



INFANT MORTALITY IN TARRANT COUNTY

- In 2024, the Tarrant County infant mortality rate was **5.63** per 1,000 live births, a **9% decrease** from 2015 and above the Healthy People 2030 goal of 5.0 per 1,000 live births
- Tarrant County had the **fourth highest** infant mortality rate among the nine Texas counties with at least 10,000 live births in 2024
- Tarrant County would need **18 fewer infant deaths** in 2024 to **meet the Healthy People 2030 Objective** of 5.0 infant deaths per 1,000 live births
- Out of the 71 rankable causes of infant death, **five** were responsible for **more than half** of all deaths among Tarrant County infants from 2020-2024
- Birth defects** were the leading causes of infant death in Tarrant County, responsible for **1 out of 4** infant deaths from 2020-2024

In 2024, the infant mortality rate among non-Hispanic Black residents was **8.29 per 1,000 live births, which was a historic low, but still remained higher than all other race/ethnicity groups in Tarrant County**

Figure 1. Infant mortality in Tarrant County, Texas, and United States, 2024




Figure 2. Infant mortality in Tarrant County, Texas, and United States, 2015-2024




Figure 3. Infant mortality in Texas counties with 10,000+ live births, 2024




Figure 4. Infant mortality by race/ethnicity among Tarrant County residents, 2015-2024





Figure 5. Leading causes of death among Tarrant County infants, 2020-2024
