#### Week 33 Summary

138 mosquito pools\* have been tested in NTRL from week 33

- Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 2246 mosquito pools

11 mosquito pools tested positive for WNV this week:

Arlington (1) Colleyville (1) Euless (1) Fort Worth (7) North Richland Hills (1)

Average number of mosquitoes/trap include:

- Culex spp: 27.9
- Aedes aegypti and Aedes albopictus: 1.5

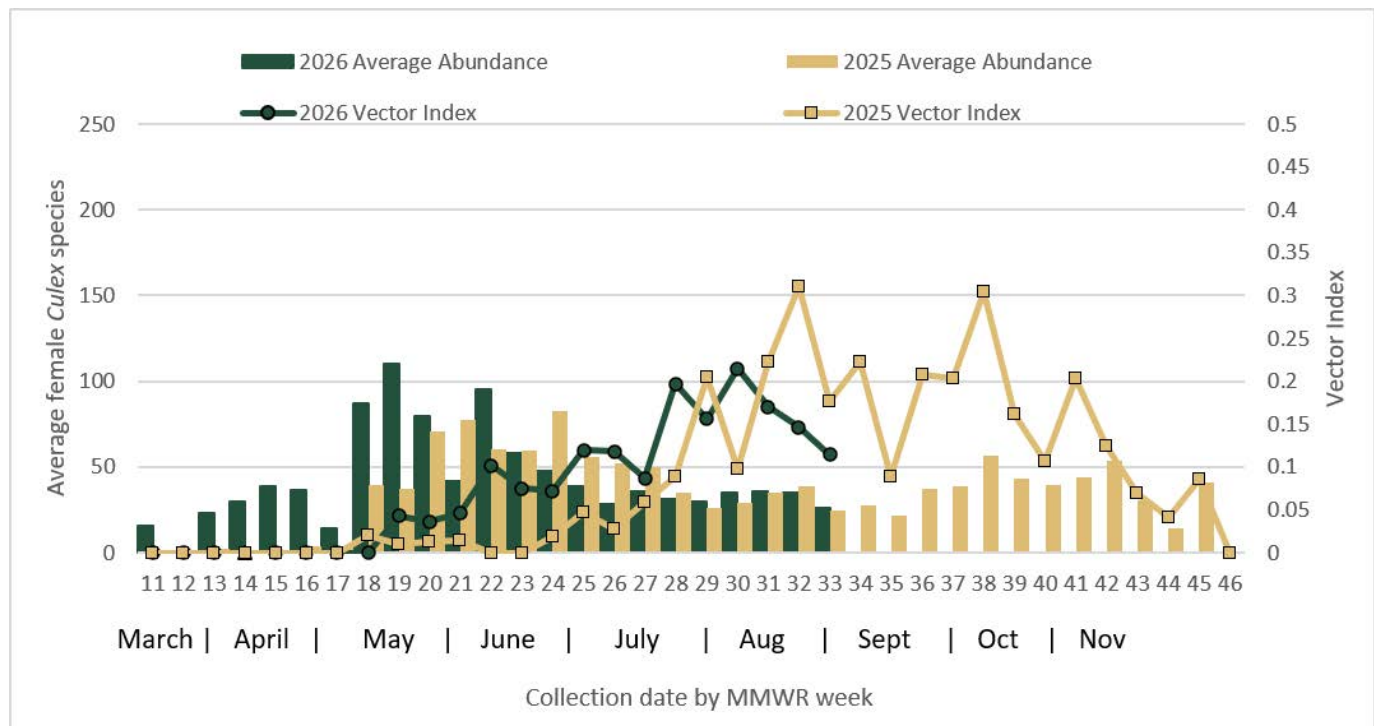

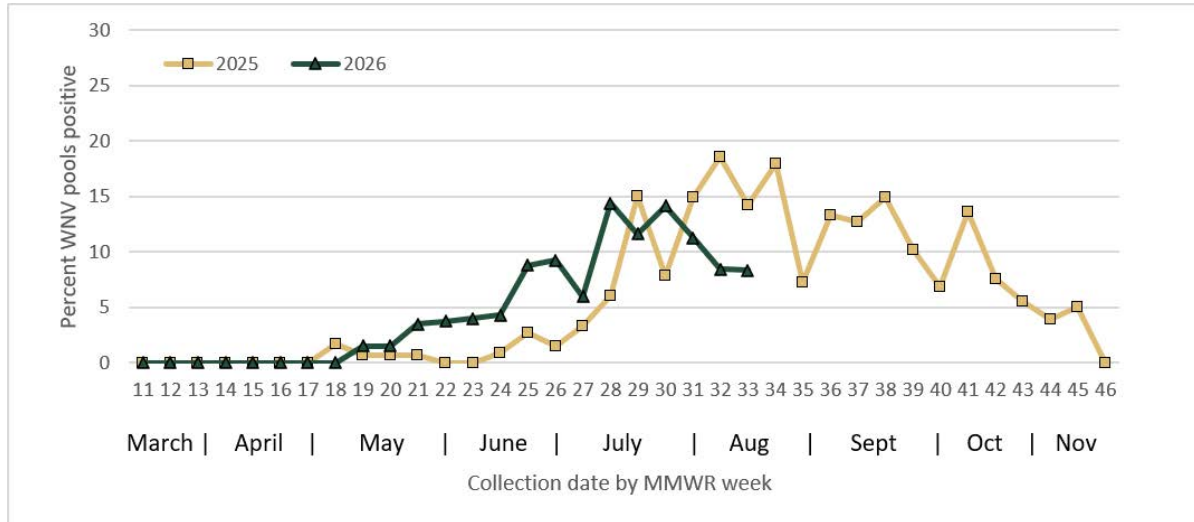
