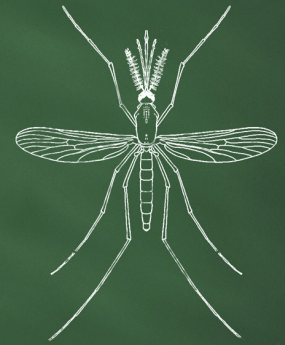

Week 36 Summary

124 mosquito pools* have been tested in NTRL from week 36

- Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 2641 mosquito pools

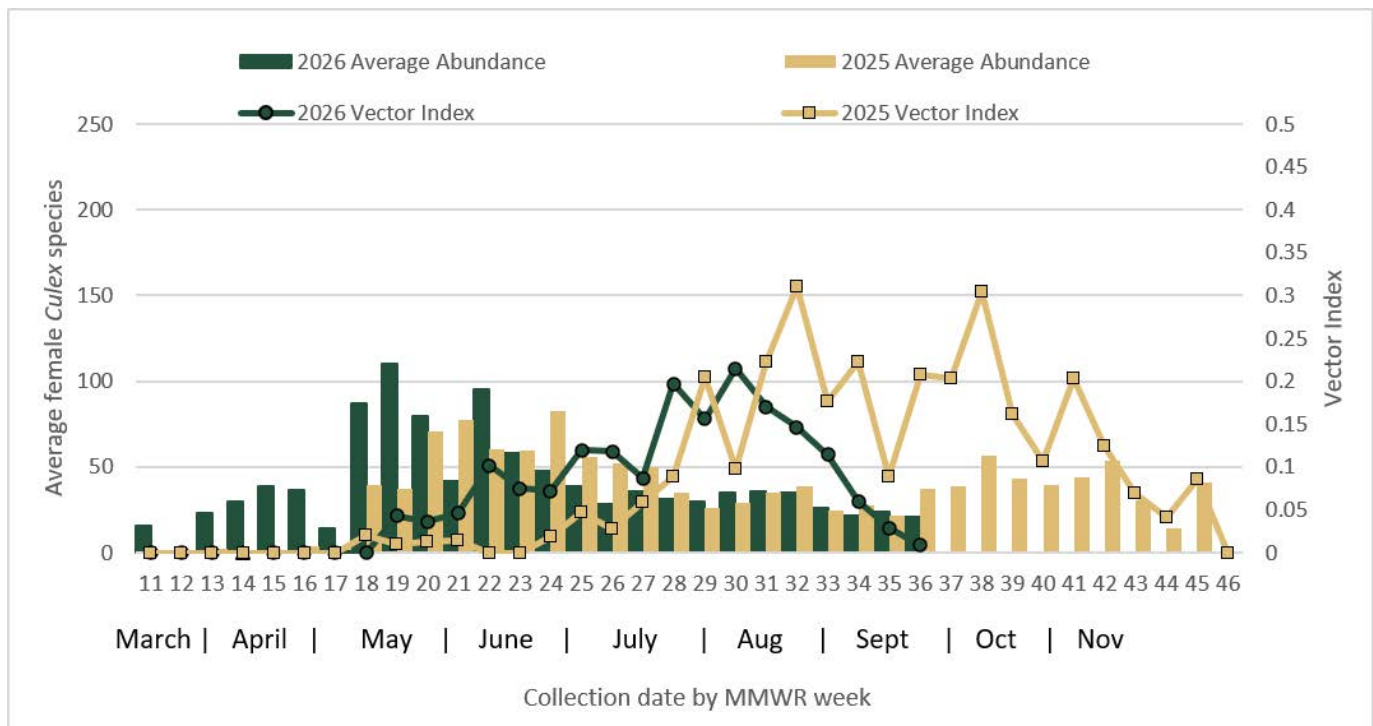

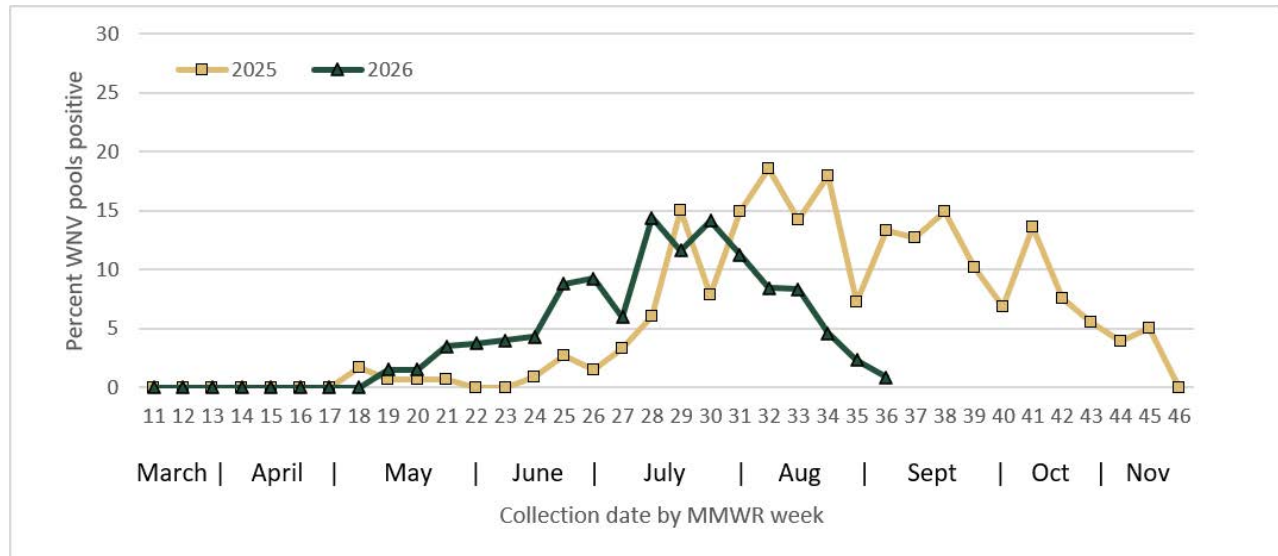
