
TEEN DATING VIOLENCE

<u>Teen Dating Violence (TDV)</u>: Unhealthy actions or threats that occur in a teenage dating relationship with a current or previous partner. TDV is a type of <u>intimate partner violence (IPV)</u> [Data Brief linked <u>here</u>].

TDV varies in severity and includes many types of abuse, such as **Economic/Financial**, **Emotional/Verbal**, **Physical**, **Sexual**, and **Technology-Facilitated**. To learn more about these and other types of abuse, [click here].

TDV is considered an adverse childhood experience (ACE). ACEs are traumatic events that happen during ages 0-17 years. ACEs can negatively impact health, development, and overall well-being during childhood and into adulthood. To learn more about ACEs and how to prevent them, [click here].


Teen dating violence reported by high school students in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) by type of dating violence and geographic location, 2019-2023*



Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) Dating Violence Questions

Among high school students who dated or went out with someone during the 12 months before the survey:

- Being physically hurt on purpose (hit, slammed into something, or injured with an object or weapon) by someone they were dating or going out with, one or more times during the 12 months before the survey.
- **Being forced to do sexual things** (kissing, touching, or being physically forced to have sexual intercourse) they did not want to do by someone they were dating or going out with, one or more times during the 12 months before the survey.



In 2021, a significantly lower percentage of Fort Worth Independent School District (FWISD) students reported experiencing physical dating violence (5.8%) compared to Texas students (12.8%)

Types of TDV abuse that Texas victims reported to the 'love is respect' hotline in 2024:

Teen Dating Violence increases the risk of:



- Antisocial Behavior
- Depression and Anxiety
- Eating Disorders
- Intimate Partner Violence in Adulthood
- Risky Sexual Behaviors
- Substance Use
- Thinking about Suicide

From October 2023 - September 2024, 4,765 students from 9 school districts in Tarrant County participated in The Archway's prevention programming that covers teen dating violence, communication styles, understanding emotions, and bullying
