Week 30 Summary

136 mosquito pools* have been tested in NTRL from week 30

- Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 1831 mosquito pools

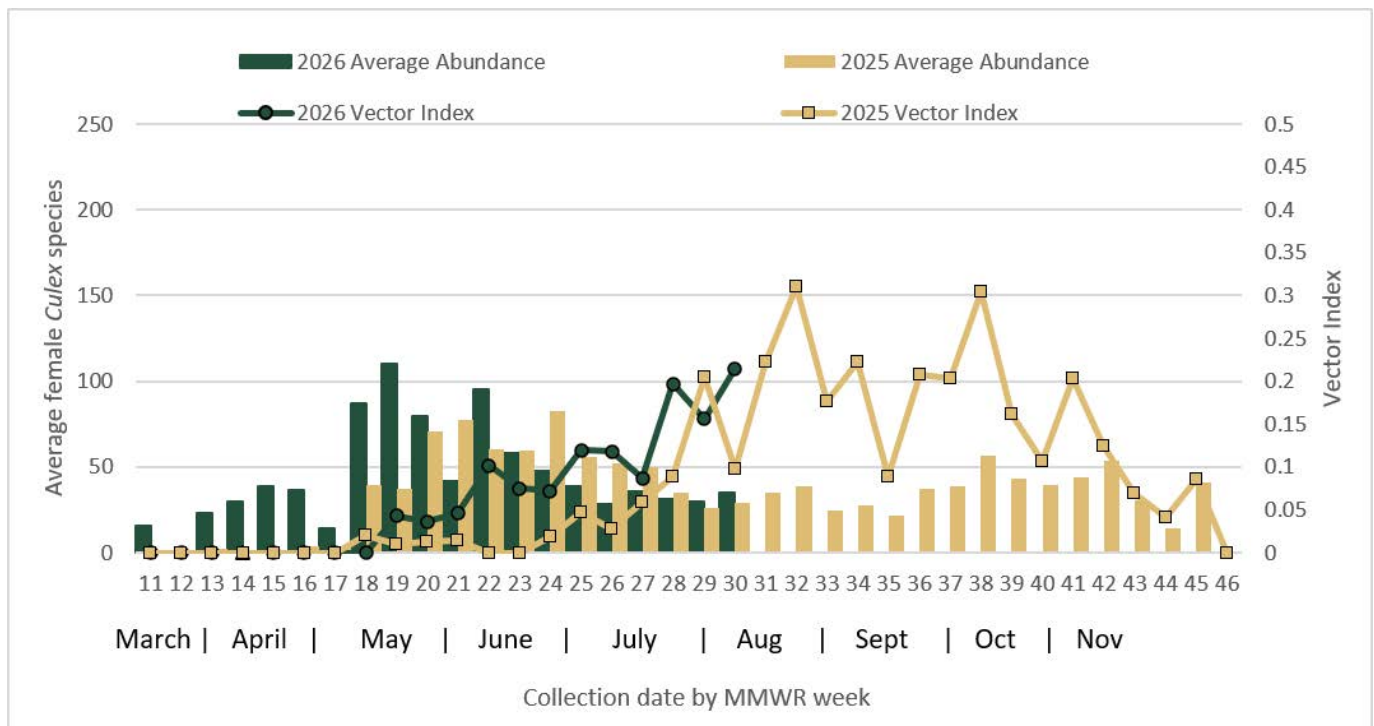

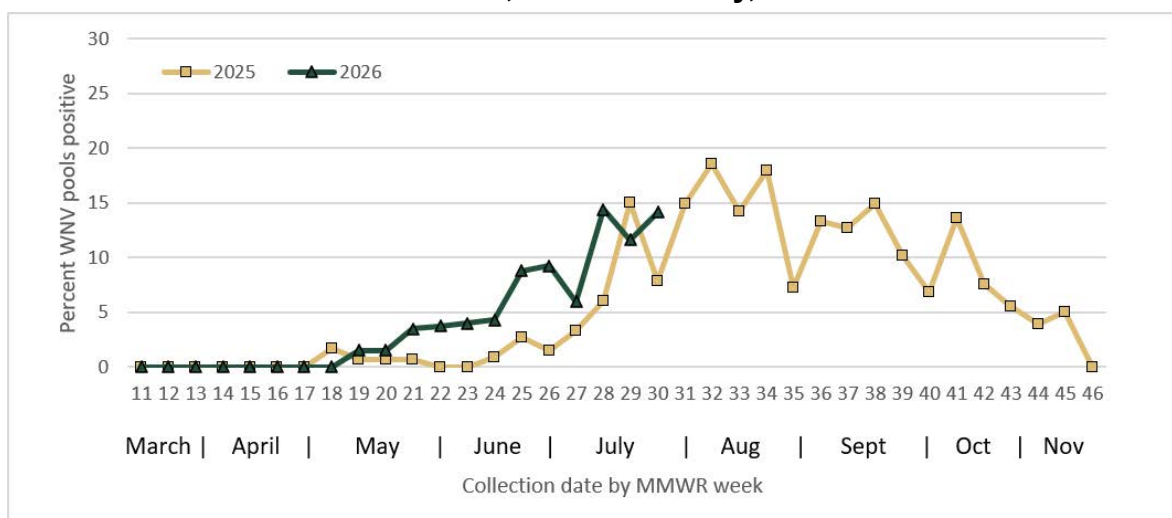
