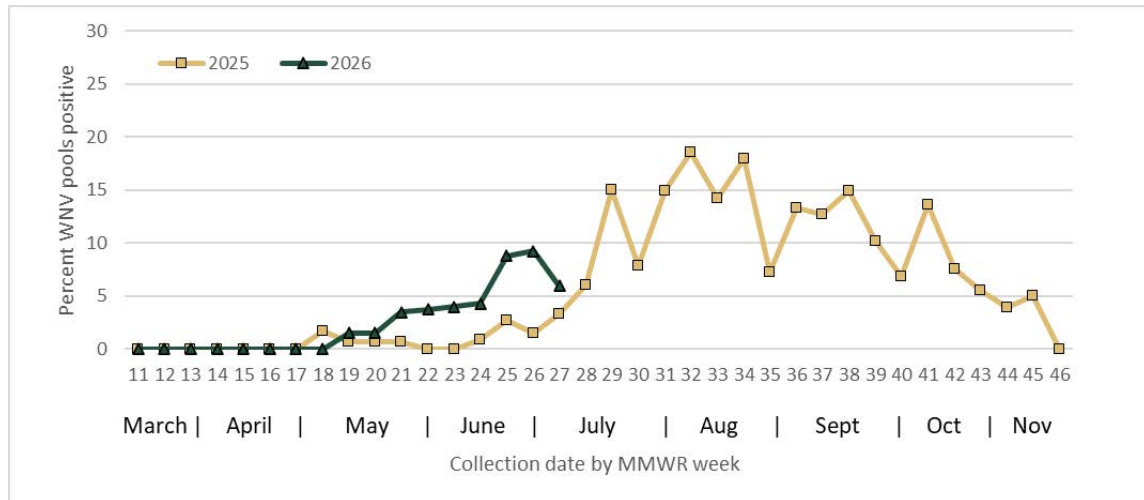
