Weekly Arbovirus Surveillance Report: MMWR Week Aug 10-Aug 16, 2025



Week 33 Summary

- 144 mosquito pools* have been tested in NTRL from week 33
 - Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 2108 mosquito pools
- 29 mosquito pools tested positive for WNV this week:
 - Arlington (3) Benbrook (1) Burleson* (6) Colleyville (2) Crowley (1) Dalworthington Gardens (1)
 - Eules (2) Fort Worth* (5) Grand Prairie* (1) Mansfield (1) North Richland Hills (1) River Oaks (1)
 - Unincorporated (3) Watauga (1)
- Average number of mosquitoes/trap include:
 - *Culex spp*: 25.1
 - *Aedes aegypti* and *Aedes albopictus*: 6.3

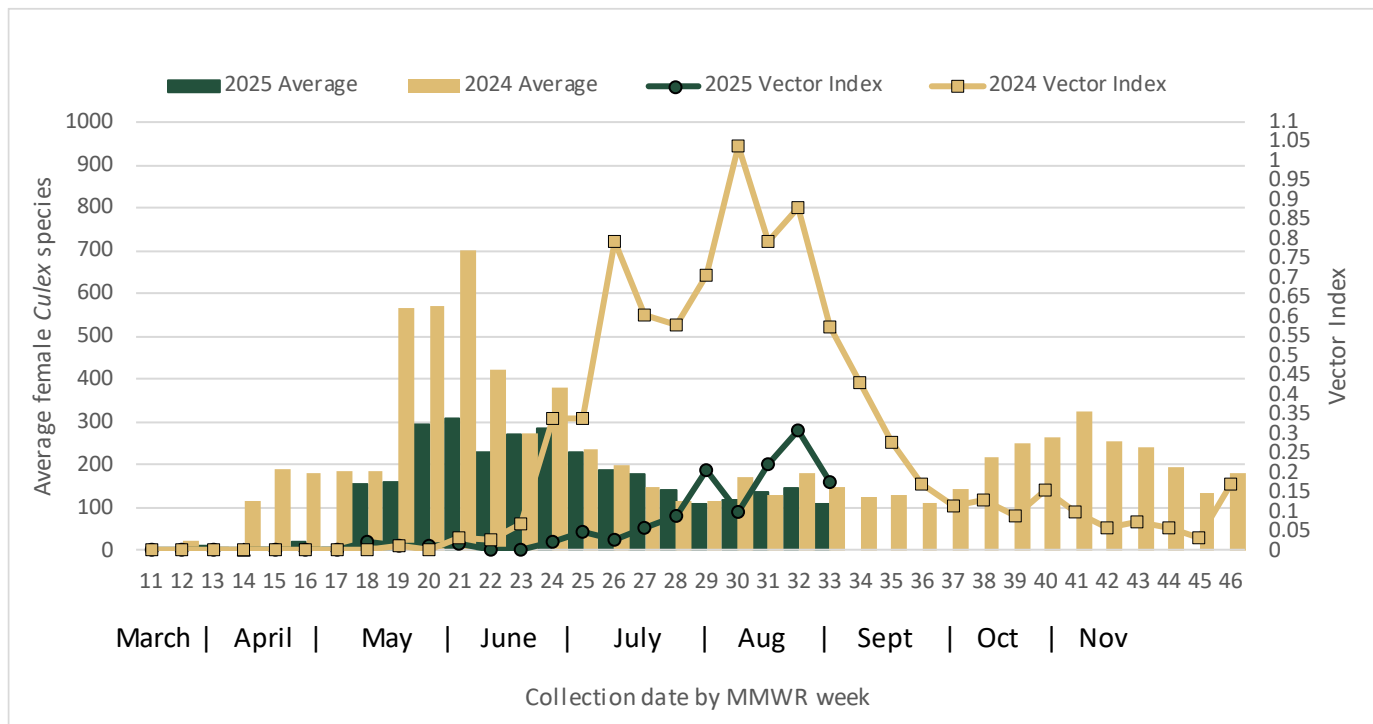

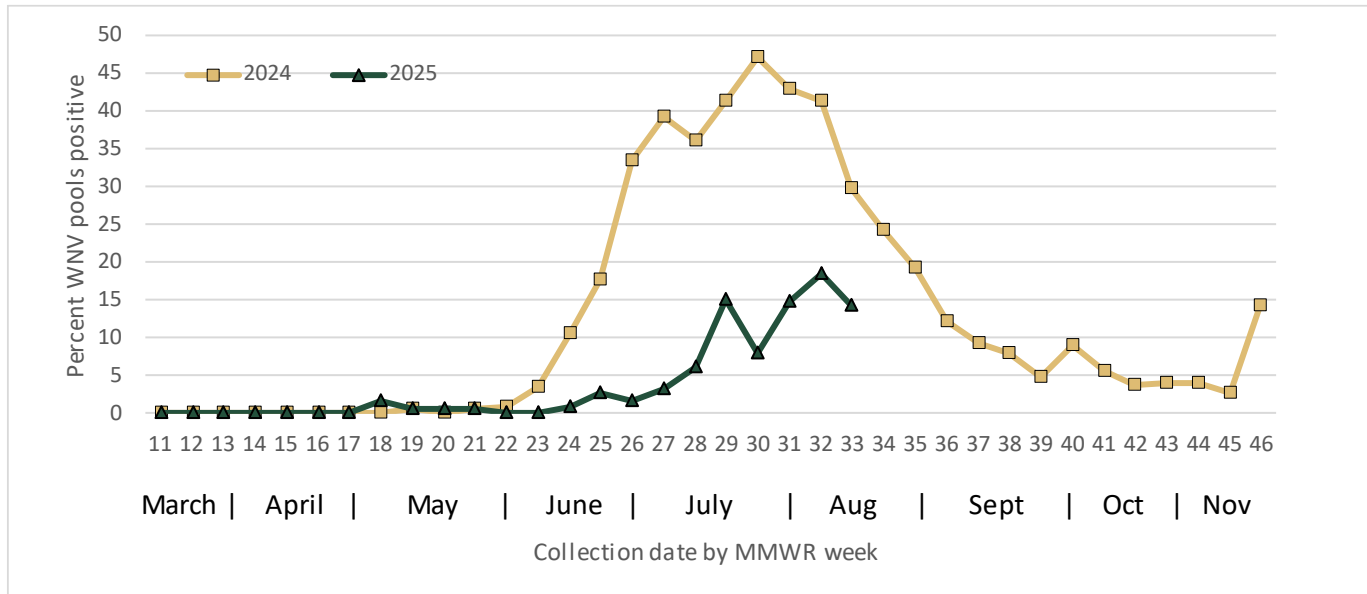
